
Our goal remains to return our students back to our campuses as soon as it is safe to do so. This will start with the resumption of our Learning Labs.

Federal Stimulus Bill Passes

California will receive \$6.8 billion of the \$54.9 billion that Congress provided in Covid-19 relief funding for K-12 schools that the President signed into law Dec. 27.

Ninety percent of funding will be distributed based on how much a school district receives in Title I funding. For Santa Ana Unified School District, this could amount to about \$57-\$58 million in one-time funding.

This latest round should help meet the short-term costs associated with Covid-19 and some of the budget shortfalls facing many school districts. But it won't be enough to address the extra funding needed to address the lost learning that a substantial number of students are experiencing across the state and the rest of the country.

Our District leadership team, with the support of the Board of Education, will work in coming weeks to determine how to most effectively spend these dollars to best serve all of our students.
