Ms. Barquin introduced Mr. Sal Tinajero, Program Specialist, Teaching & Learning to recognize the Advanced Learning Academy three time National Speech and Debate Association National Champions in 2018, 2019, and 2020. Mr. Tinajero introduced Coach Emily Benavides and Coach Justyne Gutierrez who shared a few words about the students. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Almendarez acknowledged the troubling events that took place last week in our nation's capital. He stated that we firmly believe that the violence that unfolded was a direct threat to our democracy and peaceful transition of power that has been a hallmark of America's rich history. This District strongly supports civility, respecting one another,

and recognizing everyone's unique differences. SAUSD will always encourage an engaged citizenry through a free exchange of ideas and a right to peacefully protest. Superintendent shared that we are now reaching a critical turning point in this pandemic with the rollout of vaccines. He shared that our District team has been in weekly communication with the Orange County Health Care Agency to ensure we receive the latest information of when vaccines will be available for education workers, which have been identified as one of the initial priority groups. We expect the first round of vaccines will be available for our nurses, teachers and other essential district staff in the coming weeks. This will be a key component in our effort to return to in-person instruction.

He added that even as vaccines are being rolled out, we have to remain vigilant as our Covid positivity rates remain alarmingly high. The latest figures show our rates in most of our zip codes are between 20% and 30 % following the holiday break. He encouraged everyone to continue following all safety protocols, which include mask wearing, hand washing, and avoiding gatherings of multiple households. Mr. Almendarez reminded everyone that even though we are stronger together, right now we are safer apart. He stated that many of us have had immediate family members who have become ill, or we have become ill ourselves. Our SAUSD staff has also been deeply affected. He shared that he just learned last night of the passing of one of our teachers, a veteran educator of nearly 26 years. Unfortunately, this person is not the only SAUSD staff member we've lost in recent weeks. Some are even fighting for their lives as we speak now. He encouraged everyone to keep these staff members and their families in their thoughts during this difficult time.

Superintendent stated that many have likely seen the viral video of Santa Ana High senior Cielo Echegoyen and her family learning she was accepted into Harvard. This moving video has received close to one million views, and Cielo's story has been featured on more than a dozen local and national media outlets. Through hard work and perseverance, Cielo has achieved her dream. Today she serves as a shining example for fellow classmates and for the rest of the SAUSD community of what is possible even in the face of tremendous obstacles. Superintendent Almendarez thanked Cielo for her inspiration, and also thanked her teachers, counselors, administrators, and all other staff who have supported her every step of the way.

Lastly, Superintendent stated that there has been a recent change in the District's insurance coverage. He asked the Board if they were interested in having him bringing back a variety of proposals as they do affect impacts our community partners and as part of the District's policies. Board members were in agreement for Superintendent to bring back an analysis of the changes to the insurance policy, how it affects our contractors, and to have Board make recommendations and give direction after doing some research. Ms. Amezcua asked for legal counsel to be present during the discussion. Mr. Palacio stated that he would provide information about a non-profit insurance carrier for staff to look into.

**RESOLUTION APPROVING THE  
EL SOL SANTA ANA SCIENCE AND ARTS ACADEMY RENEWAL PETITION**

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the Santa Ana Unified School District (“District”) receives and reviews charter petitions pursuant to Education Code Section 47600 et seq.;

WHEREAS, the District Board of Education (“Board”) first authorized El Sol Santa Ana Science and Arts Academy Charter School (“Charter School”) in 2000, and the Charter School’s current term expires June 30, 2021;

WHEREAS, the Charter School has submitted a petition seeking renewal for a seven year term;

WHEREAS, the Charter School has met the performance requirements for renewal, and requests the Board approve the petition to renew the Charter School’s Charter for a seven year period;

WHEREAS, the Board has the discretion to renew the Charter School for a term of five to seven years;

WHEREAS, the Board has considered the renewal petition and the recommendation for renewal from Staff, including information provided demonstrating the Charter Schools meets current academic performance criteria required for renewal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Board finds the above-listed recitals to be true and correct and incorporates them herein by this reference.
2. The Board, in accordance with Education Code Section 47607, has considered increases in pupil academic achievement for all groups of pupils served by Charter School, as the most important factor in determining whether to grant renewal.
3. The Board has confirmed that the Charter School meets academic performance criteria for renewal requirements, per Education Code Section 47607 as follows:

Ed. Code § 47607(c)(2)(A)(2): For all measurements of academic performance, the charter school has received performance levels schoolwide that are the same or higher than the



state average and, for a majority of subgroups performing statewide below the state average in each respective year, received performance levels that are higher than the state average.

4. The Board hereby renews the El Sol Santa Ana Science and Arts Academy Charter School's Charter for a renewal term of July 1, 2021, through and including June 30, 2026, and not the seven year term requested by the Charter School due primarily to recent substantial changes to the Charter School and The Charter Schools Act of 1992, as well as COVID-19 impacts on public schools.





**WHEREAS**, the Santa Ana Unified School District ("District") has received and expended statutory and/or alternative school facilities fees ("Reportable Fees") for the construction of the District's school facilities in order to accommodate students from new development; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(a), the District has established and maintained a separate capital facilities account for the Reportable Fees ("Reportable Fees Account"); and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(a), the Reportable Fees have been deposited into the Reportable Fees Account in order to avoid any commingling of the Reportable Fees with other revenues and funds of the District, except for temporary investments, and has expended the Reportable Fees, along with any interest income earned, solely for the purpose(s) for which the Reportable Fees were originally collected; and

**WHEREAS**, Government Code Section 66006(b)(1) provides that the District shall make a written report containing certain required information available to the public within one hundred eighty (180) days after the last day of each fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, Government Code Section 66006(b)(2) requires that the Board of Education of the District ("Board") review the information made available to the public, including the report entitled "Annual and Five-Year Reportable Developer Fees Report for Fiscal Year 2019-2020" ("Report") at the next regularly scheduled public meeting, at least fifteen (15) days after the Report was made available to the public; and

**WHEREAS**, the Report contains the requisite information and proposed findings concerning the collection and expenditure of Reportable Fees pursuant to Government Code Sections 66006 and 66001; and

**WHEREAS**, Government Code Section 66001(d) provides that for the fifth fiscal year following the first deposit into the Reportable Fees Account, and every five years thereafter, the District shall make findings with respect to the portion of the Reportable Fees Account that remains unexpended; and





## **SCOPE:**

In order to help prevent financial conflicts of interest, Government Code 1126 prohibits a district employee or Governing Board member from engaging in any activity which is inconsistent, incompatible, in conflict with, or inimical to his/her duties. Government Code 1126 mandates the district to adopt procedures regarding this prohibition.

## **POLICY:**

The Governing Board expects all employees to give the responsibility of their positions precedence over any other outside employment. A district employee may receive compensation for outside activities as long as these activities are not inconsistent, incompatible, in conflict with, or inimical to his/her district duties.

An outside activity shall be considered inconsistent, incompatible, or inimical to district employment when such activity: (Government Code 1126)

2. Entails compensation from an outside source for activities which are part of the employee's regular duties
3. Involves using the district's name, prestige, time, facilities, equipment, or supplies for private gain
4. Involves service which will be wholly or in part subject to the approval or control of another district employee or Board member

An employee wishing to accept outside employment that may be inconsistent, incompatible, in conflict with, or inimical to the employee's duties shall file a written request with his/her immediate supervisor describing the nature of the employment and the time required. The supervisor shall evaluate each request based on the employee's specific duties within the district and determine whether to grant authorization for such employment.

The supervisor shall inform the employee whether the outside employment is prohibited. The employee may appeal a supervisor's denial of authorization to the Superintendent or designee. An employee who continues to pursue a prohibited activity may be subject to disciplinary action.

## **Tutoring**

District employees shall not perform, without prior Board approval, any outside paid service which will be wholly or in part subject to the approval or control of another District employee or a District officer.

Upon determining that an employee's outside activity is incompatible with District employment, the Superintendent or designee shall so inform the employee. An employee who continues to pursue an incompatible activity may be subject to disciplinary action. Appeals shall be addressed in accordance with law, Board policy and administrative regulations.
