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Course Overview : By the end of the course, students will be able to identify the following; Geometric transformations and symmetry. Relationships between figures (such as similarity and congruence). Measurements of 2D and 3D figures (such as area, perimeter, volume, surface area). Tools for analyzing and measuring right triangles (such as the Pythagorean Theorem, trigonometric ratios).
