## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board authorization to adopt Resolution No. 11/12-2893 to authorize a School Facility Needs Analysis (SFNA) and Alternative School Facilities Fees (ASFF) in Compliance With Government Code Sections 65995.5, 65995.6, and 65995.7 and Education Code Section 17620 and Government Code Sections 65995.5, 65995.6, and 65995.7 allow for the imposition of Alternative School Facilities Fees (ASFF) that may be collected from residential development in the District. The School Facilities Needs Analysis (SFNA) provides the factual basis for the District to consider and, if desired, adopt the ASFF. The Board adopted Resolution No. 10/11-2846 on August 24, 2010 approving the 2010 SFNA and ASFF of \$5.09 per square foot of new residential development.

## **RATIONALE:**

ASFF are needed to offset the impact of planned new residential development. In order to levy ASFF, the SFNA must be adopted annually by resolution at a public hearing, and must demonstrate that the District meets the statutory criteria contained in Government Code Section 65995.5(b)(3). According to the 2011 SFNA prepared July 21, 2011, the District meets the criteria required for adoption of ASFF. The new ASFF (Level II Fees) imposed would be \$4.75 per square foot of new residential development starting August 24, 2011 for a maximum of one year.

## **RESOLUTION NO: 11/12-2893**

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO:11/12-2893 — AUTHORIZING A SCHOOL FACILITY NEEDS ANALYSIS AND ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL FACILITIES FEES IN COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNMENT CODE SECTIONS 65995.5, 65995.6, AND 65995.7 AND MAKING RELATED FINDINGS AND DETERMINATIONS

WHEREAS, the Governing Board ("Board") of the Santa Ana Unified School District ("District") provides for the educational needs for Grade K-12 students within the City of Santa Ana and portions of the Cities of Tustin, Irvine, Costa Mesa, Newport Beach, and Unincorporated Orange County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of the District has previously adopted and the District has imposed statutory school facility fees ("Statutory School Facility Fees" or "Level I Fees") pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 and Government Code Section 65995(b)(1) and (b)(2), and alternative school fee amounts pursuant to Government Code Sections 65995.5 ("Level II Fees") and 65995.7 ("Level III Fees") or (collectively, "Alternative School Facilities Fees" or "ASFF"), but desires to update its ASFF based on a current School Facilities Needs Analysis ("2011 SFNA") prepared by Dolinka Group, LLC in accordance with applicable law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of the District has previously by Resolution elected to participate in the school facilities funding program established pursuant to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 ("SFP") for both modernization and new construction projects, and appointed a representative ("District Representative") for the purpose of requesting an Eligibility Determination ("ED") for funding under the SFP; and

WHEREAS, the District Representative has caused the completion and certification of original and updated Enrollment Certification/Projection by submission of Form SAB 50-01, the Existing School Building Capacity by submission of Form SAB 50-02, and the Eligibility Determination by submission of Form SAB 50-03 to the State Allocation Board ("SAB") for approval pursuant to the SFP; and

WHEREAS, the District received notification from the SAB that the District meets the eligibility requirements for new construction funding pursuant to the provisions of the SFP; and

WHEREAS, the District Representative has caused the completion and certification of Form SAB 50-04, the Application for Funding ("AFF"), and prior to the adoption of this Resolution submitted the AFF to the SAB for approval pursuant to the SFP; and

WHEREAS, Level II Fees and Level III Fees, upon adoption of the ASFF and during the effective period thereof, are applicable to new residential construction in accordance with applicable law, subject to the suspension of Level III Fees pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.7(a)(2); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.6(f), ASFF adopted by the Board are effective for a maximum of one (1) year, and

WHEREAS, the District has met the requirements established by Government Code Section 65995.5(b)(3) in that (i) the District held a general obligation bond election on June 3, 2008, which date is within four (4) years hereof, and obtained voter approval of at least fifty percent (50%) plus one (1) of the votes cast; (ii) the District has issued debt or incurred obligations for capital outlay in an amount equivalent to specified threshold percentage of its local bonding capacity, and (iii) at least 20 percent (20%) of the teaching stations within the District are relocatable classrooms; and

WHEREAS, new residential construction continues to generate additional students for the District's schools and the District is required to provide grades K-12 school facilities ("School Facilities") to accommodate those students; and

WHEREAS, the District does not have sufficient funds available for the construction of the School Facilities, including acquisition of sites, construction of permanent School Facilities, and acquisition of interim School Facilities, to accommodate students from new residential construction; and

WHEREAS, the Board has caused to be prepared the 2011 SFNA July 21, 2011, pursuant to applicable law, including, but not by way of limitation, Government Code Section 65996.6, prior to the adoption of ASFF; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received and considered the 2011 SFNA which includes all matters required by applicable law, including an analysis of: (a) the purpose of the ASFF; (b) the use to which the ASFF are to be put; (c) the nexus (roughly proportional and reasonable relationship) between the residential construction and (1) the facilities for which the ASFF are to be used, (2) the need for School Facilities, (3) the cost of School Facilities and the amount of ASFF from new residential construction; (d) an evaluation and projection of the number of students that will be generated by new residential construction by grade levels of the District as described by Government Code Section 65995.6; (e) a description of the new School Facilities that will be required to service such students; and (f) the present estimated cost of such School Facilities; and

WHEREAS, the 2011 SFNA in its final form has been available to the public, for at least thirty (30) days before the Board considered at a public hearing the adoption of the ASFF, including a response by the Board to written and oral comments, if any, received by the District; and

WHEREAS, all notices of the 2011 SFNA and adoption of ASFF, including notice of the preparation of the 2011 SFNA with the offer to meet with any affected local planning agency relating to the potential expansion of existing school sites or the necessity to acquire additional school sites, have been given in accordance with applicable law; and

WHEREAS, copies of the 2011 SFNA have been provided thirty (30) days prior to the public hearing if such written request(s) for copies were filed with the District forty-five (45) days prior to a public hearing, which was held in a manner required by applicable law at a meeting of the Board of the District relating to the proposed adoption of the 2011 SFNA and ASFF; and

WHEREAS, the 2011 SFNA has been provided to all local agencies responsible for land use planning for review and comment in compliance with Government Code Section 65995.6(c); and

WHEREAS, the District has received, considered and discussed any written and/or oral comments received by the District, and has responded to all comments, which the Board desires to adopt all such written and oral responses as the Board's response(s), if any; and

WHEREAS, as to the approval of the 2011 SFNA and ASFF, Government Code Section 65995.6(g) provides that the California Environmental Quality Act, Division 13 (commencing with Section 21000) of the Public Resources Code does not apply to the preparation, adoption, or update of the 2011 SFNA or adoption of this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to approve the 2011 SFNA and adopt ASFF pursuant to Government Code Sections 65995.5, 65995.6, and 65995.7 for the purpose of establishing ASFF that may be imposed on residential construction calculated pursuant to Government Code Section 65995(b), subject to the suspension of Level 3 Fees as set forth in Government Code Section 65995.7(a)(2).

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NOW THEREFORE, THE GOVERNING BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. That the Board does hereby find and determine that the foregoing recitals and determinations are true and correct and that the 2011 SFNA meets all applicable legal requirements.
- Section 2. That the Board does hereby find and determine that the 2011 SFNA meets all applicable legal requirements, and it hereby adopts each of the findings set forth in the 2011 SFNA.
- That a District Representative made a timely application to the SAB for new Section 3. construction funding for which it is eligible.
- Section 4. That the District received notification from the SAB that the District meets the eligibility requirements for new construction funding pursuant to the provisions of the SFP.
- Section 5: That for purposes of Government Code Section 65995.5(b)(3): (i) the District held a general obligation bond election on June 3, 2008, which date is within four (4) years hereof, and obtained voter approval of at least fifty percent (50%) plus one (1) of the votes cast; (ii) the District has issued debt or incurred obligations for capital outlay in an amount equivalent to specified threshold percentage of its local bonding capacity and (iii) at least 20 percent (20%) of the teaching stations within the District are relocatable classrooms.
- Section 6. That the District has cause to prepare the 2011 SFNA, which is on file at the District office address and incorporated herein by this reference, which complies with all applicable statutory requirements, including the provisions of Government Code Section 65995.6.
- Section 7. That the Board hereby approves and adopts the 2011 SFNA for the purpose of establishing ASFF as to future residential construction within the District, subject to the temporary suspension of Level 3 Fees as set forth in Government Code Section 65995.7(a)(2).
- Section 8. That the Board finds that the purpose of the ASFF imposed upon residential construction are to fund the additional School Facilities to serve the students generated by the residential construction upon which the ASFF are imposed as provided in the 2011 SFNA and applicable law.
- That the Board finds that the ASFF are hereby established as applicable to the extent set forth herein, and will be used to fund those School Facilities described in the 2011 SFNA and that these School Facilities are to serve the students generated by the residential construction within the District as provided in the 2011 SFNA.
- That the Board finds that there is roughly proportional, reasonable relationship between the use of the ASFF and the new residential construction within the District because the ASFF imposed on new residential construction by this Resolution will be used to fund School Facilities which will be used to serve the students generated by such new residential construction in accordance with applicable law as set forth in the 2011 SFNA and on less than an estimated actual cost of the School Facilities estimated to result from additional residential construction as set forth in the 2011 SFNA.
- Section 11. That the Board finds that there is a roughly proportional, reasonable relationship between the new residential construction upon which the ASFF are imposed, and the need for additional School Facilities in the District because new students will be generated from new residential construction within the District, and the District does not have sufficient capacity in the existing School Facilities to accommodate these students.

Section 12. That the Board finds that the amount of the ASFF imposed on new residential construction as set forth in this Resolution is roughly proportional and reasonably related to, and does not exceed the cost of providing the School Facilities required to serve the students generated by such new residential construction within the District.

Section 13. That the Board finds that a separate fund ("Fund") of the District and two or more sub-funds ("Sub-Funds") have been created or are authorized to be established for all monies received by the District for the deposit of Level 1 Fees, ASFF/Level 2 Fees and ASFF/Level 3 Fees (if applicable) imposed on residential construction within the District, as well as Commercial/Industrial Fees and mitigation payments ("Mitigation Payments") collected by the District and that said Fund and Sub-Funds at all times have been separately maintained, except for temporary investments, with other funds of the District as authorized by applicable law.

Section 14. That the Board finds that the monies of the separate Fund or the separate Sub-Funds, described in Section 12, consisting of the proceeds of Level 1 Fees, ASFF/Level 2 Fees and ASFF/Level 3 Fees (if applicable), Commercial/Industrial Fees and Mitigation Payments have been imposed for the purposes of construction of those School Facilities necessitated by new residential construction as further set forth in the 2011 SFNA, and thus, these monies may be expended for all those purposes permitted by applicable law.

Section 15. That the 2011 SFNA determines the need for new School Facilities for unhoused pupils that are attributable to projected enrollment growth from the construction of new residential units over the next five (5) years, based on relevant planning agency information and the historical generation rates of new residential units constructed during the previous five (5) years that are of a similar type of unit to those anticipated to be constructed within the District, the City, and/or the County.

Section 16. That the Board has identified and considered, and/or subtracted, as set forth in the 2011 SFNA, the following information in determining amounts of the ASFF/Level2 Fees and ASFF/Level 3 Fees:

- A. Any surplus property owned by the District that can be used as a school site or that is available for sale to finance school facilities pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.6(b)(1);
- B. The extent to which projected enrollment growth may be accommodated by excess capacity in existing facilities pursuant to Government Code section 65995.6(b)(2);
- C. Local sources other than fees, charges, dedications, or other requirements imposed on residential construction available to finance the construction of school facilities needed to accommodate any growth in enrollment attributable to the construction of new residential units pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.6(b)(3); and
- D. The full amount of local funds the Board has dedicated to facilities necessitated by new construction, including fees, charges, dedications, or other requirements imposed on commercial or industrial construction pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.5.(c)(2).

Section 17. That the Board has calculated, as set forth in the 2011 SFNA, the maximum square foot fees, charges, or dedications to be established as ASFF that may be collected in accordance with the provisions of Government Code Sections 65995.5(c) and 65995.7(a).

<u>Section 18.</u> That notice and relevant and available information relating to the potential expansion of existing school sites or the necessity to acquire additional school sites, including notice of a proposed meeting regarding such information was provided to City and County planning commissions or agencies with land use jurisdiction within the District prior to the completion of the 2011 SFNA.

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That the 2011 SFNA in its final form has been made available to the public for a Section 19. period of not less than thirty (30) days, and that the District has made itself available to the public to meet with any affected city or county to discuss the preparation of the 2011 SFNA, pursuant to the requirements of Government Code Section 65352.2.

Section 20. That the public has had the opportunity to review and comment on the 2011 SFNA, and the Board has responded to written comments it has received, if any, regarding the 2011 SFNA.

That in responding to written comments pursuant to Government Code Section Section 21. 65995.6(c), if any, the Board may adopt any and/or all such responses made by District staff and/or consultants, and does hereby adopt all responses, if any, as responses of the Board thereto.

That notice of the time and place of the public hearing ("Hearing") to adopt the Section 22. 2011 SFNA, including the location and procedure for viewing or requesting a copy of the proposed 2011 SFNA, and any proposed revision thereof, has been published in at least one (1) newspaper of general circulation within the jurisdiction of the District at least thirty (30) days prior to the Hearing.

Section 23. That the District has caused to be mailed a copy of the 2011 SFNA not less than thirty (30) days prior to the Hearing to any person who made a written request forty-five (45) days prior to the Hearing.

Section 24. That the 2011 SFNA has been provided to all local agencies responsible for land use planning for review and comment in compliance with Government Code Section 65995.6(c).

Section 25. That the Board conducted the required Public Hearing on August 23, 2011, prior to adoption of the 2011 SFNA and the ASFF, at which time all persons desiring to be heard on all matters pertaining to the 2011 SFNA were heard and all information presented was duly considered.

Section 26. That the Board hereby adopts ASFF and establishes the ASFF on new residential construction projects within the District in the following amounts:

- Pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.6, ASFF/Level 2 Fees within the Santa Ana Unified School District boundaries are \$4.75 per square foot of assessable space for new residential construction, including new residential projects, manufactured homes, and mobilehomes as authorized under Education Code Section 17625. However, this amount shall not be imposed on any construction project used exclusively for housing senior citizens, as described in Civil Code Section 51.3, or as described in subsection (k) of Section 1569.2 of the Health and Safety Code or paragraph 9 of subdivision (d) of Section 15432 of the Government Code or any mobile homes or manufactured home that is located within a mobilehome park, subdivision, cooperative, or condominium for mobilehomes limited to older persons as defined by the Federal Fair Housing Amendments of 1988.
- Pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.7, ASFF/Level 3 Fees within the Santa Ana Unified School District boundaries are \$9.51 per square foot of Assessable Space for new residential construction, including new residential projects, manufactured homes, and mobilehomes as authorized under Education Code Section f17625. However, this amount shall not be imposed on any construction project used exclusively for housing senior citizens, as described in Civil Code Section 51.3, or as described in subsection (k) of Section 1569.2 of the Health and Safety Code or paragraph 9 of subdivision (d) of Section 15432 of the Government Code or any mobilehome or manufactured home that is located within a mobilehome park, subdivision, cooperative, or condominium for mobilehomes limited to older persons as defined by the Federal Fair Housing Amendments of 1988. Additionally, Level 3 Fees shall not be levied by the District until authorized by Government Code Section 65995.7(a)(2).

 Section 27. That ASFF, upon adoption and during the effective period thereof, are applicable to residential construction in the alternative to Level 1 Fees in accordance with applicable law, except that Level 3 Fees are suspended temporarily as set forth in Government Code Section 65995.7(a)(2).

Section 28. That the proceeds of the ASFF increased and established pursuant to this Resolution shall continue to be deposited into those Sub-Funds of the Funds identified in Section 12 of this Resolution, the proceeds of which shall be used exclusively for the purpose for which the ASFF are to be collected.

Section 29. That the Superintendent, or his/her designee, is directed to cause a copy of this Resolution to be delivered to the building officials of the affected City and the County within the District's boundaries, along with a copy of all the supporting documentation referenced herein, and a map of the District clearly indicating the boundaries thereof, advising such entities that new residential construction is subject to the ASFF increased pursuant to his Resolution, and requesting that no building permit or approval for occupancy be issued by any of these entities for any new residential construction project, mobilehome, or manufactured home subject to the ASFF absent a certificate of compliance ("Certificate of Compliance") from this District demonstrating compliance of such project with the requirements of the ASFF, nor that any building permit be issued for any non-residential construction absent a certification from this District of compliance with the requirements of the applicable ASFF.

Section 30. That the Superintendent, or his/her designee, is authorized to cause a Certificate of Compliance to be issued for each construction project, mobilehome, and manufactured home for which there is compliance with the requirement for payment of the ASFF in the amounts specified by this Resolution. In the event a Certificate of Compliance is issued for the payment of ASFF for a construction project, mobilehome, or manufactured home, and it is later determined that the statement or other representation made by an authorized party concerning the construction project as to square footage is untrue or in the event the zoning is declared invalid, then such Certificate of Compliance shall automatically terminate, and the appropriate City or County shall be so notified.

Section 31. That regarding the timely provision of a Certificate of Compliance by the District for residential construction, although not required by applicable law, the Board hereby determines that the 2011 SFNA is a proposed construction plan for purposes of requiring payment of ASFF prior to the issuance of any building permit for residential construction in accordance with Government Code Section 66007, and that all ASFF are appropriated for the purpose of accomplishing such construction plan.

Section 32. That no statement or provision set forth in this Resolution, or referred to therein shall be constructed to repeal any preexisting fee or mitigation amount previously imposed by the District on any residential or non-residential construction.

<u>Section 33.</u> That if any portion set forth in this Resolution, is held to be invalid, the remaining provisions of this Resolution is intended to be and shall remain valid.

Section 34. That if the ASFF/Level 2 Fees and/or the ASFF/Level 3 Fees are held to be invalid (other than the suspension under Government Code Section 65995.7(a)(2)), Statutory School Facility Fees, in amounts determined by applicable law at such time, are intended to be, and shall remain, in full force and effect.

Section 35. That the ASFF adopted by this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon such adoption and shall be effective for a maximum of one (1) year, subject to the temporary suspension of Level 3 Fees as set forth in Government code Section 65995.7(a)(2).

## Parking

The Superintendent or designee shall develop and maintain supplemental standards to those required by Federal or State law as to school parking facilities and drop-off procedures to ensure the safety of the students, staff, and the public. District schools are required to employ the district standards, where practicable and adequate site area exists. District parking and student drop-off regulations shall apply to all staff, student, and visitor motor vehicles and bicycles on District property.

## Designated Parking

Parking spaces will be marked for handicapped, principal, and visitors. Reservation of parking spaces for additional purposes, including other school officials, will be reviewed by the Superintendent or designee for approval. Approval will be based on the amount of available parking and path of travel considerations from the parking lot to the main entrance of the school.

## Parking

District parking and student drop-off regulations apply to all staff, student, and visitor motor vehicles and bicycles on district property.

## Parking Regulations

Provisions of the California Vehicle Code apply at all times.

The parking stalls especially marked for handicapped use are not to be used by unauthorized personnel or unauthorized students. Those who park their vehicle in a handicap parking stall must have a special identification license plate issued (Vehicle Code 5007; Vehicle Code 22507.8(a)) or a distinguishing placard issued (Vehicle Code 22511.55 or 22511.59). The placard must be in their possession and must be clearly posted inside the vehicle. (Vehicle Code 22507.8(A)).

Improperly parked vehicles that block the flow of traffic or emergency vehicles are subject to being cited and/or towed away at the owner's expense at no responsibility to the district.

## Parking Permits

Vehicles parked on school campuses during school hours and after hours must display SAUSD issued parking permit. Failing to properly display SAUSD parking permit will result in a parking citation (Vehicle Code 21113(A)).

Vehicles illegally parked or abandoned on district property for more than 72 hours without prior district permission may be cited and/or removed at the owner's expense. (Vehicle Code 22651 & 22669)

Bicycles must be parked in the provided bicycle racks. Illegally parked bikes shall be cited and/or removed by school police personnel.

## Prohibited Areas

Vehicles may not be parked or driven on turf or landscaped areas. Vehicles are not permitted on inner campus walkways and roadways, except for vehicles delivering supplies and vehicles belonging to the district while in performance of maintenance, deliveries, etc.

## Liability

Parking of motor vehicles and bicycles on district property is done at the risk of the vehicle owner. The district does not assume any liability for damage or theft of vehicles, or their contents, that occurs on district property.

## Speed Limits

The speed limit within all district-wide campus parking lots shall be no greater than is reasonable or prudent, having due regard for weather, visibility, and traffic (Vehicle Code 22350) and shall not exceed 15 m.p.h.

## Violators of Regulations and/or California Vehicle Code

Persons who violate these regulations shall receive a warning, police citation, and/or may be subject to their vehicle being towed away at the owner's expense. Continuous violations may result in revocation of permission to drive or park on campus.

The programs will provide additional guidance for teachers to obtain teaching credentials with support through coursework and observations. The program will increase the percentage of credentialed teachers.

## **RATIONALE:**

The student teacher, intern, and fieldwork programs will provide an additional option for staff attempting to complete credentials. Teachers would have a colleague and a university supervisor providing guidance and feedback on the instructional program. The programs would assist in increasing the percentage of qualified instructors that meet the Commission on Teacher Credentialing standards.

## STUDENT TEACHER AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into by and between Azusa Pacific University, hereinafter called the UNIVERSITY and the Santa Ana Unified hereinafter called the DISTRICT:

## WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the governing board of a school district may enter into agreements with a college or university approved by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing as a teacher education institution (Ed. Code Section 44227), to provide student teaching experience and to provide supervised field experience as may be called for in the requirements of the various authorized credentials for public school service; and

WHEREAS, any such agreement may provide for the payment in money or in services for the services rendered by the school district of an amount not to exceed the actual cost to the school district of the services rendered; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined between the parties hereto that the payments to be made to the District under this agreement do not exceed the actual cost to the District of the services rendered by the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed between the parties hereto as follows:

I.

The District shall provide teaching experience through student teaching in schools and classes of the District for students of the University who possess a valid certificate of clearance and are assigned by the University to student teaching in schools or classes of the District. Such student teaching shall be provided in such schools or classes of the District, and under the direct supervision and instruction of such employees of the District, as the District and the University through their duly authorized representatives may agree upon.

The District may, for good cause, refuse to accept for student teaching any student of the University assigned to student teaching in the District and upon request of the District, made for good cause, the University shall terminate the assignment of any student of the University to student teaching in the District.

"Student teaching" as used herein and elsewhere in this agreement means active participation in the duties and functions of classroom teaching under the direct supervision and instruction of employees of the District holding valid credentials issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing, other than emergency or intern credentials, authorizing them to serve as classroom teachers in the schools or classes in which the student teaching is provided.

II.

## **Student Teaching**

"Full-time student teaching" is an assignment for the regular school day for the full 18-week public school semester, including all adjunct duties normally performed by a teacher.

At the secondary level, a full-time assignment is four periods of student teaching, one period of planned observation, and one preparation period for eighteen weeks. For this, the University will pay the District for performance by the District of all services required at the rate of two hundred dollars (\$200) for each full-time student teacher. For the summer internship program, a full-time assignment is four periods of student teaching for six weeks.

For special education, a full-time assignment is a full school day in an appropriate mild/moderate or moderate/severe setting for eighteen weeks. For this, the University will pay the District for performance by the District of all services required at the rate of two hundred dollars (\$200) for each full-time student teacher.

At the elementary level a full-time assignment is nine weeks in a primary (K-3) classroom and nine weeks in an intermediate (4-6) classroom. For this, the University will pay the District for performance by the District of all services required at a rate of one hundred dollars (\$100) for each nine-week assignment for each full-time student teacher.

III.

An assignment of a student of the University to student teaching in schools or classes of the District shall be, at the discretion of the University for approximately one semester and, as much as possible, shall begin on the first day of the District semester and continue through the last day of the District semester.

IV.

Within a reasonable time following the close of each semester of the University, the University will send a letter to the District requesting an invoice for master teacher payment. The

District shall submit an invoice, in duplicate, to the University for payment, at the rate provided herein, for all student teaching assignments provided by the District under and in accordance with this agreement during said semester. University is responsible for workers' compensation coverage for all University students assigned to District.

Additional Information Specific to District (if any)

The term of this agreement shall commence on September 1, 2011 and terminate on June 30, 2014.

VI.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained to the contrary, this agreement may be terminated and the provisions of this agreement may be altered, changed, or amended, by mutual consent of the parties hereto.

## Single Subject Internship Program MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into September 1, 2011 and is between Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) and the University of California, Irvine (UCI).

## A. Purpose

The purpose of the MOU is to establish a formal working relationship between the parties of the MOU and to set forth the operative conditions that will govern the relationship between UCI and Santa Ana Unified School District in this single subject internship program

## **B.** Parameters

- 1. Starting and ending dates of this MOU are September 1, 2011 August 31, 2012.
- 2. Contract and monitoring responsibilities of the MOU shall rest with the Personnel Office of SAUSD and UCI DOE Business office, and UCI's Director of Internships.

## C. Responsibilities

- 1. University Responsibilities
  - a. Per Education Code 44325c ensure that district intern candidates entering the UCI/SAUSD Internship Program meet the following requirements:
    - Baccalaureate or higher degree from a regional accredited institution of higher education with a 2.70 G.P.A. or higher
    - Passage of the California Basic Education Skills Test (CBEST)
    - Meet subject matter competency requirements
    - Certificate of Clearance (Education Code 44320(d))

In addition the candidate must be admitted to UCI's teacher credential program meeting all admission requirements prior to admission into the internship program.

- b. UCI will provide participating districts with clearly defined program outcomes, roles and responsibilities of the support system, and funding sources designed to assist each intern in successfully completing credential program requirements while teaching in a contracted position.
- c. The intern will be required to complete course work for the single subject credential through UCI during the semesters enrolled in Internship. Tuition for all course work is the responsibility of the Intern. Program requirements are monitored by UCI Internship Program and the district shall be notified immediately if the intern is not complying with university credential program requirements.
- d. The university agrees to pay a stipend to the support

provider for each semester of service in that role.

- e. The university is responsible for paying the salary of the university supervisors.
- f. The university supervisors will visit the intern a minimum of 6 times in the first semester and 4 times in the second semester as well as formal conferencing times set for evaluation at semester break and at the end of the academic year.
- g. Prior to any decision to remove an intern from the university intern program as a result of weak performance, attendance, grades, etc. conferences will be held with site and district personnel and UCI Intern Program personnel.
- h. The same services will be provided to the intern candidate as all other UCI teacher credential students advising, library, financial aid, preliminary credential filing, etc.
- Interns who successfully complete all criteria of the internship/teacher credential program will be recommended for a single subject teaching credential.
- j. UCI intern candidates who do not meet the teaching performance expectations (TPE's), attendance and GPA requirements of UCI's teacher credential program will be dropped from the Intern program. District Human Resources and site administrators will be notified.

## 2. School Site/ District Responsibilities

- a. Each participating school district will work closely with UCl to ensure that an appropriate support system is in place to monitor and assist the intern candidate.
- b. Per education code 44326d and 44830.3a the site administrator will assign a support provider with the appropriate single subject credential to mentor the intern teacher throughout the internship period.

The support provider will offer weekly support to the intern teacher and attend trainings or ensure appropriate levels of support are being provided. The support provider will be paid a stipend by University of California, Irvine, as per C.1.d. above.

c. Santa Ana Unified School District will allocate an in-kind contribution to provide the intern support provider two days of release time over a one year or two semester program time line (or four days over a four semester program time line) (Observations of intern, planning, etc.).

- **d.** Santa Ana Unified School District will allocate an in-kind contribution to provide an intern two days of release time over a one year or two semester program time line (or four days over a four semester program time line) (Observations, planning, etc.).
- e. The site administrator will, whenever possible, avoid assigning intern candidates activities and committee assignments. The site administrator clearly recognizes that the intern candidate is concurrently attending classes to complete the credential requirements and completing the Teaching Performance Assessment (TPA) during the internship year.
- f. Schools hosting intern candidates agree to allow University Supervisors to visit the UCI intern candidates in their classrooms a minimum of 6 times the first semester and 4 times in the second semester.
- g. Districts agree to assign candidates to assume the functions authorized by the appropriate single subject teaching credential. The Intern credential authorized the same service as the regular credential authorization (Education Code 44454), and as such Interns are accorded appropriate district benefits. Interns will teach in the subject area in which they intend to be credentialed.
- i. Districts must certify that interns are not displacing certificated employees (CCTC Preconditions)
- j. Interns will be assigned no more than two separate preparations.

## B. OPERATIVE PROVISION

- The District shall provide educational fieldwork and practica experiences in schools, classes or other appropriate sites of the district, under the direct supervision and instruction of certificated employees of the District.
- 2. The District may, for good cause, refuse to accept for participation, any student of the University assigned to educational fieldwork or practica experiences in the District. The University shall terminate the assignment of any student of the University upon the District's request, which request shall be made in writing only for good cause.
- In performance of the Agreement, each of the parties hereto agrees
  that is shall not discriminate against any student on the basis of
  race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, physical or mental
  impairment, sex, or any other basis prohibited by law.
- 4. Credential candidates assigned field experiences or practica will have California Department of Justice and Federal Bureau of Investigation fingerprint clearance documentation on file with the University with a copy forwarded to the District.
- S. Assignment of a University student to fieldwork or practica experiences in District schools will be under the following definition:

"Counseling Practica" means a person recommended by the university who possess a certificate of clearance and are enrolled in

a class requiring student contact. This is for a specific number of hours and the individual us under the supervision of a regularly paid credentialed pupil personnel employee of the district and the class instructor. This is usually 10 to 20 hours of small group, large group guidance lesson or individual counseling.

"Counseling Fieldwork" means persons recommended by the University who possess a certificate of clearance, have completed coursework and enrolled in the Fieldwork Course. The Individual will be under the supervision of a regularly pald credentialed employee of the District and a University supervisor. A total of 600 clock hours is required. A minimum of 200 hours at two different school levels are needed. In addition, a minimum of 50 hours at the third level and the remaining 150 hours at any level are required. The university reserves the right to issue or deny the Pupil Personnel Services Credential at the end of the fieldwork experience. Either the District or the University may remove the fieldwork student for unsatisfactory performance, or for good cause.

- 6. The University will be responsible for providing a University supervisor or person designated and employed by the University to direct, supervise, and evaluate the performance of students of the University engaged in fieldwork experiences. This person(s) will work cooperatively with those individuals in the District responsible for placement and who serve as the site supervisor.
- 7. The University is obligated to maintain neutrality in the District's labor disputes, to ensure that all field experiences will be educationally valid, and to avoid placing its students in situations where this is risk of physical injury.

## Alteration Disclaimer

No alteration or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall bevalld unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto, and no oral understanding of agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on any of the parties hereto.

## **Extension of Modification Agreement**

This agreement may be extended or modified for subsequent periods of time with the written agreement of both parties.
