CALL TO ORDER

Board President Rodriguez called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

Other members in attendance were Ms. Torres, Ms. Amezcua, and Mr. Palacio.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Almendarez acknowledged SAUSD's Classified Employee of the Year Patricia Mendez, an activity monitor at Esqueda Elementary. Ms. Mendez has worked at the school for 10 years. She's known on campus for her caring attitude, her stellar organization skills and her ability to connect deeply with families. Esqueda Principal Kevin Tonai describes her as "a master supervisor who sees everything that happens on and off campus. She understands the pulse of the school and how to make sure it runs smoothly." Ms. Mendez is now a finalist in the 2021 Orange County Classified School Employee of the Year competition. He thanked all SAUSD staff, other community members, and Board members who have volunteered in a series of COVID vaccination clinics over the past few weeks. He stated that he has seen first-hand, teachers, principals, Board members, and dozens of other classified and certificated employees work to make sure the SAUSD community is vaccinated. He also thanked the community partners who have provided these vaccines. To date combined efforts have led to more than 10,000 vaccines for SAUSD staff and community. He encouraged everyone to take advantage of these vaccination opportunities. Mr. Almendarez shared that he received his first dose already, and will receive his second in a few days. Superintendent Almendarez thanked all the coaches, athletic directors, nurses, LVNs, and other staff who have worked tirelessly to help student athletes get safely back on the field in practices and competitions. Last Friday, SAUSD cheer squads also resumed activities. This means that hundreds of students across the district have been given back a sense of normalcy. The goal remains to bring back students in other extracurricular activities to campuses for in-person events as soon and as safely as possible. He also gave an update on the COVID rates. He shared that the testing positivity rates are now under 5% across every zip code in the district. The county recently entered the Red tier, and the even less restrictive Orange Tier could come by early April. He cautioned everyone that this fight is not over and that we need to continue working together in order to get through this pandemic. Lastly, Superintendent Almendarez shared that there are a lot of questions regarding the reopening plan. There will be a presentation later today. There have been a lot of questions related specifically to seniors. The high schools are working very hard to identify activities that they can safely honor and bring students back to participate to have an experience on campus prior to their graduations.

Mr. Palacio requested information on the sophomores and juniors that are behind in credits, the percentage of students that are being helped during learning labs, and how many teachers are teaching in the classrooms. Ms. Torres requested a description on how COVID money will be used. Mr. Palacio motioned to add a friendly amendment to include Madeline Spencer. Dr. Rodriguez asked Ms. Torres if she was willing to accept the friendly amendment. Ms. Torres did not accept the amendment. Dr. Rodriguez called the motion as non-debatable. Dr. Alvarez requested a legal opinion regarding the public comment that was read. Dr. Rodriguez commented on the process of vetting members to a committee. Dr. Rodriguez called the question for a majority vote to end the debate. By a vote of 3-0, the debate ended. Board members with a yes vote were Dr. Rodriguez, Ms. Torres, and Dr. Alvarez, with no response from Ms. Amezcua and Mr. Palacio. Dr. Rodriguez called the vote to approve item 8.5.

BOARD REPORTS

Dr. Alvarez acknowledged last year on March 13th schools closed due to COVID. He asked that the District continue to monitor the rates and if safe to do so, increase the original number of learning labs. He also asked the District to consider COVID testing for students participating in the learning labs. Dr. Alvarez shared that senior events, sports, cheerleaders, are back. He thanked staff for helping with food distribution, testing, and vaccine distribution. He gave a shout-out to Speech and Debate team and shared that intermediate school students are going to nationals. Dr. Alvarez commented on the partnership with the City of Santa Ana and stated that Cabinet members should be interacting with counterparts at the city.

Ms. Amezcua requested that resolutions like denouncing hate crime against Asian Americans should be presented to show support to the community. Ms. Amezcua thanked staff for helping with the vaccines. Over 10,000 vaccines have been given. She acknowledged Walgreens, Rite Aid, and Latino Health Access, together with all our partners and elected like Tom Daly, Tom Umberg, Lou Correa, Josh Newman, Mr. Palacio, Dr. Lopez-Guerra, and Michelle Dominguez. She also thanked all the volunteers, classified staff, DSO's, and custodians. She informed everyone that another 2,300 vaccines will be provided on Monday. Ms. Amezcua asked for how many staff members have been vaccinated that want it. She congratulated the Speech and Debate team. She commented on band and cheerleading returning. She mentioned that Dr. Lorraine Perez and Amanda Corridan are working on night school, summer school, to meet the needs of the children. Ms. Amezcua requested a weekly B2B update on graduation. She asked for everyone to be more mindful in regard to learning pods, continue to wear masks, and continue testing. Lastly, Ms. Amezcua commented on Ms. Madeline Spencer's public comment.

Mr. Palacio shared that his participation in the NJROTC program along with Dr. Alvarez and Ms. Amezcua and acknowledged that they have been distinguished for 20 years. Mr. Palacio also shared that he met with Senator Umber, Assembly member Daly, Senator Minh, and Senator Norris, along with other elected officials to talk about issues to address. He added that he participated in the Speech and Debate program and acknowledged their success. He encouraged staff and other community members to help volunteer with the vaccine distribution. He asked Superintendent to send a message to staff for those interested in volunteering.

Ms. Torres thanked everyone for staying on late. She asked that instructions for callers to unmute themselves be added to the instructions given to them when submitting a request to address the Board.

Ms. Amezcua thanked the Orange County Labor Federation for their partnership and helping with the distribution of 1,500 vaccines on one day and 1,000 on another day.



Superintendent Almendarez verified and Ms. Amezcua added that only if there are vaccines left over. Dr. Rodriguez commented on the school reopening and the conversation that took place. He asked everyone to stay focused on the health of the community. Dr. Rodriguez acknowledged the work of Dr. Susie Lopez-Guerra, Michelle Dominguez, FACE workers, and the Board, who have supported the involvement as a District through its resources to be engaged in a community level campaign around vaccinations and other items such as Protect Santa Ana. Lastly he expressed his respect to each of the Board members for being committed to provide students and their families with the best support they can.

JOB SUMMARY:

Under the direction of the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services, plan, organize, and implement the overall operation of the Risk Management Department. Provide direction in the monitoring of the expenditure of funds assigned to be utilized in the various programs in order to ensure maximum effectiveness and legal compliance. Provide leadership in the administration of the Worker's Compensation Program as required by law.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

- Plan, coordinate, and implement the insurance, loss control and risk management programs, including self-insured and indemnity functions of property, casualty, liability, worker's compensation, medical, dental, vision, life and retirement programs and employee and pupil safety programs. **E**
- Supervise the Employee and Retirees Group Health Benefits including Employee Wellness, Disability Retirement, and Deferred Compensation. **E**
- Monitor expenditures in the health benefits and workers' compensation funds and insurance related portions of all other District funds. **E**
- Oversee insurance and risk management expenses, forecasts, and budget to ensure all financial objectives are met; and manage self-insured loss reserve accounts with primary emphasis on retiree health benefits, property liability, and workers' compensation. **E**
- Communicate with health care providers, attorneys and third party administrators regarding health insurance and worker's compensation issues. **E**
- Participate in the investigation of incidents and coordinate the preparation of material and evidence for use in hearings, litigation and insurance claim cases. **E**
- Administer District fleet vehicle accident claims. **E**
- Administer subrogation and recoveries on District's behalf. **E**
- Consult and work collaboratively with Human Resources to identify and resolve workers' compensation, return to work, FMLA compliance, employee absence management, return to work, reasonable accommodation and acts of violence. **E**

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF RISK MANAGEMENT (cont.)

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES: (continued)

- Review new regulatory requirements and initiate technical guidance in the formulation, interpretation, and application of District policies and procedures as they pertain to risk management, liability claims, workers' compensation claims, occupational and student health and safety regulations, workplace accommodations, and other related issues. **E**
- Coordinates with outside counsel on legal matters and claims/litigation against the District. **E**
- Settles Workers' Compensation and Liability claims as authorized by the Board of Education. **E**
- Work with the Director of Maintenance and Operations to develop, manage and direct the District's environmental, occupational and student health and safety programs to ensure compliance with Cal/OSHA, ADA, and other related Federal, State, and local laws and regulations. **E**
- Conduct on-site inspections, and identify and analyze District loss exposures and review loss histories. **E**
- Serve as the District's Chemical Hygiene Officer; investigate and ensure that hazardous waste and surplus chemicals are handled in compliance with local, State and Federal regulations across all existing and new facilities; update and oversee compliance with the District's Chemical Hygiene Plan as required; prepares mandated regulatory reports. **E**
- Identify risk, which consists of the continuous identification of the District's exposure to loss and quantitative measurement of the risks affecting the District in terms of both frequency and severity; work closely with District stakeholders to identify and resolve compliance issues. **E**
- Assist in the development, maintenance and management of necessary budgets to accomplish risk management programs; evaluate and analyze costs and benefits of insurance programs and participate in contract negotiations with providers; and assist in the development of cost containment programs. **E**
- Analyzes the District's claim, loss, and accident history, and identify methods to eliminate or minimize risks and possible losses and recommend solutions. **E**
- Develop specifications, select, and manage insurance service providers, including insurers, brokers, and third party claims administrators. **E**

- Organize, facilitate, and maintain training programs to enhance and encourage employee awareness of workplace hazards; assist in the instruction of staff and provide specific on-site occupational safety and health training; may coordinate, schedule, and arrange for off-site training through specific courses, seminars, and workshops. **E**
- Gather, organize, and analyze employee training records and documentation of safety training accomplished; utilize computerized spreadsheet and/or database management programs in order to review, evaluate, and maintain records regarding employee accidents; prepare appropriate reports. **E**




