MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

October 25, 2011

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:10 p.m. by Vice President Richardson. Other members in attendance were Mr. Palacio and Mr. Reyna. Mr. Hernández arrived at 5:15 p.m. and Dr. Yamagata-Noji arrived at 5:55 p.m.

Cabinet members present were Dr. Meléndez de Santa Ana, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Ms. Lohnes, Mr. Dixon, and Ms. Miller.

CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Board Vice President Richardson asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board on matters of Closed Session.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting recessed to Closed Session to consider confidential issues, negotiations, and personnel matters.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:30 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Vice President Richardson.

MOMENT OF SILENCE IN OBSERVANCE OF MR. GEORGE P. HEIDLER, JR.

Board President Hernández turned the meeting over to Dr. Yamagata-Noji.

Dr. Yamagata-Noji asked everyone to pause for a moment of silence in respect and memory of George P. Heidler, Jr., an outstanding member of the community who put his heart and soul into creating educational opportunities for the young people in Santa Ana.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

Dr. Meléndez welcomed all present at the meeting. Superintendent Meléndez's opening report focused on working with the community to remain academically focused.

Dr. Meléndez asked Middle College High School ASB President Jazmin Hall to step to the podium. Jazmin gave an overview of school news and the academic accomplishments. Middle College High School's mission is to provide an academically rigorous and safe learning environment that prepares students for success in high school and higher education.

Dr. Meléndez provided an update of her 100-Day Entry Plan. She was pleased to share that the first two meetings held thus far have been well attended. She has heard many things about what parents would like to see and improve at the schools. The remaining meetings to be held are from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on:

- Wednesday, November 2 at McFadden Intermediate School
- Monday, November 7 at Lathrop Intermediate School
- Wednesday, November 9 at Mendez Fundamental Intermediate School, and
- Tuesday, November 15 at Thorpe Fundamental Elementary School

Dr. Meléndez announced that Jackson Elementary School has been named a finalist for a 2011 Golden Bell Award by the California School Boards Association. The School was nominated as a recipient for the coveted Golden Bell Award for its lunchtime fitness program administered through the Santa Ana Police and Athletic League.

On Thursday, October 20, 2011, the Hispanic Education Endowment Fund recognition dinner took place. Ms. Lucinda Pueblos, Century High School Principal, was honored. She is the 2011 Apple of Gold Award recipient for excellence in K-12 leadership.

Dr. Meléndez shared information of arts events that will be taking place this fall.

- Santa Ana High School Choirs have entered a video competition called "GLEE! Give a Note." Everyone was asked to log on to www.gleegiveanote.com to vote. Santa Ana High School can win up to \$50,000 in prizes.
- In honor of Santa Ana High School's 100 Years on Walnut Anniversary celebration, they will host a benefit concert headlining alumnus Bill Medley of the Righteous Brothers. The concert will be held on Thursday, December 15, at 7:30 p.m., with the goal of supporting the school's "Dollars for Scholars" scholarship program.
- Willard Intermediate School is partnering with New Hope Presbyterian Church in sponsoring the Hope Alive! Keeping Music Alive in the Schools concert on Sunday, November 13, 2011. Grammy award winner Oleta Adams will headline this event and the Santa Ana High Jazz Band will be featured.

• And, on Tuesday, November 1, at 3:30 p.m., Santa Ana Arts Alliance for Education and SAUSD will showcase Santa Ana's Arts Advantage Plan at the Wooden Floor.

The secondary division leaders participated in a strategic retreat at McFadden Intermediate School. Their focus was working towards improving student academics. Topics included: new standards for college readiness, the use of data in planning for the future and tracking student progress, and a review of trends.

Summarized Data of Williams Settlement First Quarterly Report

Dr. Cathie Olsky, Deputy Superintendent, provided a summation of the Williams Settlement first quarterly report. In order to meet the Williams Settlement Uniform Complaint Reporting requirements, staff is required to report summarized data on the nature and resolution of all complaints on a quarterly basis to the County Superintendent of Schools and Governing Board of school districts.

There were no complaints to report during the first quarter.

High School Inc. Academies Quarterly Update

Ms. Dawn Miller, Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services, Secondary, spoke briefly of the partnership agreement with the Santa Ana Chamber of Commerce, which calls for an update. Ms. Miller called Mr. Richard Porras, President of High School Inc. (HSI) Academies to the podium to provide an update on HSI Academies at Valley High School.

Mr. Porras spoke about the Academies highlights which included: New kitchen upgrade – Culinary Arts & Hospitality (CAH); first competitive student team – CAH; first summer program – Health Care Academy; Greeting Card Company, Re-organization & Expansion – Global Business Academy; Television and Video Lab. He gave on overview of the new business partner affiliations and provided a financial update.

Mr. Patrick Yrarrazaval-Correa, Valley High School Principal, spoke briefly about the events that have taken place. Alejandro Hernández, Culinary Arts student, and Laura Tagaleo, Global Business Academy of Finance student, shared their experiences in the Academy. In attendance at the meeting were High School Inc. Board members Susan Dixon, Jack Oakes, and Mark McLoughlin. Ms. Miller gave a special recognition to Mr. Dale Ward, Executive Director, who was also in attendance.
