The agenda shall provide members of the public the opportunity to address the Board regarding agenda items before or during the Board's consideration of the item. The agenda also provides members of the public an opportunity to testify at regular meetings on matters which are not on the agenda but which are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board.

Individual speakers are allowed three minutes to address the Board on agenda or nonagenda items. The Board may limit the total time for public input on each item to 20 minutes. With the Board's consent, the Board President may increase or decrease the time allowed for public presentation, depending on the topic and the number of persons wishing to be heard. The Board President may take a poll of speakers for or against a particular issue and may ask that additional persons speak only if they have something new to add.

The Board urges that complaints and derogatory remarks against a District employee be made in writing on forms available in the Office of the Superintendent. This allows the District and the Board to examine more carefully the complaint and to initiate the appropriate investigation.

Persons wishing to address the Board on an item on the agenda or an item of business in the Board's jurisdiction are requested to complete a card. This card is to be submitted to the Recording Secretary. The Request to Address the Board of Education cards are located on the table in the foyer.

1 RESOLUTION NO. 19/20-3313 2 BOARD OF EDUCATION 3 SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT 4 ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA 5 6 Proclamation Declaring Importance of Mental Health Services 7 8 WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education unanimously 9 passes this resolution acknowledging mental health is essential to children's 10 overall social emotional health and well-being propelling children and youth to 11 thrive at home, school, and their community; 12 WHEREAS, promotion of mental health efforts that create safe, caring, 13 peaceful, and engaging school environments improve students' connectedness to 14 schools, readiness to learn, and positive civil engagement; 15 behavioral WHEREAS, health disorders, including major depression, 16 schizophrenia, panic disorders, and obsessive-compulsive disorders affect many 17 children and youth every year, indiscriminate of age, gender, race, ethnicity, 18 religion or economic status; 19 WHEREAS, approximately 50 percent of students, 14 years or older, with a 20 mental health condition drop out of school and have the highest dropout rate for 21 any disability group; these students are less likely to pursue higher education, and more likely to suffer with mental illness years past their K-12 educational 22 23 experience; 24 WHERE AS, local statistics, as reported by Orange County Health Care Agency, show that an average of 57% of children and 64% of adolescents do not receive needed 25 26 mental health treatment and an average of 35% of children under 18 do not see a 27 mental health specialist;

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WHERE AS, local statistics, as reported by the district's school based mental health services, show that several individual sessions were provided to many students who were referred for mental health services across the District's 55 school sites;

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WHEREAS, a focus on prevention and early intervention efforts could greatly reduce the number of children experiencing serious mental health conditions;

WHEREAS, children, youth and adults can recover from mental illness and lead full, productive lives in the community;

WHEREAS, each county office of education, school district, school, elected official, business, government agency, health-care provider, organization shares the burden of mental health issues and has a responsibility to promote suicide 10 prevention, mental wellness and support prevention efforts;

WHEREAS, the school district and schools, acknowledge that school based mental health programs can effectively implement the recommendations set forth by the Mental Health Services Act, Prevention & Early Intervention (MHSA-PEI), which include outreach to families, access and linkage to programs for children or youth with severe mental illness, and activities the promote the reduction of stigma and discrimination associated with mental illness;

WHEREAS, the school district and schools, acknowledge that school based mental 18 health programs can effectively implement the recommendations set forth by the 19 Mental Health Services Act, Prevention & Early Intervention (MHSA-PEI), which 20 include strategies to reduce negative outcomes such as suicide, involvement with 21 the juvenile justice system, school failure or dropout, prolonged suffering, 22 homelessness, and removal of children from their homes; 23

SUBJECT: Sale and Disposal of Books, Equipment and Supplies CATEGORY: Business and Noninstructional Operations RESPONSIBLE OFFICE(S): Business Services, Purchasing

SCOPE:

This policy provides standards and requirements for the disposal or sale of equipment, supplies and property. The policy ensures that the disposal of equipment, supplies and property are to be done in the best interest of the District and in compliance with all applicable laws and codes.

POLICY:

The Governing Board recognizes its fiscal responsibility to maximize the use of District equipment, supplies, instructional materials, and other personal property while providing up-to-date resources that facilitate student learning and effective District operations. When the Board, upon recommendation of the Superintendent or designee, declares any District-owned personal property unusable, obsolete, or no longer needed, the Board shall determine the estimated value of the property and shall decide whether the property will be donated, sold, or otherwise disposed of as prescribed by law and administrative regulation.

The Board shall approve the price and terms of any sale or lease of personal property of the District.

If the Board members who are in attendance at a meeting unanimously agree that the property, whether one or more items, does not exceed \$2,500 in value, the property may be sold without advertising for bids. (Education Code 17546)

If the Board members who are in attendance at a meeting unanimously find that the value of the property is insufficient to defray the costs of arranging a sale, the property may be donated to a charitable organization deemed appropriate by the Board or may be disposed of in the local public dump. Instructional materials shall be considered obsolete or unusable by the District if they have been replaced by more recent editions or new materials selected by the Board, are not aligned with the District's academic standards or course of study, and have no foreseeable value in other instructional areas. Such materials may be sold or donated if they continue to serve educational purposes that would benefit others outside the District. Instructional materials are not appropriate for sale or donation if they meet any of the following criteria:

- 1. Contain information rendered inaccurate or incomplete by new research or technologies
- 2. Contain demeaning, stereotyping, or patronizing references to any group of persons protected against discrimination by law or Board policy
- 3. Are damaged beyond use or repair

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that District records are developed, maintained, and disposed of in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation. The Superintendent or designee shall consult with District legal counsel, site administrators, District information technology staff, personnel department staff, and others as necessary to develop a secure document management system that provides for the storage, retrieval, archiving, and destruction of District documents, including electronically stored information such as email. This document management system shall be designed to comply with state and federal laws regarding security of records, record retention and destruction, response to "litigation hold" discovery requests, and the recovery of records in the event of a disaster or emergency. If the District discovers or is notified that a breach of security of District records containing unencrypted personal information has occurred, the Superintendent or designee shall notify every individual whose personal information was, or is reasonably believed to have been, acquired by an unauthorized person. Personal information includes, but is not limited to, a social security number, driver's license or identification card number, medical information, health insurance information, or an account number in combination with an access code or password that would permit access to a financial account. The Superintendent or designee shall coordinate individualized teacher support and guidance activities developed pursuant to this policy with other district staff development programs and staff evaluation processes.

Teachers may volunteer to participate in a teacher support and guidance program or may be referred to such services based on their performance evaluation.

Consulting Educators shall be experienced certificated personnel who are knowledgeable about teacher development and needed competencies and have strong interpersonal and communication skills. Support may include, but is not limited to, classroom observations, regular meetings with the support provider, and an individualized plan for professional development or coursework that takes into consideration the teacher's assignment and prior preparation and experience. The roles and responsibilities of Consulting Educators shall be clearly defined in writing and communicated to all participants.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure the timely assignment of qualified Consulting Educators to participating teachers and for reassignment as needed. He/she shall also ensure that Consulting Educators receives appropriate training to serve in a support capacity and is provided adequate time and resources to assist other teachers.

The district may provide a stipend to Consulting Educators in accordance with the collective bargaining agreement and district budget.

If a beginning teacher induction program is unavailable, he/she may instead complete a general education clear credential program through an accredited teacher preparation program at a California college or university. ***

The Superintendent or designee shall inform teachers who possess a preliminary credential about the SAUSD Teacher Induction Program available to help them fulfill the requirements of the clear multiple subject, single subject, or education specialist credential pursuant to Education Code 44259.

The district's teacher induction program shall meet program standards adopted by the CTC and shall support beginning teachers in meeting the competencies described in the California Standards for the Teaching Profession.

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a complete record of each teacher's progress toward completion of clear credential requirements.

The performance of a participating teacher shall be monitored by the Consulting Educators, Superintendent or designee, and/or a panel of teachers and administrators in order to determine whether

Course Description:

The course will introduce students to basic coding skills. Students will learn to solve problems through puzzles, challenges and word games, and will program a Micro Bit computer. The course will use College & Career Readiness (CCRLP) lessons to expose students to STEM-related and other careers. Students will develop a 6-year school plan that will map out the course to take based on their desired career field. Students will identify and solve a potential or existing business problem and will create a mobile app that will solve the problem.

This is a one-semester course for 7th graders. It is the second course in a two-course sequence for the Business and Finance Industry Sector, Business Management Pathway.

This 18-week course will integrate CCRLP lessons while exposing students to STEM and its relationship to the business environment. Students use basic coding to solve problems through puzzles, challenges, and word games. In addition, students will learn how computers do input/output, store, and process information to solve problems.

Key Assignment: Solving the Sprite's Problem

Students write a code that will manipulate a Sprite through a puzzle (problem) of their choosing. Students first define the problem (e.g., create an escape room in which the Sprite collects data that opens doors to the next room.) Students will demonstrate proficiency in the following competencies:

- Write an application to collect and store data to solve problem

Students will learn to program a Micro Bit computer. The students will program the computer to interact with the users, sensors and control surface devices.

Key Assignment: Protect my Journal

The students will create an alarm system to protect a journal (book) from being picked up or opened. Students will write code for the Micro Bit to react to input signals from the sensors. This code will have the Micro Bit trigger an alarm if the book is moved or opened.

Students will learn how to write applications for an android tablet. This app will collect and store data.

The program will display sprites in random positions. The player will click on each sprite as it is displayed. Students will code the program to do the following:

Students will brainstorm a potential business problem. Students will work as a team to write a program to run on a tablet to solve that business problem. Students will publicly display the efficacy of the apps they have created.

Using design thinking, the students will work as a team to define a potential business problem. The students will plan and organize the steps needed to solve the problem. The students then write an application to solve their business problem. They will test and prove the program on an android tablet. In addition to solving the problem, the program will include the following:

- Collect and store data
- Display data field for the end user
- Allow users to input and recall data
- Notify the user when data has exceeded design limits

Students design a trade show presentation of their program which will contain the following:

- Product and business problem description
- Planning and design process used
- Working model of program
- Tablet for interested users to try the program
- A place provided for visitor comments

Parents most often state that school districts have not met the free and appropriate public education (FAPE) standard as provided in the law, i.e., that the student has not made adequate educational progress. This formal claim results in alternative dispute resolution sessions that involve a due process hearing officer provided by OAH. To work cooperatively with parents and to avoid costly and adversarial due process hearings that include legal representation, school districts work diligently toward settlement of these legal claims. As provided in other civil rights legislation, this claim provides for reimbursement of parent's legal fees.

RATIONALE:

The parties on the attached list participated in a resolution session and mediation following the filing of a due process hearing and agreed to resolve the dispute by reimbursing those applicable for costs incurred.

Independent Contractor Agreement

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the **Santa Ana Unified School District**, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and Dreams for Schools hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR." The DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR may be referred to herein individually as "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR represents and warrants that it is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services to be provided by CONTRACTOR</u>: ("Scope of Work") AppJam + Program to provide learning opportunities that will promote the necessary skills students will need to develop a mobile application. The program will serve students in the Engage 360 program at the following intermediate schools: Carr, Lathrop, Sierra, Spurgeon, Villa and Willard. Scope is further outlined in Exhibit A.

2. <u>Term:</u> Time is of the essence with respect to this AGREEMENT and the performance by the CONTRACTOR of each of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on 9/30/2019 and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by 5/18/2020.

3. <u>Compensation</u>: DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed One Hundred Forty Six Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety One Dollars (\$146,991). Such compensation shall be payable by monthly invoicing submitted to the DISTRICT by the CONTRACTOR. The DISTRICT shall pay undisputed invoices within thirty (30) days of receipt from the CONTRACTOR. The DISTRICT may, within fifteen (15) days of receipt of a payment request from CONTRACTOR, reasonably request additional information and supporting documentation, in which case the DISTRICT'S time to pay the pending invoice shall be extended by an amount of time equal to the time in which it takes the CONTRACTOR to submit such information and/or documentation.

4. <u>Expenses</u>: DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: N/A. Any reimbursement under this Section shall be for the reasonable, actual costs incurred by the CONTRACTOR, without markup for profit, overhead or other purposes. The DISTRICT shall reimburse the CONTRACTOR only for expenses incurred in connection with the performance of the Scope of Work as the District in its sole discretion may agree.

5. *Independent Contractor:* CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she/it and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including, without limitation, unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. CONTRACTOR's compensation under this AGREEMENT shall not be increased because of any costs incurred by CONTRACTOR that are attributable to such compliance hereunder.

6. <u>Materials</u>: CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows: N/A. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of its profession.

7. <u>Metrics</u>: The DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR will partake in coordination meetings at mutually agreed upon times and dates to discuss the progress of the program Scope of Work. DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR will also mutually establish criteria and process for ongoing program assessment/evaluation such as, but not limited to the DISTRICT's assessment metrics and other state metrics [(Measures of Academic Progress – English, SBAC – 11th grade, Redesignation Rates, mutually developed rubric score/s, student attendance, and Social Emotional Learning (SEL) data)]. The DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR will also engage in annual review of program content to ensure standards alignment that comply with DISTRICT approved coursework. The CONTRACTOR will provide their impact data based upon these metrics.

8. <u>Data Sharing</u>: In order to facilitate the evaluation of the program, the DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR will share aggregate student data for the purposes of determining program impact in compliance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") and applicable State of California laws. CONTRACTOR needs access to the following data:

We will need access to student data.

Confidentiality Compliance:

To affect the transfer of data subject to federal, state and local laws or regulations, the CONTRACTOR agrees to:

- i. Use data shared under this AGREEMENT for no purpose other than evaluating and analyzing the impact of programs on students' academic/behavior performance. The CONTRACTOR further agrees not to share data received under this contract with any other entity without DISTRICT's prior written approval.
- ii. Require all CONTRACTOR employees, contractors and agents of any kind to comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state and local laws with respect to the data shared under this AGREEMENT. The CONTRACTOR agrees to require and maintain an appropriate confidentiality agreement from each employee, contractor or agent with access to data pursuant to this AGREEMENT. Nothing in this paragraph authorizes sharing data provided under this AGREEMENT with any other person or entity for any purpose.
- iii. Maintain all data obtained pursuant to this AGREEMENT separate from all other data files and not copy, reproduce or transmit data obtained pursuant to this AGREEMENT except as necessary to fulfill the purpose of the original request. All copies of data of any type, including any modifications or additions to data from any source that contains information regarding individual teachers, are subject to the provisions of this AGREEMENT in the same manner as the original data. The ability to access or maintain data under this AGREEMENT shall not under any circumstances transfer from the CONTRACTOR to any other person or entity aside from the DISTIRCT and its designated representatives.
- iv. Not disclose any data contained under this AGREEMENT in a manner, which could identify any individual to any other entity. The CONTRACTOR may only publish results of studies authorized by this AGREEMENT only if the CONTRACTOR has received written approval following the DISTRICTS Application to Conduct Educational Research in the Santa Ana Unified School District process. The CONTRACTOR agrees to abide to a "small numbers" policy of deleting all data items that include any group of individuals less than ten and to require all employees, contractors and agents of any kind to also abide by that policy.
- v. Take reasonable steps to insure the physical security of such data under its control, including, but not limited to: fire protection against smoke and water damage; alarm systems; locked files, guards, or other devices reasonably expected to prevent loss or

unauthorized access to electronically or mechanically held data limited terminal access, access to input documents and output documents and design provisions to limit use of personal data.

vi. Destroy all data obtained under this AGREEMENT when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was obtained. Nothing in this AGREEMENT authorizes either Party to maintain data beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the purpose of the request. All data no longer needed shall be destroyed or returned to DISTRICT within sixty (60) days. No other person or entity is authorized to continue research-using data obtained under this AGREEMENT upon cessation of studies conducted under the direct supervision of DISTRICT.

Data Requests

The DISTRICT may decline to comply with a request in part at its discretion if it determines that providing the data element requested would not be in the best interest of current or former students in DISTRICT schools. All requests shall include a statement of purpose for which it is requested, and an estimation of the time needed to complete the project for which the data is requested.

9. **Originality of Services:** CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.

10. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent:</u> CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become and remain the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

11. Conflict of Interest: CONTRACTOR represents and warrants the following:

(a) **No Current or Prior Conflict of Interest.** That CONTRACTOR has no financial, business, professional, personal, or other interest, including, but not limited to, the representation of other clients, that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. Such conflicts include those contemplated under Government Code section 1090, the California Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 87100 et seq.), or other California law, including the common law.

(b) **Notice of Potential Conflict.** If any such actual or potential conflict of interest arises under this AGREEMENT, CONTRACTOR shall immediately inform the DISTRICT in writing of such conflict.

(c) **Termination for Material Conflict.** If, in the reasonable judgment of the DISTRICT, such conflict poses a material conflict to and with the performance of CONTRACTOR's obligations under this AGREEMENT, then the DISTRICT may terminate the AGREEMENT immediately upon written notice to CONTRACTOR; such termination of the AGREEMENT shall be effective upon the receipt of such notice by CONTRACTOR. Such a termination shall be considered "for cause" as defined in this AGREEMENT.

12. **Termination:** DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered up to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of the Scope of Work by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the date of mailing, whichever is sooner. DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. "Cause" shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR including, but not limited to, the breach of any representation or warranty; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within **TEN (10)** days after service of such notice the condition

or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall, upon the expiration of the **TEN (10)** days, cease and terminate. In the event of such termination "for cause," the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

13. *Fingerprint Clearance:* Pursuant to Education Code Section 45125.1, CONTRACTOR and any subcontractors working independently with students shall, at its own cost, ensure that all employees working with the DISTRICT submit fingerprints to the California Department of Justice to screen for background clearance, with the results of such screening and any subsequent arrest activity being directed to the DISTRICT's Department of School Police. CONTRACTOR will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school whom has a conviction of a serious or violent felony as defined in Education Code Section 44830.1(c)(1), or sex offense as defined in Education Code Section 44010 or controlled substance offense as defined by Education Code Section 44011. 24. This Section shall apply regardless of whether such above-referenced statutes are applicable to these circumstances. If CONTRACTOR is a sole proprietor, the DISTRICT shall prepare and submit the CONTRACTOR'S fingerprints per Education Code Section 45125.1(k). Any CONTRACTOR that is a sole proprietor shall have an immediate and affirmative duty to inform the DISTRICT of such status so as to allow the DISTRICT time to comply with Education Code section 45125.1(k).

14. *Tuberculosis Examination:* CONTRACTOR shall ensure that if there is to be contact with employees working with the DISTRICT, a proper tuberculosis (TB) certificate of clearance will be provided to DISTRICT for each applicable person or employee prior to commencing initial employment. CONTRACTOR will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school without a valid TB certificate on file showing the employee was examined and found to be free from active tuberculosis, as defined in Education Code Section 49406.1 (a).

15. *Hold Harmless:* CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every cost, liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of, or which may be directly or indirectly related to:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the active negligence, sole negligence, or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the DISTRICT's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any actual or alleged act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for injury/death or damage/loss which result from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT, except for damages which result from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(d) The performance of this AGREEMENT or the Scope of Services by CONTRACTOR, or anyone working under or for the CONTRACTOR, except unless caused by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

Where the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents are held to be only partially negligent or partially liable based on willful misconduct, the Parties shall be responsible and liable under this Section on a comparative basis. The CONTRACTOR'S obligations under this Section shall not be deemed to be: (i) conditioned upon, or in any manner limited by, the any insurance coverage maintained by a Party or other person or entity; or (ii) conditioned upon the receipt by any person or entity of, or limited to the amount of, any insurance proceeds.

For all acts, omissions, or incidents occurring before the termination or expiration of this AGREEMENT, the CONTRACTOR'S obligations under this Section shall survive termination/expiration of this AGREEMENT, regardless of whether the CONTRACTOR has then completed the Scope of Work.

16. Insurance: CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general liability and automobile liability insurance with limits of ONE MILLION Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both Parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policy. CONTRACTOR further agrees to obtain and maintain workers' compensation insurance as required by State law and employer's liability insurance with coverage of at least \$1,000,000. To the extent permitted by law, the CONTRACTOR'S insurance policies under this AGREEMENT shall be primary and non-contributing with respect to any insurance or selfinsurance programs covering the District, the District Board or individual members thereof, or the District's other officers, employees, or agents. The general liability policy and the vehicle liability policy shall be endorsed to provide that they are so primary and non-contributory. DISTRICT Risk Manager will review all insurance requirements for the program being provided by the CONTRACTOR and verify submitted insurance documentation for accuracy and compliance with required coverages.

17. <u>Assignment</u>: The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR.

18. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws:</u> The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to the Scope of Work, CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT, or accruing out of the performance of such services.

19. <u>Permits/Licenses:</u> CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

20. *Employment With Public Agency:* CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

21. *Entire Agreement/Amendment:* This AGREEMENT and any recitals or exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the Parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both Parties to the AGREEMENT.

22. <u>Nondiscrimination and other policies</u>: CONTRACTOR agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, disability, marital status, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, genetic information, age, or military veteran status, or any other basis prohibited by law. CONTRACTOR further agrees that it will comply with all DISTRICT policies and administrative regulations including, without limitation, those prohibiting weapons, alcohol, and tobacco on DISTRICT properties.

23. <u>Non Waiver:</u> The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not

be deemed a waiver by that Party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

24. <u>Notice</u>: All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either Party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either Party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this Section. 26. *Attorney Fees/Costs:* Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, should litigation be necessary to enforce or defend any terms or provisions of this AGREEMENT, then each Party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorneys' fees.

27. <u>Governing Law:</u> The terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California. This AGREEMENT is made in and shall be performed in Orange County, California.

28. *Exhibits and Recitals:* This AGREEMENT incorporates by this reference any recitals and/or any exhibits which are attached hereto and incorporated herein.

29. *Fair and Reasonable Interpretations:* Before execution and delivery of this AGREEMENT, each Party has received, or had unqualified opportunities to receive, independent legal advice from its legal counsel with respect to the advisability of executing this AGREEMENT and the meaning of the provisions herein. The provisions of this AGREEMENT, therefore, shall be construed based on their fair and reasonable meaning, and not for or against any Party based on whether such Party or its legal counsel was responsible for drafting this AGREEMENT or any particular provision herein.

30. *Headings and Captions:* The headings and captions set forth in this AGREEMENT are for the convenience of the reader only and shall not be deemed to establish, define, or limit the meaning of any Section or other provision.

31. <u>Correct Legal Requirements Deemed Included</u>: Each and every provision required by any applicable law to be included in this AGREEMENT is hereby deemed to be so included, and this AGREEMENT shall be construed and enforced as if all such provisions are so included.

32. *No Third-Party Beneficiaries:* The Parties have entered into this AGREEMENT solely for their own purposes, and this AGREEMENT shall not be deemed or construed to: (i) benefit any third party; (ii) create any right for any third party; or (iii) except as provided by law, provide a basis for any claim, demand, action, or other proceeding by any third party.

33. *Agreement is Public Record:* Notwithstanding anything to the contrary: (i) nothing in this AGREEMENT shall be deemed to constitute confidential information; and (ii) this AGREEMENT is a public record which the District may disclose per State of California law or otherwise.

Independent Contractor Agreement

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the **Santa Ana Unified School District**, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and Extended Learning Inc. dba Educational Resource Consultants hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR." The DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR may be referred to herein individually as "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR represents and warrants that it is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services to be provided by CONTRACTOR</u>: ("Scope of Work") Consultant will provide an interview with each site coordinator based on the twelve quality standards (supported by the CDE) for after school programs. Each program will be rated on each of the twe lve quality standards in a written report that explains the ratings with commendations for quality standards that are being met and recommendations in areas that show room cont inual improvement.

2. <u>Term:</u> Time is of the essence with respect to this AGREEMENT and the performance by the CONTRACTOR of each of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on 10/1/2019 and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by 6/30/2020.

3. <u>Compensation</u>: DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed Forty Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$47,750). Such compensation shall be payable by monthly invoicing submitted to the DISTRICT by the CONTRACTOR. The DISTRICT shall pay undisputed invoices within thirty (30) days of receipt from the CONTRACTOR. The DISTRICT may, within fifteen (15) days of receipt of a payment request from CONTRACTOR, reasonably request additional information and supporting documentation, in which case the DISTRICT'S time to pay the pending invoice shall be extended by an amount of time equal to the time in which it takes the CONTRACTOR to submit such information and/or documentation.

4. <u>Expenses:</u> DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: N/A. Any reimbursement under this Section shall be for the reasonable, actual costs incurred by the CONTRACTOR, without markup for profit, overhead or other purposes. The DISTRICT shall reimburse the CONTRACTOR only for expenses incurred in connection with the performance of the Scope of Work as the District in its sole discretion may agree.

5. *Independent Contractor:* CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she/it and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including, without limitation, unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. CONTRACTOR's compensation under this AGREEMENT shall not be increased because of any costs incurred by CONTRACTOR that are attributable to such compliance hereunder.

6. <u>Materials</u>: CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows: N/A. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of its profession.

7. <u>Metrics</u>: The DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR will partake in coordination meetings at mutually agreed upon times and dates to discuss the progress of the program Scope of Work. DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR will also mutually establish criteria and process for ongoing program assessment/evaluation such as, but not limited to the DISTRICT's assessment metrics and other state metrics [(Measures of Academic Progress – English, SBAC – 11th grade, Redesignation Rates, mutually developed rubric score/s, student attendance, and Social Emotional Learning (SEL) data)]. The DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR will also engage in annual review of program content to ensure standards alignment that comply with DISTRICT approved coursework. The CONTRACTOR will provide their impact data based upon these metrics.

8. <u>*Data Sharing:*</u> In order to facilitate the evaluation of the program, the DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR will share aggregate student data for the purposes of determining program impact in compliance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") and applicable State of California laws. CONTRACTOR needs access to the following data:

Confidentiality Compliance:

To affect the transfer of data subject to federal, state and local laws or regulations, the CONTRACTOR agrees to:

- i. Use data shared under this AGREEMENT for no purpose other than evaluating and analyzing the impact of programs on students' academic/behavior performance. The CONTRACTOR further agrees not to share data received under this contract with any other entity without DISTRICT's prior written approval.
- ii. Require all CONTRACTOR employees, contractors and agents of any kind to comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state and local laws with respect to the data shared under this AGREEMENT. The CONTRACTOR agrees to require and maintain an appropriate confidentiality agreement from each employee, contractor or agent with access to data pursuant to this AGREEMENT. Nothing in this paragraph authorizes sharing data provided under this AGREEMENT with any other person or entity for any purpose.
- iii. Maintain all data obtained pursuant to this AGREEMENT separate from all other data files and not copy, reproduce or transmit data obtained pursuant to this AGREEMENT except as necessary to fulfill the purpose of the original request. All copies of data of any type, including any modifications or additions to data from any source that contains information regarding individual teachers, are subject to the provisions of this AGREEMENT in the same manner as the original data. The ability to access or maintain data under this AGREEMENT shall not under any circumstances transfer from the CONTRACTOR to any other person or entity aside from the DISTIRCT and its designated representatives.
- iv. Not disclose any data contained under this AGREEMENT in a manner, which could identify any individual to any other entity. The CONTRACTOR may only publish results of studies authorized by this AGREEMENT only if the CONTRACTOR has received written approval following the DISTRICTS Application to Conduct Educational Research in the Santa Ana Unified School District process. The CONTRACTOR agrees to abide to a "small numbers" policy of deleting all data items that include any group of individuals less than ten and to require all employees, contractors and agents of any kind to also abide by that policy.
- v. Take reasonable steps to insure the physical security of such data under its control, including, but not limited to: fire protection against smoke and water damage; alarm systems; locked files, guards, or other devices reasonably expected to prevent loss or

unauthorized access to electronically or mechanically held data limited terminal access, access to input documents and output documents and design provisions to limit use of personal data.

vi. Destroy all data obtained under this AGREEMENT when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was obtained. Nothing in this AGREEMENT authorizes either Party to maintain data beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the purpose of the request. All data no longer needed shall be destroyed or returned to DISTRICT within sixty (60) days. No other person or entity is authorized to continue research-using data obtained under this AGREEMENT upon cessation of studies conducted under the direct supervision of DISTRICT.

Data Requests

The DISTRICT may decline to comply with a request in part at its discretion if it determines that providing the data element requested would not be in the best interest of current or former students in DISTRICT schools. All requests shall include a statement of purpose for which it is requested, and an estimation of the time needed to complete the project for which the data is requested.

9. <u>Originality of Services</u>: CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.

10. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>: CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become and remain the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

11. Conflict of Interest: CONTRACTOR represents and warrants the following:

(a) **No Current or Prior Conflict of Interest.** That CONTRACTOR has no financial, business, professional, personal, or other interest, including, but not limited to, the representation of other clients, that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. Such conflicts include those contemplated under Government Code section 1090, the California Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 87100 et seq.), or other California law, including the common law.

(b) **Notice of Potential Conflict.** If any such actual or potential conflict of interest arises under this AGREEMENT, CONTRACTOR shall immediately inform the DISTRICT in writing of such conflict.

(c) **Termination for Material Conflict.** If, in the reasonable judgment of the DISTRICT, such conflict poses a material conflict to and with the performance of CONTRACTOR's obligations under this AGREEMENT, then the DISTRICT may terminate the AGREEMENT immediately upon written notice to CONTRACTOR; such termination of the AGREEMENT shall be effective upon the receipt of such notice by CONTRACTOR. Such a termination shall be considered "for cause" as defined in this AGREEMENT.

12. <u>Termination</u>: DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered up to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of the Scope of Work by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the date of mailing, whichever is sooner. DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. "Cause" shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR including, but not limited to, the breach of any representation or warranty; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within **TEN (10)** days after service of such notice the condition

or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall, upon the expiration of the **TEN (10)** days, cease and terminate. In the event of such termination "for cause," the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

13. *Fingerprint Clearance*: Pursuant to Education Code Section 45125.1, CONTRACTOR and any subcontractors working independently with students shall, at its own cost, ensure that all employees working with the DISTRICT submit fingerprints to the California Department of Justice to screen for background clearance, with the results of such screening and any subsequent arrest activity being directed to the DISTRICT's Department of School Police. CONTRACTOR will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school whom has a conviction of a serious or violent felony as defined in Education Code Section 44830.1(c)(1), or sex offense as defined in Education Code Section 44010 or controlled substance offense as defined by Education Code Section 44011. 24. This Section shall apply regardless of whether such above-referenced statutes are applicable to these circumstances. If CONTRACTOR is a sole proprietor, the DISTRICT shall prepare and submit the CONTRACTOR'S fingerprints per Education Code Section 45125.1(k). Any CONTRACTOR that is a sole proprietor shall have an immediate and affirmative duty to inform the DISTRICT of such status so as to allow the DISTRICT time to comply with Education Code section 45125.1(k).

14. <u>*Tuberculosis Examination:*</u> CONTRACTOR shall ensure that if there is to be contact with employees working with the DISTRICT, a proper tuberculosis (TB) certificate of clearance will be provided to DISTRICT for each applicable person or employee prior to commencing initial employment. CONTRACTOR will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school without a valid TB certificate on file showing the employee was examined and found to be free from active tuberculosis, as defined in Education Code Section 49406.1 (a).

15. <u>Hold Harmless</u>: CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every cost, liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of, or which may be directly or indirectly related to:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the active negligence, sole negligence, or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the DISTRICT's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any actual or alleged act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for injury/death or damage/loss which result from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT, except for damages which result from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(d) The performance of this AGREEMENT or the Scope of Services by CONTRACTOR, or anyone working under or for the CONTRACTOR, except unless caused by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

Where the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents are held to be only partially negligent or partially liable based on willful misconduct, the Parties shall be responsible and liable under this Section on a comparative basis. The CONTRACTOR'S obligations under this Section shall not be deemed to be: (i) conditioned upon, or in any manner limited by, the any insurance coverage maintained by a Party or other person or entity; or (ii) conditioned upon the receipt by any person or entity of, or limited to the amount of, any insurance proceeds.

For all acts, omissions, or incidents occurring before the termination or expiration of this AGREEMENT, the CONTRACTOR'S obligations under this Section shall survive termination/expiration of this AGREEMENT, regardless of whether the CONTRACTOR has then completed the Scope of Work.

16. Insurance: CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general liability and automobile liability insurance with limits of **ONE MILLION Dollars (\$1,000,000)** per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both Parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policy. CONTRACTOR further agrees to obtain and maintain workers' compensation insurance as required by State law and employer's liability insurance with coverage of at least \$1,000,000. To the extent permitted by law, the CONTRACTOR'S insurance policies under this AGREEMENT shall be primary and non-contributing with respect to any insurance or selfinsurance programs covering the District, the District Board or individual members thereof, or the District's other officers, employees, or agents. The general liability policy and the vehicle liability policy shall be endorsed to provide that they are so primary and non-contributory. DISTRICT Risk Manager will review all insurance requirements for the program being provided by the CONTRACTOR and verify submitted insurance documentation for accuracy and compliance with required coverages.

17. <u>Assignment:</u> The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR.

18. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws:</u> The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to the Scope of Work, CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT, or accruing out of the performance of such services.

19. <u>*Permits/Licenses:*</u> CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

20. <u>Employment With Public Agency:</u> CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

23. <u>Non Waiver:</u> The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not

be deemed a waiver by that Party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

24. <u>Notice</u>: All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either Party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either Party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this Section. After School Program Quality Assessment 2019-20 Service Agreement with the Santa Ana Unified School District

Program Quality Assessment

ERC will assess the quality of after school programs operated by the Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) on elementary, middle, and high school campuses. This assessment will be based on the California Department of Education's (CDE) Quality Standards for Expanded Learning in California. Programs will be selected for either an in-person or online assessment, as decided by the District Program Coordinator.

During in-person assessments, an ERC evaluator will conduct structured interviews with the school principal and site coordinator, conduct a student focus group, and observe program activities. ERC will conduct in-person assessments at all selected schools by May 30, 2020 and will coordinate dates for in-person visits through the District Program Coordinator.

Programs that are not selected for an in-person assessment will participate in an assessment online. The purpose of the online assessment is to engage site level coordinators in self-reflection regarding how their program is addressing each of the Quality Standards.

When all assessments are complete ERC will complete written reports for all programs which contain ratings on each of the Quality Standards, rationale for each rating, and recommendations for program improvement. ERC will also complete a similar report that summarizes findings at the district level. Findings for in-person and online assessment will be reported separately. Following the end of the school year, ERC evaluators will present all reports and share district-level findings and recommendations at an in-person meeting with the District Program Coordinator.

Independent Contractor Agreement

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the **Santa Ana Unified School District**, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and All American Inspection hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR." If CONTRACTOR is a sole proprietor, the DISTRICT shall prepare and submit the CONTRACTOR'S fingerprints per Education Code Section 45125.1(k). Any CONTRACTOR that is a sole proprietor shall have an immediate and affirmative duty to inform the DISTRICT of such status so as to allow the DISTRICT time to comply with Education Code section 45125.1(k).

14. <u>*Tuberculosis Examination:*</u> CONTRACTOR shall ensure that if there is to be contact with employees working with the DISTRICT, a proper tuberculosis (TB) certificate of clearance will be provided to DISTRICT for each applicable person or employee prior to commencing initial employment. CONTRACTOR will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school without a valid TB certificate on file showing the employee was examined and found to be free from active tuberculosis, as defined in Education Code Section 49406.1 (a).

15. *Hold Harmless:* CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every cost, liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of, or which may be directly or indirectly related to:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the active negligence, sole negligence, or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the DISTRICT's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any actual or alleged act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for injury/death or damage/loss which result from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT, except for damages which result from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(d) The performance of this AGREEMENT or the Scope of Services by CONTRACTOR, or anyone working under or for the CONTRACTOR, except unless caused by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

Where the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents are held to be only partially negligent or partially liable based on willful misconduct, the Parties shall be responsible and liable under this Section on a comparative basis. The CONTRACTOR'S obligations under this Section shall not be deemed to be: (i) conditioned upon, or in any manner limited by, the any insurance coverage maintained by a Party or other person or entity; or (ii) conditioned upon the receipt by any person or entity of, or limited to the amount of, any insurance proceeds. For all acts, omissions, or incidents occurring before the termination or expiration of this AGREEMENT, the CONTRACTOR'S obligations under this Section shall survive termination/expiration of this AGREEMENT, regardless of whether the CONTRACTOR has then completed the Scope of Work.

16. <u>Insurance</u>: CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general liability and automobile liability insurance with limits of **ONE MILLION Dollars (\$1,000,000)** per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both Parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policy.

CONTRACTOR further agrees to obtain and maintain workers' compensation insurance as required by State law and employer's liability insurance with coverage of at least \$1,000,000.

To the extent permitted by law, the CONTRACTOR'S insurance policies under this AGREEMENT shall be primary and non-contributing with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs covering the District, the District Board or individual members thereof, or the District's other officers, employees, or agents. The general liability policy and the vehicle liability policy shall be endorsed to provide that they are so primary and non-contributory. DISTRICT Risk Manager will review all insurance requirements for the program being provided by the CONTRACTOR and verify submitted insurance documentation for accuracy and compliance with required coverages.

17. *Assignment:* The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR.

18. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>: The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local

laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to the Scope of Work, CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT, or accruing out of the performance of such services.

19. <u>*Permits/Licenses:*</u> CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

20. *Employment With Public Agency:* CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

21. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>: This AGREEMENT and any recitals or exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the Parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both Parties to the AGREEMENT.

22. <u>Nondiscrimination and other policies</u>: CONTRACTOR agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, disability, marital status, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, genetic information, age, or military veteran status, or any other basis prohibited by law. CONTRACTOR further agrees that it will comply with all DISTRICT policies and administrative regulations including, without limitation, those prohibiting weapons, alcohol, and tobacco on DISTRICT properties.

23. <u>Non Waiver</u>: The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that Party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

24. <u>Notice</u>: All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either Party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either Party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this Section. Ninyo & Moore is pleased to submit this proposal for geotechnical, materials testing and special inspection services pertaining to construction of the John Muir Fundamental Elementary school Two Story Classroom Building project located at 1951 Mabury Street in Santa Ana, California. Based on our review of the referenced approved plans and DSA 103 form, we understand that the planned project will generally consist of a new two-story modular classroom building with associated site work. The modular building is 88 feet wide and 191 feet long. The modular buildings will be fabricated at Silver Creek. The construction for the new building will include concrete foundations. The project will also include a new elevator, stairways, reinforced masonry walls, seat walls, ramps and a new canopy. The site improvements include new asphalt concrete pavement, concrete pavement, fence and gates, underground utilities and landscaping. The earthwork is anticipated to include over-excavation and recompaction to provide 2 feet of engineered fill below the new concrete foundations. The DSA-103 indicates that inspection and testing services will be required for soils, concrete, masonry and steel.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Based on our understanding of the proposed construction and our experience with similar projects, we propose to provide the following scope of services:

- Project coordination and management, including work scheduling and review of the project plans, specifications and contract documents, as well as uploading of the project reports to the DSA Box site.
- Field technician services for observation and documentation of the foundation excavation construction operations, as well as density testing during rough grading, structural excavation backfill, subgrade and aggregate base recompaction operations. Independent Contractor Agreement

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the **Santa Ana Unified School District**, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and WestEd hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR." The DISTRICT and CONTRACTOR may be referred to herein individually as "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR represents and warrants that it is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services to be provided by CONTRACTOR:</u> ("Scope of Work") Year two support for Assessment Literacy and CAASPP Tools per scope submitted 8/19/19.

2. <u>Term:</u> Time is of the essence with respect to this AGREEMENT and the performance by the CONTRACTOR of each of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on 09/01/2019 and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by 6/30/2020.

5. *Independent Contractor:* CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she/it and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including, without limitation, unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees. CONTRACTOR's compensation under this AGREEMENT shall not be increased because of any costs incurred by CONTRACTOR that are attributable to such compliance hereunder.

6. <u>Materials:</u> CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows: N/A. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of its profession.

11. Conflict of Interest: CONTRACTOR represents and warrants the following:

(a) **No Current or Prior Conflict of Interest.** That CONTRACTOR has no financial, business, professional, personal, or other interest, including, but not limited to, the representation of other clients, that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. Such conflicts include those contemplated under Government Code section

1090, the California Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 87100 et seq.), or other California law, including the common law.

(b) **Notice of Potential Conflict.** If any such actual or potential conflict of interest arises under this AGREEMENT, CONTRACTOR shall immediately inform the DISTRICT in writing of such conflict.

(c) **Termination for Material Conflict.** If, in the reasonable judgment of the DISTRICT, such conflict poses a material conflict to and with the performance of CONTRACTOR's obligations under this AGREEMENT, then the DISTRICT may terminate the AGREEMENT immediately upon written notice to CONTRACTOR; such termination of the AGREEMENT shall be effective upon the receipt of such notice by CONTRACTOR. Such a termination shall be considered "for cause" as defined in this AGREEMENT.

12. Termination: DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered up to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of the Scope of Work by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the date of mailing, whichever is sooner. DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. "Cause" shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR including, but not limited to, the breach of any representation or warranty; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within TEN (10) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall, upon the expiration of the TEN (10) days, cease and terminate. In the event of such termination "for cause," the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available

to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

To the extent permitted by law, the CONTRACTOR'S insurance policies under this AGREEMENT shall be primary and non-contributing with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs covering the District, the District Board or individual members thereof, or the District's other officers, employees, or agents. The general liability policy, the vehicle and liability

policy shall be endorsed to provide that they are so primary and non-contributory. DISTRICT Risk Manager will review all insurance requirements for the program being provided by the CONTRACTOR and verify submitted insurance documentation for accuracy and compliance with required coverages.

17. <u>Assignment:</u> The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR.

CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to the Scope of Work, CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT, or accruing out of the performance of such services.

19. <u>*Permits/Licenses:*</u> CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

24. *Notice:* All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either Party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either Party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this Section. Dates of Service: September 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020

Background

In May and June of 2019, WestEd partnered with the Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) to provide professional development and technical assistance aimed at increasing local capacity to use CAASPP tools and resources to improve teaching and learning.

On May 16-17, 2019, WestEd provided training on CAASPP item design, tools, and resources to 68 SAUSD educators. Additionally, WestEd provided virtual onsite technical assistance to SAUSD leadership. The purpose of this TA was to support planning for pilot activities for the 2019-2020 school year focused on learning with and from teachers using the Smarter Balanced Interim Assessment Blocks (IABs) in flexible ways to support teaching and learning in the classroom.

At this time, SAUSD has requested a scope of work from WestEd focused on providing additional professional development and technical assistance to support implementation and learning in the 2019-2020 school year.

Services

SAUSD has identified the following services for WestEd to provide in order to support ongoing implementation and learning in the 2019-2020 school year:

A. Face-to-Face Professional Development

- WestEd will develop and deliver two days of face-to-face professional development in October 2019:
 - Day 1: two repeated 3-hour sessions (8:00-11:00 for elementary, 11:30-2:30 for secondary); one two-hour clinic for Data Lead Experts (DLEs) (3:00-5:00)
 - Day 2: two repeated 3-hour sessions (9:00-12:00 for elementary, 1:00-3:00 for secondary)
- WestEd will develop and deliver two days of face-to-face professional development in January 2019:
 - Day 1: two repeated 3-hour sessions (8:00-11:00 for elementary, 11:30-2:30 for secondary); one two-hour clinic for Data Lead Experts (DLEs) (3:00-5:00)
 - Day 2: two repeated 3-hour sessions (9:00-12:00 for elementary, 1:00-3:00 for secondary)



B. Virtual Support for DLEs

- WestEd will develop and deliver a one-hour recorded webinar with an introduction to the comprehensive assessment system (available to all participants in the October session, including DLEs)
- WestEd will develop and deliver six one-hour virtual sessions for DLEs as follows:
 - Two (one for elementary and one for secondary) one-hour follow up virtual meetings for DLEs (approximately six-weeks after October training)
 - Two (one for elementary and one for secondary) one-hour follow up virtual meetings for DLEs (aim for late February)
 - Two (one for elementary and one for secondary) one-hour follow up virtual meetings for DLEs (after testing window aim for late May)

C. Virtual TA and District Support

- WestEd will facilitate a total of 9 monthly 1-1.5 hour virtual planning meetings with R&E leadership team.
- WestEd will review and provide feedback on PD training materials prepared by SAUSD staff for up to five PD sessions, including content for a session scheduled to begin September 9.
- WestEd will facilitate four, 1.5 hour virtual TA meetings for curriculum specialists supporting pilot efforts (two for the ELA team and two for the math team).

D. Face-to-Face TA

- WestEd will develop and deliver a one-day, face-to-face TA session with R&E leadership and curriculum specialists (aim for late May or June) to reflect on implementation efforts and focus on plans for the 2020-2021 school year.
- WestEd will facilitate two, one-hour face-to-face meetings (convened on the second afternoons of the two face-to-face PD days described in section A above).

- Facility for each event, including AV equipment, general session space, break out rooms
- Catering for all events
- Registration and recruitment of participants

Memorandum of Understanding

This AGREEMENT is hereby entered into between the **Santa Ana Unified School District**, hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT," and Center for Balanced Development hereinafter referred to as "PARTNER." The DISTRICT and PARTNER may be referred to herein individually as "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and WHEREAS, PARTNER represents and warrants that it is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Services to be provided by PARTNER: ("Scope of Work")

PATH OF SUCCESS for Innovators of Tomorrow is a progressive empowerment program for Middle School Jr. Youth focused on developing the students' capacity, creativity, innovation mindset, service skills and healthy habits in collaboration with parents, teachers and community members

2. <u>Term:</u> Time is of the essence with respect to this AGREEMENT and the performance by the PARTNER of each of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. PARTNER shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on 10/1/2019 and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by 06/30/2020.

3. <u>Compensation</u>: DISTRICT agrees there is no cost to pay the PARTNER for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

4. <u>Expenses</u>: DISTRICT shall not be liable to PARTNER for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by PARTNER in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: N/A. Any reimbursement under this Section shall be for the reasonable, actual costs incurred by the PARTNER, without markup for profit, overhead or other purposes. The DISTRICT shall reimburse the PARTNER only for expenses incurred in connection with the performance of the Scope of Work as the District in its sole discretion may agree.

5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>: PARTNER, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. PARTNER understands and agrees that he/she/it and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. PARTNER assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. PARTNER shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including, without limitation, unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to PARTNER's employees. PARTNER's compensation under this AGREEMENT shall not be increased because of any costs incurred by PARTNER that are attributable to such compliance hereunder.

6. <u>Materials</u>: PARTNER shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows: N/A. PARTNER's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of its profession.

7. <u>Metrics:</u> The DISTRICT and PARTNER will partake in monthly coordination meetings at mutually agreed upon times and dates to discuss the progress of the program Scope of Work.

DISTRICT and PARTNER will also mutually establish criteria and process for ongoing program assessment/evaluation such as, but not limited to the DISTRICT's assessment metrics and other state metrics [(Measures of Academic Progress – English, SBAC – 11th grade, Redesignation Rates, mutually developed rubric score/s, student attendance, and Social Emotional Learning (SEL) data)]. The DISTRICT and PARTNER will also engage in annual review of program content to ensure standards alignment that comply with DISTRICT approved coursework. The PARTNER will provide their impact data based upon these metrics.

8. <u>**Data Sharing:</u>** In order to facilitate the evaluation of the program, the DISTRICT and PARTNER will share aggregate student data for the purposes of determining program impact in compliance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") and applicable State of California laws. PARTNER needs access to the following data:</u>

Confidentiality Compliance:

To affect the transfer of data subject to federal, state and local laws or regulations, the PARTNER agrees to:

- i. Use data shared under this AGREEMENT for no purpose other than evaluating and analyzing the impact of programs on students' academic/behavior performance. The PARTNER further agrees not to share data received under this contract with any other entity without DISTRICT's prior written approval.
- ii. Require all PARTNER employees, contractors and agents of any kind to comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state and local laws with respect to the data shared under this AGREEMENT. The PARTNER agrees to require and maintain an appropriate confidentiality agreement from each employee, contractor or agent with access to data pursuant to this AGREEMENT. Nothing in this paragraph authorizes sharing data provided under this AGREEMENT with any other person or entity for any purpose.

- iii. Maintain all data obtained pursuant to this AGREEMENT separate from all other data files and not copy, reproduce or transmit data obtained pursuant to this AGREEMENT except as necessary to fulfill the purpose of the original request. All copies of data of any type, including any modifications or additions to data from any source that contains information regarding individual teachers, are subject to the provisions of this AGREEMENT in the same manner as the original data. The ability to access or maintain data under this AGREEMENT shall not under any circumstances transfer from the PARTNER to any other person or entity aside from the DISTIRCT and its designated representatives.
- iv. Not disclose any data contained under this AGREEMENT in a manner, which could identify any individual to any other entity. The PARTNER may only publish results of studies authorized by this AGREEMENT only if the PARTNER has received written approval following the DISTRICTS Application to Conduct Educational Research in the Santa Ana Unified School District process. The PARTNER agrees to abide to a "small numbers" policy of deleting all data items that include any group of individuals less than ten and to require all employees, contractors and agents of any kind to also abide by that policy.
- v. Take reasonable steps to insure the physical security of such data under its control, including, but not limited to: fire protection against smoke and water damage; alarm systems; locked files, guards, or other devices reasonably expected to prevent loss or unauthorized access to electronically or mechanically held data limited terminal access, access to input documents and output documents and design provisions to limit use of personal data.
- vi. Destroy all data obtained under this AGREEMENT when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was obtained. Nothing in this AGREEMENT authorizes either Party to maintain data beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the purpose of the request. All data no longer needed shall be destroyed or returned to DISTRICT within sixty (60) days. No other person or entity is authorized to continue research-using data obtained under this AGREEMENT upon cessation of studies conducted under the direct supervision of DISTRICT.

Data Requests

The DISTRICT may decline to comply with a request in part at its discretion if it determines that providing the data element requested would not be in the best interest of current or former students in DISTRICT schools. All requests shall include a statement of purpose for which it is requested, and an estimation of the time needed to complete the project for which the data is requested.

9. <u>Originality of Services:</u> PARTNER agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and/or video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to PARTNER and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to PARTNER by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.

10. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent:</u> PARTNER understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become and remain the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT. PARTNER consents to use of PARTNER's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

11. *Conflict of Interest:* PARTNER represents and warrants the following:

(a) **No Current or Prior Conflict of Interest.** That PARTNER has no financial, business, professional, personal, or other interest, including, but not limited to, the representation of other clients, that would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of its obligations under this AGREEMENT. Such conflicts include those contemplated under Government Code section 1090, the California Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 87100 et seq.), or other California law, including the common law.

(b) **Notice of Potential Conflict.** If any such actual or potential conflict of interest arises under this AGREEMENT, PARTNER shall immediately inform the DISTRICT in writing of such conflict.

(c) **Termination for Material Conflict.** If, in the reasonable judgment of the DISTRICT, such conflict poses a material conflict to and with the performance of PARTNER's obligations under this AGREEMENT, then the DISTRICT may terminate the AGREEMENT immediately upon written notice to PARTNER; such termination of the AGREEMENT shall be effective upon the receipt of such notice by PARTNER. Such a termination shall be considered "for cause" as defined in this AGREEMENT.

12. Termination: DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate PARTNER only for services satisfactorily rendered up to the date of termination. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of the Scope of Work by PARTNER. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the PARTNER or no later than three days after the date of mailing, whichever is sooner. DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. "Cause" shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the PARTNER including, but not limited to, the breach of any representation or warranty; or (b) any act by PARTNER exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or (c) PARTNER is adjudged a bankrupt, PARTNER makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of PARTNER's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within TEN (10) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall, upon the expiration of the TEN (10) days, cease and terminate. In the event of such termination "for cause," the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charges to and collected from the PARTNER. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the PARTNER, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

13. *Fingerprint Clearance:* Pursuant to Education Code Section 45125.1, PARTNER and any subcontractors working independently with students shall, at its own cost, ensure that all employees working with the DISTRICT submit fingerprints to the California Department of

Justice to screen for background clearance, with the results of such screening and any subsequent arrest activity being directed to the DISTRICT's Department of School Police. PARTNER will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school whom has a conviction of a serious or violent felony as defined in Education Code Section 44830.1(c)(1), or sex offense as defined in Education Code Section 44011. (c)(1), or sex offense as defined in Education Code Section 44011. 24. This Section shall apply regardless of whether such above-referenced statutes are applicable to these circumstances. If PARTNER is a sole proprietor, the DISTRICT shall prepare and submit the PARTNER'S fingerprints per Education Code Section 45125.1(k). Any PARTNER that is a sole proprietor shall have an immediate and affirmative duty to inform the DISTRICT of such status so as to allow the DISTRICT time to comply with Education Code section 45125.1(k).

14. <u>*Tuberculosis Examination:*</u> PARTNER shall ensure that if there is to be contact with employees working with the DISTRICT, a proper tuberculosis (TB) certificate of clearance will be provided to DISTRICT for each applicable person or employee prior to commencing initial employment. PARTNER will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school without a valid TB certificate on file showing the employee was examined and found to be free from active tuberculosis, as defined in Education Code Section 49406.1 (a).

15. <u>Hold Harmless</u>: PARTNER agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every cost, liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of, or which may be directly or indirectly related to:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the PARTNER or any person, firm or corporation employed by the PARTNER, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the active negligence, sole negligence, or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the DISTRICT's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any actual or alleged act, neglect, default, or omission of the PARTNER, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the PARTNER, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for injury/death or damage/loss which result from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT, except for damages which result from the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(d) The performance of this AGREEMENT or the Scope of Services by PARTNER, or anyone working under or for the PARTNER, except unless caused by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

Where the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents are held to be only partially negligent or partially liable based on willful misconduct, the Parties shall be responsible and liable under this Section on a comparative basis. The PARTNER'S obligations under this Section shall not be deemed to be: (i) conditioned upon, or in any manner limited by, the any insurance coverage maintained by a Party or other person or entity; or (ii) conditioned upon the receipt by any person or entity of, or limited to the amount of, any insurance proceeds.

For all acts, omissions, or incidents occurring before the termination or expiration of this AGREEMENT, the PARTNER'S obligations under this Section shall survive termination/expiration of this AGREEMENT, regardless of whether the PARTNER has then completed the Scope of Work.

16. <u>Insurance</u>: PARTNER agrees to carry a comprehensive general liability and automobile liability insurance with limits of **ONE MILLION Dollars (\$1,000,000)** per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both Parties to protect PARTNER and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. PARTNER shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. PARTNER agrees to name DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policy.

PARTNER further agrees to obtain and maintain workers' compensation insurance as required by State law and employer's liability insurance with coverage of at least \$1,000,000.

To the extent permitted by law, the PARTNER'S insurance policies under this AGREEMENT shall be primary and non-contributing with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs covering the District, the District Board or individual members thereof, or the District's other officers, employees, or agents. The general liability policy and the vehicle liability policy shall be endorsed to provide that they are so primary and non-contributory. DISTRICT Risk Manager will review all insurance requirements for the program being provided by the PARTNER and verify submitted insurance documentation for accuracy and compliance with required coverages.

All insurance documentation received from PARTNER will be reviewed by the DISTRICT'S Risk Manager.

17. <u>Assignment</u>: The obligations of the PARTNER pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the PARTNER.

18. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws:</u> The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. PARTNER agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to the Scope of Work, PARTNER, PARTNER's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT, or accruing out of the performance of such services.

19. <u>*Permits/Licenses:*</u> PARTNER and all PARTNER's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

20. <u>Employment With Public Agency:</u> PARTNER, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that PARTNER will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

21. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>: This AGREEMENT and any recitals or exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the Parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both Parties to the AGREEMENT.

22. <u>Nondiscrimination and other policies:</u> PARTNER agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, disability, marital status, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, genetic information, age, or military veteran status, or any other basis prohibited by law. PARTNER further agrees that it will comply with all DISTRICT policies and administrative regulations including, without limitation, those prohibiting weapons, alcohol, and tobacco on DISTRICT properties.

23. <u>Non Waiver:</u> The failure of DISTRICT or PARTNER to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that Party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

24. *Notice:* All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either Party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either Party may

be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this Section. At the date of this AGREEMENT, the addresses of the Parties are as follows:

26. <u>Attorney Fees/Costs:</u> Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, should litigation be necessary to enforce or defend any terms or provisions of this AGREEMENT, then each Party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs, and attorneys' fees.

27. <u>Governing Law:</u> The terms and conditions of this AGREEMENT shall be governed by the laws of the State of California with venue in Orange County, California. This AGREEMENT is made in and shall be performed in Orange County, California.

28. <u>Exhibits and Recitals</u>: This AGREEMENT incorporates by this reference any recitals and/or any exhibits which are attached hereto and incorporated herein.

29. *Fair and Reasonable Interpretations:* Before execution and delivery of this AGREEMENT, each Party has received, or had unqualified opportunities to receive, independent legal advice from its legal counsel with respect to the advisability of executing this AGREEMENT and the meaning of the provisions herein. The provisions of this AGREEMENT, therefore, shall be construed based on their fair and reasonable meaning, and not for or against any Party based on whether such Party

or its legal counsel was responsible for drafting this AGREEMENT or any particular provision herein.

30. *Headings and Captions:* The headings and captions set forth in this AGREEMENT are for the convenience of the reader only and shall not be deemed to establish, define, or limit the meaning of any Section or other provision.

31. <u>Correct Legal Requirements Deemed Included:</u> Each and every provision required by any applicable law to be included in this AGREEMENT is hereby deemed to be so included, and this AGREEMENT shall be construed and enforced as if all such provisions are so included.

32. <u>No Third-Party Beneficiaries:</u> The Parties have entered into this AGREEMENT solely for their own purposes, and this AGREEMENT shall not be deemed or construed to: (i) benefit any third party; (ii) create any right for any third party; or (iii) except as provided by law, provide a basis for any claim, demand, action, or other proceeding by any third party.

33. <u>Agreement is Public Record</u>: Notwithstanding anything to the contrary: (i) nothing in this AGREEMENT shall be deemed to constitute confidential information; and (ii) this AGREEMENT is a public record which the District may disclose per State of California law or otherwise.

Signature pages may be detached from counterpart originals and combined to physically form one or more copies of this AGREEMENT having original signatures of both Parties. Signature pages sent via email shall also constitute original signatures under this AGREEMENT.

35. *Due Authority:* Each person signing this AGREEMENT on behalf of a Party represents and warrants that he or she has been duly authorized by such Party to sign, and thereby bind such Party to, this AGREEMENT.

PARTNER will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school whom has a conviction of a serious or violent felony as defined in Education Code Section 44830.1(c)(1), or sex offense as defined in

Education Code Section 44010 or controlled substance offense as defined by Education Code Section 44011. 24. Working independently for this section means and refers to strictly work with students without a certified SAUSD staff member present.

14. <u>*Tuberculosis Examination:*</u> PARTNER and its subcontractors shall ensure that a proper tuberculosis (TB) certificate of clearance will be provided to DISTRICT prior to commencing initial employment. PARTNER will ensure that subcontractors will not place any person at a school without a valid TB certificate on file showing the employee was examined and found to be free from active tuberculosis, as defined in Education Code Section 49406.1 (a).

15. <u>Hold Harmless</u>: PARTNER agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every cost, liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of, or which may be directly or indirectly related to:

(a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the PARTNER or any person, firm or corporation employed by the PARTNER, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(b) Any injury to or death of any person(s), including the DISTRICT's officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any actual or alleged act, neglect, default, or omission of the PARTNER, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the PARTNER, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, except for injury/death or damage/loss which result from the negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT, except for damages which result from the negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

(d) The performance of this AGREEMENT or the Scope of Services by PARTNER, or anyone working under or for the PARTNER, except unless caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.

Where the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents are held to be only partially negligent or partially liable based on willful misconduct, the Parties shall be responsible and liable under this Section on a comparative basis. The PARTNER'S obligations under this Section shall not be deemed to be: (i) conditioned upon, or in any manner limited by, the any insurance coverage maintained by a Party or other person or entity; or (ii) conditioned upon the receipt by any person or entity of, or limited to the amount of, any insurance proceeds.

For all acts, omissions, or incidents occurring before the termination or expiration of this AGREEMENT, the PARTNER'S obligations under this Section shall survive termination/expiration of this AGREEMENT, regardless of whether the PARTNER has then completed the Scope of Work.

16. <u>Insurance</u>: PARTNER agrees to carry a comprehensive general liability and automobile liability insurance with limits of **ONE MILLION Dollars (\$1,000,000)** per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both Parties to protect PARTNER and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. PARTNER shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. PARTNER agrees to name DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policy.

PARTNER further agrees to obtain and maintain workers' compensation insurance as required by State law and employer's liability insurance with coverage of at least \$1,000,000.

To the extent permitted by law, the PARTNER'S insurance policies under this AGREEMENT shall be primary and non-contributing with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs covering the District, the District Board or individual members thereof, or the District's other officers, employees, or agents. The general liability policy and the vehicle liability policy shall be endorsed to provide that they are so primary and non-contributory. DISTRICT Risk Manager will review all insurance requirements for the program being provided by the PARTNER and verify submitted insurance documentation for accuracy and compliance with required coverages.

All insurance documentation received from PARTNER will be reviewed by the DISTRICT'S Risk Manager.

17. <u>Assignment</u>: The obligations of the PARTNER pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the PARTNER.

18. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>: The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. PARTNER agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to the Scope of Work, PARTNER, PARTNER's business, equipment and personnel engaged in services covered by this AGREEMENT, or accruing out of the performance of such services.

19. <u>Permits/Licenses:</u> PARTNER and all PARTNER's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

20. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>: PARTNER, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that PARTNER will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an

employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.

21. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>: This AGREEMENT and any recitals or exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the Parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both Parties to the AGREEMENT.

22. <u>Nondiscrimination and other policies:</u> PARTNER agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, disability, marital status, gender, gender identity, sexual orientation, genetic information, age, or military veteran status, or any other basis prohibited by law. PARTNER further agrees that it will comply with all DISTRICT policies and administrative regulations including, without limitation, those prohibiting weapons, alcohol, and tobacco on DISTRICT properties.

23. <u>Non Waiver:</u> The failure of DISTRICT or PARTNER to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that Party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.

24. <u>Notice</u>: All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either Party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Dear Marjorie Cochran:

I am pleased to inform you that The William and Flora Hewlett Foundation (the "Foundation") has authorized a grant of \$60,000 over two months to Santa Ana Unified School District ("Grantee") for support of a California school district–community partnership initiative. The grant will be paid in one installment. This grant is for support of a California school district–community partnership initiative.

In order for the Foundation to make payment, Grantee must accept the terms of the grant as set forth in the following paragraphs. The terms of this award letter constitute the entire agreement between the Foundation and the Grantee and supersede any prior oral or written understandings or communications between them. Please note that the Foundation reserves the right to cancel this grant if a signed copy of this Agreement is not received by the Foundation within 60 days of the date first written above.

Tax Status. Grantee confirms that it is a governmental unit referred to in Section 170(c)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code, or a Federal, state, local, or foreign government body, agency, or instrumentality that is treated as an organization described in Code Sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(1).

Use of Grant Funds. Grantee agrees that the grant funds will be used exclusively for charitable purposes as described in Section 501(c)(3) or Section 170(c)(1) of the Internal Revenue Code, and only in support of the activities described in Grantee's proposal of September 13, 2019 and the budget attached thereto. Funds not used during the term of the grant (September 27, 2019 to November 27, 2019) must be returned to the Foundation unless an extension is approved at Grantee's request and in the Foundation's discretion.

Grantee agrees to repay to the Foundation any portion of the grant funds expended in violation of this Agreement.

Prohibited Use of Funds. Grantee agrees to not use any portion of the grant funds to any extent for any of the following:

- a. To participate in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office or to otherwise influence the outcome of any specific public election as described in Section 4945(d)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code; or
- b. For any non-charitable purposes.

Prohibition on Lobbying Activity. No grant funds may be used for the carrying on of propaganda or attempting to influence legislation within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code Sections 501(h), 4945(d)(1) and 4945(e) and related regulations (these provisions include local, state, federal, and foreign legislation), and neither Grantee nor the Foundation has entered into any agreement, oral or written, to the contrary.

Please note that in the event Grantee uses any of the grant funds to influence governmental action in ways permissible under the Internal Revenue Code and the terms of this Agreement, Grantee may have lobby reporting or other disclosure requirements under the laws of a particular state or other jurisdiction; note further, that state law may include influencing state administrative agencies within the definition of lobbying. Grantee acknowledges that Grantee is solely responsible for complying with any and all applicable lobby reporting or other disclosures.

Special Limitations for Ballot Questions. The Foundation intends that the grant funds shall not be used to influence the qualification or passage of any ballot question or similar legislative decision put to voters. As an essential condition for receiving the grant funds, Grantee shall not use any portion of the grant funds in any manner that would cause the Foundation to be identified as funding reportable lobbying, or require the Foundation to register under any applicable state or local disclosure law, except as may otherwise be provided in this Agreement.

Human Subject Research. Safeguarding the rights and welfare of human subjects involved in research is principally the responsibility of the Grantee. However, while the Foundation does not micromanage or seek to interfere in the implementation of grants, Grantees conducting human subject research must have appropriate standards to ensure compliance with generally accepted research ethics. If grant funds will be used in whole or in part for research involving human subjects, Grantee represents that it has such rules and review processes in place and that these rules and processes will be followed. (Such processes may include: obtaining and maintaining institutional review board (or a research ethics review committee) approval, and informed consent of participating research subjects.) Grantee agrees that any subgrant or subcontract awarded by Grantee in its performance of the activities under this grant shall include similar rules and processes in regards to human subject research. Grantee Control of Funds. Grantee acknowledges that there is no agreement, oral or written, whereby the Foundation has designated or earmarked any part of the grant funds for any specific named organization or individual. Furthermore, Grantee retains full authority and control over the selection process of any re-grants contemplated under the proposal. Specifically, any re-grants will be approved by the Grantee's Board of Directors or its designee. The Foundation may not select re-grantees.

Reporting. Grantee agrees to submit a narrative and financial report on use of the grant funds during the grant period. Reports should be submitted according to the following schedule:

Grant Payment. The Foundation's disbursement of payments is contingent upon the Foundation's determination, in its sole discretion, that satisfactory performance of the grant purpose has occurred and is likely to continue to occur. Funding may be modified or discontinued, and any unspent grant funds must be repaid, if at any time the Foundation determines that the conditions of this Agreement are not being met or that satisfactory performance has not occurred.

Grant payments will be made by wire transfer into the Grantee's bank account in accordance with the instructions on the signed wire transfer form, which is incorporated herein by reference.

Grant Conditions (Financial Accounting Treatment Only). While grant funds are restricted and intended for use for the purposes described in this Agreement, for financial accounting treatment, the grant funds shall not be deemed to be conditioned upon the accomplishment of any particular, measurable goal or metric, unless that condition is specifically identified in the space below:

Compliance with Laws; Government Officials. Grantee represents to the Foundation that Grantee is legally authorized to enter into this Agreement and that Grantee has complied with and will continue to comply with all applicable local, state, federal and international laws or requirements, including laws governing contacts with government officials (e.g., anti-bribery laws such as the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act) and anti-terrorism laws and sanctions, in connection with the performance of the activities under this grant.

Grantee further represents, except as otherwise set forth in this Agreement, that there is no agreement, written or oral, between the Foundation and the Grantee whereby the Foundation may direct the activities of the Grantee, including, if applicable, causing the selection of any government official to attend or participate in any event or activity of the Grantee. The Grantee exercises control over that selection process and makes the selection completely independent of the Foundation. Grantee acknowledges that the Foundation is relying upon the representations made by the Grantee in this section in determining that there is no legal impediment to the Foundation's making a grant to the Grantee.

Anti-Terrorism. You will not use funds provided under this Grant Agreement, directly or indirectly, in support of activities (a) prohibited by U.S. laws related to combatting terrorism; (b) with or related to parties on the List of Specially Designated Nationals (www.treasury.gov/sdn); or (c) with or related to countries against which the U.S. maintains a comprehensive embargo (currently, Cuba, Iran, (North) Sudan, Syria, North Korea, and the Crimea Region of Ukraine), unless such activities are fully authorized by the U.S. government under applicable law and specifically approved by the Foundation in its sole discretion. Further, you represent that Grantee is not the target of economic or trade sanctions, and Grantee will immediately inform the Foundation if Grantee becomes the target of economic or trade sanctions, including any ownership or control of Grantee by one or more persons on the List of Specially Designated Nationals.

Notification. Grantee agrees to notify the Foundation promptly of any organizational changes during the term of the grant, including, but not limited to, changes in key personnel and changes in tax status, and changes in the project timing or goals. Any such notification shall be provided in writing, which may be by electronic mail to the Program Officer or other Foundation representative responsible for overseeing this grant.

Evaluation. The Foundation may choose to conduct an evaluation of the effectiveness of this grant (the "Evaluation") either individually or as part of a broader Foundation strategy.

Grantee agrees to cooperate in the Evaluation and provide such information to the Foundation or its representatives as is reasonably requested.

In such cases, the Foundation agrees to first share the results of the Evaluation with the Grantee and provide an opportunity for the Grantee to comment.

Grant Disclosure and Acknowledgement. This data generally includes grantee name, grant amount, duration, award date and purpose. No additional permission from the Foundation is required for a grantee to share this information. All uses beyond this period must be pre-approved in writing by the Foundation, which may be granted or withheld in the sole and absolute discretion of the Foundation.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board authorization to reject all bids and rebid for Bid Package No. 1 – K-8 Music Expansion at Heninger Elementary School.

RATIONALE:

The legal advertisement of the notice calling for bids was placed in the Orange County Reporter on August 9, 2019, and August 16, 2019. On September 5, 2019, staff received and opened three bids. EXCLUSIVE AUTHORIZATION

FOR LEASE OR PURCHASE OF PROPERTY

Santa Ana Unified School District (SAUSD) and/or any other affiliated entities ("Client") hereby authorizes Lee & Associates -Orange, Inc. ("L&A") to act as its representative during the term and in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement and grants to L&A, the exclusive right to represent its interests in continuing to monitor real estate opportunities for the District's various real estate needs. L&A will conduct a survey of available or potentially available property for lease or purchase and facilitate a forum for ensuing contract negotiations. Further terms of the exclusive agreement between Client and L&A are as follows:

- 1. TERM: The term of this Agreement shall commence on October 9, 2019, and will end at midnight on October 9, 2020, or sooner, unless terminated in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement, upon thirty (30) days written notice by client to cancel Exclusive Authorization between Client and L&A.
- 2. L&A'S SERVICES: L&A will enlist the best efforts of its firm to monitor and secure a location(s) satisfactory to Client, and if L&A deems it necessary, and with the written consent of Client, L&A will also solicit the cooperation of other licensed real estate brokers. L&A will contact potential developers/landlords and will acquire the details on all contemplated or presently available locations and present to Client those that, in L&A's opinion, are the most suitable for Client's purposes. If and when Client decides on a location(s), L&A will coordinate the process of Request for Proposals and will then advise and assist Client, as Client may request, with the negotiation of the terms of the transaction on Client's behalf and in Client's interest. Client must approve all such Requests for Proposals in writing prior to dissemination. L&A acknowledges that it has no authority to make any commitments or enter into any agreement whatsoever on behalf of Client and L&A shall not represent to any person or entity that L&A has any such authority.
- 3. CLIENT REFERRALS: Client will advise L&A of all inquiries and offerings received by Client regarding the purchase or lease of property in the target area.
- 4. BROKER RECOGNITION: Client agrees to recognize L&A as its sole and exclusive broker in connection with any prospective locations submitted by L&A to Client during the term of this Agreement. Except as otherwise provided in Paragraph 12 of this Agreement, subsequent to the expiration of this Agreement, Client agrees to continue to recognize L&A as its sole and exclusive broker for a period of six months expiring midnight on July 31, 2020 in connection with any prospective locations submitted by L&A to Client during the term of this Agreement. Client agrees that such a period will be extended for so long as negotiations with respect to a prospective location submitted by L&A to Client are continuing.
- 5. COMMISSION: There are no fees, commissions or other sums to be paid to L&A by Client. L&A will look exclusively to the landlord or seller for the payment of a commission or fee.

- 6. PROPERTY INFORMATION: Client acknowledges that L&A is not responsible to determine whether toxic or hazardous wastes or substances or other undesirable materials are present, or whether defective conditions exist, at the property which ultimately may be leased or purchased, provided, however, that L&A shall disclose to Client any such information of which L&A is aware. Client acknowledges that it is solely Client's responsibility to conduct final investigations or determine the presence of such materials.
- 7. OTHER CLIENTS: Client acknowledges that L&A may represent potential developers/landlords or sellers and L&A agree that L&A shall disclose any such representations to Client in writing, and upon disclosure, L&A will seek Client's consent to such dual representation.
- 8. FEES AND EXPENSES: If either party institutes legal action to enforce its rights under this Agreement, the prevailing party will be entitled to recover its reasonable attorney's fees and other costs so incurred.

ITEM SUMMARY:

The new job description focuses on the Multi-Tiered Systems of Support work centered specifically around behavior.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval of the new job description: Muti-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) Coordinator of Behavior. The MTSS Coordinator of Behavior must have a high level of understanding in the area of behavior and the ability to perform technical job functions.

RATIONALE:

When appropriate positive behavioral interventions and supports are utilized to address problem behaviors, we are able to increase student outcomes. With lack of support to address behavioral challenges, teachers and administrators lean on exclusionary practices resulting in out-of-school suspension, loss of average daily attendance (ADA), and more importantly, loss of instructional minutes. These achievement gaps continue to perpetuate gaps in the student's academic program potentially resulting in referrals for special education assessment.

The District has adopted a Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) framework which includes Behavior. Through the work of the MTSS Committee, a Behavior Action Plan was developed. Through the planning and implementation of the MTSS District team and the Behavior Action Plan, the need for a MTSS Coordinator of Behavior was identified. This positions primary focus is to implement and expand Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports and provide support to sites with students exhibiting challenging behavior. Additionally, using the MTSS model, they would prioritize tiered interventions as well as implement, integrate, evaluate and sustain Behavior programming and supports by developing professional development and coaching for teachers and administrators. This position will report to the Assistant Superintendent, School Performance and Culture, or designee.

The new job description is attached.

SCOPE:

The Governing Board is committed to ensuring accountability to the public for the fiscal health of the District. The Board shall adopt sound fiscal policies and oversee the District's financial condition.

POLICY:

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all financial reports are prepared in accordance with law and in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles and financial reporting standards stipulated by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board and the California Department of Education (CDE). He/she shall establish a system of ongoing internal controls to ensure the reliability of financial reporting.

When required by law or the Board, the Superintendent or designee shall submit to the Board reports of the District's financial status, including, but not limited to, any report specified in this Board policy or accompanying administrative regulation. When any such report must be approved by the Board prior to its submission to a local, state, and/or federal agency, the Superintendent or designee shall provide the report to the Board in sufficient time to enable the Board to carefully review the report and meet any applicable submission deadline.

The Board shall regularly communicate the District's financial position to the public and shall use financial reports to determine what actions and budget amendments, if any, are needed to ensure the District's financial stability.

If District conditions predict fiscal distress or indicate that the District might not be able to meet its fiscal obligations, the Board and Superintendent or designee shall act quickly to identify and resolve these conditions. The Board shall work cooperatively with the County Superintendent of Schools to improve the District's fiscal health and may contract with an external individual or organization to advise the District on fiscal matters.

Unaudited Actual Receipts and Expenditures:

On or before September 15, the Board shall approve and file with the County Superintendent a statement of the District's unaudited actual receipts and expenditures for the preceding fiscal year. The Superintendent or designee shall prepare this statement using the state's standardized account code structure (SACS) as prescribed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction (SPI).

Gann Appropriations Limit Resolution:

On or before September 15, the Board shall adopt a resolution identifying, pursuant to Government Code 7900-7914, the District's estimated appropriations limit for the current fiscal year and the actual appropriations limit for the preceding fiscal year. Documentation used to identify these limits shall be

made available to the public on the day of the Board meeting.

Interim Reports/Certification of Ability to Meet Fiscal Obligations:

The Superintendent or designee shall submit two interim fiscal reports to the Board, the first report covering the District's financial and budgetary status for the period ending October 31 and the second report covering the period ending January 31. The reports and supporting data shall be made available by the District for public review.

Within 45 days after the close of the period reported, the Board shall approve the interim report and certify, on the basis of the interim report and any additional financial information known by the Board, whether the District will be able to meet its fiscal obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year and, based on current forecasts, for the two subsequent fiscal years. The certification shall be classified as one of the following:

- 1. "Positive certification" indicating that the District will meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year and two subsequent fiscal years
- 2. "Qualified certification" indicating that the District may not meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year or two subsequent fiscal years
- 3. "Negative certification" indicating that the District will be unable to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year or the subsequent fiscal year

The Superintendent or designee shall submit a copy of each interim report and certification to the County Superintendent using the state's SACS software, as prescribed by the SPI.

If the District's certification is subsequently changed by the County Superintendent from a positive to a qualified or negative certification, or from a qualified to a negative certification, the Board may appeal the decision to the SPI within five days of receiving the notice of change.

Whenever the District receives a qualified or negative certification from the Board or the County Superintendent, the Superintendent or designee shall cooperate in the implementation of any remedial actions taken or prescribed by the County Superintendent under the authority granted to him/her pursuant to Education Code 42131.

If the second interim report is accompanied by a qualified or negative certification, the Board shall, no later than June 1, provide to the County Superintendent, the State Controller, and the SPI a financial statement as of April 30 ("third interim report") that projects the District's fund and cash balances through June 30.

At any time during the year when the County Superintendent conducts a comprehensive review of the District's financial and budgetary conditions after he/she has determined that the District's budget does not comply with state criteria and standards for fiscal stability, the Board shall review the County Superintendent's recommendations at a public Board meeting. Within 15 days of receiving the report, the District shall notify the County Superintendent and the SPI of its proposed actions on the recommendation.

Audit Report:

By April 1 of each year, the Board shall provide for an annual audit of the District's books and accounts. To conduct the audit, the Board shall select a certified public accountant or public accountant licensed by the State Board of Accountancy from among those deemed qualified by the State Controller. The Board shall not select any public accounting firm to provide audit services if the lead or coordinating audit partner having primary responsibility for the audit, or the audit partner responsible for reviewing the audit, has performed audit services for the District in each of the six previous fiscal years.

No later than December 15, the report of the audit for the preceding fiscal year shall be filed with the County Superintendent, the CDE, and the State Controller.

Prior to December 15 whenever possible, but in no case later than January 31, the Board shall review, at an open meeting, the annual District audit for the prior year, any audit exceptions identified in that audit, the recommendations or findings of any management letter issued by the auditor, and any description of correction or plans to correct any exceptions or any issue raised in a management letter. The Board shall have an opportunity at the meeting to ask questions of the auditor and request further information about the audit findings.

DESIRED OUTCOME:

To ensure the District's budget and financial operations support the District's goals for student achievement.

Within 45 days after the close of the period reported, the Board shall approve the interim report and certify, on the basis of the interim report and any additional financial information known by the Board, whether the District will be able to meet its fiscal obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year and, based on current forecasts, for the two subsequent fiscal years. The certification shall be classified as one of the following:

- 1. "Positive certification" indicating that the District will meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year and two subsequent fiscal years
- 2. "Qualified certification" indicating that the District may not meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year or two subsequent fiscal years
- **3.** "Negative certification" indicating that the District will be unable to meet its financial obligations for the remainder of the fiscal year or the subsequent fiscal year

The Superintendent or designee shall submit a copy of each interim report and certification to the County Superintendent using the state's SACS software, as prescribed by the SPI.

If the District's certification is subsequently changed by the County Superintendent from a positive to a qualified or negative certification, or from a qualified to a negative certification, the Board may appeal the decision to the SPI within five days of receiving the notice of change.

Whenever the District receives a qualified or negative certification from the Board or the County Superintendent, the Superintendent or designee shall cooperate in the implementation of any remedial actions taken or prescribed by the County Superintendent under the authority granted to him/her pursuant to Education Code 42131.

If the second interim report is accompanied by a qualified or negative certification, the Board shall, no later than June 1, provide to the County Superintendent, the State Controller, and the SPI a financial statement as of April 30 ("third interim report") that projects the District's fund and cash balances through June 30.

At any time during the year when the County Superintendent conducts a comprehensive review of the District's financial and budgetary conditions after he/she has determined that the District's budget does not comply with state criteria and standards for fiscal stability, the Board shall review the County Superintendent's recommendations at a public Board meeting. Within 15 days of receiving the report, the District shall notify the County Superintendent and the SPI of its proposed actions on the recommendation.

Audit Report:

By April 1 of each year, the Board shall provide for an annual audit of the District's books and accounts. To conduct the audit, the Board shall select a certified public accountant or public accountant licensed by the State Board of Accountancy from among those deemed qualified by the State Controller. The Board shall not select any public accounting firm to provide audit services if the lead or coordinating audit partner having primary responsibility for the audit, or the audit partner responsible for reviewing the audit, has performed audit services for the District in each of the six previous fiscal years.

No later than December 15, the report of the audit for the preceding fiscal year shall be filed with the County Superintendent, the CDE, and the State Controller.

Prior to December 15 whenever possible, but in no case later than January 31, the Board shall review, at an open meeting, the annual District audit for the prior year, any audit exceptions identified in that audit, the recommendations or findings of any management letter issued by the

auditor, and any description of correction or plans to correct any exceptions or any issue raised in a management letter. The Board shall have an opportunity at the meeting to ask questions of the auditor and request further information about the audit findings.

SCOPE:

The Governing Board recognizes the right of citizens to have access to public records of the district.

POLICY:

The Board intends the district to provide any person reasonable access to the public records of the schools and district during normal business hours and within the requirements of law.

In response to a public records request, the Superintendent or designee shall make reasonable efforts to locate the requested records, including, but not limited to, any electronic communication substantively related to the records, such as email, text messages, instant messages, and other electronic communications, regardless of whether they are transmitted through a district-provided device or account or through an employee's or Board member's personal device or account. (cf. 4040 - Employee Use of Technology) (cf. 9012 - Board Member Electronic Communications)

The District may charge for copies of public records or other materials requested by individuals or groups. The charge shall be based on actual costs of duplication, as determined by the Superintendent or designee and as specified in administrative regulation.

In order to help maintain the security of district records, members of the public granted access shall examine records in the presence of a district staff member.

Public access shall not be given to records listed as exempt from public disclosure in the California Public Records Act and other state or federal law.

RATIONALE:

Bylaw updated to delete an outdated deadline for adopting a plan to delay the consolidation of board elections with statewide elections as required due to low voter turnout. Bylaw reflects NEW LAW (AB 2449, 2018).Bylaw also adds optional paragraph regarding the provision of information to board candidates regarding the responsibilities and expectations of board members, expands requirements related to campaign conduct, and clarifies provisions related to the publication of a candidate's statement of qualifications.

RECOMMENDATION:

First reading of revised Board Bylaw (BB) 9220 - Governing Board Elections.

SCOPE:

The Board of Education shall consist of members whose terms shall be staggered so that, as nearly as practicable, one half of the members shall be elected at each regular Board of Education election. (Education Code 1000, 1007) Election procedures shall be followed in accordance with state and federal law.

Board Member Qualifications

Any person other than the County Superintendent of Schools, a member of the county office of education (COE) staff, or an employee of a school district that is within the jurisdiction of the Board of Education is eligible to be a member of the Board of Education if that person is an elector of the trustee area to be represented and is not legally disqualified from holding civil office. (Education Code 1000, 1006) is eligible to be a Governing Board member, without further qualifications, if he/she is 18 years of age or older, a citizen of California, a resident of the school district, a registered voter and not legally disqualified from holding civil office. Any person who has been convicted of a felony involving the giving, accepting, or offering of a bribe, embezzlement or theft of public funds, extortion, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any such crime, under California law or the law of another state, the United States of America, or another country, is not eligible to be a candidate for office or be elected as a Board of Education member unless except when he/she has been granted a pardon in accordance with law. (Education Code 35107; Elections Code 20)

The Board of Education encourages all candidates to become knowledgeable about the role of the Board of Education. Upon request, all candidates shall be provided with information that will enable them to understand the responsibilities and expectations of being a Board of Education member, including information regarding available workshops, seminars, and/or training, the county election official's contact information, and general information about school programs, COE operations, and Board of Education responsibilities. (cf. 9230 - Orientation) (cf. 9240 - Board Training)

POLICY: Election Date

To reduce costs associated with conducting elections, the election of Board of Education members shall be consolidated with the local municipal or statewide primary or general election in accordance with a Board of Education resolution approved by the Board of Education of Supervisors. (Elections Code 1302, 10404.5) A member whose term has expired shall continue to discharge the duties of the office until a successor has qualified by taking the oath of office. (Government Code 1302, 1360)

Campaign Conduct



All candidates, including current Board of Education members running as incumbents, shall abide by local, state, and federal requirements regarding campaign donations, funding, and expenditures. No candidate shall expend or accept any public money for the purpose of seeking elective office, unless the COE has established a dedicated fund for those seeking election to the Board of Education and such funds are available to all qualified candidates without regard to incumbency or political preference. (Government Code 85300)

In order to help protect the public's trust in the electoral process as well as the public's confidence in the Board of Education and the COE, the Board of Education encourages all candidates to sign and adhere to the principles in the Code of Fair Campaign Practices pursuant to Elections Code 20440.

A district employee elected to the Board shall resign his/her employment before being sworn in or shall have his/her employment automatically terminated upon being sworn into office. (Education Code 35107) (cf. 9270 - Conflict of Interest)

Board election procedures shall be conducted in accordance with the California Education Code and Elections Code. (cf. 9110 - Terms of Office)

DESIRED OUTCOME: Statement of Qualifications

On the 125th day prior to the day fixed for the general election, the Board of Education secretary or designee shall deliver a notice, bearing the secretary's signature and seal, to the county elections official describing both of the following: The Board secretary shall notify the county eleck of this policy on or before the 125th day before each Board member election. (Elections Code 10509)

1. The elective offices of the Board of Education to be filled at the general election and which offices, if any, are for the balance of an unexpired term

2. Whether the Board of Education or the candidate is to pay for the publication of a statement of qualifications pursuant to Elections Code 13307

Candidate<mark>s for the Board of Education may submit a candidate</mark> statements to the elections official for inclusion in the voter's pamphlet. Candidate statements shall be limited to no more than 200 words. (Elections Code 13307)

When the elections official allows for the electronic distribution of candidate statements, a candidate for the Board of Education may, in addition to or instead of submitting a candidate statement for inclusion in the mailed voter's pamphlet, prepare and submit a candidate statement for electronic distribution.



The Board of Education The district shall assume no part of the cost of printing, handling, translating or mailing candidate statements filed pursuant to Elections Code 13307. As a condition of having candidate statements included in the voter's pamphlet, the Board of Education Candidates may be required candidates to pay their pro rata share of these costs to the Board of Education district in advance as specified in Elections Code 13307.

Campaign Contributions and Expenditures

The Board believes that the district and community will be best served by imposing a limitation upon campaign contributions in accordance with Board Resolution #11/12-2926. Campaign expenditures shall be in accordance with the California Political Reform Act which creates certain voluntary expenditure limits. (Government Code 85100, et.seq)

Tie Votes in Board Member Elections

Whenever a tie makes it impossible to determine which of two or more candidates has been elected to the **Board of Education**, the **Board of Education** shall immediately notify the candidates who received the tie votes of the time and place where the candidates or their representatives should appear before the **Board of Education**. At that time the Board of Education lots shall be cast to determine the winner by lot. (Education Code 5016)

SCOPE:

The Board of Education shall consist of members whose terms shall be staggered so that, as nearly as practicable, one half of the members shall be elected at each regular Board of Education election. (Education Code 1000, 1007) Election procedures shall be followed in accordance with state and federal law.

Board Member Qualifications

Any person other than the County Superintendent of Schools, a member of the county office of education (COE) staff, or an employee of a school district that is within the jurisdiction of the Board of Education is eligible to be a member of the Board of Education if that person is an elector of the trustee area to be represented and is not legally disqualified from holding civil office. (Education Code 1000, 1006) Any person who has been convicted of a felony involving the giving, accepting, or offering of a bribe, embezzlement or theft of public funds, extortion, perjury, or conspiracy to commit any such crime, under California law or the law of another state, the United States of America, or another country, is not eligible to be a candidate for office or be elected as a Board of Education member unless granted a pardon in accordance with law. (Elections Code 20)

The Board of Education encourages all candidates to become knowledgeable about the role of the Board of Education. Upon request, all candidates shall be provided with information that will enable them to understand the responsibilities and expectations of being a Board of Education member, including information regarding available workshops, seminars, and/or training, the county election official's contact information, and general information about school programs, COE operations, and Board of Education responsibilities. (cf. 9230 - Orientation) (cf. 9240 - Board Training)

POLICY: Election Date

To reduce costs associated with conducting elections, the election of Board of Education members shall be consolidated with the local municipal or statewide primary or general election in accordance with a Board of Education resolution approved by the Board of Education of Supervisors. (Elections Code 1302, 10404.5) A member whose term has expired shall continue to discharge the duties of the office until a successor has qualified by taking the oath of office. (Government Code 1302, 1360)

Campaign Conduct

All candidates, including current Board of Education members running as incumbents, shall abide by local, state, and federal requirements regarding campaign donations, funding, and expenditures. No candidate shall expend or accept any public money for the purpose of seeking elective office, unless the COE has established a dedicated fund for those seeking election to the Board of Education and such



funds are available to all qualified candidates without regard to incumbency or political preference. (Government Code 85300)

The elective offices of the Board of Education to be filled at the general election and which offices, if any, are for the balance of an unexpired term

2. Whether the Board of Education or the candidate is to pay for the publication of a statement of qualifications pursuant to Elections Code 13307

Candidates for the Board of Education may submit a candidate statement to the elections official for inclusion in the voter's pamphlet. Candidate statements shall be limited to no more than 200 words. (Elections Code 13307)

When the elections official allows for the electronic distribution of candidate statements, a candidate for the Board of Education may, in addition to or instead of submitting a candidate statement for inclusion in the mailed voter's pamphlet, prepare and submit a candidate statement for electronic distribution.

The Board of Education shall assume no part of the cost of printing, handling, translating or mailing candidate statements filed pursuant to Elections Code 13307. As a condition of having candidate statements included in the voter's pamphlet, the Board of Education may require candidates to pay their pro rata share of these costs to the Board of Education in advance as specified in Elections Code 13307.

Tie Votes in Board Member Elections

Whenever a tie makes it impossible to determine which of two or more candidates has been elected to the Board of Education, the Board of Education shall immediately notify the candidates who received the tie votes of the time and place where the candidates or their representatives should appear before the Board of Education. At that time the Board of Education shall determine the winner by lot. (Education Code 5016)

SCOPE:

No matters other than those announced in open session shall be acted upon during the closed session. (Government Code 54957.7) (cf. 9321 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas)

POLICY:

The Board shall reconvene in open session before adjourning and report closed session actions, the votes or abstentions thereon, and other disclosures required by Government Code 54957.1. These disclosures may be made at the location announced in the agenda for the closed session, as long as the public is allowed to be present at that location for the purpose of hearing them. (Government Code 54957.7)

Disclosure of Information

Information relative to the above closed session items are to be disclosed only in accordance with:

- 1. An order by a court, or other formal legal proceedings.
- 2. Authorization by a majority of the Board. If such information and/or action shall be disclosed, it shall be in an open Board meeting by the President of the Board, or the Board's designated representative.

Violation of Disclosure of Information

A violation of disclosure of information by one or more persons is considered to be a violation of this Bylaw, the Brown Act and of the concept of privileged communication. It further would be a violation of the spirit and intent of the legislature which has permitted closed sessions to be held relative to the above matters in order to protect the student, the employee, and the District from unwarranted embarrassment, possible deleterious affect regarding litigation, real property purchase or sale, employment, or negotiations.

Personnel Matters

The Board shall report any personnel action taken and the votes or abstentions thereon at the public meeting during which the closed session is held. This report shall identify the title of the position. However, the report of a dismissal or nonrenewal of an employment contract shall be deferred until the first public meeting after administrative remedies, if any, have been exhausted. (Government Code 54957.1) (cf. 1312.1 - Complaints Concerning District Employees) (cf. 2123 - Evaluation of the Superintendent) (cf. 4118 - Suspension/Disciplinary Action) (cf. 4218 - Dismissal/Suspension/Disciplinary Action)

Negotiations/Collective Bargaining

Final action on the proposed compensation of one or more unrepresented employees shall not be taken during the closed session. (Government Code 54957.6)



Approval of an agreement concluding closed session labor negotiations with represented employees shall be reported after the agreement is final and has been accepted or ratified by the other party. This report shall identify the item approved and the other party or parties to the negotiation. (Government Code 54957.1) (cf. 4143/4243 - Negotiations/Consultation) (cf. 4143.1/4243.1 - Public Notice - Personnel Negotiations)

Student Matters

Actions related to student matters shall be taken in open session and shall be a matter of public record. No information shall be released in violation of student privacy rights provided in law. (Education Code 35146, 48918; 20 USC 1232))

In an expulsion action, the student's name shall not be disclosed, but the cause for the expulsion shall be disclosed in open session. (cf. 5117 - Interdistrict Attendance) (cf. 5119 - Students Expelled from Other Districts) (cf. 5125 - Student Records) (cf. 5125.3 - Challenging Student Records) (cf. 5144 - Discipline) (cf. 5144.1 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process)

Real Estate Negotiations

Approval of an agreement concluding real estate negotiations shall be reported after the agreement is final. If the Board renders the agreement final, it shall report that approval, the votes or abstentions thereon, and the substance of the agreement in open session at the public meeting during which the closed session is held. If final approval rests with the other party, the Superintendent or designee shall disclose the fact of that approval and the substance of the agreement upon inquiry by any person, as soon as the other party or its agent has informed the district of its approval. (Government Code 54957.1)

Pending Litigation

The Board shall report the following actions related to pending litigation, and the votes or abstentions thereon, at the public meeting during which the closed session is held: (Government Code 54957.1)

- 1. Approval to legal counsel to defend, appeal or not appeal, or otherwise appear in litigation. This report shall identify the adverse parties, if known, and the substance of the litigation.
- 2. Approval to legal counsel to initiate or intervene in a lawsuit. This report shall state that directions to initiate or intervene in the action have been given and that details will be disclosed to inquiring parties after the lawsuit is commenced unless doing so would jeopardize the district's ability to serve process on unserved parties or its ability to conclude existing settlement negotiations to its advantage.

BB 9321.1(c)

3. Acceptance of a signed offer from the other party or parties which finalizes the settlement of pending litigation. This report shall state the substance of the agreement.



If approval is given to legal counsel to settle pending litigation and if final approval rests with the other party or with the court, the district shall report the fact of approval, the substance of the agreement and the vote and abstentions thereon to persons who inquire once the settlement is final. (Government Code 54957.1)

JPA/Self-Insurance Claims

The Board shall report the disposition of joint powers authority or self-insurance claims and the votes or abstentions thereon at the public meeting during which the closed session is held. This report shall include the name of the claimant(s), the name of the agency claimed against, the substance of the claim and the monetary settlement agreed upon by the claimant. (Government Code 54957.1) (cf. 3320 - Claims and Actions Against the District) (cf. 3530 - Risk Management/Insurance)

Review of Assessment Instruments

At the public meeting during which the Board holds a closed session to review student assessment instruments, the Board shall confirm that this review was made. Any actions related to the review shall be taken in open session without revealing any proprietary or confidential information and shall be a matter of public record. (cf. 6162.5 - Student Assessment)

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to present to the Board for first reading, the proposed revisions to the current Board Bylaw (BB) 9321 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas (Revised: First Reading).

RATIONALE:

Bylaw retitled and updated to incorporate material formerly in BB 9321.1 - Closed Session Actions and Reports. Bylaw also adds the requirement to provide final documents approved or adopted during closed session to persons who have submitted a request. Section on "Matters Related to Students" provides that student names should not be included on the agenda or reports of expulsion hearings pursuant to court decision. Section on "Security Matters" reflects the board's authority to meet in closed session with law enforcement officials to develop a tactical response plan. Section on "Real Property Negotiations" reflects Attorney General publication stating the board's authority to approve a final real property agreement in closed session. Section on "Pending Litigation" updates legal cites. Exhibit (1) added to provide examples of agenda descriptions of closed session items. Exhibit (2) added to provide examples of reports of closed session actions that must be made when the board reconvenes in open session following the closed session.

RECOMMENDATION:

First reading of revised Board Bylaw (BB) 9321- Closed Session Purposes and Agendas (Revised: First Reading).

SCOPE:

The Governing Board is committed to complying with state open meeting laws and modeling transparency in its conduct of district business. The Governing Board shall hold **a** closed sessions only for purposes authorized by law. A closed session may be held during a regular, special, or emergency meetings only for purposes authorized by in accordance with law. (Government Code 54954.5)

POLICY:

Each agenda shall contain a general description of each closed session item to be discussed at the meeting, as required by law **and specified below**. (Government Code 54954.2)

The Board shall disclose in open session the items to be discussed in closed session. In the closed session, the Board may consider only those matters covered in its statement. After the closed session, the Board shall reconvene in open session before adjourning the meeting, and when applicable, shall disclose any action taken in the closed session, in the manner prescribed by Government Code 54957.1. (Government Code 54957.7)

(cf. 9320 – Meetings and Notices) (cf. 9322 – Agenda/Meeting Materials)

In the open session preceding the closed session, the Board shall disclose the items to be discussed in closed session. In the closed session, the Board may consider only those matters covered in its statement. (Government Code 54957.7)

After the closed session, the Board shall reconvene in open session before adjourning the meeting and, when applicable, shall publicly disclose any action taken in the closed session, the votes or abstentions thereon, and other disclosures specified below that are applicable to the matter being addressed. Such reports may be made in writing or orally at the location announced in the agenda for the closed session. (Education Code 32281; Government Code 54957.1, 54957.7)

When an action taken during a closed session involves final approval or adoption of a document such as a contract or settlement agreement, the Superintendent or designee shall provide a copy of the document to any person present at the conclusion of the closed session who submitted a written request. If the action taken results in one or more substantive amendments, the Superintendent or designee shall make the document available the next business day or when the necessary retyping is completed. Whenever copies of an approved agreement will not be immediately released due to an amendment, the Board president shall orally summarize the substance of the amendment for those present at the end of the closed session. (Government Code 54957.1)

Confidentiality

A Board member shall not disclose confidential information received in closed session unless the Board authorizes the disclosure of that information. (Government Code 54963)

(cf. 9011 - Disclosure of Confidential/Privileged Information)

The Board shall not disclose any information that is protected by state or federal law. In addition, no victim or alleged victim of tortious sexual conduct or child abuse shall be identified in any Board agenda, notice, announcement or report required by the Brown Act, unless the identity of the person has previously been publicly disclosed. (Government Code 54957.7, 54961)

(cf. 1340 - Access to District Records)

Personnel Matters

The Board may hold a closed sessions under the "personnel exception" to consider the appointment, employment, **performance** evaluation of performance, discipline, or dismissal of an employee. Such a closed session shall not include discussion or action on proposed compensation except for a reduction of compensation that results from the imposition of discipline. (Government Code 54957)

(cf. 2140 - Evaluation of the Superintendent) (cf. 4115 - Evaluation/Supervision) (cf.4118 - Suspension/Disciplinary Action) (cf.4215 - Evaluation/Supervision) (cf. 4218 - Dismissal/Suspension/Disciplinary Action) (cf. 4315 - Evaluation/Supervision)

The Board may hold a closed session to hear complaints or charges brought against an employee by another person or employee, unless the employee who is the subject of the complaint requests an open session. Before the Board holds a closed session on specific complaints or charges brought against an employee, the employee shall receive written notice of his/her right to have the complaints or charges heard in open session if desired. This notice shall be delivered personally or by mail at least 24 hours before the time of the session. (Government Code 54957) (cf. 1312.1 - Complaints Concerning District Employees) (cf. 4112.9/4212.9/4312.9 - Employee Notifications)

The Board may hold a closed sessions to discuss a district employee's application for early withdrawal of funds in a deferred compensation plan when the application is based on financial hardship arising from an unforeseeable emergency due to illness, accident, casualty, or other extraordinary event, as specified in the deferred compensation plan. (Government Code 54957.10)



Agenda items related to district employee appointments and employment shall describe the position to be filled. Agenda items related to performance evaluations shall specify the title of the employee being reviewed. Agenda items related to employee discipline, dismissal, or release require no additional information. (Government Code 54954.5)

After the closed session, the Board shall report any action taken to appoint, employ, dismiss, accept the resignation of, or otherwise affect the employment status of a district employee and shall identify the title of the affected position. The report shall be given at the public meeting during which the closed session is held, except that the report of a dismissal or nonrenewal of an employment contract shall be deferred until the first public meeting after administrative remedies, if any, have been exhausted. (Government Code 54957.1)

(cf. 4117.7/4317.7 - Employment Status Reports)

Negotiations/Collective Bargaining

Unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties involved, the following shall not be subject to the Brown Act: (Government Code 3549.1)

Any meeting and negotiating discussion between the district and a recognized or certified employee organization.

Any meeting of a mediator with either party or both parties to the meeting and negotiating process.

Any hearing, meeting, or investigation conducted by a factfinder or arbitrator.

Any executive (closed) session of the district or between the district and its designated representative for the purpose of discussing its position regarding any matter within the scope of representation and instructing its designated representatives. (cf. 4143/4243 - Negotiations/Consultation) (cf. 4140/4240/4340 - Bargaining Units) (cf. 4143.1/4243.1 - Public Notice - Personnel Negotiations)

The Board may meet in closed session, **prior to and during consultations and discussions with representatives of employee organizations and unrepresented employees,** to review the Board's position and/or instruct its designated representative(s) regarding salaries, salary schedules, or compensation paid in the form of fringe benefits of its represented and unrepresented employees. Prior to the closed session, the Board shall identify its designated representative in open session. Any closed session held for this purpose may include discussions of the district's available funds and funding priorities, but only insofar as they relate to providing instructions to the Board's designated representative. Final action on the proposed compensation of one or more unrepresented employees



shall not be taken in closed session.

(Government Code 54957.6) (cf. 2121 - Superintendent's Contract)

The agenda shall also specify the name of the organization representing the employee(s) or the position title of the unrepresented employee who is the subject of the negotiations. (Government Code 54954.5)

Approval of an agreement regarding labor negotiations with represented employees pursuant to Government Code 54957.6 shall be reported after the agreement is final and has been accepted or ratified by the other party. This report shall identify the item approved and the other party or parties to the negotiation. (Government Code 54957.1)

Matters Related to Students

The Board shall meet in closed session to consider the expulsion of a student, unless the student submits a written request at least five days before the date of the hearing that the hearing be held in open session. Regardless of whether the expulsion hearing is conducted in open or closed session, the Board may meet in closed session for the purpose of deliberatingons. (Education Code 48920) and determining whether the student should be expelled. (cf. 5144 – Discipline) (cf. 5144.1 – Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process) (cf. 5144.2 – Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process (Students with Disabilities)

Security Matters

(Government Code 54957) (cf. 0450 Comprehensive Safety Plan) (cf. 3515 Campus Security) (cf. 3516 Emergencies and Disaster Preparedness Plan)

The Board may meet in closed session during an emergency meeting held pursuant to Government Code 54956.5 to meet with law enforcement officials for the emergency purposes specified in Government Code 54957 if agreed to by a two thirds vote of the Board members present. If less than two thirds of the members are present, then the Board must agree by a unanimous vote of the members present. (Government Code 54956.5)



Agenda items related to security matters shall specify the name of the law enforcement agency and the title of the officer, or name of applicable agency representative and title, with whom the Board will consult. (Government Code 54954.5)

Conference with Real Property Negotiatorions

The Board may meet in closed session with its real property negotiator prior to the purchase, sale, exchange, or lease of real property by or for the district in order to grant its negotiator authority regarding the price and terms of payment for the property. (Government Code 54956.8)

Before holding the closed session, the Board shall hold an open and public session to identify its negotiator(s) and the property under negotiation, and specify the person(s) with whom the negotiator may negotiate. For purposes of real property transactions, negotiators may include members of the Board. (Government Code 54956.8)

Agenda items related to real property negotiations shall specify the district negotiator attending the closed session. If circumstances necessitate the absence of a specified negotiator, an agent or designee may participate in place of the absent negotiator so long as the name of the agent or designee is announced at an open session held prior to the closed session. The agenda shall also specify the name of the negotiating parties and the street address of the real property under negotiation. If there is no street address, the agenda item shall specify the parcel number or another unique reference of the property. The agenda item shall also specify whether instruction to the negotiator will concern price, terms of payment, or both. (Government Code 54954.5)

When the Board approves a final agreement concluding real estate negotiations pursuant to Government Code 54956.8, it shall report that approval and the substance of the agreement in open session at the public meeting during which the closed session is held. If final approval rests with the other party to the negotiations, the Superintendent or designee shall disclose the fact of that approval and the substance of the agreement upon inquiry by any person, as soon as the other party or its agent has informed the district's of its approval. (Government Code 54957.1)

Pending Litigation

Based on the advice of its legal counsel, the Board may hold a closed session to confer with or receive advice from its legal counsel regarding pending litigation when a discussion of the matter in open session would prejudice the district's position in the litigation. For this purpose, "litigation" means adjudicatory proceeding, including eminent domain, before a court, administrative body exercising its adjudicatory authority, hearing officer, or arbitrator. (Government Code 54956.9)

Litigation is considered "pending" in any of the following circumstances: (Government Code 54956.9)



Litigation to which the Board is a "party" has been initiated formally. (Government Code 54956.9(a))

A point has been reached where, in the Board's opinion based on the advice of its legal counsel regarding the "existing facts and circumstances," there is a "significant exposure to litigation" against the district, or the Board is meeting solely to determine whether, based on existing facts and circumstances, a closed session is authorized. (Government Code 54956.9(b))

Existing facts and circumstances for these purposes are limited to the following: (Government Code 54956.9)

A. Facts and circumstances that might result in litigation against the district but which the district believes are not yet known to potential plaintiffs and which do not need to be disclosed.

B. Facts and circumstances including, but not limited to, an accident, disasters, incident or transactional occurrence which might result in litigation against the district, which are already known to potential plaintiff(s), and which must be publicly disclosed before the closed session or specified on the agenda.

C. The receipt of a claim pursuant to the Tort Government Claims Act or a written threat of litigation from a potential plaintiff. The claim or written communication must be available for public inspection. (cf. 3320 - Claims and Actions Against the District)

D. A threat of litigation made by a person in an open meeting on a specific matter within the responsibility of the Board.

E. A threat of litigation made by a person outside of an open meeting on a specific matter within the responsibility of the Board, provided that the district official or employee receiving knowledge of the threat made a record of the statement before the meeting and the record is available for public inspection. Such record does not need to identify an alleged victim of tortious sexual conduct or anyone making a threat **of litigation** on **the victim's** his/her behalf or identify an employee who is the alleged perpetrator of any unlawful or tortious conduct, unless the identity of this person has been publicly disclosed.

Based on existing facts and circumstances, the Board has decided to initiate or is deciding whether to initiate litigation. (Government Code 54956.9(c) (d)(4))

Before holding a closed session pursuant to the pending litigation exception, the Board shall state on the agenda or publicly announce the subdivision of Government Code 54956.9 under which the closed session is being held. If authority is based on Government Code 54956.9(a)(d)(1), the Board shall either



state the title or specifically identify the litigation to be discussed or state that doing so would jeopardize the district's ability to effectuate service of process upon unserved parties or to conclude existing settlement negotiations to its advantage. (Government Code 54956.9)

Agenda items related to pending litigation shall be described as a conference with legal counsel regarding either "Existing Litigation" or "Anticipated Litigation." (Government Code 54954.5)

"Existing litigation" items shall identify the name of the case specified by either the claimant's name, names of parties, and or case or claim number, unless the Board states that to identify the case would jeopardize service of process or existing settlement negotiations. (Government Code 54954.5)

"Anticipated litigation" items shall state that there is significant exposure to litigation pursuant to Government Code 54956.9(b)(d)(2) or (3) and shall specify the potential number of cases. When the district expects to initiate a suit, items related to anticipated litigation shall state that the discussion relates to the initiation of litigation pursuant to Government Code 54956.9(c)(d)(4) and shall specify the potential number of cases. The agenda or an oral statement before the closed session may be required to provide additional information regarding existing facts and circumstances described in items #2b-e above. (Government Code 54956.9(c)(d)(3)(B-E))

Following the closed session, the Board shall publicly report, as applicable: (Government Code 54957.1)

1. Approval to legal counsel to defend, appeal or not appeal, or otherwise appear in litigation. This report shall identify the adverse parties, if known, and the substance of the litigation.

2. Approval to legal counsel to initiate or intervene in a lawsuit. This report shall state that directions to initiate or intervene in the action have been given and that the action, defendants, and other details will be disclosed to inquiring parties after the lawsuit is commenced unless doing so would jeopardize the district's ability to serve process on unserved parties or its ability to conclude existing settlement negotiations to its advantage.

3. Acceptance of a signed offer from the other party or parties which finalizes the settlement of pending litigation. This report shall state the substance of the agreement.

If approval is given to legal counsel to settle pending litigation but final approval rests with the other party or with the court, the district shall report the fact of approval and the substance of the agreement thereon to persons who inquire once the settlement is final. (Government Code 54957.1)



Joint Powers Agency Issues

The Board may meet in closed session to discuss a claim for the payment of tort liability losses, public liability losses, or workers' compensation liability incurred by a joint powers agency (JPA) formed for the purpose of insurance pooling or self-insurance authority of which the district is a member. (Government Code 54956.95)

Closed session agenda items related to liability claims shall specify the claimant's name and the name of the agency against which the claim is made. (Government Code 54954.5) (cf. 3530 - Risk Management/Insurance)

(Government Code 54956.96)

The Board member may also disclose the confidential JPA information to district legal counsel in order to obtain advice on whether the matter has direct financial or liability implications for the district. (Government Code 54956.96)

Closed session agenda items related to conferences involving a JPA shall specify the closed session description used by the JPA and the name of the Board member representing the district on the JPA board. Additional information listing the names of agencies or titles of representatives attending the closed session as consultants or other representatives shall also be included. (Government Code 54954.5)

DESIRED OUTCOME Review of Audit Report from California State Auditor's Office

Upon receipt of a confidential final draft audit report from the California State Auditor's Office, the Board may meet in closed session to discuss its response to that report. After public release of the report from the California State Auditor's Office, any Board meeting to discuss the report must be conducted in open



session, unless exempted from that requirement by some other provision of law. (Government Code 54956.75)

Closed session agenda items related to an audit by the California State Auditor's Office shall state "Audit by California State Auditor's Office." (Government Code 54954.5)

Following the closed session, the Board shall publicly confirm that the report was reviewed and a response was prepared.

Review of Assessment Instruments

The Board may meet in closed session to review the contents of any student assessment instrument approved or adopted for the statewide testing system. Before any such meeting, the Board shall agree by resolution to accept any terms or conditions established by the State Board of Education for this review. (Education Code 60617) (cf. 6162.51 - Student Assessment State Achievement Tests)

Agenda items related to the review of student assessment instruments shall state that the Board is reviewing the contents of an assessment instrument approved or adopted for the statewide testing program and that the Education Code **60617** authorizes a closed session for this purpose in order to maintain the confidentiality of the assessment under review.

Following the closed session, the Board shall confirm that the assessment instruments were reviewed. Any actions related to the review shall be taken in open session without revealing any proprietary or confidential information and shall be a matter of public record.

POLICY:

Each agenda shall contain a general description of each closed session item to be discussed at the meeting, as required by law and specified below. (Government Code 54954.2)

The Board shall disclose in open session the items to be discussed in closed session. In the closed session, the Board may consider only those matters covered in its statement. After the closed session, the Board shall reconvene in open session before adjourning the meeting, and when applicable, shall disclose any action taken in the closed session, in the manner prescribed by Government Code 54957.1. (Government Code 54957.7)

In the open session preceding the closed session, the Board shall disclose the items to be discussed in closed session. In the closed session, the Board may consider only those matters covered in its statement. (Government Code 54957.7)

In taking final action, the Board shall not release any information in violation of student privacy rights provided in 20 USC 1232g or other applicable laws. In an expulsion appeal, the Board shall refer to the student number or other identifier and shall not disclose the student's name.

The Board shall meet in closed session to address any student matter over which it has statutory authority, when the matter may involve disclosure of confidential student information.



Real Property Negotiations

The Board may meet in closed session with its real property negotiator prior to the purchase, sale, exchange, or lease of real property by or for the district in order to grant its negotiator authority regarding the price and terms of payment for the property. (Government Code 54956.8)

Before holding the closed session, the Board shall hold an open and public session to identify its negotiator(s) the property under negotiation, and the person(s) with whom the negotiator may negotiate. For purposes of real property transactions, negotiators may include members of the Board. (Government Code 54956.8)

Agenda items related to real property negotiations shall specify the district negotiator attending the closed session. If circumstances necessitate the absence of a specified negotiator, an agent or designee may participate in place of the absent negotiator so long as the name of the agent or designee is announced at an open session held prior to the closed session. The agenda shall also specify the name of the negotiating parties and the street address of the real property under negotiation. If there is no street address, the agenda item shall specify the parcel number or another unique reference of the property. The agenda item shall also specify whether instruction to the negotiator will concern price, terms of payment, or both. (Government Code 54954.5)

When the Board approves a final agreement concluding real estate negotiations pursuant to Government Code 54956.8, it shall report that approval and the substance of the agreement in open session at the public meeting during which the closed session is held. If final approval rests with the other party to the negotiations, the Superintendent or designee shall disclose the fact of that approval and the substance of the agreement upon inquiry by any person, as soon as the other party or its agent has informed the district's of its approval. (Government Code 54957.1)

Pending Litigation

Based on the advice of its legal counsel, the Board may hold a closed session to confer with or receive advice from its legal counsel regarding pending litigation when a discussion of the matter in open session would prejudice the district's position in the litigation. For this purpose, "litigation" means adjudicatory proceeding, including eminent domain, before a court, administrative body exercising its adjudicatory authority, hearing officer, or arbitrator. (Government Code 54956.9)

Litigation is considered "pending" in any of the following circumstances: (Government Code 54956.9)

Litigation to which the Board is a "party" has been initiated formally. (Government Code 54956.9(a))



A point has been reached where, in the Board's opinion based on the advice of its legal counsel regarding the "existing facts and circumstances," there is a "significant exposure to litigation" against the district, or the Board is meeting solely to determine whether, based on existing facts and circumstances, a closed session is authorized. (Government Code 54956.9(b))

Existing facts and circumstances for these purposes are limited to the following: (Government Code 54956.9)

A. Facts and circumstances that might result in litigation against the district but which the district believes are not yet known to potential plaintiffs and which do not need to be disclosed.

B. Facts and circumstances including, but not limited to, an accident, disasters, incident or transactional occurrence which might result in litigation against the district, which are already known to potential plaintiff(s), and which must be publicly disclosed before the closed session or specified on the agenda.

C. The receipt of a claim pursuant to the Government Claims Act or a written threat of litigation from a potential plaintiff. The claim or written communication must be available for public inspection.

D. A threat of litigation made by a person in an open meeting on a specific matter within the responsibility of the Board.

E. A threat of litigation made by a person outside of an open meeting on a specific matter within the responsibility of the Board, provided that the district official or employee receiving knowledge of the threat made a record of the statement before the meeting and the record is available for public inspection. Such record does not need to identify an alleged victim of tortious sexual conduct or anyone making a threat of litigation on the victim's behalf or identify an employee who is the alleged perpetrator of any unlawful or tortious conduct, unless the identity of this person has been publicly disclosed.

Based on existing facts and circumstances, the Board has decided to initiate or is deciding whether to initiate litigation. (Government Code 54956.9 (d)(4))

Before holding a closed session pursuant to the pending litigation exception, the Board shall state on the agenda or publicly announce the subdivision of Government Code 54956.9 under which the closed session is being held. If authority is based on Government Code 54956.9(d)(1), the Board shall either state the title or specifically identify the litigation to be discussed or state that doing so would jeopardize the ability to effectuate service of process upon unserved parties or to conclude existing settlement negotiations to its advantage. (Government Code 54956.9)

Agenda items related to pending litigation shall be described as a conference with legal counsel regarding



either "Existing Litigation" or "Anticipated Litigation." (Government Code 54954.5)

"Existing litigation" items shall identify the name of the case specified by either the claimant's name, names of parties, and or case or claim number, unless the Board states that to identify the case would jeopardize service of process or existing settlement negotiations. (Government Code 54954.5)

"Anticipated litigation" items shall state that there is significant exposure to litigation pursuant to Government Code 54956.9(d)(2) or (3) and shall specify the potential number of cases. When the district expects to initiate a suit, items related to anticipated litigation shall state that the discussion relates to the initiation of litigation pursuant to Government Code 54956.9(d)(4) and shall specify the potential number of cases. The agenda or an oral statement before the closed session may be required to provide additional information regarding existing facts and circumstances described in items #2b-e above. (Government Code 54954.5)

Following the closed session, the Board shall publicly report, as applicable: (Government Code 54957.1)

1. Approval to legal counsel to defend, appeal or not appeal, or otherwise appear in litigation. This report shall identify the adverse parties, if known, and the substance of the litigation.

2. Approval to legal counsel to initiate or intervene in a lawsuit. This report shall state that directions to initiate or intervene in the action have been given and that the action, defendants, and other details will be disclosed to inquiring parties after the lawsuit is commenced unless doing so would jeopardize the district's ability to serve process on unserved parties or its ability to conclude existing settlement negotiations to its advantage.

3. Acceptance of a signed offer from the other party or parties which finalizes the settlement of pending litigation. This report shall state the substance of the agreement.

If approval is given to legal counsel to settle pending litigation but final approval rests with the other party or with the court, the district shall report the fact of approval and the substance of the agreement thereon to persons who inquire once the settlement is final. (Government Code 54957.1)

Joint Powers Agency Issues

The Board may meet in closed session to discuss a claim for the payment of tort liability losses, public liability losses, or workers' compensation liability incurred by a joint powers agency (JPA) formed for the purpose of insurance pooling or self-insurance authority of which the district is a member. (Government Code 54956.95)



Closed session agenda items related to liability claims shall specify the claimant's name and the name of the agency against which the claim is made. (Government Code 54954.5) (cf. 3530 - Risk Management/Insurance)

Following the closed session, the Board shall publicly report the disposition of joint powers agency or self-insurance claims, including the name of the claimant(s), the name of the agency claimed against, the substance of the claim, and the monetary settlement agreed upon by the claimant. (Government Code 54957.1)

When the board of the JPA has so authorized and upon advice of district legal counsel, the Board may meet in closed session in order to receive, discuss, and take action concerning information obtained in a closed session of the JPA that has direct financial or liability implications for the district. During the Board's closed session, a Board member serving on the JPA board may disclose confidential information acquired during a closed session of the JPA to fellow Board members. (Government Code 54956.96)

Closed session agenda items related to conferences involving a JPA shall specify the closed session description used by the JPA and the name of the Board member representing the district on the JPA board. Additional information listing the names of agencies or titles of representatives attending the closed session as consultants or other representatives shall also be included. (Government Code 54954.5)

DESIRED OUTCOME Review of Audit Report from California State Auditor's Office

Upon receipt of a confidential final draft audit report from the California State Auditor's Office, the Board may meet in closed session to discuss its response to that report. After public release of the report from the California State Auditor's Office, any Board meeting to discuss the report must be conducted in open session, unless exempted from that requirement by some other provision of law. (Government Code 54956.75)

Closed session agenda items related to an audit by the California State Auditor's Office shall state "Audit by California State Auditor's Office." (Government Code 54954.5)

Following the closed session, the Board shall publicly confirm that the report was reviewed and a response was prepared.

Review of Assessment Instruments

The Board may meet in closed session to review the contents of any student assessment instrument



approved or adopted for the statewide testing system. Before any such meeting, the Board shall agree by resolution to accept any terms or conditions established by the State Board of Education for this review. (Education Code 60617) (cf. 6162.51 - State Achievement Tests)

Agenda items related to the review of student assessment instruments shall state that the Board is reviewing the contents of an assessment instrument approved or adopted for the statewide testing program and that the Education Code 60617 authorizes a closed session for this purpose in order to maintain the confidentiality of the assessment under review.

Following the closed session, the Board shall confirm that the assessment instruments were reviewed. Any actions related to the review shall be taken in open session without revealing any proprietary or confidential information and shall be a matter of public record.
