SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

November 28, 2006

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. by Board President Yamagata-Noji. Other members in attendance were Mr. Richardson, Mr. Tinajero, Mrs. Avila, and Mr. Palacio.

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Mr. Nelson, Mr. Trigg, Mr. Lopez, Dr. Stainer, and Dr. Bratcher.

MEETING RECESSED AND RECONVENED

The Regular meeting was immediately recessed to Closed Session to consider legal matters, personnel matters, negotiations, and student discipline issues.

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:45 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mr. Tinajero, Jr.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Interim Superintendent Russo on behalf of the District welcomed returning staff and students from the Thanksgiving holiday. She invited the community to participate in the District's 17th Annual **CENA, Caring Educators Nourishing All**, on Sunday, December 24, where less fortunate families are provided a holiday dinner, and each child will receive a toy and a book. Interested volunteers are asked to contact Ms. Maddox at (714) 558-5523.

Talented students from the Art Song Competition performed beautifully. Karen Siu sang "Music for a While" by Henry Purcell. Karen is a 7th Grade student at McFadden Intermediate. Her music director is Gregory Ellis. Student April Canchola from Saddleback High School, sang "My Mother Bids Me Bind My Hair" by Franz Joseph Haydn. Her Director is Gina McMahan.

A video portrayed a monthly event that brings a tasty reminder for healthy eating to families in Santa Ana. The Harvest of the Month event took place at Martinez Bookstore, and introduced kids to new and different fruits and vegetables through stories and samplings. #### PRESENTATIONS

##### Update and Status of School Building Program

Mr. Jerry Hills, Manager of Construction, presented an update and status report of the Santa Ana Unified School District School Building Program. Various pictures and aerial views were also provided in the report.

Dr. Yamagata-Noji inquired about the enrollment capacity of Griset and the number of students coming from Mountain View. Dr. Bratcher responded that the school would hold 550 students and there were approximately 250 students coming from Mountain View High. Dr. Yamagata-Noji requested a Board discussion item at a future Board meeting.

Dr. Yamagata-Noji asked for a report including the feasibility of funds for air conditioning for Valley High School's auditorium.

##### Superintendent Search Update

Mr. Lopez updated the Board of Education and the community stating that the Board met during a Closed Session special Board meeting on November 21 to review applications. On December 7 and 8, and possibly Saturday, December 9, the Community Advisory Panel and Board of Education will conduct interviews for the vacancy of Superintendent. On December 14 and 15, visitations will take place. A special Board meeting is tentatively scheduled for December 19 for the appointment of Superintendent.

##### Program Improvement Update

Dr. Stainer and Dr. Bratcher provided a PowerPoint presentation informing a packed room of administrators, parents, and staff of the District's Program Improvement (PI) schools and the technical support programs to assist in increasing student achievement based on the No Child Left Behind federal accountability system that identifies Title I districts and schools for improvement.

Dr. Stainer defined Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) and Academic Performance Index (API) for those unfamiliar with those terms. She stated that the STAR assessments along with other targets are the basis for AYP. Schools and districts not achieving required proficiency in any one of 34 AYP indicators are designated as Program Improvement schools. She defined Safe Harbor as an alternative formula used to calculate a schools, districts, and subgroups Annual Measurable Objectives (AMO) when significant growth is achieved. It is also used when a school, district, and subgroup decreases the number of students at basic and below by 10% on California Standards tests. She reviewed the No child Left Behind District Plan for PI Districts; charts that included AMO, API, Participation Rates, and Graduation Rates for Years 1 and 2 in math and language arts, for 2005-06 and 2006-07. She reviewed Program Improvement requirements for PI Year 2 Districts and actions taken by SAUSD for 2006-07.

Dr. Stainer stated that when PI individual schools achieve AYP for all significant subgroups for two consecutive years, they may exit PI status.

Dr. Bratcher then reviewed Program Improvement requirements and corrective actions for PI schools for Years 1-5. He identified schools, when schools began in PI, and where schools are currently. He stated that the SAUSD School Assistance Plan formalized Year 5 plan to support school improvement, and data-driven instruction.

Dr. Bratcher reviewed District's expectations of excellence for all schools which included high quality instruction, effective curriculum that is Standards-aligned, data driven decision-making, and on-going monitoring of student academic performance. He then described expectations of excellence for Years 1-5 PI in detail. He stated that although Santa Ana schools have made overall growth, 40 sites have not met proficiency for at least one indicator.

Dr. Bratcher stated that at the next regular Board meeting, individual information for PI 5 schools will be presented to the Board for review.

The Board of Education made the following suggestions or requests:

Mr. Palacio asked for a copy of the District letter sent to parents regarding Public School Choice in connection to Program Improvement schools.

Dr. Noji asked that staff change slide 35 to state "NO" in red.

Dr. Noji asked when providing the next presentation, that staff include specifics as to how schools acquired their graduation rates. Also, include how schools arrived in PI, what they are doing, and what plan is in place to achieve. She recommended staff look at Madison Elementary. What is working and why the school is successful.

Dr. Yamagata-Noji inquired about Slide 20 of the PowerPoint presentation, "District Technical Assistance - monitor benchmarks quarterly to assess focus achievement in the focus area and adjust actions according to benchmark results." She asked for examples of school sites and how this works.

Mrs. Avila requested specific proven results from UCLA and Springboard programs.

Mrs. Avila asked for clarification on this item. Ms. Lohnes, Interim Director Special Education, stated that the SJCOE would work with the District in the development of an individual web-based form, user controls, and navigation flow. Development will be coordinated with staff from both the District Information Technology and Special Education Departments to provide data integrity, efficiency, and scalability. In addition, it will provide efficiency and error-free completion of IEPs.

**5.0 APPROVAL OF RENZULLI LEARNING PILOT PROGRAM WITH RENZULLI LEARNING SYSTEMS FOR 2006-07 AND 2007-08 SCHOOL YEARS**

The Renzulli Learning System was created to help the classroom teacher cover their curriculum by using a web-based system that pre-assesses students' individual interests and learning profiles. It provides a database of 13,000 pre-screened activities and websites, helps students plan, complete problem-based projects, and record their progress in a portfolio that can be accessed by both teachers and parents using passwords. Both GATE and non-GATE students will have access to the program.

It was moved by Mrs. Avila, seconded by Mr. Tinajero, and carried 4-0, Mr. Richardson not present, to approve the Renzulli Learning Systems Pilot Program agreement with Renzulli Learning Systems, LLC. for the 2006-07 and 2007-08 school years.

**6.0 BOARD POLICY (BP) AND ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION (AR) 6164.2 - GUIDANCE/COUNSELING SERVICES, SUPPLEMENTAL SCHOOL COUNSELING PROGRAM (REVISION: FOR FIRST READING)**

The governor signed AB1802, the supplemental school counseling program that allocates funding to increase the number of counselors and to provide additional funding for existing credentialed counselors to conference with at-risk students in grades 7-12.

This is presented for first reading; no vote required.

**7.0 HIGH SCHOOL ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE COURSE (NEW: FOR ADOPTION)**

It was moved by Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Tinajero, and carried a 5-0, to approve the Advanced Placement High School Environmental Science Course.

**8.0 PUBLIC ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT WITH CALIFORNIA SCHOOL EMPLOYEES' ASSOCIATION**

It was moved by Mr. Palacio, seconded by Mr. Richardson, and carried 5-0, to approve the public acknowledgement of the Collective Bargaining Agreement (AB1200) with California School Employees Association.

**9.0 APPROVAL OF CANCELLATION OF REGULAR MEETING OF BOARD OF EDUCATION SCHEDULED FOR DECEMBER 26, 2006, AND AMEND JANUARY 9, 2007, AS A SPECIAL BOARD MEETING**

It was moved by Mr. Palacio, seconded by Mr. Richardson, and carried 4-0, Mr. Tinajero abstaining, to approve the cancellation of Regular Meeting of the Board of Education scheduled for December 26, 2006, and modify January 9, 2007, as a Special Board Meeting.

**11.0 VACANCY ON BOARD OF EDUCATION**

Board discussion ensued as to the policy and procedures of filling a vacancy on the seat of a Trustee. Board bylaws and Education Codes were reviewed.

The Board briefly reviewed a draft application and stated that revisions would be made by the Board and those would be returned to District staff by Friday, December 1, 2006, with the desired changes. The following timeline was requested by consensus of the Board.

December 4 - begin advertising (media, newspapers, etc.)  
December 4 - open application process  
January 5 - applications due to District Office  
January 16 - Special Board meeting held to interview and make selection

Dr. Noji requested a legal opinion. If all who apply must be interviewed, or can Board paper screen applications and make a selection from those.
