SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent recognized the vaccine distribution centers. The District has offered over 30,000 vaccines to SAUSD staff, students ages 16 and up, and families at school site clinics. On Monday, April 26th, 3,379 vaccines were administered in partnership with Rite Aid. Superintendent thanked the two Board members who volunteer on a regular basis and also thanked the entire Board for their leadership in collaboration with SAUSD community partners and staff. He also thanked Dr. Susie Lopez-Guerra, Michelle Dominguez, and all the staff that have volunteered. He stated that COVID-19 rates in the community continue to fall each week. All SAUSD zip codes have a testing positivity rate of 2% or lower, mirroring the average of Orange County. He added that if numbers continue to fall, we can enter into the yellow tier, which means there will be more opportunities for in-person activities. Mr. Almendarez announced that the District is planning on having all high school

graduations ceremonies at Angel Stadium the second week of June. He thanked the Board for supporting this effort, and for considering approval of the contract later tonight. Seniors are excited to be able to share this experience in-person with their friends and families. For many of the seniors, this will be the first time they've seen classmates all year. This will truly be an experience they remember for the rest of their lives. Superintendent Almendarez shared that staff is working on building a robust summer school program which will include in-person instruction. A variety of programs and services for various needs of students. This will include credit recovery and intervention, as well as enrichment programs for students across all grade levels. There is a plan to recruit and enroll thousands of students in both in-person and remote learning environments when summer school starts in early June.

Lastly, Superintendent stated as SAUSD students stated through their presentations at the See Summit, equity and inclusion have to be at the forefront of education. Last week, a jury found Derek Chauvin guilty on all charges in the death of George Floyd. This case helped spotlight the longstanding injustices faced by Black Americans and other communities of color in our country. The verdict represents one small, but significant step towards justice and healing across all communities. The District will always reject brutality in any form, and supports the idea that every human being deserves dignity and respect. There is still more work needed to attain these goals. As an educational institution, we continue to work in our schools to instill values of equality, tolerance and acceptance of all individuals. Our differences only make us stronger.

Dr. Rodriguez asked for the graduation dates. Superintendent Almendarez announced that graduations will be held Thursday, June 10, Friday, June 11, and Saturday, June 12.

BOARD REPORTS

Dr. Alvarez recognized and thanked staff and volunteers at the vaccine clinics at Villa and Segerstrom. He also thanked staff and volunteers at the food distribution sites. He gave a shout-out to the District's SPART team for helping with all events. Dr. Alvarez shared that there are 25,000 students anticipated for summer school in early June. He also gave a shout-out to the Speech and Debate team for doing well at last week's competition.

Ms. Amezcua shared that she attended the funeral of student who passed away and extended her condolences to all the family. Ms. Amezcua addressed parents who would like for their children to attend summer school in person and recommended that if they have not received notification, to first contact their school sites and if there is no response to then call the Office of the Superintendent. She thanked the Educational Services team and Business Services team and stated she would like to continue discussion on how to get to counselor ratios to 150 to 1 at least for a year and a half. She requested information on how many hours students will get at the rate of 250 to 1. She also requested to continue discussion on combo classes and small class sizes. Ms. Amezcua thanked staff at the vaccine clinics, the SPART team, Principals, DSO's, and volunteers. She asked Superintendent to make sure that that sites use their discretionary funds to assist families that cannot afford senior cap and gowns or senior events. Ms. Amezcua asked that communication is sent to all families and community about libraries, technology, counselors, and summer school through email, parent square, and US mail. She asked the District to do everything they can to help all the seniors that are not on the list to graduate. She asked that staff informs students about their options. Ms. Amezcua invited parents to speak up at our in person Board meetings in June.

Mr. Palacio echoed Ms. Amezcua's comments. He asked parents that have not heard from the District to reach out to their school sites to enroll their students. He also stressed the significant work of Dr. Susie Lopez-Guerra, Michelle Dominguez, FACE staff, Building Services, Principals, and SPED staff, have done at the vaccine sites. Mr. Palacio thanked Educational Services staff for their work with the reopening of school.

Ms. Torres shared her appreciation to Dr. Rodriguez for explaining of the process with regard to holding meetings. She encouraged everyone to get vaccinated. She announced that there are taco trucks at every mosque during Ramadan through May 12. She also echoed the denouncement of hate crimes against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders and recognized May as Asian American and Pacific Islander month, and called attention to the diversity both in Asian American communities and Hawaiian and Pacific Islanders. She acknowledged and affirmed their history. Ms. Torres informed the community that when mental health is addressed, they are talking about types of staffing like social worker, counselors, school psychologists, and other types of mental health workers. When talking about academics, social emotional learning, mental health, it often means staffing. She asked the Speech and Language Pathologists that spoke during public comments to please resend their concerns. Ms. Torres acknowledged staff for their work on summer programs, and she also thanked students and families.

Dr. Rodriguez left the meeting at 9:50 p.m.

Under the supervision of an administrator and in collaboration with school staff, families, and the community, a school counselor provides a data driven, comprehensive school counseling program, aligned with the American School Counseling Association (ASCA) National Model and CAMTSS Framework ensuring that academic, college/career, and personal/social emotional services are offered to all students. The school counselor assumes a leadership role in the development of an appropriate program for the school site. A school counselor works in collaboration with all stakeholders including school staff, administrators, parents and community members to be an advocate for students in order to maximize student potential and academic achievement, so that students graduate from high school “college and career ready” and with the necessary social and emotional skills to be productive global citizens. In accordance with the ASCA National Model Professional Standards and Competencies, school counselors are responsible for the fulfillment of the essential duties set forth below.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

- Plan, evaluate, and revise the annual school counseling program to make data driven decisions to support the goals and action plans of the counseling program, establish an annual calendar for counseling program activities. **E**
- Work in alignment with the ASCA Mindsets & Behaviors for student success and Multi-Tiered, Multi-Domain System of Supports (MTMDSS) model, collaborating with teachers, staff and parents to implement Tier 1 core counseling classroom lessons, Tier 2 interventions, and Tier 3 supports. **E**
- Use multiple data sources and assessments to identify students in need of intervention. Collaborate with other student support professionals to meet the intervention needs of students and monitor the effectiveness of the intervention placement to improve student achievement, college/career readiness, and social-emotional wellbeing. **E**
- Collaborate with other educators, parents and the community to implement developmentally appropriate core counseling curriculum by grade level to support student knowledge and skills in the areas of academic, social emotional and college/career. **E**

SCHOOL COUNSELOR (TK-12) (cont.)

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES: (continued)

- Participate in activities which contribute to the effective delivery of educational service including collaboration, delivery of professional learning, and consultation with other professionals in enhancing the education of students. **E**

- Articulate with elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as post-secondary personnel to assist students in making a smooth transition between each level. **E**
- Consult and collaborate with families to assist with concerns and decisions directly related to student achievement, college/career readiness, and social-emotional wellbeing. **E**
- Conduct structured, solution-focused, individual, small and large group counseling sessions to assist students in exploring, interpreting and developing personal decision-making competencies, to enhance self-esteem and self-understanding; develop academic, career and personal/social life plans. **E**
- Refer students and families to appropriate early identification, intervention, and postvention services, consult and collaborate with school system specialists and community-based resources to support coordinated care. **E**
- Use inclusive practices to promote acceptance and cultural awareness leading to a safe and secure school environment where every student feels positively connected and engaged with their school community. **E**
- Participate as a member of site and district leadership teams. **E**
- Participate as a member of the Crisis Response Team to provide prevention for students/staff utilizing the district's protocol. **E**

WHEREAS, it is appropriate for the Santa Ana Unified School District to acknowledge its members of Santa Ana Unified School District Police Department during National Police Week;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Santa Ana Unified School District's Board of Education proclaims May 9-15, 2021, as National Police Appreciation Week, and in addition, urges all citizens to participate in observances that express their gratitude and appreciation for our police officers.

8 WHEREAS, The Asian Pacific Policy and Planning Council and Chinese for
9 Affirmative Action launched a hate incident-reporting internet website, titled "Stop
10 AAPI Hate," at the beginning of the COVID-19 outbreak in March of 2020, which
11 documented over 2,800 hate incidents against Asian-American Pacific Islanders (AAPI)
12 in 2020; and

13 WHEREAS, On January 30, 2021, 84-year-old Vicha Ratanapakdee, a nearly-blind
14 and gentle elderly Thai man, died from injuries resulting from an attack while he was
15 walking in the City of San Francisco, in what is deemed as a hate crime; and

16 WHEREAS, On March 16, 2021, 8 people (6 being Asian, 2 white, all but one being
17 women) were gunned down by a white man in Atlanta, Georgia;

18 WHEREAS, These reports depict a disturbing reality, especially for Asian women,
19 who experienced violence nearly 2.5 times more than their male counterparts. However,
20 the numbers do not tell the full story: They don't include many of the unreported and
21 increasingly normalized incidents of violence; and

22 WHEREAS, Racism and anti-AAPI sentiments has been exacerbated by the COVID-19
23 pandemic and politically charged and culturally insensitive rhetoric referring to
24 COVID-19 as the "Chinese virus" or "kung flu" further encourages racism, prejudice,
25 and hate crimes against AAPIs; and

26 WHEREAS, Racism toward AAPIs has always existed ever since AAPIs began
27 immigrating to the United States, such as the 19th-century scapegoating of AAPIs,
28 also known as the "Yellow Peril," as well as the 21st-century scapegoating of AAPIs

for the COVID-19 pandemic. These examples are painful, but they are also part of a larger, and often dismissed, history of violence. In addition to the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882, the assaults against Filipino farmworkers in the 1930s by white mobs, and the Japanese internment camps of the 1940s, there's a longstanding history of racialized colonial wars that have shaped AAPI communities' histories before AAPIs even arrived to the United States; and

WHEREAS, The recent rise of violence against Asian Americans is part of a larger history of violence against communities of color, we must work together to create community centered solutions that stop the violence in all communities; and

WHEREAS, The model minority myth continues to divide communities of color, feed into racism, and contributes to the false notion that the AAPI community does not experience racial oppression or is impacted by white supremacy, which ignores the AAPI community's experience with islamophobia, anti-Arab racism, and anti-South Asian violence, especially post 9/11; and;

WHEREAS, The model minority myth also creates the stereotype that the AAPI community is a monolithic group, a stereotype that invisibilizes the economic, academic and social struggles of our diverse communities (i.e. Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, Southeast Asians, Arab-Americans, mixed-race Asians/Hapas, undocumented Asians, Hmong students, etc.), which is why this resolution also forcefully condemns the ideology of the model minority myth and dispels it due to its role in hindering solidarity amongst communities of color; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education remains committed to an Ethnic Studies program that highlights AAPI histories (along with Black, Latinx/Chicanx and Native/Indigenous histories) so as to combat the anti-AAPI racism being experienced by many AAPIs in our state and county; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District Board of Education stands with the Asian-American and Pacific Islander community and wishes to affirm its commitment to the safety and wellbeing of Asian American students, staff and community members

57 and ensure they know they are not alone and that they can speak out to help stop the
58 spread of bigotry; and

59 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Santa Ana Unified School District Board
60 of Education calls on all residents and leaders to join us in condemning racist
