#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Education Code Section 17620 and Government Code Sections 65995.5, 65995.6, and 65995.7 allow for the imposition of Alternative School Facilities Fees (ASFF) that may be collected from residential development in the District. The School Facilities Needs Analysis (SFNA) provides the factual basis for the District to consider and, if desired, adopt the ASFF. The Board adopted Resolution No. 10/11-2846 on August 24, 2010 approving the 2010 SFNA and ASFF of \$5.09 per square foot of new residential development.

#### **RATIONALE:**

ASFF are needed to offset the impact of planned new residential development. In order to levy ASFF, the SFNA must be adopted annually by resolution at a public hearing, and must demonstrate that the District meets the statutory criteria contained in Government Code Section 65995.5(b)(3). According to the 2011 SFNA prepared July 21, 2011, the District meets the criteria required for adoption of ASFF. The new ASFF (Level II Fees) imposed would be \$4.75 per square foot of new residential development starting August 24, 2011 for a maximum of one year.

Where the Outdoors Field Program offers a one-day environmental field study in the Newport Bay area, the Inside the Outdoors School Program provides a one-hour lesson taught by the Traveling Naturalist or Traveling Scientist at the school sites.

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board ratification to renew an agreement for 2011-12 school year, with The Regents of the University of California under the department of Center for Educational Partnerships. This partnership will co-fund two curriculum specialists to support the District English Language Learner (ELL) program. UCI received a California Postsecondary Education Commission (CPEC) Improving Teacher Quality (ITQ) grant in collaboration with the District. The ratification was required due to the funding of this award to cover 10% of the Curriculum Specialists' salary.

#### **RATIONALE:**

The UCI California Reading and Literature Project works in close collaboration with District leadership to develop and coordinate professional development plans.

This service agreement contracts two curriculum specialists to help implement and realize the goals and objectives for the ELL program. The District will be reimbursed the combined current salary equivalent of 40% and 20% time plus 3.53% indirect costs of two curriculum specialists. This agreement is subject to annual renewal.

These same two curriculum specialists will also serve as the co-directors of the California Reading and Literature Project, overseeing the project's implementation of its signature programs as well as developing and customizing professional development workshops/institutes for partnership districts and schools in the Orange County region.


