With a focus on nurturing and cultivating the whole child, beginning as early as preschool, the Santa Ana Unified School District offers programs and resources that are specialized and unique for each child. From dual language programs to learning environments with a focus on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and Visual and Performing Arts, we offer a personalized program for each child to help them excel and develop a passion for learning.

As your Superintendent, my primary focus is our classrooms, community, and building connectedness. What that essentially means is connecting the entire community together -- parents, teachers, staff, and community members - to support our core business of providing a high quality education for our students in and out of the classroom. One example of that is our collaboration with Santa Ana College (SAC), California State University Fullerton (CSUF) and University of California Irvine (UCI) to make college accessible to our graduates beginning with free tuition and a laptop during their first year of college when they attend SAC as a full-time student. This is a unique opportunity only for Santa Ana Unified School District graduates. Additionally, to encourage students to continue their educational journey, SAUSD students may enroll in a program called Santa Ana ¡Adelante! that will provide them guaranteed admission to CSUF or UCI when they complete all criteria while enrolled at SAC.

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### **OUR HIGHER EDUCATION PARTNERS**

SANTA ANA COLLEGE

For the past 33 years, the Santa Ana Partnership has developed a pathway from the earliest years in the Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) schools to Santa Ana College and onward to a baccalaureate-granting institution.

Through a program called Santa Ana ¡Adelante!, SAUSD graduates will receive free college tuition their freshmen year, worth an estimated \$1,104.00, when they enroll at Santa Ana College full-time. To support their education, they will also receive a free laptop.

SAUSD graduates who enroll in the Santa Ana ¡Adelante! program attend Santa Ana College, and who complete the transfer requirements, will receive guaranteed admission to California State University Fullerton or University of California Irvine.

The partnership with Santa Ana College has provided opportunity for students to enroll in college courses for dual/concurrent enrollment during the school day at Century High School and Godinez High School. Additionally, juniors and seniors are provided access to college coursework at our local high schools, in alignment with career pathways, through the College Now program after the regular school day.




