Tuesday, June 22, 2021

CALL TO ORDER

Board President Rodriguez called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

Other members in attendance were Ms. Amezcua and Ms Torres.

CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Dr. Rodriguez asked if there was anyone wishing to address the Board related to closed session items.

There was no one wishing to address the Board.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

Board Member Palacio led the Pledge of Allegiance.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Almendarez thanked all SAUSD staff and Board of Education for making sure the graduating seniors received an amazing send-off at the Angel Stadium. He especially thanked Director of Secondary Curriculum & Instruction Celeste Migliaccio and her team for coordinating this tremendous effort so quickly. A short video was shared with highlights from the graduations. Mr. Almendarez also congratulated the Santa Ana High School Speech and Debate team for winning the national championship this weekend. Santa Ana is the second high school in Orange County to ever earn this honor. Students Gillian Palacios and Destiny Ceja both placed fourth in the nation in their categories and they each beat out more than 3,000 students. He thanked former Board member and current Program Specialist Sal Tinajero and his team for helping turn SAUSD into a speech and debate powerhouse across every grade level. A full list of honorees can be viewed on the District website at www.sausd.us. Superintendent announced that the new guidelines from the Governor and Cal OSHA end physical distancing requirements for all workers and allow most fully vaccinated employees in many workplaces to stop wearing masks, although there are some key exceptions. These include all K-12 schools. SAUSD will continue requiring that everyone at schools, regardless of vaccination status, has to wear an appropriate face covering and must follow physical distancing rules. District staff is working with local and state health agencies to ensure SAUSD is providing the safest possible environment for students and staff. He added that as safety protocols continue to evolve, the District will make necessary adjustments and communicate those adjustments to families and staff.

Mr. Almendarez shared that SAUSD and community partners continue to offer vaccination clinics throughout the summer for anyone age 12 and older through multiple clinics each week. Currently, appointments are not necessary and all walk-ins are welcome. Each Monday, a clinic is held next door at Villa Fundamental Intermediate from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. He encouraged all the community members who are eligible to take advantage of this opportunity. For the latest information on these clinics visit www.sausd.us/vaccines. Lastly, Superintendent Almendarez recognized Santa Ana School Police Chief Anastasia Smith upon her retirement from SAUSD. In her four years in the district, Chief Smith has served our schools and community with the utmost dignity and professionalism. She has led school police's efforts to become a partner in how our district supports the overall well-being of all students. Chief Smith will be missed. He congratulated her on starting the next chapter of her life. He also recognized all of the other retirees for their service to the SAUSD community. He offered his sincerest thank you and wished them all the best.

BOARD REPORTS

Ms. Amezcua congratulated all the graduates and thanked staff for putting the graduations together. She recognized the Mr. Tinajero, the Speech and Debate team, and congratulated the parents. Ms. Amezcua asked if it is possible to add more funding for their Harvard trip. She also acknowledged Davis Elementary, Villa and Willard Intermediate for holding vaccine clinics. Ms. Amezcua announced a vaccine clinic at the Southwest Senior Center in Santa Ana on Saturday, June 26, 2021, from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m., where there will be vendors, food, music, and a drawing for a Disney resort vacation. She thanked all staff for putting together summer school and looks forward to the fall with all students back.

Mr. Palacio congratulated all the graduates. He acknowledged the Speech and Debate team for being 2020-21 national school champions. There are over 1,000 students in Speech and Debate, many whom have completed five years and will be graduating. They have received scholarships to prestigious universities throughout the country. He acknowledged the teams for being 2020-21 national high school and intermediate champions, California intermediate champions, and in 2020 Southern California Elementary School champions. Mr. Palacio also acknowledged the vaccination efforts at the school sites like Valley High School, Segerstrom High School, and Villa Intermediate Schools. He asked staff to promote the event at the Southwest Senior Center as well as the other events. He looks forward to the academic year in August and thanked the staff.

Dr. Alvarez acknowledge the epic graduations, congratulated the class of 2021, thanked all the teachers, and asked that we continue to celebrate students and brag about the kids going to Harvard, Berkeley, UCI, UCLA, and those going to community college. He thanked all teachers and every staff member for their support. He recognized the Speech and Debate team. He asked that staff follow up on the request for the implementation of Speech and Debate in the Alternative Education sites. Dr. Alvarez asked the Superintendent to continue dialogue with the City Manager around literacy, Head Start, and libraries. Lastly, he thanked everyone volunteering for vaccines and knocking on doors to remind the community that they don't need an appointment.

Ms. Torres acknowledged the graduations. She thanked everyone who has been involved with the vaccinations and encouraged everyone to get vaccinated. Ms. Torres asked for a discussion around concerns about having gender dress code at various schools. She thanked parents, students, and staff for participating in summer programs.

Dr. Rodriguez shared that he agreed with the graduation experiences and thanked staff, Dr. Lopez-Guerra, and Fermin Leal. He asked that for next year the speaker roll be rotated with other Board members. He asked for a conversation individually around Ed. Options program to get an understanding on how their conditions are being addressed. He acknowledged all the teachers and staff for holding down summer school. Dr. Rodriguez asked Superintendent Almendarez to get back to Board on specific discussion with City Manager on educational strategies that they are implementing and how they align with ours, such as Wi-Fi. He also acknowledged the Speech and Debate program and asked that we take a look at the equity of the program to ensure there is an equitable opportunity across the district.





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

SUBJECT: Bus Conduct

CATEGORY: Students

RESPONSIBLE OFFICE(S): Business Services, Educational Services, Transportation

SCOPE:

The Superintendent or designee shall establish regulations related to bus conduct, bus driver authority, and the suspension of riding privileges. The Governing Board shall make these rules available to parents/guardians and students.

POLICY:

In order to help ensure the safety and well-being of students, bus driver, and others, the Governing Board expects students to exhibit appropriate and orderly conduct at all times when using school transportation, including while preparing to ride, riding, or leaving the bus. (cf. 0450 - Comprehensive Safety Plan) (cf. 3516 - Emergencies and Disaster Preparedness Plan) (cf. 3540 - Transportation) (cf. 3541.2 - Transportation for Students with Disabilities) (cf. 3543 - Transportation Safety and Emergencies) (cf. 5131 - Conduct)

The Superintendent or designee shall establish regulations related to student conduct on buses, bus driver authority, and the suspension of riding privileges. He/she shall make these rules available to parents/guardians, students, and other interested parties. (5 CCR 14103) (cf. 3542 - School Bus Drivers)

Students found to be in violation of the District's bus conduct rules shall be subject to discipline in accordance with Board policy and administrative regulation. (cf. 5144 - Discipline) (cf. 5144.1 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process)

The Superintendent or designee may deny a student the privilege of using school transportation upon the student's continued disorderly conduct or his/her persistent refusal to submit to the authority of the driver. (5 CCR 14103)

Bus Surveillance Systems

The Board believes that the use of surveillance systems on school buses will help to deter misconduct and improve discipline, ensure the safety of students and bus drivers, and prevent vandalism. Therefore, surveillance systems may be installed and used on school buses to monitor student behavior while traveling to and from school and school activities. (cf. 3515 - Campus Security)

The Superintendent or designee shall notify students, parents/guardians, and staff that surveillance may occur on any school bus and that the contents of a recording may be a student record and, as such, may be used in student disciplinary proceedings or referred to local law enforcement, as appropriate. In addition, a prominent notice shall be placed in each bus stating that the bus is equipped with a surveillance monitoring system. (cf. 5125 - Student Records)

No student shall be required to be transported for any reason without the written permission of the student's parent/guardian, except in emergency situations involving illness or injury to the student pursuant to Education Code 35350 or the evacuation of students as necessary for their safety. The Governing Board desires to meet the transportation needs of students with disabilities to enable them to benefit from special education and related services. The District shall provide appropriate transportation services for a student with disabilities when the District is the student's District of residence and the transportation services are required by his/her individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 accommodation plan. (cf. 0430 - Comprehensive Local Plan for Special Education) (cf. 3540 - Transportation) (cf. 6159 - Individualized Education Program (IEP) (cf. 6164.4 - Identification and Evaluation of Individuals for Special Education) (cf. 6164.6 - Identification and Education under Section 504)

POLICY:

The specific needs of the student shall be the primary consideration when an IEP team is determining the student's transportation needs. Considerations may include, but are not limited to, the student's health needs, travel distances, physical accessibility and safety of streets and sidewalks, accessibility of public transportation systems, midday or other transportation needs, extended-year services, and, as necessary, implementation of a behavioral intervention plan.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide IEP teams with information about District transportation services in order to assist them in making decisions as to the mode, schedule, and location of transportation services that may be available to each student with disabilities. The IEP team may communicate with District transportation staff and/or invite transportation staff to attend IEP team meetings where the student's transportation needs will be discussed.

Transportation services specified in a student's IEP or Section 504 plan shall be provided at no cost to the student or his/her parent/guardian. (cf. 3250 - Transportation Fees)

If a student whose IEP or accommodation plan specifies transportation needs is excluded from school bus transportation for any reason, such as suspension, expulsion, or other reason, the district shall provide alternative transportation at no cost to the student or parent/guardian. (Education Code 48915.5) (cf. 5131.1 - Bus Conduct) (cf. 5144.2 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process (Students with Disabilities))

The Superintendent or designee shall arrange transportation schedules so that students with disabilities do not spend an excessive amount of time on buses compared to other students. Arrivals and departures shall not reduce the length of the school day for these students except as may be prescribed on an individual basis. The District shall provide special transportation to and from alternative sites or clinics where the student is scheduled to receive a related service included in the student's IEP.

SCOPE:

The Governing Board recognizes that electronic communication is an efficient and convenient way for Board members to communicate and expedite the exchange of information within the district and with members of the public. Board members shall exercise caution so as to ensure that electronic communications are not used as a means for the Board to deliberate outside of an agendaized Board meeting, circumvent the public's right to access records regarding district business, or restrict access to a public forum. (cf. 1100 - Communication with the Public) (cf. 9000 - Role of the Board) (cf. 9322 - Agenda/Meeting Materials)

PROCEDURES AND GENERAL INFORMATION:

A majority of the Board shall not, outside of an authorized meeting, use a series of electronic communications of any kind, directly or through intermediaries, to discuss, deliberate, or take action on any item that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. (Government Code 54952.2) (cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices)

Examples of permissible electronic communications concerning district business include, but are not limited to, dissemination of Board meeting agendas and agenda packets, reports of activities from the Superintendent, and reminders regarding meeting times, dates, and places.

Board members may engage in separate conversations or communications with members of the public on a social media platform to answer questions, provide information, or solicit information regarding a matter that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, as long as a majority of the Board does not use the platform to discuss among themselves any business of a specific nature that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. A Board member is prohibited from responding directly to any communication from other Board members regarding matters that are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board or using digital icons (e.g., "likes" or emojis) to express reactions to communications made by other Board members. (Government Code 54952.2)

Whenever a Board member uses a social media platform to communicate with the public about district business or Board activities, the Board member shall not block access to a member of the public based on the viewpoint expressed by that individual.

Board members may use electronic communications to discuss matters that do not pertain to district business, regardless of the number of Board members participating in the discussion.

Board members shall make every effort to ensure that their electronic communications conform to the same standards and protocols established for other forms of communication. A Board member may respond, as appropriate, to an electronic communication received from a member of the community and should make clear that the response does not necessarily reflect the views of the Board as a whole. Any complaint or request for information should be forwarded to the Superintendent in accordance with Board bylaws and protocols so that the issue may receive proper consideration and be handled through

5. Enforce the Board's bylaws related to the conduct of meetings and help ensure compliance with applicable requirements of the Brown Act.

7. Facilitate the Board's effective deliberation, ensuring that each Board member has an opportunity to participate in the deliberation and that the discussion remains focused.
8. Rule on issues of parliamentary procedure.

To encourage community involvement in the schools, Board meetings shall provide opportunities for questions and comments by members of the public. All meetings shall be conducted in accordance with law and the Board's bylaws, policies, and administrative regulations. (cf. 9321 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas) (cf. 9321.1 - Closed Session Actions and Reports) (cf. 9322 - Agenda/Meeting Materials) (cf. 9323 - Meeting Conduct)

A Board meeting exists whenever a majority of Board members gather at the same time and location, to hear, discuss deliberate, or take action on any item of district business. (Government Code 54952.2)

A majority of the Board shall not, outside of an authorized meeting, use a series of communications of any kind, directly or through intermediaries, including social media and other electronic communications, to discuss, deliberate, or take action on any item that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board.

However, an employee or district official may engage in separate conversations with Board members in order to answer questions or provide information regarding an item within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, as long as that employee or district official does not communicate the comments or position of any Board members to other Board members. (Government Code 54952.2)

In order to help ensure the participation of individuals with disabilities at Board meetings, the Superintendent or designee shall provide appropriate disability-related accommodations or modifications upon request in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. (Government Code 54953.2, 54954.1, 54954.2)

Regular Meetings

Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the presiding officer or a majority of the Board members. (Government Code 54956) However, a special meeting shall not be called regarding the salary, salary schedule, or other compensation of the Superintendent, assistant superintendent, or other management employee as described in Government Code 3511.1. (Government Code 54956)

Written notice of special meetings shall be delivered personally or by any other means to all Board members and the local media who have requested such notice in writing. The notice also shall be posted on the district's Internet web site. The notice shall be received at least 24 hours before the time of the meeting. The notice shall also be posted at least 24 hours before the meeting in a location freely accessible to the public. The notice shall specify the time and place of the meeting and the business to be transacted or discussed-other business shall be considered at these meetings. (Education Code 35144; Government Code 54956)

Any Board member may waive the 24-hour written notice requirement prior to the time of the meeting by filing a written waiver of notice with the clerk or secretary of the Board or by being present at the meeting at the time it convenes. (Government Code 54956)

Every notice of a special meeting shall provide an opportunity for members of the public to directly address the Board concerning any item that has been described in the meeting notice, before or after the item's consideration. (Government Code 54954.3)

Public notice shall be given at least 72 hours before any retreats, study sessions or training sessions held by the Board. All such meetings shall be held within district boundaries and action items shall not be included.

Emergency Meetings

In the case of an emergency situation for which prompt action is necessary due to the disruption or threatened disruption of public facilities, the Board may hold an emergency meeting without complying with the 24-hour notice or 24-hour posting requirement for special meetings pursuant to Government Code 54956. The Board shall comply with all other requirements for special meetings during an emergency meeting. (Government Code 54956.5)

An emergency situation means either of the following: (Government Code 54956.5)

1. An emergency, which shall be defined as a work stoppage, crippling activity or other activity that severely impairs public health and/or safety as determined by a majority of the members of the Board.

(cf. 4141.6/4241.6 - Concerted Action/Work Stoppage)

2. A dire emergency, which shall be defined as a crippling disaster, mass destruction, terrorist activity, or threatened terrorist act that poses peril so immediate and significant that requiring the Board to

provide one-hour notice before holding an emergency meeting may endanger the public health and/or safety as determined by a majority of the members of the Board.

(cf. 3516 - Emergencies and Disaster Preparedness Plan)

Except in the case of a dire emergency, the Board president or designee shall give notice of the emergency meeting by telephone at least one hour before the meeting to the local media that have requested notice of special meetings. If telephone services are not functioning, the notice requirement of one hour is waived and, as soon after the meeting as possible, the Board shall notify those media representatives of the meeting and shall describe the purpose of the meeting and any action taken by the Board. (Government Code 54956.5) In the case of a dire emergency, the Board president shall give such notice at or near the time he/she notifies the other members of the Board about the meeting. (Government Code 54956.5)

The minutes of the meeting, a list of persons the Board president or designee notified or attempted to notify, a copy of the roll call vote, and any actions taken at the meeting shall be posted for at least 10 days in a public place as soon after the meeting as possible. (Government Code 54956.5)

Adjourned/Continued Meetings

The Board may adjourn/continue any regular or special meeting to a later time and location that shall be specified in the order of adjournment. Less than a quorum of the Board may adjourn such a meeting. (Government Code 54955) If no Board members are present, the secretary or the clerk may declare the meeting adjourned to a later time and shall give notice in the same manner required for special meetings. (Government Code 54955)

Within 24 hours after the time of adjournment, a copy of the order or notice of adjournment/continuance shall be conspicuously posted on or near the door of the place where the meeting was held. (Government Code 54955)

Study Sessions, Retreats, Public Forums, and Discussion Meetings

The Board may occasionally convene a study session or public forum to study an issue in more detail or to receive information from staff or feedback from members of the public.

The Board may also convene a retreat or discussion meeting to discuss Board roles and relationships.

Public notice shall be given in accordance with law when a quorum of the Board is attending a study session, retreat, public forum, or discussion meeting. All such meetings shall comply with the Brown Act and shall be held in open session and within district boundaries. Action items shall not be included on the agenda for these meetings.

Other Gatherings

Attendance by a majority of the Board members at any of the following events is not subject to the Brown Act provided that a majority of the Board members do not discuss specific district business among themselves other than as part of the scheduled program: (Government Code 54952.2)

- 1.A conference or similar public gathering open to the public that involves a discussion of general interest to the public or to school board members.
- 2.An open, publicized meeting organized by a person or organization other than the district to address a topic of local community concern.
- 3.An open and noticed meeting of another body of the district.
- 4.A purely social or ceremonial occasion.
- 5.An open and noticed meeting of a standing committee of the Board, provided that the Board members who are not members of the standing committee attend only as observers. (cf. 9130 - Board Committees)
6. An open and noticed meeting of a standing committee of the Board, provided that the Board members who are not members of the standing committee attend only as observers

(cf. 9130 - Board Committees)

Individual contacts or conversations between a Board member and any other person are not subject to Brown Act. (Government Code 54952.2)

Location of Meetings

Meetings shall not be held in a facility that prohibits the admittance of any person on the basis of ancestry or any characteristic listed in Government Code 11135. In addition, meetings shall not be held in a facility which is inaccessible to individuals with disabilities or where members of the public must make a payment or purchase in order to be admitted. (Government Code 54961)

Meetings shall be held within district boundaries, except to do any of the following: (Government Code 54954)

1. Comply with state or federal law or court order or attend a judicial or administrative proceeding to which the district is a party
2. Inspect real or personal property which cannot conveniently be brought into the district, provided that the topic of the meeting is limited to items directly related to the property
3. Participate in meetings or discussions of multiagency significance, provided these meetings are held within one of the other agencies' boundaries, with all participating agencies giving the notice required by law
4. Meet in the closest meeting facility if the district has no meeting facility within its boundaries or if its principal office is located outside the district
5. Meet with elected or appointed state or federal officials when a local meeting would be impractical, solely to discuss legislative or regulatory issues affecting the district over which the state or federal officials have jurisdiction
6. Meet in or near a facility owned by the district but located outside the district, provided the meeting agenda is limited to items directly related to that facility
7. Visit the office of the district's legal counsel for a closed session on pending litigation, when doing so would reduce legal fees or costs
8. Attend conferences on nonadversarial collective bargaining techniques
9. Interview residents of another district regarding the Board's potential employment of an applicant for Superintendent of the district
10. Interview a potential employee from another district

Meetings exempted from the boundary requirements, as specified in items #1-10 above, shall still be subject to the notice and open meeting requirements for regular and special meetings when a quorum of the Board attends the meeting.

If a fire, flood, earthquake, or other emergency renders the regular meeting place unsafe, meetings shall be held for the duration of the emergency at a location designated by the Board president or designee,

who shall so inform all news media who have requested notice of special meetings by the most rapid available means of communication. (Government Code 54954)

Teleconferencing

A teleconference is a meeting of the Board in which Board members are in different locations, connected by electronic means through audio and/or video. (Government Code 54953)

The Board may use teleconferences for all purposes in connection with any meeting within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction. All votes taken during a teleconference meeting shall be by roll call. (Government Code 54953) ~~BB-9320(d)~~

During the teleconference, at least a quorum of the members of the Board shall participate from locations within district boundaries. (Government Code 54953)

Agendas shall be posted at all teleconference locations and shall list all teleconference locations whenever they are posted elsewhere. Additional teleconference locations may be provided to the public. (Government Code 54953)

All teleconferenced meetings shall be conducted in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties or the public appearing before the Board, including the right of the public to address the Board directly at each teleconference location. (Government Code 54953)

All Board policies, administrative regulations and bylaws shall apply equally to meetings that are teleconferenced. The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate public participation in the meeting at each teleconference location.
