SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Almendarez provided a COVID update. He shared that COVID-19 positivity rates for our district continue at or below the county average across all of our zip codes. The District's numbers have remained consistently low even after the Spring Break. This is a credit to our students, staff, and families who continue to work to keep schools healthy and safe places for learning. He added that this is not a time to let our quard down and encouraged everyone to follow all current safety protocols that include frequent hand washing and staying home if you feel ill or have any symptoms. The District will also continue weekly testing of students and staff at every school site through at least the end of the school year. Mr. Almendarez recognized the 16 inspiring and talented woman from SAUSD honored as 2022 Women of the year by U.S. Congressman Lou Correa on Saturday. This award honors exceptional women in the 46th Congressional District who have made significant contributions to their community. Honorees from across SAUSD include teachers, principals, administrators, family outreach specialists, and other school support staff. To see the full list of award recipients, visit www.sausd.us. Superintendent also recognized Dr. Sonia Llamas, SAUSD's Assistant Superintendent of School Performance and Culture, for being honored with the "Catalyst of Hope" award by Project Hope Alliance. Dr. Llamas was recognized for her efforts to help Project Hope Alliance to expand its service into Santa Ana Unified School District. Thanks to the leadership of Dr. Llamas, Project Hope Alliance will be able to provide services and resources to scores of SAUSD children and youth from kindergarten through age 24 so they can have tools they need to learn their way to a better tomorrow.

Mr. Almendarez announced that the California Student Aid Commission last week recognized Segerstrom High School for being one of the top three schools in the state for student financial aid application, or FAFSA completion rates. Segerstrom had 88 percent of all seniors complete a financial aid application last year. By applying for financial aid, college bound seniors made sure they took advantage of all state and federal grants and awards available to them. It's never too early to begin thinking about college, and about paying for college. He congratulated the Segerstrom's counseling team and other staff for helping students on their path to a college education. He also encouraged all high school students to learn more about financial aid at studentaid.gov. Superintendent stated that last week, the Santa Ana Public Schools Foundation awarded \$49,000 in scholarships to 42 graduating SAUSD seniors. This award will also help our student recipients realize their dream of attending college with additional financial support. He thanked the Foundation for building this scholarship program to assist our students in their academic careers. He also thanked the foundation for all the other work its members do to support our entire district. In addition, he shared a great accomplishment from our Design Class at McFadden Institute of Technology. The program was recently named winner for the Southwest Region of the Association for Learning Environments. This organization runs an annual competition where students design next generation high schools. The team was recognized for their project Obama High School, an eco-friendly campus designed with solar panels on every school building, wind turbines, large windows for natural light, rooftop gardens, and other features. The McFadden team has been invited to attend the Regional Conference in Las Vegas to present the project next month. Lastly Superintendent announced that tomorrow, April 27, is National Administrative Professionals Day. He thanked all of our amazing administrative professionals in SAUSD, who are often the first point of contact between our schools and district offices and our community members. Their roles and responsibilities can vary considerably from day to day, but their value to our District is immeasurable. He encouraged everyone to take time tomorrow to thank an administrative professional who has supported you or your school.

BOARD OF EDUCATION SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

AUTHORIZATION TO INCREASE IN STATUTORY SCHOOL FEES IMPOSED ON RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL CONSTRUCTION PURSUANT TO EDUCATION CODE SECTION 17620 AND GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 65995

WHEREAS, the Board of Education ("Board") of the Santa Ana Unified School District ("District") provides for the educational needs for Grade K-12 students within the City of Santa Ana, City of Tustin, City of Irvine, City of Costa Mesa, City of Newport Beach ("Cities"), and unincorporated portions of the County of Orange ("County"); and

WHEREAS, on February 23, 2022 the State Allocation Board authorized an adjustment in the statutory school fee amounts for unified school districts pursuant to Government Code Section 65995(b)(3) to Four and 79/100 Dollars (\$4.79) per square foot for assessable space of residential construction ("Residential Statutory School Fees"), Seventy-Eight Cents (\$0.78) per square foot of chargeable covered and enclosed space for the categories of new commercial/industrial construction ("Commercial/Industrial Fees"), collectively "Statutory School Fees"), as long as such increases are properly justified by the District pursuant to law; and

WHEREAS, residential, and commercial/industrial continues to generate additional students for the District's schools and the District is required to provide school facilities ("School Facilities") to accommodate those students; and

WHEREAS, overcrowded schools within the District have an impact on the District's ability to provide an adequate quality education and negatively impact the educational opportunities for the District's students; and

WHEREAS, the District does not have sufficient funds available for the construction or reconstruction of the School Facilities, including acquisition of sites, construction of permanent School Facilities, and acquisition of interim School Facilities, to accommodate students from residential and commercial/industrial construction; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received and considered reports entitled, "Residential Development School Fee Justification Study and Commercial/Industrial Development Fee Justification Study ("Studies") which include information, School documentation, and analysis of the School Facilities needs of the District, including: (a) the purpose of the Statutory School Fees; (b) the use to which the Statutory School Fees are to be put; (c) the nexus (roughly proportional and reasonable relationship) between the residential and commercial/industrial construction and (1) the use for Statutory School Fees, (2) the need for School Facilities, (3) the cost of School Facilities and the amount of Statutory School Fees from residential and commercial/industrial construction; (d) a determination of the impact of the increased number of employees anticipated to result from the commercial/industrial construction (by category) upon the cost of providing School Facilities within the District; (e) an evaluation and projection of the number of students that will be generated by residential construction; (f) the School Facilities that will be required to serve such students; and (g) the cost of such School Facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Studies pertaining to the Statutory School Fees and to the capital facilities needs of the District has been available to the public for at least ten (10) days before the Board considered at a regularly scheduled public meeting the increase in the Statutory School Fees; and

WHEREAS, all notices of the proposed increase in the Statutory School Fees have been given in accordance with applicable law; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was duly held at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board relating to the proposed increase in the Statutory School Fees on April 26, 2022; and

WHEREAS, as to the Statutory School Fees, Education Code Section 17621 provides that the adoption, increase or imposition of any fee, charge, dedication, or other requirement, pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 shall not be subject to the California Environmental Quality Act, Division 13 (commencing with Section 21000) of the Public Resources Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Board accepts and adopts the Studies.

<u>Section 2</u>. That the Board finds that the purpose of the Statutory School Fees imposed upon residential construction are to fund the additional School Facilities required to serve the students generated by the residential construction upon which the Statutory School Fees are imposed.

Section 3. That the Board finds that the Statutory School Fees imposed on residential construction will be used only to finance those School Facilities described in the Studies and related documents, and that these School Facilities are required to serve the students generated by the residential construction within the District; and that the use of the Statutory School Fees will include construction or acquisition of additional School Facilities, remodeling existing School Facilities to add additional classrooms, and technology, and acquiring and installing additional portable classrooms and related School Facilities, with the specific location of new schools, remodeling of existing School Facilities, and additional portables to be determined based on the residence of the students being generated by such residential construction, as well as any required central administrative and support facilities, within the District.

<u>Section 4</u>. That the Board finds that there is a roughly proportional, reasonable relationship between the use of the Statutory School Fees and the residential construction within the District because the Statutory School Fees imposed on residential construction by this Resolution will be used to fund School Facilities that will be used to serve the students generated by such residential construction.

<u>Section 5</u>. That the Board finds that there is a roughly proportional, reasonable relationship between the residential construction upon which the Statutory School Fees are imposed, and the need for additional School Facilities in the District because new students will be generated from residential construction within the District and the District does not have student capacity in the existing School Facilities to accommodate these students.

<u>Section 6</u>. That the Board finds that the amount of the Statutory School Fees imposed on residential construction as set forth in this Resolution is roughly proportional and reasonably related to, and does not exceed the cost of, providing the School Facilities required to serve the students generated by such residential construction within the District.

Section 7. That the Board finds that the purpose of the Statutory School Fees imposed on new commercial/industrial construction is to fund the additional School Facilities required to serve the students generated by the new commercial/industrial construction upon which the Commercial/Industrial Fees are imposed.

Section 8. That the Board finds that the Statutory School Fees imposed on new commercial/industrial construction (by category) will be used only to finance those School Facilities described in the Studies and related documents and that these School Facilities are required to serve the students generated by such new commercial/industrial construction; and that the use of the Statutory School Fees will include construction or acquisition of additional School Facilities, remodeling existing School Facilities to add additional classrooms and technology, and acquiring and installing additional portable classrooms and related facilities, with the specific location of new schools, remodeling of existing School Facilities, and additional portables to be determined based on the residence of the students being generated by such new commercial/ industrial construction, as well as any required central administrative and support facilities within the District.

<u>Section 9</u>. That the Board finds that there is a roughly proportional, reasonable relationship between the use of the Statutory School Fees and new commercial/industrial construction by category within the District because the Statutory School Fees imposed on commercial/industrial construction by this Resolution will be used to fund School Facilities which will be used to serve the students generated by such new commercial/industrial construction.

Section 10. That the Board finds that there is a roughly proportional, reasonable relationship between the new commercial/industrial construction by category, upon which the Statutory School Fees are imposed, and the need for additional School Facilities in the District because new students will be generated from new commercial/industrial construction within the District and the District does not have student capacity in the existing School Facilities to accommodate these students.

<u>Section 11</u>. That the Board finds that the amount of the Statutory School Fees imposed on new commercial/industrial construction by category as set forth in this Resolution is roughly proportional and reasonably related to and does not exceed the cost of providing the School Facilities required to serve the students generated by such new commercial/industrial construction within the District.

Section 12. That the Board finds that a separate fund ("Fund") of the District and two or more sub-funds ("Sub-Funds") have been created or are authorized to be established for all monies received by the District for the deposit of Statutory School Fees and mitigation payments ("Mitigation Payments") imposed on construction within the District and that said Fund and Sub-Funds at all times have been separately maintained, except for temporary investments, with other funds of the District as authorized by law.

Section 13. That the Board finds that the monies of the separate Fund or the separate Sub-Funds described in Section 12, consisting of the proceeds of Statutory School Fees and Mitigation Payments have been imposed for the purposes of constructing and reconstructing those School Facilities necessitated by residential and/or commercial/industrial construction, and thus, these monies may be expended for all those purposes permitted by applicable law. The Statutory School Fees may also be expended by the District for the costs of performing any study or otherwise making the findings and determinations required under subdivisions (a), (b), and (d) of Section 66001 of the Government Code. In addition, the District may also retain, as appropriate, an amount not to exceed in any fiscal year, three percent (3%) of the fees collected in that fiscal year pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 for reimbursement of the administrative costs incurred by the District in collecting the Statutory School Fees. Section 14. That the Board hereby increases the Statutory School Fees as a condition of approval of residential development projects and imposes the Statutory

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School Fees on such development projects in the following amounts:

- Four and 79/100 Dollars (\$4.79) per square foot of assessable space for new residential construction, including residential projects, manufactured homes and mobile homes as authorized under Education Code Section 17625, and including residential construction or reconstruction other than new construction where such construction or reconstruction results in an increase of assessable space, as defined in Government Code Section 65995, in excess of five hundred (500) square feet.
- Seventy-Eight Cents (\$0.78) per square foot of assessable space for new residential construction used exclusively for the housing of senior citizens, as described in Section 51.3 of the Civil Code or as described in subdivision (k) of Section 1596.2 of the Health and Safety Code or a multi level facility as described in paragraph 9 of subdivision (d) of Government Code Section 15432 or any mobile home or manufactured home that is located within a mobile home park, subdivision, cooperative or condominium for mobile homes limited to older persons as defined by the Federal Fair Housing Amendments of 1988.

Section 15. That this Board hereby increases the Statutory School Fees as a condition of approval of new commercial/industrial construction projects and levies the Statutory School Fees on such development projects in the following amounts:

- Four and Eight-Tenths of a Cent (\$0.048) per square foot of assessable space for new self-storage construction.
- Seventy-Eight Cents (\$0.78) per square foot of assessable space for new all other categories of commercial/industrial construction.

Section 16. That the proceeds of the Statutory School Fees increased and established pursuant to this Resolution shall continue to be deposited into those Sub-Funds of the Funds identified in Section 12 of this Resolution, the proceeds of which shall be used exclusively for the purpose for which the Statutory School Fees are to be collected, including, as to Statutory School Fees, accomplishing any study, findings or determinations required by subdivisions (a), (b) and (d) of Section 66001 of the Government Code, or retaining an amount not to exceed in any fiscal year, three percent (3%) of the fees collected in that fiscal year pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 for reimbursement of the administrative costs incurred by the District in collecting the Statutory School Fees or in financing the described Studies or in defending the imposition of Statutory School Fees.

Section 17. That the District's Superintendent, or designee, is directed to cause a copy of this Resolution to be delivered to the building officials of the Cities and the County along with a copy of all the supporting documentation referenced herein and a map of the District clearly indicating the boundaries thereof, advising the Cities and the County that residential and commercial/industrial construction is subject to the Statutory School Fees increased pursuant to this Resolution and requesting that no building permit or approval for occupancy be issued by any of these entities for any residential development project, mobile home or manufactured home subject to the Statutory School Fees absent a certification of compliance ("Certificate of Compliance") from the District demonstrating compliance of such project with the requirements of the Statutory School Fees, nor that any building permit be issued for any nonresidential construction absent a certification from this District of compliance with the requirements of the applicable Statutory School Fees.

Section 18. That the Board hereby adopts and establishes the procedures that permit the party against whom the Commercial/Industrial Fees are imposed the opportunity for a hearing to appeal that imposition of Commercial/Industrial Fees for commercial/industrial construction as stated in Education Code Section 17621 and Government Code Section 66020 and 66021.

Section 19. That the Superintendent is authorized to cause a Certificate of Compliance to be issued for each development project, mobile home and manufactured home for which there is compliance with the requirement for payment of the Statutory School Fees in the amounts specified by this Resolution. In the event a Certificate of Compliance is issued for the payment of Statutory School Fees for a development project, mobile home or manufactured home and it is later determined that the statement or other representation made by an authorized party concerning the development project as to square footage is untrue or in the event the zoning is declared invalid, then such Certificate of Compliance shall automatically terminate, and the appropriate City or County shall be so notified.

Section 20. That no statement or provision set forth in this Resolution, or referred to therein shall be construed to repeal any preexisting fee or mitigation amount previously imposed by the District on any residential or nonresidential construction. Notwithstanding the preceding, if the District adopts alternative school facilities fees for residential construction pursuant to Government Code Sections 65995.5, 65995.6 and/or 65995.7 ("Alternative School Facilities Fees"), the District is hereby authorized to collect the Alternative School Facilities Fees in lieu of the Statutory School Fee with respect to residential construction. If the Alternative School Facilities Fees should lapse or be terminated, then the Statutory School Fees shall be collected for residential construction at the amount set forth in this Resolution.

<u>Section 21</u>. That if any portion or provision hereof is held invalid, the remainder hereof is intended to be and shall remain valid.

<u>Section 22</u>. That the increase in the District's Statutory School Fees will become effective sixty (60) days from the date of this Resolution unless a separate resolution increasing the fees immediately on an urgency basis is adopted by the Board.

A Resolution Denouncing Hate Crimes and Bigotry Targeting Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders

WHEREAS, The Asian Pacific Policy and Planning Council and Chinese for Affirmative Action launched a hate incident-reporting internet website, titled "Stop AAPI Hate," at the beginning of the COVID-19 outbreak in March of 2020, which documented over 2,800 hate incidents against Asian-American Pacific Islanders (AAPI) in 2020; and

WHEREAS, On January 30, 2021, 84-year-old Vicha Ratanapakdee, a nearly-blind and gentle elderly Thai man, died from injuries resulting from an attack while he was walking in the City of San Francisco, in what is deemed as a hate crime; and

WHEREAS, On March 16, 2021, 8 people (6 being Asian, 2 white, all but one being women) were gunned down by a white man in Atlanta, Georgia;

WHEREAS, These reports depict a disturbing reality, especially for Asian women, who experienced violence nearly 2.5 times more than their male counterparts. However, the numbers do not tell the full story: They don't include many of the unreported and increasingly normalized incidents of violence; and

WHEREAS, Racism and anti-AAPI sentiments has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic and politically charged and culturally insensitive rhetoric referring to COVID-19 as the "Chinese virus" or "kung flu" further encourages racism, prejudice, and hate crimes against AAPIs; and

WHEREAS, Racism toward AAPIs has always existed ever since AAPIs began immigrating to the United States, such as the 19th-century scapegoating of AAPIs, also known as the "Yellow Peril," as well as the 21st-century scapegoating of AAPIs

for the COVID-19 pandemic. These examples are painful, but they are also part of a larger, and often dismissed, history of violence. In addition to the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882, the assaults against Filipino farmworkers in the 1930s by white mobs, and the Japanese internment camps of the 1940s, there's a longstanding history of racialized colonial wars that have shaped AAPI communities' histories before AAPIs even arrived to the United States; and

WHEREAS, The recent rise of violence against Asian Americans is part of a larger history of violence against communities of color, we must work together to create community centered solutions that stop the violence in all communities; and

WHEREAS, The model minority myth continues to divide communities of color, feed into racism, and contributes to the false notion that the AAPI community does not experience racial oppression or is impacted by white supremacy, which ignores the AAPI community's experience with islamophobia, anti-Arab racism, and anti-South Asian violence, especially post 9/11; and;

WHEREAS, The model minority myth also creates the stereotype that the AAPI community is a monolithic group, a stereotype that invisibilizes the economic, academic and social struggles of our diverse communities (i.e. Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, Southeast Asians, Arab-Americans, mixed-race Asians/Hapas, undocumented Asians, Hmong students, etc.), which is why this resolution also forcefully condemns the ideology of the model minority myth and dispels it due to its role in hindering solidarity amongst communities of color; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education remains committed to an Ethnic Studies program that highlights AAPI histories (along with Black, Latinx/Chicanx and Native/Indigenous histories) so as to combat the anti-AAPI racism being experienced by many AAPIs in our state and county; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education stands with the Asian-American and Pacific Islander community and wishes to affirm its commitment to the safety and wellbeing of Asian American students, staff and community members

and ensure they know they are not alone and that they can speak out to help stop the spread of bigotry; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education calls on all residents and leaders to join us in condemning racist attacks against Asian Americans in all forms, and renewing our commitment to speak out against such attacks, defend and protect those targeted, and seek justice and accountability against those who commit hate crimes against AAPI members of our

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education denounces hate crimes, hateful rhetoric, and hateful acts against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, and works to ensure that AAPI students feel safe and welcome, both during this COVID-19 pandemic and beyond.

WHEREAS, under current market conditions, the private sale of the bonds to a lender may be accomplished upon more favorable terms for the District than a public sale such that a sufficient level of savings may be achieved through the issuance and sale of the Bonds on a private basis in order to refund the Prior Bonds and the District now desires to proceed with a private sale;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Education of the Santa Ana Unified School District as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Recitals. The Board hereby finds and determines that the foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. Approval of Private Sale. As an alternative to the method of sale provided in the Original Resolution, the Board hereby approves of the sale of the Bonds through a private placement to a lender to be selected by the District (the "Lender"). The Bonds may be sold at a private sale upon the direction of an Authorized Officer pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement previously approved by this Board in the Original Resolution, with such changes, insertions, revisions, corrections, or amendments as shall be approved by the officer or officers executing the Agreement for the District in order to provide the terms of the private placement with the Lender.

Section 3. Valid Obligation. The Board hereby determines that all acts and conditions necessary to be performed by the District or to have been met precedent to and in issuing of the Bond in order to make it the valid and binding general obligation of the District have been performed and have been met, or will at the time of delivery of the Bonds have been performed and have been met, in regular and due form as required by law; that the full faith and credit of the District are hereby pledged for the timely payment of the principal of and interest on the

48 Bonds; and that no statutory or constitutional limitation of indebtedness or 49 taxation will have been exceeded in the issuance of the Bonds. 50 Section 4. Authorization of Officers.
