The college displays set up by individual college representatives will be in our Gymnasium. It is a good idea to visit the schools to which you may apply. Looking at pictures in brochures is no substitute for actually visiting the campus and seeing the dorms, the dining facilities, and the surrounding community. Students should use this time to identify several campuses from each of the four systems for further exploration.
