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Overview of the 2024–2025 School Year



Goal 1: Family Engagement

Actions Taken:

- Partnered with Santa Ana College to provide a 16-week Digital Literacy Course with plans to offer Digital Literacy II in Fall 2025.
- Provided opportunities for parents to share their voice during school events relating to workshop topics, areas of interest, and communication preferences.
- Continued partnerships with Second Harvest, Tzu Chi Foundation, and parents volunteers to ensure distribution of community resources.

Results:

- 176 parents completed the Spring 2025 Panorama Survey
- 91% of parents responded favorably to the degree to which families become involved with and interact with their child's school.

Goal 2: Increase ELA and Math SBAC Scores

Actions Taken:

- Provided targeted Math, Reading and Writing support classes for students.
- Provided ELPAC Achieve, an after school English language development program, to assist students in reclassification.
- Established a literacy campaign to motivate students to read and score high on tests.
- Continued to offer Math Club and UCI Math Project to students interested in excelling their math proficiency.
- Provided after school tutoring to all students.

Results:

• Spring 2025 SBAC Scores are still pending (6/23/25)

Goal 3: Decrease Suspension Rate

Actions Taken:

- Expanded SHIELD Academy (in-house alternative to suspension program) to 2-days a month where students learned about their strengths, healthy decision-making, and goal development.
- Expanded our partnership with Dr. Rios and the Scholar System to provide a 4-part Youth Empowerment Program to 20 students.
- Utilized Neutral Ground to facilitate mediations, drug and gang prevention groups, provide crisis intervention, and build student relationships.
- Staff received 2 days of Capturing Kids Hearts professional development

Results:

- The suspension rate decreased from 8% to 6%
- Students' sense of safety and sense of belonging increased by 5%

Key Goals for 2025-2026

Increase Family Engagement

- Use parent voice to guide programing and leadership opportunities offered to parents and the community in the 2025-2026 school year.
- Work on making our Wellness Center more welcoming to parents and children by organizing, decorating, and having clear signage for our space.
- Utilize parent survey results to create a parent council where parents will discuss areas of concern and existing positive practices. Establishing this parent group will allow us to build connections, trust and increase engagement.

Increase ELA & Math Scores

- Utilize supplemental math programs to assist students with math comprehension through instructional aids and assist teachers with identifying real-time actionable data to ensure student success.
- Continue to offer after school support in both ELA and Math instruction.
- Offer departments opportunities to review student data, collaborate on best practices and work towards department goals via Professional Learning Committees (PLC). PLC's have been immensely successful in increasing ELA scores in the 2023-2024 school year.
- Deliver robust integrated services to students and families to ensure that basic needs are met for whole-child student development.

Decrease Suspension Rates

- Continue to offer SHIELD Academy 2-days a month by fostering collaboration between Neutral Ground, Counselors and Engage 360.
- Continue to create Social Contracts in every class at the beginning of the school year where students and teachers develop classroom norms collaboratively.
- Promote the WellSpace to encourage students to self regulate and speak with a social worker when they need to connect with an adult on campus.
- Incentivize positive behavior with dedicated spaces on campus that students can earn through points.
