Learning Labs

Our Learning Labs will provide a safe and supervised environment for students to access their virtual classroom. They will include 14 or fewer students per cohort (group). Principals and school staff are helping to identify students who will have initial access to Learning Labs, specifically those who have had ongoing connectivity issues. Priority will be given to McKinney Vento, foster youth, English language learners, and students with disabilities.

Starting at 3 sites

Today, Learning Labs launched at **Madison Elementary**, **McFadden Intermediate**, and **Valley High** schools. At this time, Learning Labs will be staffed and led by Extended Learning classified personnel.

These Labs will be held in spaces that will ensure appropriate social distancing. Mask wearing and other safety protocols will also be a part of these Labs. Beginning next week, we plan to open Learning Labs at another round of schools. Every week, we will add Labs at additional campuses as it continues to be safe to do so.

Other Reopening News

Commitment to Common Standard to Reopening Schools

Leaders from Santa Ana Unified, Los Angeles Unified, Fresno, Long Beach, Oakland, Sacramento, and San Diego recently agreed to commit to developing a common and high standard for safely reopening schools. These districts represent a combined 1 million students in California. Superintendents from each district signed a letter asking Gov. Newsom, the state Legislature and local and county governments to join in this effort. [A copy of the letter is available here.](#)

Leaders from these seven districts agree that it will take collective action and additional funding to bring students, teachers and staff back to schools in the way that is as safe as possible and sustainable for the long-term.
