Trained staff will be employed by the hosting organization and will provide 24-hour supervision to the students. Parents have given permission for students to attend the trip under this provision. No eligible student(s) will be denied the opportunity to attend. The cost of field trips will be paid by fundraising, donations or District funds.

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board adoption of Resolution No. 11/12-2895 for the District's appropriations limits for fiscal years 2010-11 and 2011-12.

RATIONALE:

Proposition 4, "The Gann Initiative," approved by the voters on November 6, 1979, requires appropriations limits for state and local governments. This constitutional amendment became Article XIII B of the California Constitution.

Article XIII B established a formula for adjustment of the appropriations limit based upon change in population (Average Daily Attendance) and change in the Consumer Price Index. Categorical income for federal projects, state projects, and special education is over and above the appropriations limit and is not included in the formula.

Article XIII B of the California Constitution and Education Code Sections 1629 and 42132 requires the Board to establish by resolution an appropriations limit for the current and prior fiscal years by September 15, 2011.

The District's appropriations limit for 2010-11 was \$314,071,455 and the revenue received in 2010-11 subject to the appropriations limit was \$288,962,186. The District, therefore, is within the appropriations limits for 2010-11. The District's appropriations limit for 2011-12 is estimated to be \$318,831,689.
