
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Course Description:

Students in grade ten study major turning points that shaped the modern world, from the late 1700s through the present, including the cause and course of the two world wars. They trace the rise of democratic ideas and develop an understanding of the historical roots of current world issues, especially as they pertain to international relations. Students examine the American experience and understand that democratic ideals are often achieved at a high price, remain vulnerable, and are not practiced everywhere in the world. Students develop an understanding of current world issues and relate them to their historical, geographic, political, economic, and cultural contexts. Students consider multiple accounts of events in order to understand international relations from a variety of perspectives.

- 2. Thinking Like a Historian/Map Skills
- 3. Review: Enlightenment/European
- **Revolutions/American Revolution**
- 4. Industrial Revolution
- 5. Age of Imperialism
- 6. World War 1

- 9. Mexico in 20th century
