Course Requirements

1. Materials-You must bring everyday!

- "3" Three ring binder with subject dividers and paper
- Colored pencil set/ red correcting pen/ highlighter/pens, pencils

2. Homework Policy

- All assignments must be done on standard lined notebook paper or typed. Your name, date, class subject, and class period need to be included in the upper right hand corner of your paper. In addition, each assignment must be titled. If these directions are not followed, then your work will not receive full credit.
- All homework and other outside assignments are <u>due at the beginning of class</u>.
- Late homework, labs or projects will be accepted up to twenty-four hours from the original due date with a 50% point reduction.

3. Classroom Expectations

- Be respectful of yourself, your peers, and adults.
- Each student will write down all homework assignments in the GFHS student agenda.
- When the tardy bell rings, all students are expected to be seated in their assigned seats. Those who are not seated when the tardy bells rings will be considered tardy.
- Not following lab safety rules will result in a zero for all class activities/labs for that day.

4. Course Description

• This course is intended to be an upper level college preparatory life science class. However, all students are welcome regardless of academic path. This class will fulfill the G requirement as well as the Santa Ana School District third year of science requirement.

Semester I Plan:

- *1st 6 weeks*: Eat-Move-Win/ Nutrition, Body Systems Overview, Anatomical and Directional terms, Cells, Tissue types, Tissue project.
- 2nd 6 weeks: Integumentary system, Skin disease research project, Skeletal system.
- *3rd 6 weeks*: Nervous system, Special Senses and Endocrine System.

Semester II Plan:

- *1st 6 weeks*: Muscular System, Cardio-vascular system, cardiovascular disease project, Lymphatic system, blood
- 2nd 6 weeks: Respiratory system, Digestive system, Nutrition, Nutrition project, Urinary system.
- *3rd 6 weeks*: Reproductive system, Rat/ Pig Dissection.
