Course Description

Government This course will focus on the principles and beliefs upon which the United States was founded and on the structure, functions, and powers of government at the national, state, and local levels. Furthermore, students will learn major political ideas and forms of government throughout history and the world. And finally, a significant focus of this course will be on the U.S. Constitution, its underlying principles and ideas, and the form of government it created.

Economics This course will focus on the Free Enterprise System and its benefits, more specifically the principles concerning production, consumption, and the distribution of goods and services in the United States and throughout the globe. Additionally, this course will incorporate instruction in personal financial literacy. And finally, students will learn to apply critical-thinking skills using economic concepts to evaluate the costs and benefits of economic issues, both macro and micro.
