(1) Disrupted school activities or otherwise willfully defied the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, school officials, or other school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties, (2) Except as provided in Section 48910, a pupil enrolled in kindergarten or any of grades TK to 8, inclusive, shall not be suspended for any of the acts enumerated in this subdivision, and this subdivision shall NOT constitute grounds for a pupil enrolled in kindergarten or any of grades 1 to 12, inclusive, to be recommended for expulsion. (EC 48900 K)
