Weekly Update From Supt. Jerry Almendarez

Nov. 16, 2020



Dear SAUSD Community,

On Monday, Orange County and 27 other counties were moved back to the most restrictive <u>purple tier</u> of California's color-coded tracking system in response to an alarming spike in new coronavirus infections. While this does not change anything we are currently doing in SAUSD in terms of instruction, this serves as a stark reminder that we are moving in the wrong direction as we work to contain this pandemic.

Gov. Newsom says that California is "experiencing the fastest increase in cases we have seen yet — faster than what we experienced at the outset of the pandemic or even this summer."

Again, I want to encourage our community as we enter the flu season and families begin planning for the holidays to continue to practice safety measures, including mask wearing, social distancing, and avoiding large gatherings if possible. These rates have to come down in order for all our students to have the opportunity to return to in-person instruction.

Learning Labs

We have expanded our Learning Labs to nine campuses this week, bringing back 378 students in a safe and supervised environment to access their virtual classroom. Each Lab includes 14 or fewer students per cohort. We continue to plan on opening more Learning Labs each week through December. (It's important to note that the District can continue opening these Labs even under the state's purple tier because they involve very small groups of students per campus, and strict health and safety guidelines are being met.)



Updating SAUSD Student Grading Procedures

As we continue is this virtual learning environment, we want to support our students as best we can and make necessary adjustments to ensure they have the best opportunity to succeed. Last week, our Board of Education discussed making changes to the District's grading practices to address challenges of remote learning while keeping rigorous academic standards in place.

This will include adjusting how teachers grade homework, late work, and synchronous and asynchronous learning.
