## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Almendarez recognized and thanked Board Members Valerie Amezcua and John Palacio on behalf of our entire SAUSD team for their years of service to our District and to the Santa Ana community overall. He shared that tonight is Mrs. Amezcua's and Mr. Palacio's last school board meeting. He added that each of them has devoted a great part of their life in service of our schools, our children, our staff, and our families. They have not only given their time, but they have also given their love and passion. He shared that during his tenure, he has seen first-hand their tireless dedication to SAUSD and the entire community. During the early weeks of the pandemic, Mrs. Amezcua and Mr. Palacio each spent countless days volunteering at our vaccine clinics. They advocated and secured access to vaccines for our entire community and made sure our sons, daughters, wives, husbands, grandparents, and community members received their shots at a time when this was a life-saving resource. Mrs. Amezcua and Mr. Palacio also showed up regularly to our schools to support sites when needed and celebrated our children on other occasions and led the way to ensure all students received the best educational experience at SAUSD. Some of the key areas they were involved in were budget and funding, Speech and Debate, partnerships with community partners and non-profits, and were key individuals on the School Climate Committee. Both Board members have provided constant oversight of our District's budget which has helped SAUSD maintain fiscal solvency through the rollercoaster that is the State's budget process. They were never shy about asking tough questions, especially when it came to the well-being of our staff, students, and schools. Their servant leadership has always been guided by advocacy for all.

Superintendent shared that Mrs. Amezcua, a Santa Ana native whose family's roots run deep in this community, has served as a Board member since 2014. She was involved with the District long before she became a Board member which included being a parent at our schools. During her time on the school board, Mrs. Amezcua has

worked to support resources and initiatives for all our students, especially for our 'at promise' students. She has always been a strong advocate for students with special needs, often meeting with families to see how our schools can better support our student population. She brought her experience as a retired Supervising Probation Officer to help the District's efforts to enhance restorative justice and practices. During her tenure as a Board member, Mrs. Amezcua has tirelessly advocated for the entire SAUSD community. She led the efforts for the establishment of Family and Community Engagement, the development of 56 Wellness Centers, Diversion Programs, Restorative Practices where she brought in partners, and lobbied in Sacramento. She also continued the connection with our ASB kids which was near and dear to our former Board Member Rob Richardson.

Mr. Almendarez went on to share that Mr. Palacio has served on the school board since 1998. He has spent much of his life in the Santa Ana community, and has also been a parent at our schools. During his 24 years on the school board, Mr. Palacio has seen incredible changes in SAUSD. Several other Board members and Superintendents have come and gone, but Mr. Palacio has continued to champion for the rights of all students and families, especially those with special needs, like Mrs. Amezcua. Mr. Palacio has had an unwavering support for all our students. Near and dear to his heart have been our NJROTC Program, as well as our high school graduation rates, and the percentage of students who graduate with a seal of biliteracy. Mr. Palacio has served in community organizations such as the Lions Club, Elks Lodge, Rotary Club, and more than a dozen other groups, using these opportunities as a platform to advocate for SAUSD.

Finally, he encouraged everyone to reach out to Mrs. Amezcua and Mr. Palacio to thank them for all they have done for SAUSD. Each of them will continue to support our District in different ways after they leave the school board. He added that given their love and dedication for the community, there is no doubt they will continue to advocate for our students and community by asking the necessary questions from our District. They will always remain a part of the SAUSD family, no matter where the next chapters of their lives take them.

## BOARD REPORTS

Mrs. Amezcua thanked Superintendent Almendarez for the recognition, parents, staff, and kids. She asked parents to continue to advocate for their children, visit school sites, and to question the budget to ensure the money has gone to students. She also addressed academics, programs throughout the District, data, special projects, accountability, and parents teaching students about adult interaction. Mrs. Amezcua thanked everyone for allowing her to serve for eight years and will come back to watch the budget. She asked that we engage all parents, lift them, and give students the tools they need. She added comments on the District's budget, hiring, class size, special projects, parent engagement, special education, and holding Board Members accountable. Mrs. Amezcua asked that someone talk to the public speakers that spoke about the FACE staff member. She added that it has been a great experience and thanked everyone, Principals, Directors, Cabinet, Superintendent, parents and families, and invited them to come to Board meetings. She also thanked all the organizations she has worked with like Kiwanis Club of Santa Ana, Santa Ana Elks, KidWorks, Girls Inc., and staff. Lastly, she thanked her husband for his support, acknowledged her family, and is looking forward to the future and coming back for her three minutes to address the Board.

Mr. Palacio acknowledged that he is a Board Member of the previous century and that he has served for 24 years. He has been here for the children, his own children who went from kindergarten through graduation in the District. He added that he was here when we had the English-only movement, Proposition 187, and affirmative action. He shared that he had the opportunity to run for higher office but didn't because he was comfortable with what he was doing. Mr. Palacio added that he used to work with IEPs, suspensions, and expulsions in his previous employment and that he is not going away. He addressed the elimination of zero tolerance, special education, budget, declining enrollment, court settlements, child abuse and molestation, academics, and community engagement. He stated that he will continue to be involved along with Mrs. Amezcua. He went on to thank Mr. Almendarez for his comments, staff for all their hard work, thanked everyone for their support, wished everyone the best, and added that his term ends December 9, 2022 per Education Code.

Dr. Alvarez thanked the public speakers for coming out to speak. He requested that Superintendent follow up with the City on crossing guards. Dr. Alvarez congratulated the football teams from Valley and Santa Ana High School for moving on to playoffs. He addressed the budget and asked that we schedule the townhall meetings. He acknowledged Veterans Day and thanked all staff, teachers, and school police officers who are veterans, for their service. He shared that at La Chiquita Mexican Restaurant in Santa Ana, they have a mural depicting Orange County veterans and invited everyone to go see it. Dr. Alvarez thanked Mrs. Amezcua and Mr. Palacio for their years of service and encouraged everyone to go out and vote.

Ms. Torres encouraged everyone to vote. She affirmed and validated any feelings that come up during Board meetings over things that are heard. Ms. Torres shared that she looks forward to the new Board members joining the Board in December. Lastly, she asked that interactive board sector maps be clearly posted on the website and easy to find.

Dr. Rodriguez thanked Mrs. Amezcua for her years of service and Mr. Palacio for his decades of service. He wished them good luck on their future endeavors. Dr. Rodriguez shared that he attended the Franklin Trunk-or-Treat event along with Ms. Torres and Mr. Palacio. It was an incredible organized event. He thanked all the FACE workers and staff that helped Franklin and many other school sites with Trunk-or-Treat events. He also thanked schools for participating in Noche de Altares. Lastly, he made a point to address Lowell Elementary School. He clarified that whenever there is a question about staff and decisions made around staff, certain things can be shared and some cannot in order to maintain confidentiality. He asked that staff maintains in touch with parents as they need to be served with the best intentions. He addressed the public and ensured them that they are being heard and will make sure we find someone for the position. Dr. Rodriguez asked Dr. Perez to meet with the Franklin parents.

Having no further business to come before the Board, Dr. Rodriguez adjourned the meeting at 7:37 p.m.



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RESOLUTION NO. 22/23-3485

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF ITS SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA) GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, 2018 ELECTION, 2022 SERIES C IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED \$92,000,000, AUTHORIZING THE DISTRIBUTION OF AN OFFICIAL STATEMENT FOR THE BONDS, AND OTHER DOCUMENTS AND ACTIONS RELATED THERETO

WHEREAS, the issuance of not to exceed \$232,000,000 aggregate principal amount of general obligation bonds (the "Authorization") of Santa Ana Unified School District (the "District"), County of Orange (the "County"), State of California was authorized at an election (the "Election") held in said District on November 6, 2018, the proceeds of which are to be used for the financing of the acquisition, construction, equipping, furnishing and improvement of certain capital facilities of the District (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Orange County Registrar of Voters has certified to the effect that the official canvass of returns for the Election reflected that 55% or more of the votes cast on the District's bond measure submitted to the voters at the Election (the "Measure") were cast in favor of the Measure, and such result has been entered in the minutes of the Board of Education of the District (the "Board"); and

WHEREAS, the District has previously issued its first series of general obligation bonds pursuant to the Authorization designated the "Series A Bonds" in the aggregate principal amount of \$60,000,000, and its second series of general obligation bonds pursuant to the Authorization designated the "Series B Bonds" in the aggregate principal amount of \$80,000,000, such that \$92,000,000 aggregate principal amount of general obligation bonds remain for issuance under the Authorization; and

WHEREAS, the Board deems it necessary and desirable to authorize and consummate the sale of one or more additional series of the bonds, designated the "Santa Ana Unified School District (Orange County, California) General Obligation Bonds, 2018 Election, 2022 Series C" (the "Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$92,000,000, according to the terms and in the manner hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, this Board intends to structure the Bonds so as to cause the tax rate levied to pay such Bonds to be equal to or less than \$24 per \$100,000 of assessed valuation, as provided to the electorate at the Election; and

WHEREAS, Section 15140(b) of the Education Code of the State of California authorizes a county board of supervisors to allow school districts over which the county superintendent of schools has jurisdiction to issue and sell school bonds directly without further action by the board of supervisors or officers of the county if said school district has not received a qualified or negative certification in its most recent interim report; and

WHEREAS, the District is authorized by Section 53506 et seq. of the Government Code to sell bonds by public or private sale; and

WHEREAS, Rule 15c2-12 promulgated under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 ("Rule 15c2-12") requires that, in order to be able to purchase or sell the Bonds, the Purchaser must have reasonably determined that the issuer or other obligated person has undertaken in a written agreement or contract for the benefit of the

holders of the Bonds to provide disclosure of certain financial information and certain material events on an ongoing basis;

**WHEREAS**, in order to cause such requirement to be satisfied, the District desires to execute and deliver a continuing disclosure agreement, in the form presented to this meeting, with such changes, insertions and omissions as are made pursuant to this Resolution ("Continuing Disclosure Agreement");

**WHEREAS**, the Preliminary Official Statement to be distributed in connection with the public offering of the Bonds, in the form presented to this meeting, with such changes, insertions and omissions as are made pursuant to this Resolution ("Preliminary Official Statement") has been prepared;

**WHEREAS**, the Board has been presented with the form of each document referred to herein relating to the financing, and the Board has examined each document and desires to approve, authorize and direct the execution of such documents and the consummation of such financing;

**WHEREAS**, the District desires that the Auditor-Controller of the County annually establish tax rates on taxable property within the District for repayment of the Bonds, pursuant to Sections 29100-29103 of the Government Code, that the Board of Supervisors of the County annually approve the levy of such tax, and that the Treasurer-Tax Collector annually collect such tax and apply the proceeds thereof to the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds when due, all pursuant to Education Code Section 15260 et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution and laws of the State to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in connection with the consummation of the actions authorized hereby do exist, have happened and have been performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law, and the District is now duly authorized and empowered, pursuant to each and every requirement of law, to consummate such actions for the purpose, in the manner and upon the terms herein provided;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Education of the Santa Ana Unified School District, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. All of the above recitals are true and correct and the Board so finds.

Section 2. Definitions. Unless the context clearly otherwise requires, the terms defined in this Section shall, for all purposes of this Resolution, have the meanings specified herein, to be equally applicable to both the singular and plural forms of any of the terms herein defined.

"Auditor-Controller" means the Auditor-Controller of the County or any authorized deputy thereof.

"Authorized Officers" means the President of the Board, or such other member of the Board as the President may designate, the Superintendent of the District, or any Deputy, Assistant or Associate Superintendent, each acting alone, or such other officer or employee of the District as the Superintendent or any Deputy, Assistant or Associate Superintendent may designate.

"Board of Supervisors" means the Board of Supervisors of the County.

"Board" means the Board of Education of the District.

109 "Bonds" means the bonds authorized and issued pursuant to this Resolution  
110 designated the "Santa Ana Unified School District (Orange County, California) General

113 "Cede & Co." means Cede & Co., the nominee of DTC, and any successor nominee of  
114 DTC with respect to the Bonds.

116 "Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.  
117

118 "Continuing Disclosure Agreement" means the Continuing Disclosure Agreement  
119 executed and delivered by the District relating to the Bonds.  
120

121 "County" means the County of Orange.  
122

123 "District" means the Santa Ana Unified School District.  
124

125 "DTC" means The Depository Trust Company, a limited-purpose trust company  
126 organized under the laws of the State of New York, and its successors as securities  
127 depository for the Bonds, including any such successor thereto appointed pursuant to  
128 Section 9 hereof.  
129

130 "Interest Payment Date" means February 1 and August 1 of each year commencing  
131 on February 1, 2023, with respect to the Bonds, or such other dates as may be set  
132 forth in the Certificate of Award.  
133

134 "Notice of Intention" means the notice of intention to be used to advertise the  
135 offering of the Bonds as required by section 53692 of the California Government Code.

136 "Official Notice of Sale" means the official notice of sale relating to the  
137 Bonds.

138 "Official Statement" means the Official Statement of the District relating to  
139 the Bonds.  
140

141 "Opinion of Bond Counsel" means an opinion of counsel of nationally recognized  
142 standing in the field of law relating to municipal bonds.  
143

144 "Owner" means, with respect to any Bond, the person whose name appears on the  
145 Registration Books as the registered Owner thereof.  
146

147 "Paying Agent" means The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A., or any  
148 bank, trust company, national banking association or other financial institution  
149 appointed as Paying Agent to act as authenticating agent, bond registrar, transfer  
150 agent, COI agent and paying agent for the Bonds in accordance with Section 8 hereof.  
151

152 "Preliminary Official Statement" means the Preliminary Official Statement of  
153 the District relating to the Bonds.  
154

155 "Purchaser" shall mean the entity to whom the Certificate of Award is awarded  
156 pursuant to Section 5 hereof.  
157

158 "Record Date" means, with respect to any Interest Payment Date for the Bonds,  
159 the 15th day of the calendar month immediately preceding such Interest Payment Date,  
160 whether or not such day is a business day, or such other date or dates as may be set  
161 forth in the Certificate of Award  
162

163 "Registration Books" means the books for the registration and transfer of the  
164 Bonds maintained by the Paying Agent in accordance with Section 8(d) hereof.  
165

166 "State" means the State of California.  
167

168 "Tax Certificate" means the Tax Certificate with respect to the Bonds executed  
169 by the District, dated the date of issuance of the Bonds.  
170

171 "Treasurer-Tax Collector" means the Treasurer-Tax Collector of the County or  
172 any authorized deputy thereof.  
173

174 Section 3. Authorization and Designation of Bonds. The Bonds described herein  
175 shall be issued pursuant to the authority of Article 4.5 of Chapter 3, of Part 1 of  
176 Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code, and other applicable provisions of law,  
177 including applicable provisions of the Education Code. The Governing Board hereby  
178 authorizes the issuance and sale of not to exceed \$92,000,000 aggregate principal  
179 amount of Bonds. The Bonds shall be designated "Santa Ana Unified School District  
180 (Orange County, California) General Obligation Bonds, 2018 Election, 2022 Series C"  
181 with such additional series designations as may be necessary or advisable in order to  
182 market the Bonds. The proceeds of the Bonds, exclusive of any premium and accrued  
183 interest received, shall be applied to finance projects authorized to be financed  
184 under the Authorization.  
185

186 Section 4. Form of Bonds: Execution.  
187

188 (a) Form of Bonds. The Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form without  
189 coupons. The Bonds and the certificate of authentication and registration and the  
190 forms of assignment to appear on each of them, shall be in substantially the form  
191 attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, with necessary or appropriate variations, omissions and  
192 insertions as permitted or required by this Resolution.  
193

194 (b) Execution of Bonds. The Bonds shall be signed by the manual or facsimile  
195 signatures of the President of the Board, and countersigned by the manual or facsimile  
196 signature of the Secretary of the Board or by a deputy of either of such officers.  
197 In case any one or more of the officers who shall have signed any of the Bonds shall  
198 cease to be such officer before the Bonds so signed shall have been issued by the  
199 District, such Bonds may, nevertheless, be issued, as herein provided, as if the  
200 persons who signed or sealed such Bonds had not ceased to hold such offices. Any of  
201 the Bonds may be signed and sealed by such persons as at the time of the execution of  
202 such Bonds shall be duly authorized to hold or shall hold the proper offices in the  
203 District, although at the date borne by the Bonds such persons may not have been so  
204 authorized or have held such offices. The Bonds shall be authenticated by a manual or  
205 electronic signature of a duly authorized signatory of the Paying Agent.  
206

207 (c) Valid Authentication. Only such of the Bonds as shall bear thereon a  
208 certificate of authentication and registration as described in subsection (a) of this  
209 Section, executed by the Paying Agent, shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose  
210 or entitled to the benefits of this Resolution, and such certificate of authentication  
211 and registration shall be conclusive evidence that the Bonds so authenticated have  
212 been duly authenticated and delivered hereunder and are entitled to the benefits of  
213 this Resolution.  
214

215 (d) Identifying Number. The Paying Agent shall assign each Bond authenticated  
216 and registered by it a distinctive letter, or number, or letter and number, and shall  
217 maintain a record thereof at its principal office, which record shall be available to  
218 the District and the County for inspection.  
219

Section 5. Terms of Bonds.

(a) Date of Bonds. The Bonds shall be dated the date of their delivery, or such other date as shall be set forth in the Certificate of Award.

(b) Denominations. The Bonds shall be issued in denominations of \$5,000 principal amount or any integral multiple thereof.

(c) Maturity. The Bonds shall mature on the date or dates, in each of the years, in the principal amounts and in the aggregate principal amount as shall be set forth in the Certificate of Award. No Bond shall mature later than the date which is 40 years after the date of issuance of the Bonds; provided, however, that for any Bonds that have a maturity greater than 30 years, an Authorized Officer shall make a finding that the useful life of the facility financed with the Bonds equal or exceeds the maturity date of the Bonds, to be determined as provided in subsection (a) of this Section. No Bond shall have principal maturing on more than one principal maturity date.

(d) Interest. The Bonds shall bear interest at an interest rate not to exceed 8.00% per annum, payable on the Interest Payment Dates in each year computed on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day months. Each Bond shall bear interest from the Interest Payment Date next preceding the date of authentication thereof, unless it is authenticated after the close of business on a Record Date and on or prior to the succeeding Interest Payment Date, in which event it shall bear interest from such Interest Payment Date, or unless it is authenticated on or before the Record Date preceding the first Interest Payment Date, in which event it shall bear interest from its dated date; provided, however, that if, at the time of authentication of any Bond, interest is in default on any outstanding Bonds, such Bond shall bear interest from the Interest Payment Date to which interest has previously been paid or made available for payment on the outstanding Bonds.

Section 6. Payment of Bonds.

(a) Request for Tax Levy. The money for the payment of principal, redemption premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds shall be raised by taxation upon all taxable property in the District and provision shall be made for the levy and collection of such taxes in the manner provided by law and for such payment out of the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District. The Board of Supervisors and officers of the County are obligated by statute to provide for the levy and collection of property taxes in each year sufficient to pay all principal and interest coming due on the Bonds in such year, and to pay from such taxes all amounts due on the Bonds. The District hereby requests the Board of Supervisors of the County to annually levy a tax upon all taxable property in the District sufficient to redeem the Bonds, and to pay the principal, redemption premium, if any, and interest thereon as and when the same become due.

The ad valorem tax revenues levied to pay the Bonds shall, when collected, be deposited into the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District. The foregoing Interest and Sinking Fund and ad valorem tax revenues are irrevocably pledged, and the District hereby grants a lien and security interest therein, for the payment of the principal, redemption premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds when and as the same fall due. The moneys in the Interest and Sinking Fund, to the extent necessary to pay the principal, redemption premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds as the same become due and payable, shall be transferred by the County or the District, as the case may be, to the Paying Agent, as paying agent for the Bonds, as necessary to pay the principal, redemption premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds. The property taxes and amounts held in the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District shall immediately

277 be subject to this pledge, and the pledge shall constitute a lien and security interest  
278 which shall be effective, binding, and enforceable against the District, its  
279 successors, creditors and all others irrespective of whether those parties have notice  
280 of the pledge and without the need of any physical delivery, recordation, filing, or  
281 further act. The pledge is an agreement between the District and the Owners of the  
282 Bonds in addition to any statutory lien that may exist, and the Bonds are being issued  
283 to finance one or more projects and not to finance the general purposes of the District.  
284

285 Additionally, in accordance with Section 15251(b) of the California Education  
286 Code and Section 53515(a) of the California Government Code, the Bonds shall be  
287 secured by a statutory lien on all revenues received pursuant to the levy and  
288 collection of the tax for the Bonds. The lien shall automatically attach without  
289 further action or authorization by the District or the County. The lien shall be  
290 valid and binding from the time the Bonds are executed and delivered. The revenues  
291 received pursuant to the levy and collection of the tax shall be immediately subject  
292 to the lien, and the lien shall automatically attach to the revenues and be effective,  
293 binding, and enforceable against the District, its successors, transferees and  
294 creditors, and all others asserting rights therein, irrespective of whether those  
295 parties have notice of the lien and without the need for any physical delivery,  
296 recordation, filing, or further act.  
297

298 (b) Payment of Principal. The principal of the Bonds shall be payable in lawful  
299 money of the United States of America to the Owners thereof, upon the surrender  
300 thereof at the principal corporate trust office of the Paying Agent.  
301

302 (c) Payment of Interest; Record Date. The interest on the Bonds shall be payable  
303 on each Interest Payment Date in lawful money of the United States of America to the  
304 Owner thereof as of the Record Date preceding such Interest Payment Date, such interest  
305 to be paid by check or draft mailed on such Interest Payment Date (if a business day,  
306 or on the next business day if the Interest Payment Date does not fall on a business  
307 day) to such Owner at such Owner's address as it appears on the Registration Books or  
308 at such address as the Owner may have filed with the Paying Agent for that purpose  
309 except that the payment shall be made by wire transfer of immediately available funds  
310 to any Owner of at least \$1,000,000 of outstanding Bonds who shall have requested in  
311 writing such method of payment of interest prior to the close of business on the  
312 Record Date immediately preceding any Interest Payment Date.  
313

314 (d) Interest and Sinking Fund. Principal and interest due on the Bonds shall be  
315 paid from the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District as provided in Section 15250  
316 of the Education Code.  
317

318 (e) Obligation of the District. No part of any fund or account of the County is  
319 pledged or obligated to the payment of the Bonds. The obligation for repayment of the  
320 Bonds is the sole obligation of the District.  
321

#### 322 Section 7. Redemption Provisions.

323

324 (a) Optional Redemption. The Bonds may be subject to redemption, at the option  
325 of the District, on the dates and terms as shall be designated in the Certificate of  
326 Award. The Certificate of Award may provide that the Bonds shall not be subject to  
327 optional redemption, and may provide separate and distinct redemption provisions for  
328 the Bonds.  
329

330 (b) Selection. If less than all of the Bonds are subject to such redemption and  
331 are called for redemption, such Bonds shall be redeemed in inverse order of maturities  
332 or as otherwise directed by the District (or as otherwise set forth in the Certificate  
333 of Award), and if less than all of the Bonds of any given maturity are called for



redemption, the portions of such Bonds of a given maturity to be redeemed shall be determined by lot (or as otherwise set forth in the Certificate of Award).

(d) Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption. The Bonds, if any, which are designated in the Certificate of Award as term bonds shall also be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturity dates, without a redemption premium, in part by lot (or as otherwise set forth in the Certificate of Award), from mandatory sinking fund payments in the amounts and in accordance with the terms to be specified in such Certificate of Award. Unless otherwise provided in the Certificate of Award, the principal amount of each mandatory sinking fund payment of any maturity shall be reduced proportionately by the amount of any Bonds of that maturity redeemed in accordance with subsection (a) or (b) of this Section prior to the mandatory sinking fund payment date. The Certificate of Award may provide that the Bonds shall not be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption. The Auditor-Controller is hereby authorized to create such sinking funds or accounts for the term Bonds as shall be necessary to accomplish the purposes of this Section.

(e) Notice of Redemption. Notice of any redemption of the Bonds shall be mailed by the Paying Agent, postage prepaid, not less than twenty (20) nor more than sixty (60) days prior to the redemption date (i) by first class mail to the County and the respective Owners thereof at the addresses appearing on the Registration Books, and (ii) as may be further required in accordance with the Continuing Disclosure Agreement. Each notice of redemption shall state (i) the date of such notice; (ii) the name of the Bonds and the date of issue of the Bonds; (iii) the redemption date; (iv) the redemption price; (v) the dates of maturity or maturities of Bonds to be redeemed; (vi) in the case of Bonds redeemed in part only, the respective portions of the principal amount of the Bonds of each maturity to be redeemed; (vii) the CUSIP number, if any, of each Bond to be redeemed; (viii) a statement that such Bonds must be surrendered by the Owners at the principal corporate trust office of the Paying Agent, or at such other place or places designated by the Paying Agent; (ix) notice that further interest on such Bonds will not accrue after the designated redemption date; and (x) in the case of a conditional notice, that such notice is conditioned upon certain circumstances and the manner of rescinding such conditional notice.

(f) Effect of Notice. A certificate of the Paying Agent that notice of redemption has been given to Owners as herein provided shall be conclusive as against all parties. Neither the failure to receive the notice of redemption as provided in this Section, nor any defect in such notice shall affect the sufficiency of the proceedings for the redemption of the Bonds or the cessation of interest on the date fixed for redemption. When notice of redemption has been given substantially as provided for herein, and when the redemption price of the Bonds called for redemption is set aside for the purpose as described in subsection (h) of this Section, the Bonds designated for redemption shall become due and payable on the specified redemption date and interest shall cease to accrue thereon as of the redemption date, and upon presentation and surrender of such Bonds at the place specified in the notice of redemption, such Bonds shall be redeemed and paid at the redemption price thereof out of the money provided therefor. The Owners of such Bonds so called for redemption after such redemption date shall be entitled to payment thereof only from the Interest and Sinking Fund or the trust fund established for such purpose. All Bonds redeemed shall be cancelled forthwith by the Paying Agent and shall not be reissued.

(g) Right to Rescind Notice. The District may rescind any optional redemption and notice thereof for any reason on any date prior to the date fixed for redemption by causing written notice of the rescission to be given to the owners of the Bonds so called for redemption. Any optional redemption and notice thereof shall be rescinded if for any reason on the date fixed for redemption moneys are not available in the Interest and Sinking Fund or otherwise held in trust for such purpose in an amount

sufficient to pay in full on said date the principal of, interest, and any premium due on the Bonds called for redemption.

Notice of rescission of redemption shall be given in the same manner in which notice of redemption was originally given. The actual receipt by the owner of any Bond of notice of such rescission shall not be a condition precedent to rescission, and failure to receive such notice or any defect in such notice shall not affect the validity of the rescission.

(h) Funds for Redemption. Prior to or on the redemption date of any Bonds there shall be available in the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District, or held in trust for such purpose as provided by law, monies for the purpose and sufficient to redeem, at the redemption prices as in this Resolution provided, the Bonds designated in the notice of redemption. Such monies shall be applied on or after the redemption date solely for payment of principal of, interest and premium, if any, on the Bonds to be redeemed upon presentation and surrender of such Bonds, provided that all monies in the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District shall be used for the purposes established and permitted by law. Any interest due on or prior to the redemption date shall be paid from the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District, unless otherwise provided to be paid from such monies held in trust. If, after all of the Bonds have been redeemed and cancelled or paid and cancelled, there are monies remaining in the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District or otherwise held in trust for the payment of redemption price of the Bonds, the monies shall be held in or returned or transferred to the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District for payment of any outstanding bonds of the District payable from such fund; provided, however, that if the monies are part of the proceeds of bonds of the District, the monies shall be transferred to the fund created for the payment of principal of and interest on such bonds. If no such bonds of the District are at such time outstanding, the monies shall be transferred to the general fund of the District as provided and permitted by law.

(i) Defeasance of Bonds. If at any time the District shall pay or cause to be paid or there shall otherwise be paid to the Owners of any or all of the outstanding Bonds all or any part of the principal, interest and premium, if any, on the Bonds at the times and in the manner provided herein and in the Bonds, or as provided in the following paragraph, or as otherwise provided by law consistent herewith, then such Owners shall cease to be entitled to the obligation of the District as provided in Section 6 hereof, and such obligation and all agreements and covenants of the District and of the County to such Owners hereunder and under the Bonds shall thereupon be satisfied and discharged and shall terminate, except only that the District shall remain liable for payment of all principal, interest and premium, if any, represented by the Bonds, but only out of monies on deposit in the Interest and Sinking Fund or otherwise held in trust for such payment; and provided further, however, that the provisions of subsection (j) of this Section shall apply in all events.

For purposes of this Section, the District may pay and discharge any or all of the Bonds by depositing in trust with the Paying Agent or an escrow agent, selected by the District, at or before maturity, money or non-callable direct obligations of the United States of America (including zero interest bearing State and Local Government Series) or other non-callable obligations the payment of the principal of and interest on which is guaranteed by a pledge of the full faith and credit of the United States of America, in an amount which will, together with the interest to accrue thereon and available monies then on deposit in the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District, be fully sufficient to pay and discharge the indebtedness on such Bonds (including all principal, interest and redemption premiums) at or before their respective maturity dates.

(j) Unclaimed Monies. Any money held in any fund created pursuant to this Resolution, or by the Paying Agent or an escrow agent in trust, for the payment of the principal or accreted value of, redemption premium, if any, or interest on the Bonds and remaining unclaimed for two years after the principal or accreted value of all of the Bonds has become due and payable (whether by maturity or upon prior redemption) shall be transferred to the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District for payment of any outstanding bonds of the District payable from the fund; or, if no such bonds of the District are at such time outstanding, the monies shall be transferred to the general fund of the District as provided and permitted by law.

#### Section 8. Paying Agent.

(a) Appointment, Payment of Fees and Expenses. This Board does hereby consent to and confirm the appointment of The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A., to act as the initial paying agent for the Bonds. All fees and expenses of the paying agent shall be the sole responsibility of the District, and to the extent not paid from the proceeds of sale of the Bonds, or from the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District, insofar as permitted by law, including specifically by Section 15232 of the Education Code, such fees and expenses shall be paid by the District.

(b) Resignation, Removal and Replacement of Paying Agent. The Paying Agent initially appointed or any successor Paying Agent may resign from service as Paying Agent and may be removed at any time by the County after consultation with the District as provided in the Paying Agent's service agreement. If at any time the Paying Agent shall resign or be removed, the Treasurer-Tax Collector shall appoint a successor Paying Agent, which shall be any bank, trust company, national banking association or other financial institution doing business in and having a corporate trust office in California, with at least \$50,000,000 in net assets.

(c) Principal Corporate Trust Office. The initial Paying Agent, and any successor Paying Agent, shall designate each place or places where it will conduct the functions of transfer, registration, exchange, payment, and surrender of the Bonds, and any reference herein to the "principal corporate trust office" of the Paying Agent shall mean the office so designated for a particular purpose. If no office is so designated for a particular purpose, such functions shall be conducted at the office of The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A., in Dallas, Texas, or the principal corporate trust office of any successor Paying Agent.

(d) Registration Books. The Paying Agent shall keep or cause to be kept at its principal corporate trust office sufficient books for the registration and transfer of the Bonds, which shall at all times be open to inspection by the District and the County, and, upon presentation for such purpose, the Paying Agent shall, under such reasonable regulations as it may prescribe, register or transfer or cause to be registered or transferred on the Registration Books, Bonds as provided in Sections 9 and 10 hereof. The Paying Agent shall keep accurate records of all funds administered by it and of all Bonds paid and discharged by it. Such records shall be provided, upon reasonable request, to the District in a format mutually agreeable to the Paying Agent and the District.

#### Section 9. Transfer Under Book-Entry System; Discontinuation of Book-Entry System.

(a) Unless otherwise specified in the Certificate of Award, DTC is hereby appointed depository for the Bonds and the Bonds shall be issued in book-entry form only, and shall be initially registered in the name of "Cede & Co.," as nominee of DTC. One bond certificate shall be issued for each maturity of the Bonds; provided, however, that if different CUSIP numbers are assigned to Bonds maturing in a single

year or, if Bonds maturing in a single year are issued with different interest rates, additional bond certificates shall be prepared for each such maturity. Registered ownership of such Bonds of each such maturity, or any portion thereof, may not thereafter be transferred except as provided in this Section or Section 10 hereof:

(i) To any successor of DTC, or its nominee, or to any substitute depository designated pursuant to clause (ii) of this Section (a "substitute depository"); provided, however that any successor of DTC, as nominee of DTC or substitute depository, shall be qualified under any applicable laws to provide the services proposed to be provided by it;

(ii) To any substitute depository not objected to by the District, upon (1) the resignation of DTC or its successor (or any substitute depository or its successor) from its functions as depository, or (2) a determination by the District to substitute another depository for DTC (or its successor) because DTC or its successor (or any substitute depository or its successor) is no longer able to carry out its functions as depository; provided, that any such substitute depository shall be qualified under any applicable laws to provide the services proposed to be provided by it; or

(iii) To any person as provided below, upon (1) the resignation of DTC or its successor (or substitute depository or its successor) from its functions as depository; provided that no substitute depository which is not objected to by the District can be obtained, or (2) a determination by the District that it is in the best interests of the District to remove DTC or its successor (or any substitute depository or its successor) from its functions as depository.

(b) In the case of any transfer pursuant to clause (i) or clause (ii) of subsection (a) of this Section, upon receipt of the outstanding Bonds by the Paying Agent, together with a written request of the District to the Paying Agent, a new Bond for each maturity shall be executed and delivered in the aggregate principal amount of such Bonds then outstanding), registered in the name of such successor or such substitute depository, or their nominees, as the case may be, all as specified in such written request of the District. In the case of any transfer pursuant to clause (iii) of subsection (a) of this Section, upon receipt of the outstanding Bonds by the Paying Agent together with a written request of the District to the Paying Agent, new Bonds shall be executed and delivered in such denominations, numbered in the manner determined by the Paying Agent, and registered in the names of such persons, as are requested in such written request of the District, subject to the limitations of Section 5 hereof and the receipt of such a written request of the District, and thereafter, the Bonds shall be transferred pursuant to the provisions set forth in Section 10 hereof provided, however, that the Paying Agent shall not be required to deliver such new Bonds within a period of less than sixty (60) days after the receipt of any such written request of the District.

(c) In the case of partial redemption or an advance refunding of the Bonds evidencing all or a portion of the principal amount then outstanding, DTC shall make an appropriate notation on the Bonds indicating the date and amounts of such reduction in principal.

(d) The District and the Paying Agent shall be entitled to treat the person in whose name any Bond is registered as the owner thereof, notwithstanding any notice to the contrary received by the District or the Paying Agent; and the District and the Paying Agent shall have no responsibility for transmitting payments to, communicating with, notifying, or otherwise dealing with any beneficial owners of the Bonds, and neither the District nor the Paying Agent shall have any responsibility or obligation, legal or otherwise, to the beneficial owners or to any other party, including DTC or

its successor (or substitute depository or its successor), except for the Owner of any Bonds.

(e) So long as the outstanding Bonds are registered in the name of Cede & Co. or its registered assigns, the District and the Paying Agent shall cooperate with Cede & Co., as sole registered Owner, or its registered assigns in effecting payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds by arranging for payment in such manner that funds for such payments are properly identified and are made immediately available on the date they are due.

#### Section 10. Transfer and Exchange.

(a) Transfer. Following the termination or removal of DTC or successor depository pursuant to Section 9 hereof, any Bond may, in accordance with its terms, be transferred, upon the Registration Books, by the Owner thereof, in person or by the duly authorized attorney of such Owner, upon surrender of such Bond to the Paying Agent for cancellation, accompanied by delivery of a duly executed written instrument of transfer in a form approved by the Paying Agent.

Whenever any Bonds shall be surrendered for transfer, the designated District officials shall execute and the Paying Agent shall authenticate and deliver, as provided in Section 4 hereof, new Bonds, of the same maturity, Interest Payment Date and interest rate for a like aggregate principal amount. The Paying Agent may require the payment by any Owner of Bonds requesting any such transfer of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such transfer.

No transfer of any Bond shall be required to be made by the Paying Agent (i) during the period established by the Paying Agent for selection of the Bonds for redemption, and (ii) after any Bond has been selected for redemption.

(b) Exchange. The Bonds may be exchanged for Bonds of other authorized denominations of the same maturity and Interest Payment Date, by the Owner thereof, in person or by the duly authorized attorney of such Owner, upon surrender of such Bond to the Paying Agent for cancellation, accompanied by delivery of a duly executed request for exchange in a form approved by the Paying Agent.

Whenever any Bonds shall be surrendered for exchange, the designated District officials shall execute and the Paying Agent shall authenticate and deliver, as provided in Section 4 hereof, new Bonds of the same maturity and interest payment mode and interest rate for a like aggregate principal amount. The Paying Agent may require the payment by the Owner requesting such exchange of any tax or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such exchange.

No exchange of any Bonds shall be required to be made by the Paying Agent (i) during the period established by the Paying Agent for selection of the Bonds for redemption, and (ii) after any Bond has been selected for redemption.

Section 11. Sale of Bonds. The Bonds shall be sold upon the taking of public bids and shall be offered by means of an Official Notice of Sale, substantially in the form attached as **Exhibit C.** Such bonds shall be sold to the responsible bidder who makes the best responsive bid therefor, after publication of a Notice of Intention to Sell Bonds once at least five (5) days before the date of sale in a financial publication generally circulated throughout the State of California or which the Municipal Advisor advises is expected to be disseminated among prospective bidders for the Bonds. The Official Notice of Sale with respect to the competitively sold Bonds shall require that (i) the purchase price of such Bonds shall be no less than the principal amount thereof; (ii) such Bonds shall otherwise conform to the

618 limitations specified in this Resolution, including specifically those terms  
619 prescribed by this section. The forms of the Official Notice of Sale on file with the  
620 Secretary of the Board are hereby approved, and the Authorized Officers are each  
621 hereby authorized to publicize one or more instruments in substantially said form and  
622 award the sale pursuant thereto and pursuant to one or more certificates of award  
623 (the "Certificate of Award"), subject to such changes or revisions to the Official  
624 Notice of Sale as may be acceptable to the Authorized Officer, and the District's  
625 approval of all such changes shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and  
626 delivery of the Certificate of Award. The District reserves the right to reject all  
627 bids and to re-bid the Bonds or, if necessary, to sell the Bonds by negotiated sale  
628 as permitted by law, upon consultation the Municipal Advisor, and upon terms and  
629 conditions otherwise in conformity with the limitations contained in this Resolution.

630  
631 The Certificate of Award or such other document awarding the sale of Bonds,  
632 shall recite the terms of the Bonds sold under such document in accordance with  
633 Section 5 hereof as determined in the sale thereof. The Certificate of Award shall  
634 recite the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds and shall recite the date thereof,  
635 the maturity dates, principal amounts and annual rates of interest of each maturity  
636 thereof, the initial and semiannual Interest Payment Dates thereof, and the terms of  
637 optional, extraordinary and mandatory sinking fund redemption thereof if any.

638  
639 In accordance with Section 15146(g) of the Education Code, to the extent not  
640 contracted to be paid by the Purchaser, the Authorized Officers are each hereby  
641 authorized to cause to be deposited in a costs of issuance account, which may be held  
642 by The Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A., as cost of issuance administrator,  
643 proceeds of sale of the Bonds (exclusive of any premium or accrued interest received)  
644 in an amount not exceeding 2.00% of the principal amount of the Bonds sold, as shall  
645 be set forth in the Certificate of Award, for the purposes of paying the costs  
646 associated with the issuance of the Bonds not contracted to be paid by the Purchaser,  
647 if any.

648  
649 In accordance with subsection (h) and (i) of Section 15146 of the Education  
650 Code, the Authorized Officers are each hereby authorized to cause to be deposited in  
651 the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District proceeds of sale of the Bonds (in  
652 addition to any premium or accrued interest received) to fund (i) an annual reserve  
653 permitted by Section 15250 of the Education Code, and/or (ii) capitalized interest in  
654 an amount not exceeding the interest scheduled to become due on the Bonds for a period  
655 of two years from the date of issuance of the Bonds, as shall be set forth in the  
656 Certificate of Award, if any such a deposit is deemed by the Authorized Officer  
657 executing the same to be in the best interests of the District.

658  
659 For purposes of Education Code section 15146(b) and Government Code section  
660 5852.1, good faith estimates of (a) the true interest cost of the Bonds; (b) the costs  
661 associated with the issuance of the Bonds; (c) the amount of proceeds to be received  
662 by the District (less the Costs of Issuance or reserves or capitalized interest, if  
663 any); and (d) the total payments of principal of and interest on the Bonds through  
664 the final maturity of the Bonds, are set forth on **Exhibit B** attached hereto and  
665 incorporated herein.

666  
667 Section 12. Continuing Disclosure Agreement. The Continuing Disclosure  
668 Agreement, in substantially the form submitted to this meeting and made a part hereof  
669 as though set forth herein, is hereby approved, and the Authorized Officers are each  
670 hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to  
671 execute and deliver a Continuing Agreement in substantially said form, as is necessary  
672 to cause the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 to be satisfied, with such changes,  
673 insertions and omissions as the Authorized Officer executing the same may require or  
674 approve, such determination, requirement or approval to be conclusively evidenced by

the execution of the applicable Continuing Disclosure Agreement by such Authorized Officer.

Section 13. Preliminary Official Statement. The Preliminary Official Statement to be distributed in connection with the public offering of the Bonds, in substantially the form submitted to this meeting and made a part hereof as though set forth herein, with such changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by an Authorized Officer, is hereby approved, and the use of such Preliminary Official Statement in connection with the offering and sale of the Bonds is hereby authorized and approved. The Authorized Officers are each hereby authorized to certify on behalf of the District that such Preliminary Official Statement is deemed final as of its date, within the meaning of Rule 15c2 12 (except for the omission of certain final pricing, rating and related information as permitted by Rule 15c2-12).

Section 14. Official Statement. The preparation and delivery of an Official Statement with respect to the Bonds, and its use by the Purchaser in connection with the offering and sale of the Bonds, is hereby authorized and approved. Such Official Statement shall be in substantially the form of the Preliminary Official Statement distributed in connection with the public offering of the Bonds with such changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by an Authorized Officer, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof. The Authorized Officers are each hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name of and on behalf of the District, to execute the final Official Statement with respect to the Bonds and any amendment or supplement thereto and thereupon to cause such final Official Statement and any such amendment or supplement to be delivered to the Purchaser.

Section 15. Application and Investment of Proceeds.

(a) Proceeds Deposit. The proceeds from the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited in the County Treasury to the credit of the Building Fund of the District. Any premium or accrued interest received by the District shall be deposited in the Interest and Sinking Fund of the District in the County Treasury. Earnings on the investment of moneys in either fund will be retained in that fund and used only for the purposes to which that fund may lawfully be applied. Moneys in the Building Fund may only be applied for the purposes for which the Bonds were approved. Moneys in the Interest and Sinking Fund may only be applied to make payments of interest, principal, and premium, if any, on bonds of the District.

(b) Investment of Proceeds. Amounts deposited into the Building Fund and the Interest and Sinking Fund, as well as proceeds of taxes held therein for payment of the Bonds, will be invested at the Treasurer-Tax Collector's discretion pursuant to law and the investment policy of the County.

Section 16. Tax Covenants.

(a) Adverse Effect. The District shall not take any action, or fail to take any action, if such action or failure to take such action would adversely affect the exclusion from gross income of the interest payable on Bonds under Section 103 of the Code. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the District hereby covenants that it will comply with the requirements of the Tax Certificate with respect to the Bonds to be executed by the District on the date of issuance of such Bonds. The provisions of this subsection (a) shall survive payment in full or defeasance of the Bonds.

(b) Yield Restriction. In the event that at any time the District is of the opinion that for purposes of this Section it is necessary or helpful to restrict or limit the yield on the investment of any monies held by the Treasurer-Tax Collector

on behalf of the District, in accordance with this Resolution or pursuant to law, the District shall so request of the Treasurer-Tax Collector in writing, and the District shall make its best efforts to ensure that the Treasurer-Tax Collector shall take such action as may be necessary in accordance with such instructions.

(c) Legal Opinion. Notwithstanding any provision of this Section, if the District shall provide to the Treasurer-Tax Collector an Opinion of Bond Counsel that any specified action required under this Section is no longer required or that some further or different action is required to maintain the exclusion from federal income tax of interest on Bonds under Section 103 of the Code, the Treasurer-Tax Collector may conclusively rely on such Opinion of Bond Counsel in complying with the requirements of this Section and of the Tax Certificate with respect to the Bonds, and the covenants hereunder shall be deemed to be modified to that extent.

Section 17. Professional Services. Dannis Woliver Kelley shall serve as bond counsel and as disclosure counsel to the District for the Bonds. Fieldman, Rolapp & Associates, Inc. shall serve as Municipal Advisor for the Bonds.

Section 18. Delegation of Authority. The Authorized Officers are hereby authorized and directed, jointly and severally, to do any and all things which they may deem necessary or advisable in order to consummate the transactions herein authorized and otherwise to carry out, give effect to and comply with the terms and intent of this Resolution.

Section 19. Approval of Actions. All actions heretofore taken by the officers, employees and agents of the District with respect to the transactions set forth above are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified.

Section 20. Filing with County. The Superintendent, or such other officer or employee of the District as the Superintendent may designate, is hereby authorized and directed to report to the Auditor-Controller of the County the final terms of sale of the Bonds, and to file with the Auditor-Controller and with the Treasurer-Tax Collector a copy of the executed Certificate of Award and this Resolution, and the schedule of amortization of the principal of and payment on the Bonds, and to file with the Treasurer-Tax Collector a proposed schedule of draws on the building fund of the District, and this Resolution shall serve as the notice required to be given by Section 15140(c) of the Education Code and as the District's request to the Auditor-Controller of the County and the Board of Supervisors of the County to propose and adopt in each year a tax rate applicable to all taxable property of the District for payment of the Bonds, pursuant to law; and to the other officers of the County to levy and collect said taxes for the payment of the Bonds, to pay in a timely manner to the Paying Agent on behalf of the Owners of the Bonds the principal, interest, and premium, if any, due on the Bonds in each year, and to create in the County Treasury to the credit of the District a building fund and an Interest and Sinking Fund pursuant to Section 15146 of the Education Code.

Section 21. Reimbursement of County Costs. The District shall reimburse the County for all costs and expenses incurred by the County, its officials, officers, agents and employees in connection with the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 22. Nonliability of County. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, in the Bonds or in any other document mentioned herein, neither the County, nor its officials, officers, employees or agents shall have any liability hereunder or by reason hereof or in connection with the transactions contemplated hereby. The Bonds are not a debt of the County or a pledge of the County's full faith and credit, and the Bonds and any liability in connection therewith shall be paid



788 solely from the ad valorem taxes lawfully levied to pay the Principal of or interest  
789 on the Bonds.

790  
791 Section 23. Indemnification of County. The District shall indemnify the County,  
792 its officers, agents and employees against any and all losses, claims, actions, suits,  
793 judgments, demands, damages, liabilities and expenses (including attorney fees and  
794 costs of investigation) of any nature arising out of any action or inaction of the  
795 District with respect to the issuance of the Bonds.

796  
797 Section 24. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect from and after  
798 its date of adoption.
