I want to thank all of our staff, parents and students who have followed safety measures to ensure schools can stay open. We're still working out the final details on when testing will begin. But our goal remains to make testing convenient and the least disruptive as possible for our students and staff. Vaccines for community and staff

State guidelines now allow for any individual age 12 and older to receive a Covid-19 vaccination. The District continues to offer up-to-date information on upcoming community clinics through SAUSD partnerships. Information is available by contacting your student's school or by visiting www.sausd.us/vaccines.

The District has now provided about 50,000 vaccines for employees and SAUSD community members through all local partnerships. We are working to secure more vaccination opportunities to ensure all our community members have equitable access.

In the meantime, staff and community members can also secure vaccination appointments as they become available through the Othena app, and through clinics such as those offered through Walmart, Walgreens, CVS, Albertsons, or through their own healthcare provider. FAQ: Returning to School Safely

SAUSD hosted two Town Hall meetings with parents and other community members. As part of these town halls, SAUSD staff collected the most commonly asked questions. Answers to these questions are posted on the district's website at www.sausd.us/covid-resources. Here is a sample:

Q: Are Covid vaccinations going to become mandatory for my child to attend school?

A: At this time, the COVID-19 vaccination is NOT a requirement under the California Health and Safety Code. Under the California Health and Safety Code, Section 120325-120375, schools and pre-kindergarten facilities are required to enforce immunization requirements set by the state, maintain immunization records, and submit reports. Q: Will teachers being vaccinated be mandatory? Will staff be required to show proof of vaccination or get tested twice a week per guidance? Why or why not?

A: Vaccination is not mandated for teachers/staff by CDE at this time. We strongly recommend and encourage vaccination for every staff and students (12 and older). No one is required to show proof of vaccination at any site. But weekly testing will soon be provided for students and staff at every site.
