BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is for the Board to conduct a public hearing at the Board of Education meeting to request approval from the State Board of Education for four waivers under the Quality Education Investment Act (QEIA) of the California Education Code Sections 52055(a), 52055.730 and 52055.740, regarding class size, Teacher Experience Index, and Academic Performance Index (API) requirements as follows:

- Waiver 1 Waiver is requested to allow classes to exceed class size limits as required by QEIA on behalf of Davis, Diamond, Edison, Garfield, Kennedy, Lowell, Martin, Monte Vista, and Wilson elementary schools. A waiver will be submitted for grades 1 through 3. QEIA requires no more than 20 pupils per class in grades 1 through 3 as set forth in the Class Size Reduction Program established in 1996.
- Waiver 2 Waiver is requested to allow classes to exceed class size limits as required by QEIA on behalf of Davis, Diamond, Edison, Garfield, Kennedy, Lowell, Martin, Monte Vista, and Wilson elementary schools, Sierra Preparatory Academy, and Century High School. A waiver will be submitted for class size in grades 4 through 12. QEIA requires at least five students fewer per classroom than the average in the 2006-07 school year with an average of 25 students per classroom school-wide with no class exceeding 27.
- Waiver 3 Waiver is requested to allow classes to exceed class size limits, fall below the Teacher Experience Index, and API growth as required by QEIA on behalf of Spurgeon Intermediate School. QEIA requires at least five students fewer per classroom than the average in 2006-07 school year with an average of 25 students per classroom school-wide with no class exceeding 27. In addition, QEIA requires the school to exceed the API growth target average over the first three years of funding and have an average experience of classroom teacher in the school equal to or exceeding the average for the school district.
- Waiver 4 Waiver is requested to allow classes to exceed class size limits and fall below the Teacher Experience Index as required by QEIA on behalf of Lathrop and Willard Intermediate schools. A waiver will be submitted for class size in grades 6 through 8. QEIA requires at least five students fewer per classroom than the average in the 2006-07 school year with an average of 25 students per classroom school-wide with no class exceeding 27. In addition, QEIA requires the school to have an average experience of classroom teacher in the school equal to or exceeding the average for the school district.

The call for public hearing took place at the September 27, 2011, Board of Education meeting.

RATIONALE:

Administration would like to seek four waivers from the State Board of Education to ensure continued funding for the 2012-13 school year. QEIA schools that do not meet all monitored QEIA program requirements for school year 2010-11 will have their funding terminated. Currently, QEIA funding will end June 30, 2012. There are 106 teachers who are staffed by QEIA funding for the 2011-12 school year.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY QUALITY EDUCATION INVESTMENT ACT (QEIA)

Education Code sections 52055.700-52055.770 established the Quality Education Investment Act (QEIA) of 2006. The goals of the program are:

- Improve the quality of academic instruction and the level of pupil achievement;
- Develop exemplary school district and school practices that will create the working conditions and classroom learning environments that will attract and retain well qualified teachers, administrators, and other staff;
- Focus school resources, including all categorical funds, solely on instructional improvement and services to pupils.

Santa Ana Unified School District has 14 schools that receive funding under QEIA: Davis, Diamond, Edison, Garfield, Kennedy, Lowell, Martin, Monte Vista, and Wilson elementary schools, Lathrop, Sierra, Spurgeon, and Willard intermediate schools, and Century High School.

SAUSD is requesting four waivers from the California State Board of Education:

Waiver 1 To allow classes to exceed class size limits as required by QEIA on behalf of Davis, Diamond, Edison, Garfield, Kennedy, Lowell, Martin, Monte Vista, and Wilson elementary schools. A waiver will be submitted for 1-3; QEIA requires no more than 20 pupils per class in grades 1-3 as set forth in the Class Size Reduction Program established in 1996.

Due to fiscal constraints, class sizes were recalculated and have increased in subsequent years after QEIA was enacted. Changes to the Class Size Reduction program have also been changed to allow classes in grades 1 through 3 to exceed the 20.44 cap to as many as 30 and continue to retain a majority of CSR funding. Approval of this waiver to exceed the 20.44 cap will permit the nine elementary schools to maintain and to continue to receive QEIA funding for 2012-13. Each of the nine elementary schools met the spirit of law and have improved the quality of academic instruction and the level of student achievement.

Waiver 2 To allow classes to exceed class size limits as required by QEIA on behalf of the nine elementary schools, Sierra Preparatory Academy and Century High School. A waiver will be submitted for class size in grades 4-12. QEIA requires at least five students fewer per classroom than the average in the 2005-06 school year with an average of 25 students per classroom school-wide with no class exceeding 27.

Due to fiscal constraints, class sizes were recalculated and have increased in subsequent years after QEIA was enacted. Approval of this waiver to exceed the class sizes pursuant to the QEIA calculation will permit the nine elementary schools, one intermediate and one high school to maintain and to continue to receive QEIA funding for 2012-13. The majority of the schools met QEIA class size requirements. Each of the schools met the spirit of law and have improved the quality of academic instruction and the level of student achievement.

Waiver 3 To allow classes to exceed class size limits, fall below the Teacher Experience Index and API growth as required by QEIA on behalf of Spurgeon Intermediate School. QEIA requires as least five students fewer per classroom than the average in 2006-07 school year with an average of 25 students per classroom school-wide with no class exceeding 27. In addition, QEIA requires the school to exceed the API growth target average over the first three years of funding and have an average experience of classroom teacher in the school equal to or exceeding the average for the school district.

Due to fiscal constraints, class sizes were recalculated and have increased in subsequent years after QEIA was enacted. In addition, QEIA requires funded schools to exceed their API growth target average over the first three years of the program. With the new administrative leadership at Spurgeon Intermediate, the school has made great progress towards its academic growth the past two years. We were able to rehire all teachers who had been laid off the previous year. Per Ed Code and our Collective Bargaining Agreement, we had laid off those with the least seniority.

When they returned to SAUSD, their years of experience when added to the school average, lowered the Teacher Experience Index below the QEIA required target. WHEREAS, District and School District desire to contribute to community health education; WHEREAS, District operates <u>Orange Coast College</u> ("College") and College is a duly accredited educational institution that conducts the program(s) described and identified in Attachment 1 to this Agreement ("the Program");

WHEREAS District has obtained all necessary licenses, consents and/or approvals to conduct the Program from the State of California and any other applicable governmental agency;

WHEREAS, School District operates a duly licensed health care agency at the address listed above and has obtained all necessary licenses, consents, and approvals;

WHEREAS, as part of the Program, students are required to participate in a clinical experience rotation;

WHEREAS, District desires to affiliate with the School District in order that students may participate in a clinical experience rotation at the School District; and

WHEREAS, District and School District desire to enter into this Agreement to memorialize their respective rights, duties and obligations with respect to the clinical experience rotation of students of the College's Program.

For purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:

"District" shall refer to the Coast Community College District, its member Colleges, the District's Governing Board, and each of their trustees, employees, agents, representatives, successor and assigns;

"College" shall refer to <u>Orange Coast College</u>, and each of its instructors, employees, agents, representatives and assigns;

"School District" shall refer to <u>Santa Ana Unified School District</u>, its parents, subsidiaries, related companies, and each of their officers, directors, employees, agents, representatives, successors, and assigns;

The "Program" shall refer to the Clinical training in health science programs as identified and described in Attachment 1 to this Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following covenants, conditions and agreements, the parties hereto agree as follows:

TERMS

1. <u>Clinical Experience Rotation</u>. School District agrees to provide students of the Program who are specified by College with a clinical experience rotation ("Rotation"), in accordance with standards established by governmental agencies and in compliance with the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 as codified at 42 U.S.C. § 1320 through d-8 ("HIPAA") and recognized professional accrediting agencies, and subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

- 2. <u>Development of Curriculum.</u> College shall be fully responsible for the development, planning, and administration of the program, including, without limitation, programming, administration, matriculation, promotion and graduation. College acknowledges and agrees that the rotation is intended to meet certain educational performance objectives, and College shall provide a copy of such performance objectives to School District on or before student placement. School District shall be fully responsible for the availability and appropriateness of the learning environment in relation to the program's written objectives.
- Exposure to Bloodbourne Pathogens. Program students and college faculty will comply with the final regulations issued by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration governing employee exposure to bloodbourne pathogens in the workplace under Section VI(b) of the occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, which regulations became effective March 6, 1992 (the "Regulations"), including but not limited to responsibility as the employer to provide all program students with (a) information and training about the hazards associated with blood and other potentially infectious materials, (b) information and training about the protective measures to be taken to minimize the risk of occupational exposure to bloodbourne pathogens, (c) training in the appropriate actions to take in an emergency involving exposure to blood and other potentially infectious materials, and (d) information as to the reasons the program student should participate in hepatitis B vaccination and post-exposure evaluation and follow-up.
- 4. <u>Application Procedure; Acceptance</u>. College agrees to provide School District with a list of the name(s) of students who will be participating in a rotation.
- 5. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>. The parties agree not to discriminate in the selection, placement or evaluation of any student or faculty member because of race, creed, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, handicap, and/or medical condition.
- 6. <u>Academic Year</u>. The academic year consists of Fall and Spring semesters, summer session and winter break intersession.
- 7. <u>Rotation Schedule</u>. The rotation schedule shall be determined by College and School District and may be amended from time to time by agreement of the parties. The number of students in each rotation shall be limited to a number mutually agreed upon by both parties, not to exceed the number specified by the accrediting agency(s).
- 8. <u>Orientation</u>. College shall provide an orientation for assigned students participating in each rotation.
- 9. <u>Compliance With School District Rules</u>. School District shall make available all applicable governing instruments, policies and procedures, rules and regulations of School District to each student participating in a rotation, and student shall comply with these rules.

In providing the students with the clinical experience rotation that is the subject of this Agreement, School District shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, statutes, policies, procedures, and ordinances and shall be consistent with the professional standards of a health care agency.

10. <u>Confidentiality of School Districts' Students Records.</u> Students and faculty understand and agree that School District's student files are confidential. District and School District each has been advised of and is aware of the federal Health Insurance Portability and

Accountability Act of 1996 as codified at 42 U.S.C. § 1320 through d-8 ("HIPAA") and understands the requirements and regulations promulgated thereunder requiring strict confidentiality of School District's student records. District and School District each understands the federal privacy regulations as contained in 42 C.F.R. Part 164 and the federal security standards as contained in 45 C.F.R. Part 142 (collectively, the "Regulations"). Neither party shall use or further disclose any protected health information of the School District's student or any information as defined in 45 C.F.R. 164.504, or individually identifiable health information in 42 U.S.C. § 1320d (collectively, the "Protected Health Information"), other than as permitted in writing by the healthcare provider and the requirements of HIPAA or its regulations.

- 11. <u>Clinical Coordinator (College)</u>. College agrees to designate a coordinator for each program. The coordinator, who may be an academic instructor, shall be responsible for all teaching activities.
- 12. <u>Clinical Advisor (School District)</u>. School District agrees to designate a clinical advisor or coordinator who shall provide input to the clinical performance and evaluation of College student(s), be a resource person for College's faculty and students, and shall communicate with the clinical coordinator designated by College regarding the proposed curriculum and the performance of individual College students and shall arrange formal orientation to the facility for the College's faculty and students.
- 13. Supervision of Students. The supervision and direction of College students while on site at School District shall be the responsibility of the Clinical Coordinator (College) or designee as guided by the instructional objectives. No direct, hands-on School District student care shall be provided by participating College students at School District, except in accordance with all applicable laws, School District and Medical Staff rules, regulations, policies and procedures. District recognizes the School District students' rights to refuse care provided by a College student at School District.
- 14. Removal of College Students. School District retains the right to exclude any College student at any time from any clinical area. Any College student who is asked to leave by School District shall do so promptly and without protest. School District shall also have the right, at any time, to request College to remove a student permanently from the rotation. Except as otherwise provided under any applicable policies, procedures, rules, regulations, and/or under any law, any such removal shall not require compliance with any notice, hearing or other procedural requirements.
- 15. <u>School District Student Care</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as conferring any right or duty upon College, its students or faculty members, to control or direct School District student care or operations at School District. School District shall maintain sole responsibility and accountability for School District student care and shall provide adequate staffing in number and competency to ensure safe continuous health care during the term of this Agreement.
- 16. <u>College Student Evaluation</u>. In the case of direct supervision of the College's students by the Clinical Instructor (College), he/she shall be responsible for College's student(s) evaluation. Unless otherwise mutually agreed between the Clinical Coordinator (College) and the Clinical Advisor (School District), School District may be responsible for submitting input to the Clinical Coordinator evaluating and appropriately documenting the performance of each College student during the rotation. College shall keep records on the progress and evaluation of each

student's clinical experience during a rotation for a period of three (3) years following the end of the specific rotation in which the student is involved.

- 17. Ongoing Communication/Evaluation. College has the privilege of regularly scheduled meetings with School District staff, including both selected unit personnel and administrative level representatives for the purpose of interpreting, discussing, and evaluating College's health care programs at a mutually agreed upon time.
- 18. <u>Materials</u>. College agrees to provide their students with all educational materials required during the clinical program.
- 19. No Payments or Other Remuneration. College agrees that no fees or monetary payments of any kind shall be exchanged between School District, its agents and employees, and College, its agents, employees and their students under the terms of this Agreement. Further, neither College, its staff members, nor other representatives, shall attempt to bill or collect from any School District's student or from any other source fees for services provided to School District's students by said College student. The only exception shall be when School District and College mutually agree to pay a Clinical Advisor a stipend for duties directly related to College's program.
- 20. <u>No Right To Employment</u>. The parties agree that the students of College shall not be considered employees, agents or volunteers of School District, nor shall any College student be entitled to any right, compensation or benefits normally afforded to employees of School District, including but not limited to, Social Security, unemployment and workers' compensation insurance.
- 21. <u>Insurance Carried By District</u>. District shall assure coverage of professional liability insurance coverage for each College student participating in the Rotation of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate, and said policy shall remain in full force and effect during the term hereof, District shall provide workers' compensation coverage with the statutory requirements of California law for College students participating in the rotation. These coverages are in effect while the College student is on-site at School District and while under the direction of the District.
- 22. <u>Insurance Carried By School District</u>. School District shall secure and maintain comprehensive general liability insurance covering personal injury, property damage, and general liability claims in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate with coverage for incidental contracts. A certificate of insurance must be provided that includes thirty (30) days notice of cancellation, modification, or reduction in said insurance. School District shall deliver certificate(s) of insurance under School District's comprehensive general liability insurance policy on or before the date of execution of this agreement. Upon request District shall be provided a copy of said policy.

School District shall carry professional liability insurance for itself and each of its employee(s), partners, and/or representatives providing professional services at School District, except for District's students and College faculty in the amount of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and three million dollars (\$3,000,000) in the aggregate. School District shall provide District with thirty (30) days written notice prior to any cancellation, or reduction in said insurance. Upon request, District shall be provided a copy of said policy.

School District shall carry workers compensation coverage with the statutory requirements of California law for each of its employees.

- 23. College Student Health Records. Any College student participating in a rotation shall, at the request of School District provide a current statement from his or her physician that the College student is in good health and capable of participating in the rotation. School District, upon request, may require that any College student returning from an extended absence caused by illness or injury submit to a physical examination or present a statement from a physician indicating that the College student is capable of resuming clinical activities. Any such physical examination shall be the financial responsibility of the College student. Any College student participating in a rotation shall provide verification of annual T. B. screening, immune status for rubeola, rubella, and chicken pox, Hepatitis B (or signed waiver for Hepatitis B).
- 24. <u>College Student Medical Care</u>. To the extent that any first aid or emergency care is required in connection with an injury or illness incurred by a College student during performance of his/her training during a rotation, the College student shall be treated by School District as appropriate.
- 25. <u>Confidentiality Of College Student Records</u>. School District shall keep confidential and shall not disclose to any person or entity (i) College student applications; (ii) College student health records or reports; and or (iii) any student records as defined in California Education Code Section 76210 and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. paragraph 1232(g), concerning any College student participating in the ROTATION, unless disclosure is authorized by (i) the student in writing, or (ii) disclosure is ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction. Clinical facilities shall adopt and enforce whatever policies and procedures are necessary to protect the confidentiality of College student records as defined herein.
- 26. <u>College Student Background Check.</u> All College students are required to have completed and submitted a pre-clinical background check including social security number and address verification, a minimum of three county criminal history, seven years history of a sex offender database search and a Medicare/Medicare Sanctioned Fraud List verification (OIG/GSA search). The results of the background checks will be provided to the School District upon request. Participating students will have California Department of Justice fingerprint clearance on file with the College.
- 27. <u>Verification</u>. College warrants and represents that it has obtained all necessary approvals and consents from any and all agencies to enable School District to offer the rotation to College's students participating in the Program. If requested by School District, College will provide School District with verification that the Program is duly licensed, duly accredited and/or certified, as applicable, by appropriate agencies. District covenants and agrees that at all times during the term hereof it shall retain such licensure, accreditation and/or certification, and its Program and faculty members shall continue to meet any and all federal, state and local requirements.
- 28. <u>Indemnification by District</u>. District agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless School District and its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers from any and all claims, actions, losses, damages and/or liability arising out of the performance of this Affiliation Agreement or from any cause whatsoever which may arise because of the negligence, misconduct, or other fault of District, including the acts, errors, or omissions of any officers, employees, instructors, students, or agents of District, for any costs and expenses incurred by School District on account of any claims therefore except where such indemnification is prohibited by law.

- 29. <u>Indemnification by School District</u>. School District agrees to indemnify and hold harmless District and its authorized agents, officers, trustees, volunteers, employees, and students, against any and all claims, actions, losses, damages and/or liability arising out of the performance of this Affiliation Agreement from any cause whatsoever which may arise because of the negligence, misconduct or other fault of School District, including any acts, errors, or omissions of any officers, employees, instructors, or agents of School District, for any costs or expenses incurred by District on account of any claims therefore except where such indemnification is prohibited by law.
- 30. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by and constructed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 31. <u>Assignment.</u> Neither party hereto may assign this Agreement or delegate its duties hereunder without the prior written consent of the other party which can and may be withheld by either party in its sole and absolute discretion.
- 32. Effective Date Termination. This Agreement shall become effective on and shall remain in effect until October 1, 2016, unless sooner terminated by either party in accordance with this section. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving ninety (90) days prior written notice to the other party of its intention to terminate. In the event a rotation is in progress, any written notice to terminate with or without cause shall become effective at the expiration of the rotation. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event the Program is discontinued by College during its Term, this Agreement shall immediately terminate without further action by the parties hereto.
- 33. Notices. Any notices to be given hereunder by either party to the other may be effectuated only in writing and delivered either by personal delivery, or by U.S. mail. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the persons at the addresses set forth below, but each party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally will be deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of ten (10) days after mailing.

Any such notices or communications personally served or delivered by courier shall be effective when received. All notices sent by certified mail shall be effective forty-eight (48) hours after deposit in the mail.

Each party shall make a reasonable, good faith effort to ensure that it will accept or receive notices that are given in accordance with this paragraph. A party may change its address for purposes of this paragraph by giving the other party written notice of a new address in the manner set forth above.

This Student Participation Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Coast
Community College District, a public educational agency ("District") and

("Student"), concerning the Student's participation in a clinical experience rotation ("Clinical Rotation")
at a clinical facility ("Clinical Facility").

In consideration of District allowing Student to participate in the Clinical Rotation at Clinical Facility, Student hereby agrees with the following requirements for participation:

- 1. <u>Compliance With Laws, Rules, and Regulations</u>. While participating in the Clinical Rotation, Student at all times shall abide by and comply with all applicable local, state, and federal laws, rules, statutes, ordinances, regulations, policies, and procedures, including but not limited to those of District and Clinical Facility. The supervision of Student at Clinical Facility shall be the responsibility of the Clinical Coordinator.
- 2. <u>Background Check.</u> Students will be required to submit an application for, complete, and submit a pre-clinical background check. The background check will include a Social Security number and address verification, a three-county felony criminal history, seven-year history of a state sex offender search, and a Medicare/Medicare Sanctioned Fraud List verification (OIG/GSA search). The background checks will be performed by a service approved by the District, and must be completed prior to beginning the first Clinical Rotation. Student understands that the result of background checks will be provided to the clinical sites by the District before patient care or clinical work commences. The procedures for such background checks are set forth in the District's written "Background Check Procedure" which will be provided upon request.

- 3. <u>No Unsupervised Patient Care</u>. There shall be no direct, hands-on patient care by any Student participating in the Clinical Rotation unless said care is provided under the supervision and control of medical or nursing staff and in conformance with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, statutes, ordinances, and policies.
- 4. <u>Confidentiality</u>. Student hereby understands that patient records are confidential and that confidentiality is protected by the rules and regulations of District, all healthcare providers where Student may receive clinical experience and by federal law. Student therefore hereby agrees to keep strictly confidential and hold in trust all confidential information of any healthcare provider and/or its patients and not to review, disclose or reveal any confidential information to any third party without the express or prior written consent of the patient and/or healthcare provider.

Student has been advised of and is aware of the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 as codified at 42 U.S.C. § 1320 through d-8 ("HIPAA") and understands the requirements and regulations promulgated thereunder requiring strict confidentiality of patient records. Student understands the federal privacy regulations as contained in 45 C.F.R. Part 164 and the federal security standards as contained in 45 C.F.R. Part 142 (collectively the "Regulations"). Student shall not use or further disclose any protected health information of the patient or any information as defined in 45 C.F.R. 164.504, or individually identifiable health information in 42 U.S.C. § 1320d (collectively the "Protected Health Information"), other than as permitted in writing by the healthcare provider and the requirements of HIPAA or its regulations. Student further understands that Student is only allowed to

review patient records that are directly related to Student's assignment and for which Student has been specifically authorized to review by Student instructor.

Violations of this confidentiality protection by Student shall subject Student to immediate removal from any clinical experience, a possible failing grade, and expulsion from District and any of its colleges.

5. Release and Hold Harmless. Student hereby releases, discharges, and agrees to hold harmless District, District's governing board ("Board"), and each of its trustees, instructors, employees, agents, and representatives from any and all liability arising out of or in connection with Student's enrollment in the nursing program (Golden West College) or allied health programs (Orange Coast College) and participation in its classes, training courses, activities, field trips, practice sessions, hospital clinical experiences, and related exercises such as the Clinical Rotation and the Clinical Facility. For the purpose of this release, "liability" means all claims, demands, losses, causes of action, suits, or judgments of any kind that Student or Student's heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns may have against District, and any of its trustees, employees, agents, or representatives, or that any other person or entity may have against District, Board, College, and any of their trustees, instructors, employees, agents, and representatives because of Student's failure to pass any course or class or obtain any particular grades, personal injury, accident, illness, or death, or because of any loss of or damage to property that occurs to Student or Student's property during Student's participation in the nursing program or allied health program including classes, training courses, activities, field trips, practice sessions, hospital clinical experiences, and related exercise, such as the Clinical Rotation and the Clinical Facility. that result from any cause, including but not limited to District's or its trustees', employees', agents', or representatives' own passive or active negligence or other acts other than fraud or willful misconduct.

6. Acknowledgement of Inherently Dangerous Activities and Assumption of the Risk Thereof. Student acknowledges that the nature of Student's training in the nursing program/allied health programs may involve dangerous and hazardous activities, including but not limited to exposure to disease, blood pathogens, illness, personal injuries, and possible death. Student acknowledges the inherently hazardous and dangerous nature of these activities and voluntarily participates therein and assumes all risk of injury, illness, or death from Student's participation therein. Student represents and warrants that Student is mentally and physically fit, capable, able, and willing to participate in these inherently hazardous and dangerous activities without any limitations.

7. No Right to Employment; Removal. Student understands and agrees that Student's participation in the Clinical Rotation does not create any right to employment at Clinical Facility. Student understands and agrees that Student may be removed from the Clinical Rotation at any time for any reason, except in violation of any law. If Student is asked to leave by any representative of Clinical Facility, Student shall do so promptly and without protest.

8. General Rules.

- a. Students entering the clinical phase of their education shall read and familiarize Student with all the rules, regulations, and obligations of the Clinical Facility and shall at all times strictly abide thereby.
- b. Clinicals are scheduled courses with specific days and times. Student is to adhere to these and adjust any outside work or activities accordingly. Student must complete a physical within a sixmonth period prior to the start of the clinical phase (see supplied form). The physical may be

completed at the college health center, Student's private physician, or group health care facility. Blood work, urinalysis, and annual T.B. tests or chest x-rays are required as may be immunizations (rubella, rubeola, and varicella titre) or proof of immunity. Hepatitis B vaccine is highly recommended by District or waiver must be signed. Certain clinical sites will not allow Student participation without Hepatitis B vaccination. The completed information must be returned to the clinical coordinator or director of Student's program. See Student's program or clinical coordinator for specific details.

- c. Any Student participating in a Rotation shall, at the request of Clinical Facility, provide a current statement from a physician that the Student is in good health and capable of participating in the Rotation. Clinical Facility may require that any Student, returning from an extended absence caused by illness or injury, submit to a physical examination or present a statement from a physician indicating that the Student is capable of resuming clinical activities. Any such physical examination shall be the financial responsibility of Student.
- d. All Students in a clinical rotation must have an active CPR card (per specific program protocol). If Students CPR card expires at any time during clinical training, it is Student's responsibility to become recertified. Student will be removed from clinical experience rotation if Student does not have an active CPR card.
- e. In programs which require Allied Health 115 Patient Care, Student must enroll in Patient Care just prior to entry into the clinical phase, in accordance with the program schedule sequence. Students taking Allied Health 115 will become CPR certified.
- f. Student must adhere to appropriate dress code and grooming standards designated by Clinical Facility. This may include a laboratory coat or uniform. Closed, soft soled shoes are required. A facility ID badge provided by Clinical Facility will be provided that must be worn at all times at Clinical Facility site. The ID badge shall be returned to Hoag Hospital at conclusion of Student's clinical experience. See Student's program director or clinical coordinator for specific requirements for Student's program.
- g. Specific clinical sites may have certain health related requirements and may include drug testing, Hepatitis B vaccination, or blood work. Student is expected to meet the requirements of the site when scheduled to be at that site. There may be exposure to hazardous materials and blood borne pathogens in the clinical setting. Student must adhere to all safety and universal precautionary measures.
- h. Student must have adequate reliable transportation to the clinical site and will be responsible for parking.
- 9. Acknowledgement. Student has read this Agreement including the background check requirement in Section 2, the release requirements in Section 5, and the assumption of risk provisions in Section 6. Student has read and agrees to abide by and comply with all terms of this Agreement. Student understands that failure to abide by and comply with any term may subject Student to immediate removal from any clinical experience, a possible failing grade, and possible expulsion from District and any of its colleges.

CLINICAL AFFILIATION AGREEMENT - NURSING

Contract # 0796-05

THIS AGREEMENT, is made and entered into on 9/9/11, pursuant to Education Code 89036, by and between Santa Ana Unified School District
hereinafter referred to as the "FACILITY" and the Trustees of the California State University, an agency of the State of California, on behalf of the School of Nursing, CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY DOMINGUEZ HILLS, hereinafter referred to as "UNIVERSITY".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the UNIVERSITY'S BSN, MSN, and Nurse Practitioner Programs in nursing requires its students to have clinical experience and the use of clinical facilities; and

WHEREAS, the FACILITY is willing to permit the use of its clinical facilities and services for the education of said students, under the circumstances herein defined; and

WHEREAS, it is to the mutual benefit of the parties hereto that students of the University's Nursing Program use the clinical facilities of the Facility for their clinical nursing experience,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants, conditions, and stipulations hereinafter expressed and in consideration of the mutual benefits to be derived there from, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I. FACILITY SHALL:

- A. Provide clinical facilities for learning experiences for nursing students designated by the UNIVERSITY. The clinical experience for each student shall cover such period of time as will be specified by the UNIVERSITY.
- B. Maintain clinical facilities in conformance with standards of the Board of Registered Nursing and permit inspection of its clinical facilities upon request by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education, Western Association of Schools and Colleges and by authorized representatives of the UNIVERSITY.
- C. Permit designated students and staff of UNIVERSITY to use all services of the FACILITY herein contracted for. The level of services and the number of students involved shall be determined by mutual agreement between the parties.
- D. Nominate staff members to serve as clinical preceptors. The final selection of the preceptors shall be made by mutual consent between the FACILITY and the Faculty Coordinator. The preceptors shall serve on a volunteer basis in accordance with the Preceptor Policy Handbook found in the following link: http://www.csudh.edu/soh/soh/don/handbookforms.htm
- E. Permit members of the medical and nursing staffs of the FACILITY to participate as their time may permit in the clinical learning experience of the students.
 - F. Upon request, provide insurance for general liability insurance coverage.

II. TRUSTEES, THROUGH THE UNIVERSITY, SHALL:

- A. Designate the students who are enrolled in the Nursing Program of the University to be assigned for clinical nursing experience at the Facility.
- B. Be responsible for all instruction and evaluation of student performance required to meet the course objectives given at the FACILITY to the students so designated.
 - C. Be responsible for keeping all attendance and academic records of the students.
- D. Provide guidance to students in their clinical activities, through an individualized Learning Contract which specifies learning activities to take place within the patient care framework of the FACILITY.

- E. Agree that the students and instructors shall be subject to the requirements and restrictions specified jointly by representatives of the UNIVERSITY and the FACILITY, and subject to the FACILITY's rules and regulations governing conduct.
- F. Require students to provide documentation of appropriate immunizations or immunity in compliance with OSHA Blood-Borne Pathogens Regulations, as well as requirements of the FACILITY.
- G. Provide students with appropriate training regarding obligation to keep confidential all employee and patient information as required by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and its implementing regulations issued by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services at 45 CFR, code of Federal Regulations, parts 160-164.
 - H. Upon request, provide insurance for general liability insurance coverage.

III. General Conditions

- A. THIS AGREEMENT shall become effective upon execution, and shall continue until the expiration date or until cancelled by either party with sixty (60) days advance written notice.
- B. UNIVERSITY shall defend, indemnify and hold FACILITY, its officers, employees and agents harmless from and against any and all liability, loss expense (including reasonable attorneys fees and court costs), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent acts or omissions of UNIVERSITY, its officers, agents, or employees.

FACILITY shall defend, indemnify and hold UNIVERSITY, its officers, employees and agents harmless from and against any and all liability, loss expense (including reasonable attorneys fees and court costs), or claims for injury or damages arising out of the performance of this Agreement but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent acts or omissions of FACILITY, its officers, agents, or employees.

- C. While in the performance of this agreement, students serve as volunteers at the Facility without compensation and are not to be considered officers, agents or employees of the University for Worker's Compensation purposes.
- D. Students shall provide and maintain in force a One Million Dollar (\$1,000,000) policy of professional liability insurance during the course of their activities under this agreement.



BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval to submit a waiver application to the State Board of Education for a waiver under the Quality Education Investment Act (QEIA) of the California Education Code Sections 52055(a) and 52055.730, regarding class size and Teacher Experience Index requirements.

The waiver is requested to allow classes to exceed class size limits and fall below the Teacher Experience Index as required by QEIA on behalf of Lathrop and Willard Intermediate schools. A waiver will be submitted for class size in grades 6 through 8. QEIA requires at least five students fewer per classroom than the average in the 2006-07 school year with an average of 25 students per classroom school-wide with no class exceeding 27. In addition, QEIA requires the school to have an average experience of classroom teachers in the school equal to or exceeding the average for the school district.

The call for the public hearing took place at the September 27, 2011, Board of Education meeting.

RATIONALE:

Administration would like to seek a waiver from the State Board of Education to ensure continued funding for the 2012-13 school year. QEIA schools that do not meet all monitored QEIA program requirements for the 2010-11 school year will have their funding terminated. Currently, QEIA funding will end June 30, 2012. There are a total of 106 teachers who are staffed by QEIA funding for the 2011-12 school year.

Desired Outcome/Rationale

Santa Ana Unified School District requests on behalf of Lathrop and Willard Intermediate Schools, a permanent single QEIA baseline target of 27:1 for grades 6-8 to fiscally support and meet all of the QEIA component mandates for the time periods of July 1, 2010-June 30, 2014.

Each of these schools is a Title 1 school with approximately 93% of its students receiving free or reduced lunch. Approximately 60% of our student population is English Language Learners. State level cuts to revenue limit funding have resulted in teacher reductions causing an increase of the student-to-teacher ratio.

Due to fiscal constraints, class sizes were recalculated and have increased in subsequent years after QEIA was enacted. Approval of this waiver to exceed the 25.0 cap will permit these two intermediate schools to maintain and to continue to receive QEIA funding for 2012-13. Each of these schools met the spirit of the law and have improved the quality of academic instruction and the level of student achievement.

By creatively exhausting all flexible funding sources, SAUSD has managed to successfully staff our class size targets for the past three years. We have now reached a point at which an increase of our baseline targets is necessary to maintain the momentum that will help move our school out of Program Improvement.

SAUSD has 106 teachers who are staffed by QEIA funding for the 2011-12 school year. Approval of this waiver would allow SAUSD to maintain its target.

The City shall provide a level of supervision and security commensurate with that provided at City-owned facilities at all times while using the Joint Use Facilities (and for reasonable periods of time immediately prior to and following such use).
 - I. <u>Maintenance</u>. The City shall be responsible for the normal maintenance of the Public Facilities and all sports lighting at the Joint Use Facilities. Normal maintenance of the rest of the Joint Use Facilities will continue to be the responsibility of the District, including the synthetic turf field.

 - K. <u>Utilities</u>. District shall pay for all utility services furnished to the Joint Use Facilities for the use, operation and maintenance of the Joint Use Facilities during the Term of this Agreement, or any extension thereof, except for electrical service on the athletic field and

track which will be paid for by City. District shall pay for its use of the sports lighting based on an hourly fee agreed between City and District when the sports lighting is used by the District.

L. <u>Further Funding Sources</u>. The Parties to this Joint Use Agreement will cooperate in good faith to seek further funding for improvements to the Joint Use Facilities and other common areas at the School and agree that if such funding and improvements are made, that this Joint Use Agreement will be amended to encompass the renovated areas and additional provisions related thereto.

4. LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION.

- A. The City shall be financially responsible for damages caused by during City Use.
- B. The City shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless District, its officers, agents, employees, representatives, and volunteers from damage to property and for injury to or death of any person and from all claims, demands, actions, liability, or damages of any kind or nature arising out of or in connection with City Use, activities or programs sponsored by City under this Agreement, third party activities programmed or sponsored by the City, and City programming outside of City Time, except those which arise out of a dangerous/defective condition of District property or due to the sole negligence of the District.
- C. The District shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents, employees, representatives, and volunteers from damage to property and for injury to or death of any person and from all claims, demands, actions, liability, or damages of any kind or nature arising out of its operation of the School, including use, operation, maintenance and repair of the Joint Use Facilities, except as provided in "B" above.
- 5. **INSURANCE.** Both the City and the District shall maintain, for the period covered by this Agreement, at their own respective costs, their own respective policy or policies of general liability insurance and property insurance. Each party waives subrogation of its insurance coverage for the other entity. Self-insurance authorized by state law and/or maintained by the City or the District in the regular course of business for its other activities shall satisfy this requirement.
- 6. **NOTICES**. 8. **AMENDMENTS**. This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding between the Parties with respect to Willard Intermediate School. Any modifications must be in the form of a written amendment agreed to by both Parties.

9. **REMEDIES FOR BREACH**. Any material breach of this Agreement alleged by either party shall be subject of notification in writing to the alleged breaching party, as provided herein. Each party shall be accorded a 60-day period from actual receipt of written notification to cure each and every breach identified in the notification. Failure to provide notification in writing and the opportunity to cure any alleged breach shall constitute a waiver of that breach of the Agreement. Any dispute as to the existence of a material breach, the acceptability of a cure for each alleged breach, or the appropriate remedy for each and every material breach of this Agreement shall be resolved by mediation and/or arbitration by a mediator/arbitrator agreeable to both Parties. Arbitration of disputes as to material breach of this Agreement shall be final and binding as the exclusive remedy for enforcement of the rights and responsibilities of all Parties subject to this Agreement.



BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval of Agreement for Reimbursement of Construction Costs for Willard Intermediate School with the City of Santa Ana.

RATIONALE:

The City of Santa Ana has been awarded funding under Proposition 84 to be used at Willard Intermediate School to develop approximately five acres. Amenities to be included are:

- A new all-weather running track
- Synthetic turf sports field
- Sports field lighting
- Restroom, exercise / play area
- Fencing and landscaping, and
- Renovation of the existing basketball courts

Since this project requires careful coordination with the existing modernization project at Willard Intermediate School, it is important that the District oversee all elements of the construction. Therefore, the District will execute all design, bidding, inspection, and closeout and the City will reimburse the District as costs are realized. This agreement has been approved by legal counsel.

The proposed agreement is attached.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SANTA ANA AND SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT REGARDING REIMBURSEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION COSTS FOR WILLARD INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL INCORPORATING PROP. 84 GRANT REQUIREMENTS

This Agreement Between the City of Santa Ana and Santa Ana Unified School District Regarding Reimbursement of Construction Costs for Willard Intermediate School Incorporating Prop. 84 Grant Requirements ("Agreement") is made this 11th day of October, 2011, by and between the City of Santa Ana, a charter city and municipal corporation ("City"), and the Santa Ana Unified School District ("District"), a public school district (collectively, "Parties"; individually "Party").

RECITALS

- A. The District is designing and constructing improvements at its Willard Intermediate School site (the "Project").
- B. The Project includes development of approximately five (5) acres, including the following sports and recreation facilities ("Facilities"), which are depicted in **Exhibit A**:
- 1. A new all weather running track,
- 2. Synthetic turf sports field,
- 3. Sports field lighting,
- 4. Restroom, exercise / play area,
- 5. Fencing and landscaping, and
- 6. Renovation of the existing basketball courts,

The Parties intend to use Facilities for joint use to benefit the community and District students.

- C. The City wishes to reimburse the District for costs associated with the design and construction of the Facilities, which will be constructed as part of the Project.
- D. The City, as a recipient of Proposition 84- Statewide Park Development and Community Revitalization Program Grant Funds under the Safe Drinking Water Quality and Supply, Flood Control, River and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2006 ("Prop. 84") funds, desires to enter this Agreement with the District for the expenditure of Prop. 84 funds in accordance with State Department of Parks and Recreation rules and regulations, to pay for certain construction costs for the Facilities. The enforceability of this Agreement is contingent upon the City's receipt of sufficient Prop. 84 funds to pay for the design and construction of the Facilities.
- E. The District, pursuant to, without limitation, section 17077.40, et seq. and/or section 17527, et seq., of the Education Code, is authorized to enter into joint use agreements with other public entities.
- F. The Parties intend to also enter into a separate agreement for joint use of the Facilities between the City and the District, that the Parties will approve separate from this Agreement ("Joint Use Agreement"). Upon completion of the Facilities, the District shall permit the City to access the Facilities for public use and recreation purposes pursuant to applicable law and to the Joint Use Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. Design and Construction of Facilities.
- A. As part of the Project, the District shall cause the Facilities to be designed and built, subject to the City's

approval, which shall not be unreasonably withheld. The District or its agents or representatives shall meet and confer with the City prior to finalizing construction work on the Facilities, and at reasonable intervals during the development process. The District shall not be obligated to incur any expenses or be obligated by a third party contract to start the design or construction of the Facilities until the City gives the District notice that it has received from the State a certain sum of Prop. 84 funds that will be available for design and construction of the Facilities, and that the District has reasonably determined are sufficient funds available to start or continue with design or construction of the Facilities. City shall provide the District with notice of each Prop. 84 disbursements received for use on the Facilities.

B. The City acknowledges that the District is undertaking design and construction of the Facilities as generally portrayed in Exhibit A, unless modified by written agreement between the Parties.

2. Payment for Construction of the Facilities.

- A. The City shall pay for the cost to design and construct the Facilities for a not to exceed amount of Four Million, Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,400,000.00). The City shall pay invoices submitted by the District within thirty (30) days of receipt evidencing the work performed.
- B. The Contractor has agreed to separately invoice for its construction of the Facilities so that the City can reimburse only the construction of the Facilities part of the Project.
- C. The Parties agree to take all reasonable actions to cooperate to enforce the provisions in this Agreement, including this provision, if other third party agencies, including the State of California or the County of Orange, attempt to interpret this Agreement, including these provisions, contrary to the language herein.
- 3. Record Drawings/Plans for Facilities. District will provide to City a set of record drawings of the Facilities and copies of all contractor-supplied use manuals and warranty information, as applicable.

4. Term/Termination.

- A. Except as indicated herein, neither Party may terminate this Agreement.
- B. If the City breaches this Agreement in any material way, the District may elect to provide written notice to the City of the breach (es). If the City does not cure the breach (es) within ten (10) days of receipt of the notice by paying all overdue funds, the District may terminate this Agreement by providing written notice of termination to the City. Irrespective of the source of funds, City shall be liable to District for all costs, fees, expenses, and other damages the District incurs because of the City's breach (es).
- C. If the District breaches this Agreement in any material way, the City may elect to provide written notice to the District of the breach (es). If the District does not cure the breach (es) within ten (10) days of receipt of the notice, the City may terminate this Agreement by providing written notice of termination to the District. District shall be liable to City for all costs, fees, expenses, and other damages the City incurs because of the District's breach (es). If a breach is not curable in ten (10) days, the District will provide the City notice thereof and so long as the District diligently works to cure the breach, the District will not be liable to the City thereon and the City may not terminate this Agreement based on that breach.
- D. The remedies in this paragraph are in addition to any additional remedies available at law or under this Agreement. A decision by a Party not to terminate this Agreement pursuant to this paragraph does not constitute a waiver of any other claims or remedies that Party may have against the other.

5. Indemnification and Cooperation in Claim Defense.

A. District shall indemnify, save, protect, defend and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, costs, and liability, including reasonable attorneys' fees, for any damage, injury or death, to persons or property arising from the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of

the District or its agents under this Agreement, except to the extent that such claims, costs, or liability arise directly or indirectly from the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of City, its officers, agents and employees.

- B. City shall indemnify, save, protect, defend and hold harmless the District, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, costs and liability, including reasonable attorneys' fees, for any damage, injury or death, to persons or property arising from the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of the City or its agents under this Agreement, except to the extent that such claims, costs, or liability arise directly or indirectly from the negligent or wrongful acts or omissions of District, its officers, agents and employees.
- 6. Environmental Review. The District shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act and any other applicable environmental laws with regard to the Project; however, the City shall be responsible for CEQA clearance and compliance for the Facilities.
- 7. Confidentiality: If either Party receives from the other Party information which due to the nature of that information is reasonably understood to be confidential and/or proprietary, the Parties agree that they shall not use or disclose that information except in the performance of this Agreement, and further agrees to exercise the same degree of care it uses to protect its own information of like importance, but in no event less than reasonable care. "Confidential Information" shall include all nonpublic information. Confidential information includes not only written information, but also information transferred orally, visually, electronically, or by other means. Confidential information disclosed to either Party by any subsidiary and/or agent of the other Party is covered by this Agreement. The foregoing obligations of non-use and nondisclosure shall not apply to any information that (a) has been disclosed in publicly available sources; (b) is, through no fault of the Parties disclosed in a publicly available source; (c) is in rightful possession of the Parties without an obligation of confidentiality; (d) is required to be disclosed by operation of law; or (e) is independently developed by one of the Parties without reference to information disclosed by the other Party.
- 8. Conflict of Interest. The Parties shall ensure compliance with all applicable conflict of interest laws including, without limitation, the Fair Political Practices Act and Government Code section 1090, et seq. In addition, each Party agrees that it will not hire or permit the hiring of any person to fill a position funded through this Agreement if a member of that person's immediate family is employed in an administrative capacity by that Party. For the purposes of this section, the term "immediate family" means spouse, child, aunt, uncle, niece, nephew, stepparent and stepchild. The term "administrative capacity" means having selection, hiring, supervisor or management responsibilities.
- 9. <u>Drug Free Workplace</u>. The Parties confirm that both comply with Government Code Sections 8350 *et seq.*, the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 and shall take diligent actions to ensure that there is no unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance on the Project.
- 10. <u>Anti-Discrimination</u>: It is the policy of the Parties that there be no discrimination against any employee engaged in the work, including work under contract, on the basis of sex, race, creed, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, disability, medical condition or marital status, and therefore each Party agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to the California Fair Employment Practice Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735. In addition, the District agrees to require like compliance by all its contractor(s) and subcontractor(s) on the Project.
- 11. <u>Attorneys' Fees.</u> During any dispute(s) between the Parties related to this Agreement, if any, each Party shall pay their own attorneys fees and related expenses incurred and shall not have a right to recover any of those fees from the other Party.
- 12. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Neither Party shall be held responsible or liable for an inability to fulfill any obligation under this Agreement by reason of an act of God, natural disaster, rationing or restrictions on the use of utilities or public transportation whether due to energy shortages or other causes, war, civil disturbance, riot, or terrorism ("Force Majeure"). Any Party relying on a Force Majeure shall give the other Party reasonable notice thereof,

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and the Parties shall use their best efforts to minimize potential adverse effects from such Force Majeure, including, without limitation, subcontracting the obligations of the Party claiming such Force Majeure to a third party and extending the time periods for performance.

- 13. Assignment. Neither Party may, without the other Party's prior written consent, assign its rights or delegate its duties pursuant to this Agreement. This provision does not apply to the District's contracting with contractor(s), consultant(s), or others to perform services or provide other items related to the planning, approval, design, or construction of Project, including the Facilities. The District's contracting with others shall not alter the District obligations pursuant to this Agreement.
- 14. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall bind the successors and assigns of the Parties hereto.
- 15. Further Assurances. Each Party to this Agreement shall at its own expense perform all acts and execute all documents and instruments that may be necessary or convenient to carry out its obligations under this Agreement.
- 16. Modifications. The terms and conditions of this Agreement may be modified or changed only by written mutual consent of the Parties.
- 17. Notices. Any notices that either Party desires to or is required to give to the other Party or to any other person shall be in writing and either served personally or sent by prepaid first class mail. Such notices shall be addressed to the other Party at the address set forth below. Either Party may change its address by notifying the other Party of the change of address. Notice shall be deemed communicated within seventy-two hours from the date of mailing, if mailed as provided in this paragraph.

- 18. Execution in Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts such that the signatures may appear on separate signature pages. A copy, or an original, with all signatures appended together, shall be deemed a fully executed Agreement.
- 19. Interpretation. The language of all parts of this Agreement shall, in all cases, be construed as a whole, according to its fair meaning, and not strictly for or against either Party.
- 20. Severability. Should all or any portion of any provision of this Agreement be held unenforceable or invalid for any reason, but the remainder of the Agreement can be enforced without failure of material consideration to any Party, then the remaining portions or provisions shall be unaffected.
- 21. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and venue shall be in the appropriate Superior Court in Orange County, California.
- 22. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits. The Recitals and all Exhibits attached hereto, are hereby incorporated herein and made a part of this Agreement by this reference.
- 23. Captions. The headings used in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not affect the interpretation of this Agreement.
- 24. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral.

- 25. <u>Time of the Essence</u>. Time is of the essence in the performance of each Party's respective obligations under this Agreement.
- 26. Parties to Bear Their Own Costs. Except as specifically set forth in this Agreement, the Parties shall each bear their own costs, including, without limitation, attorneys' and consultants' fees, incurred in connection with any negotiations, strategic planning, analysis and due diligence relating to this Agreement.
- 27. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Agreement must be executed by both Parties and approved or ratified by the City's City Council and the District's Board of Trustees. This Agreement shall be effective upon the latter date of approval of either the City Council or the Board of Trustees.
- 28. <u>Terms Required Based on Proposition 84 Funding.</u> The following terms are made a part of this Agreement, as required by the Parties participation in and use of funds from the Prop. 84 grant program.
- A. Project Administration.
- 1. District shall comply with all applicable current laws and regulations affecting acquisition and development projects, including but not limited to, legal requirements for construction contracts, building codes, health and safety codes, and laws and codes pertaining to individuals with disabilities, including by not limited to the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §12101 et. seq.) and the California Unruh Act (California Civil Code §51 et. seq.)
- 2. The California Department of Parks and Recreation (hereinafter "DPR") and/or City shall have the right to inspect all property or facilities developed or constructed with Prop. 84 grant funding. District shall make said property available for inspection upon 24-hour notice from DPR or City.
- 3. District agrees that final payment may not be made until the work required to complete the Facilities, as described in City's Grant Application, is complete.
- B. Project Termination. Because the benefit to be derived by the City from the full compliance by the District with the terms of this Agreement, is the preservation, protection and net increase in the quantity and quality of parks, public recreation facilities, opportunities and/or historical resources available to the people of the State of California and because such benefit exceeds to an immeasurable and unascertainable extent, the amount of money furnished through Prop. 84 grant monies under the provisions of this Agreement, the District agrees that payment by the District to the State and/or City of an amount equal to the amount of the Grant Monies disbursed under this Agreement by the City would be inadequate compensation for any breach by the District of this Agreement. The District further agrees therefore, that in addition to compensatory damages, the appropriate remedy in the event of a breach of this Agreement by the District shall be the specific performance of this Agreement, unless otherwise agreed to by the City or unless prohibited by applicable law.
- C. Budget Contingency Termination or Revision Clause. If Prop. 84 funding for the Facilities is reduced or deleted by the State of California, the City shall immediately provide notice to the District and shall have the option to either terminate this Agreement or provide an alternative funding source. If City terminates this Agreement it shall provide 30-day's advanced notice, and the joint use agreement between the Parties for the Facilities shall automatically and immediately terminate. The City shall remain liable to the District for monies expended until this termination takes effect. The Parties shall not be liable to each other for termination of the joint use agreement pursuant to this Section.
- D. Financial Records.
- 1. The District shall maintain satisfactory financial accounts, documents and records for the project and make them available to the DPR and/or City for auditing at reasonable times. The District also agrees to retain such financial accounts, documents and records for five years following project termination or final payment, whichever is later.

- The District shall keep such records as the DPR and/or City shall prescribe, including records which fully disclose (a) the disposition of the proceeds of Prop. 84 funding assistance, (b) the total cost of the project in connection with such assistance that is given or used, (c) the amount and nature of that portion of the project cost supplied by other sources, and (d) any other such records that will facilitate an effective audit.
 - 3. The District agrees that the DPR and/or City shall have the right (at its sole cost) to inspect and make copies of any books, records or reports pertaining to this Agreement or matters related thereto during regular office hours. The District shall maintain and make available for inspection by the DPR and/or City accurate records of all of its costs, disbursements and receipts with respect to its activities under this Agreement. Such accounts, documents, and records shall be retained by the District for five (5) years following final payment.
 - 4. The District shall use a generally accepted accounting system that clearly records costs incurred on the Facilities and accurately reflects fiscal transactions with necessary controls and safeguards. District shall submit written project status reports within 30 calendar days after the DPR, or City has made such a request. District shall provide the City a report showing total final Project expenditures within sixty (60) days of Project completion.
 - E. Audit. To the extent the District uses California Prop. 84 funds for the Project, the District is subject to audit by the DPR and/or City. Upon request of DPR or City, District shall provide all Project records, including the source documents and cancelled warrants, books, papers, accounts, time sheets, or other records requested by DPR. Additionally, District shall provide an employee having knowledge of the Project and its records to assist DPR's auditor.
 - F. Prevailing Wage. District shall require that its contractor(s) for construction of the Facilities pay prevailing wage. Additionally, if required by applicable law, the District or the California Department of Industrial Relations shall implement a Labor Compliance Program as described in California Labor Code §1771.5.

G. Insurance/Bonding.

- 1. With respect to performance of work under this Agreement, District shall require that Contractor shall maintain and shall require its subcontractors, if any, to maintain insurance as described below:
- a. Workers' compensation insurance with statutory limits, and employer's liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per accident.
- b. Commercial general liability insurance, which shall include, but not be limited to protection against claims arising from bodily and personal injury, including death resulting therefrom and damage to property, resulting from any act or occurrence arising out of Consultant's operations in the performance of the contract, including, without limitation, acts involving vehicles. The amounts of insurance shall be not less than the following: single limit coverage applying to bodily and personal injury, including death resulting therefrom, and property damage, in the total amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. Such insurance shall (a) name the District and the City, their officers, employees, agents, volunteers and representatives as additional insured(s); (b) be primary and not contributory with respect to insurance or self-insurance programs maintained by the District and/or the City; and (c) contain standard separation of insured's provisions.

Contractor shall (a) furnish properly executed certificates of insurance to District and the City prior to commencement of work under this Agreement, which certificates shall clearly evidence all coverage required above and provide that such insurance shall not be materially changed or terminated except on thirty (30) days' prior written notice to District; and (b) maintain such insurance from the time work first commences until completion of the work under this Agreement; and (c) replace such certificates for policies expiring prior to completion of work under this Agreement.

2. District shall require Contractor to post performance and payment bonds to cover the entire construction period.

- H. Access to Records. During District office hours and with reasonable notice, City and the DPR and/or their representatives shall have access for purposes of monitoring, auditing, and examining District's activities and performance, to books, documents and papers, and the right to examine records of District's subcontractors, bookkeepers and accountants, employees and participants in regard to said program. City and the DPR and/or their representatives shall also schedule on-site monitoring at their discretion. Monitoring activities may also include, but are not limited to, questioning employees and participants in said program and entering any premises or any site in which any of the services or activities funded hereunder is conducted or in which any of the records of District are kept. Nothing herein shall be construed to require access to any privileged or confidential information as set forth in federal or state law.
- I. Use of Facilities.

- District acknowledges that the City has applied for and received grant funds through California Prop. 84, and that the Facilities which will be developed with such Prop. 84 funds shall have operating hours consistent with the times proposed in the City Grant Application, and be open to members of the public, unless otherwise granted permission by the DPR.
- 2. The District agrees that any Facilities developed with Prop. 84 funds shall be used only for District use and for the purposes of the grant and consistent with the Grant Scope referenced in the City's Grant Application unless prior written approval is given by the State.
- 3. The District agrees to use the Facilities developed under this Agreement only for District use and for the purposes of the grant and, for the next thirty (30) years, no other use, sale, or other disposition shall be permitted except as authorized by a specific act of the California Legislature in which event the property shall be replaced by the District with property of equivalent value and usefulness as determined by DPR.
- 4. The Facilities may be transferred to another eligible entity only if the successor entity assumes the obligations imposed under this Agreement and with written approval of the DPR.
- Any real property (including any portion of it or any interest in it) may not be used as security for any debt or mitigation, without the written approval of the State of California, acting through the DPR, or its successor, provided that such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld as long as the purposes for which the Grant was awarded are maintained. Any such permission that is granted does not make DPR a guarantor or a surety for any debt or mitigation, nor does it waive DPR's rights to enforce performance under the Grant Contract.

1 AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO AMENDED AND RESTATED GROUND LEASE 2 This Amendment No. 2 ("Amendment") to the Amended and Restated Ground Lease 3 dated July 22, 2003, as amended by Amendment No. 1 dated July 22, 2003 (collectively the "Lease") by and between the Santa Ana Unified School District ("District") and Centennial 4 Heritage Museum, now known as Heritage Museum of Orange County ("Museum") (referred to 5 individually as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties"), is hereby made and entered into this 6 day of , 2011 ("Effective Date") as follows: 8 WHEREAS, the District is the owner of approximately 22 acres of real property located 9 at the northwest corner of Fairview Road and Harvard Street in the City of Santa Ana, California ("District Property"); and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Museum occupies a portion of the District Property as set forth in the 12 Lease ("Museum Site"); and WHEREAS, the Museum desires to construct and maintain an adobe structure 13 14 ("Adobe") on a portion of the Museum Site for visual demonstration purposes only; and 15 WHEREAS, the District has agreed to allow for the construction and maintenance of the 16 Adobe by the Museum, subject to the terms and conditions set forth below. 17 **NOW THEREFORE**, the District and the Museum hereby agree as follows: 18 Amended and Restated Ground Lease. The Parties hereto represent and warrant that 19 the aforementioned Lease is the true, correct and complete Lease, and that there has been no written or oral amendment(s) to the Lease (except for Amendment No. 1) prior to the execution 20 of this Amendment. All capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the same 21 22 meanings given in the Lease. 23 Adobe. The Adobe shall be considered an Alteration and Improvement as defined in the Lease and shall be subject to all applicable terms and conditions for Alternations and 24 Improvements, as set forth in the Lease. The Adobe shall be constructed in accordance with the 25 26 description and plans attached hereto and incorporated by this reference as Exhibit "A." The 27 District must approve in writing any alterations to the attached description and plans. 28 Costs. Museum shall be responsible for all costs and expenses of any kind resulting from the design, construction, maintenance, use, demolition, removal or any other function of the 29 Adobe. District shall not be responsible for any costs or expenses whatsoever attributable to the 30 31 Adobe. 32 Insurance. Within thirty (30) days of the Effective date of this Amendment, the 33 Museum shall provide the District with updated insurance documents that demonstrate that the 34 Adobe is covered under the Museum's insurance. 35 Limitations on Use of Adobe. 5. The District's approval of the Adobe is made in

reliance on the Museum's representations that the Adobe will be used for visual demonstration


purposes only. The Adobe may not be used as a residence, classroom, interactive exhibit or

- otherwise accessed by any individual. Such use shall render the District's approval of the Adobe null and void, and the Museum shall be in breach of the Lease. The Museum shall take all steps necessary to restrict access to the Adobe, including, but not limited to physical barriers and written notice or warnings. Notwithstanding the above, access by a Museum employee or contractor for the limited purposes of construction or maintenance of the Adobe only, shall not be a violation of the terms of this Amendment.
 - 6. <u>Indemnification</u>. Museum shall indemnify, defend, and hold District harmless from and against all loss, expense (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' and experts' fees and court costs), damage, injury, liability, cause of action or claim of any kind or character (collectively "Claims" and individually a "Claim" including but not limited to construction Claims), in any way arising out of the design, construction, maintenance, use, demolition, removal or any other function of the Adobe, except those caused by the sole active negligence or willful misconduct of the District. This indemnification is in addition to, and in no way limits, the indemnification provided in the Lease between the Parties. This indemnification shall survive the termination of the Lease.
 - 7. Binding Effect; Partial Invalidity. This Amendment shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. If any provision of this Amendment shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this Amendment or the Lease.
 - 8. <u>Full Force and Effect; No Other Amendments</u>. The Lease is hereby modified with respect to the terms set forth herein, and any other portion thereof as necessary to implement the foregoing. Except as specifically set forth in this Amendment, the language of the Lease shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect as executed by the parties.
 - 9. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Amendment may be executed and delivered in any number of counterparts, each of which so executed and delivered shall be deemed to be an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
 - 22. <u>Inconsistencies</u>. In the event of any inconsistency between the terms of this Amendment and those of the Lease, the terms of this Amendment shall control.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval to adopt Resolution No. 11/12-2897 to amend the Uniform System of Prequalifying and Rating Bidders for Prequalification on Certain Construction Projects pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 20111.5. The original Resolution No. 10/11-2863 was previously approved by the Board on January 25, 2011.

RECOMMENDATION:

Public Contract Code Section 20111.5 allows local agencies to adopt prequalification documents, which includes an objective rating system. At the January 25, 2011, Board meeting, the Board adopted Resolution No. 10/11-2863 - Uniform System of Prequalifying and Rating Bidders. The use of the prequalifying process has assisted the District in attracting responsive, qualified bidders. However, due to the current economic climate, prequalifying only those contractors that have performed five recent projects equal to the amount of the projected construction cost has restricted some responsive contractors from bidding. This amendment will allow contractors qualifying amount to be 50% of their bonding capacity. Labor union representatives are in favor of this amendment.

RESOLUTION NO. 11/12-2897 BOARD OF EDUCATION SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

ADOPTING TO AMEND UNIFORM SYSTEM OF PREQUALIFYING AND RATING BIDDERS FOR PREQUALIFICATION ON CERTAIN CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS PURSUANT TO PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE SECTION 20111.5

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District ("District") desires to prequalify potential bidders for certain designated District construction projects;

WHEREAS, the District has prequalified contractors for many of its projects in the past but wishes now to update its prequalification process and its prequalification documents

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code section 20111.5 authorizes school districts to require prospective bidders to submit a standardized questionnaire and other documentation prior to bidding on specific construction projects;

WHEREAS, Public Contract Code 20111.5 (b) authorizes school districts to adopt and apply a uniform system of rating bidders on the basis of completed questionnaires and financial statements, in order to determine the size of the contracts upon which each bidder shall be deemed qualified to bid;

WHEREAS, District staff has developed a Contractor's Prequalification Questionnaire ("Questionnaire") and a Prequalification Evaluation Procedure ("Procedure") in accordance with Public Contract Code section 20111.5. A sample of the Questionnaire and Procedure are attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein;

WHEREAS, District staff has developed a uniform system of rating potential bidders based upon the completed Questionnaires ("Rating System"). The Procedure includes this Rating System;

WHEREAS, the minimum criteria set forth in the Rating System shall include, inter alia, a requirement for a potential bidder to have constructed a minimum number of California school district or community college construction projects of a minimum size within the recent past for the same license classification, and with a similar scope of work to the type of work for which they are bidding;

WHEREAS, if a potential bidder meets the minimum criteria set forth in the Rating System, the District desires:

- To prequalify each potential bidder to bid on certain projects;
- To deem a prequalification "valid for up to one calendar year following the date of initial prequalification" (Public Contract Code section 20115(e)), unless the bidder fails to maintain the requirements to satisfy the minimum criteria;
- To require a bidder that the District prequalified on a previous project and bids on a subsequent project to re-prequalify if that subsequent project either exceeds the project cost amount of the previous project or differs in scope from the previous project.

(Collectively, the "Prequalification Process")

WHEREAS, the Questionnaire includes a process for potential bidders to appeal certain decisions with respect to the Prequalification Process ("Appeal Process");

WHEREAS, the District desires to adopt the Questionnaire, Procedure, Rating System, Prequalification Process, and Appeal Process for prequalification on certain District projects consistent with the documents attached as Exhibit "A", but tailored to each particular construction project contemplated by the District, and consistent with and in compliance with Public Contract Code section 20111.5;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Board of the Santa Ana Unified School District hereby finds, determines, declares, orders and resolves as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. That the Questionnaire, Procedure, Rating System, Prequalification Process, and Appeal Process are approved and adopted pursuant to Public Contract Code section 20111.5.

Section 3. That the District's Superintendent, or her designee, is hereby delegated the authority to determine the specific projects on which to prequalify contractors.

Section 4. For those projects on which the District will prequalify contractors, the District shall utilize a Questionnaire, Procedure, Rating System, Prequalification Process, and Appeal Process that are consistent with the documents attached as Exhibit "A" and tailored to the particular construction project(s) contemplated by the District, and consistent with and in compliance with Public Contract Code section 20111.5.

The Santa Ana Unified School District ("District") has determined that bidders on this Project must be prequalified prior to submitting a bid on the project. Each prospective contractor shall be currently licensed and shall submit the following information to establish its qualifications to bid to perform construction work on the Project. A Contractor's bid for the Project will not be accepted unless the District has pregualified the Contractor.

A Contractor who submits a complete Prequalification Questionnaire thereby consents to and will comply with the procedures outlined below and as set forth in greater detail in this document.

- A. <u>Form.</u> Each Contractor shall fully complete the Prequalification Questionnaire and timely submit all documents in yellow as indicated therein. No other prequalification documents submitted by Contractor will meet these requirements. All information requested in the Prequalification Questionnaire must be provided in order for a Prequalification Questionnaire to be considered responsive. The Prequalification Questionnaire shall be submitted simultaneously as one package it shall not be submitted piecemeal. Contractors shall submit one (1) completed yellow Prequalification Questionnaires in a sealed envelope as indicated above. A Contractor's submission of an incomplete and/or unclear Prequalification Questionnaire will likely result in a determination that the Contractor is non-responsive.
- B. <u>District's Review</u>. Information submitted in the Prequalification Statement shall not be public information and shall not be open to public inspection, to the extent permitted by law. Once a Contractor's Prequalification Statement is submitted, the District will notify the Contractor if the Contractor meets the prequalification requirements and, if so, the maximum size of the contract upon which the Contractor is prequalified to bid, which will be fifty percent (50%) of the Contractor's total aggregate bonding capacity as indicated herein.
- C. <u>Nonresponsiveness</u>. A Contractor's Prequalification Questionnaire shall be deemed nonresponsive if:

- 1. The Prequalification Questionnaire is not returned on time.
- 2. Contractor does not provide all requested information on District forms (yellow in color).
- 3. The Prequalification Questionnaire is not signed under penalty of perjury by individuals who have the authority to bind the Contractor on whose behalf they are signing.
- 4. Information contained in the Prequalification Questionnaire is not updated under penalty of perjury when it is no longer accurate.
- 5. Any information provided by the Contractor is misleading or inaccurate in any material manner (e.g., financial resources are overstated; previous violations of law are not accurately reported). Even after a Contractor has been prequalified, the District reserves the right to revoke that determination at any subsequent time, to terminate any contract awarded, and to cease making payments if it determines that any information provided by the Contractor in its Prequalification Questionnaire or subsequently was incomplete, misleading, or inaccurate in any material manner.
- D. <u>Previously Prequalified Contractors</u>. All Contractors must satisfy the Essential Criteria for this Project, as indicated in section (F)(1)(a). A Contractor that prequalified on a District project within the past twelve (12) months and needs to update their list in order to maintain their prequalification status by listing additional projects to satisfy these criteria must submit a Prequalification Questionnaire, but need only do the following:
 - 1. Write "Unchanged" on all sections of the Prequalification Questionnaire that remain unchanged;
 - Provide additional information for the sections of the Prequalification Questionnaire that the Contractor must update, including "Section: G. PROJECT REFERENCES"; and
 - 3. Recertify the Prequalification Questionnaire by executing "Section: +L. CERTIFICATION."

E. Appealing A Prequalification Finding

A Contractor may appeal the District's decision. If a Contractor decides to appeal the District's prequalification decision, it must follow this procedure: Within three (3) working days from receipt of the District's prequalification notice/finding, Contractor must submit, in writing, a request for a meeting with the District's staff. Contractor must submit with the request any and all information that it believes supports a finding that District's determination should be changed.

FAILURE OF A CONTRACTOR TO TIMELY FOLLOW THIS APPEAL PROCEDURE SHALL BE A WAIVER OF THE CONTRACTOR'S RIGHT TO APPEAL THE DISTRICT'S DECISION.
