WHEREAS, before June 30th of each year, the Director of Finance shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates made pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36(f) that will be available for transfer into the Education Protection Account during the next fiscal year;

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the Education Protection Account within ten days preceding the end of the fiscal year;

WHEREAS, all monies in the Education Protection Account are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools and community college districts;

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the Education Protection Account shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor or any agency of state government;

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the school or schools within its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the governing board of the district shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the Education Protection Account in open session of a public meeting of the governing board;

WHEREAS, the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators or any other administrative cost;

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district and charter school shall annually publish on its Internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent;

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution;

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools to comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36 may be paid with funding from the Education Protection Act and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

- 1. The monies received from the Education Protection Account shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36 and the spending determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the governing board of Santa Ana Unified School District;
- 2. In compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the governing board of the Santa Ana Unified School District has determined to spend the monies received from the Education Protection Act as attached.

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the Education Protection Account shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor or any agency of state government;

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the school or schools within its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the governing board of the district shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the Education Protection Account in open session of a public meeting of the governing board;

WHEREAS, the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators or any other administrative cost;

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district and charter school shall annually publish on its Internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent;

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution;

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools to comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36 may be paid with funding from the Education Protection Act and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

- 1. The monies received from the Education Protection Account shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36 and the spending determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the governing board of Santa Ana Unified School District;
- 2. In compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the governing board of the Santa Ana Unified School District has determined to spend the monies received from the Education Protection Act as attached.

WHEREAS, on the District's public works projects, the District desires to list the material(s), product(s), thing(s), or service(s) listed on the attached list (Exhibit "A") as the only acceptable material(s), product(s), thing(s), or service(s) for use on the District's construction projects, because those material(s), product(s), thing(s), or service(s) "match other product(s) in use on other District public improvement(s) either completed or in the course of completion" (PCC \S 3400 (c)(2)),

- Notifier (located at approximately 70% District sites currently)
- Silent Knight (located at approximately 10% District sites currently)

These systems are integral safety components at District sites. In addition to the basis in the Resolution for determining that the Board wishes to match new fire detection and alarm systems to existing systems already in use, the District is endeavoring to better coordinate the training, maintenance, and repair of these The ever-increasing cost and coordination of systems throughout the District. varied systems with a limited maintenance personnel staff and a limited budget for outside vendors, requires the District to limit variance in these types of systems to facilitate more control and cost containment in keeping those systems operational.

- B. Locksets and Cylinders manufactured by the following manufacture(s):
 - Schlage (located at approximately 100% District sites currently)

These systems are integral safety components at District sites. The ever-increasing cost and coordination of varied systems with a limited maintenance and technical personnel staff and a limited budget for outside vendors, requires the District to limit

variance in these types of systems to facilitate more control and cost containment in keeping those systems operational.

I. IP Telephony/Voice Over IP (VoIP) System by the following manufacture(s):

Solid HDPE plastic partitions are more durable and require less maintenance than other products. Standardization will help alleviate over stocked items and allow us the ability to maintain a reasonable inventory. This will limit variance of this type of system to facilitate better inventory and cost control.

L. Door and Gate Hardware by the following manufacturers(s):

- ullet Von Duprin exit hardware (located at approximately 70% District sites currently)
 - LCN Door Closers (located approximately 70% District sites currently)

These systems are an integral safety and accessibility component at District sites. The District is endeavoring to facilitate cost control by minimizing training, maintenance and inventory associated with the use of multiple products. Standardization will help alleviate over stocked items and allow us the ability to maintain a reasonable inventory.

M. Paint manufactured by the following manufacture(s):

- Dunn Edwards (located at approximately 80% District sites currently)
- Sherwin Williams (located approximately 10% District sites currently)
- Tnemec (all epoxy coatings)

The District is endeavoring to reduce the cost of stored paint and limit the quantity of colors and types of paint used throughout the District. Standardization will help alleviate over stocked items and allow us the ability to maintain a reasonable inventory.

- M. Building Automation System(s) (BAS)/Energy Management System(s) (EMS) manufactured by the following manufacture(s):
 - Niagra AXP (located at approximately 20% District sites currently)

These systems are integral energy saving components at District sites. In addition to the basis in the Resolution for determining that the Board wishes to match BAS & EMS systems to existing systems already in use, the District is endeavoring to better coordinate the training, maintenance, and repair of these systems throughout the District. The ever-increasing cost and coordination of varied systems with a limited maintenance personnel staff and a limited budget for outside vendors, requires the District to limit variance in these types of systems to facilitate more control and cost containment in keeping those systems operational. Providing better energy controls to the district will enhance the energy saving program and provide improved services to our students.

N. Marquee Message Boards by the following manufacturer (s):

Daktronics (located at approximately 50% District sites currently)

The District endeavors to implement one system of electronic message boards to be controlled by each school site or from the District Office. Standardization with one technology manufacturer enables emergency communication to be sent throughout the District more effectively, especially in the case of an emergency message. The implementation of one system will also facilitate cost control by minimizing training, maintenance and inventory associated with the use of multiple manufacturers.



SUBJECT: Independent Study

CATEGORY: Instruction

RESPONSIBLE OFFICE(S): Educational Services, K-12 Teaching and Learning

SCOPE:

The Board of Education authorizes independent study programs, including a course-based independent study program, as an optional alternative instructional strategy for eligible students whose needs may be best met through study outside of the traditional classroom setting.

POLICY:

The Governing Board authorizes independent study as an optional alternative instructional strategy by which students in grades K-12 and adult education may reach curriculum objectives and fulfill graduation requirements. Independent study shall offer a means of individualizing the educational plan for students whose needs may be met best through study outside of the regular classroom setting. (cg. 5147-Dropout Prevention)

The District's independent study option shall be substantially equivalent in quality and quantity to classroom instruction, thus enabling students enrolled in independent study to complete the District's adopted course of study within the customary time frame. Students in independent study shall have access to the same services and resources as is available to other students in the school. (cr. 6143 - Courses of Study) (cf. 6200 - Adult Education)

The Superintendent or designee shall determine that the prospective independent study student understands and is prepared to meet the District's requirements for independent study. Independent study entails a commitment by both the parent/guardian and the student. As the student gets older, he/she assumes a greater portion of the responsibility involved. Independent study may be offered only to students who can achieve in this program as well as or better than they would in the regular classroom.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that a written independent study agreement, as prescribed by law, exists for each participating student (Education Code 51747)

The Board recognizes that independent study may be used as an option to encourage students to remain in school. Teachers should carefully set the duration of independent study assignments, within the limits specified by the Board to help identify students falling behind in their work or in danger of failing or dropping out of school.

Because excessive leniency in the duration of independent study assignments may result in a student falling behind peers and increase the risk of dropping out of school, independent study assignments shall be completed no more than one week after assigned for all grade levels and types of programs. However, when necessary, based on the specific circumstances of the student's approved program, the Superintendent or designee may allow for a longer period of time between the date an assignment is made and when it is due, up to the termination date of the agreement.

SUBJECT: **Independent Study** CATEGORY: Instruction

RESPONSIBLE OFFICE(S): Educational Services, K-12 Teaching and Learning

To foster each student's success in independent study, the Board establishes the following maximum lengths of time which may elapse between the time an assignment is made and date by which the student must complete the assigned work shall be as follows:

1. For students in grades K-3: 1 week

- 2. For students in grades 4-8: 2 weeks
- 3. For students in grades 9-12, continuation and adult education: 3 weeks

When circumstances justify a longer time, the Superintendent or designee may extend the maximum length of an assignment to a period not to exceed eight weeks, pursuant to written request with justification.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that students participating in independent study for fifteen (15) school days or more receive the following throughout the school year: (EC 51747)

- 1. For students in grades transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and grades 1-3, opportunities for daily synchronous instruction.
- 2. For students in grades 4-8, opportunities for both daily live interaction and at least weekly synchronous instruction.
- 3. For students in grades 9-12, opportunities for at least weekly synchronous instruction.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop a plan to transition students whose families wish to return to in-person instruction from independent study expeditiously, and, in no case, later than five (5) instructional days. This requirement only applies to students participating in an independent study program for fifteen (15) school days or more. (EC 51747)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that a written master agreement exists for each participating student as prescribed by law no later than thirty (30) days after the first day of instruction. (EC 51747, 51749.5)

The district shall provide written notice to the parents/guardians of all enrolled students of the option to enroll their child in in-person instruction or independent study during the 2022- 23 school year and thereafter. This notice shall be posted on the district's website, and shall include, at a minimum, information about the right to request a student-parent-educator conference before enrollment, student rights regarding procedures for enrolling, disenrolling, and re enrolling in independent study, and the instructional time, including synchronous and asynchronous learning, that a student will have access to as part of independent study. (EC 51747)

Upon the request of the parent/guardian of a student, before making a decision about enrolling or disenrolling in independent study and entering into a written agreement to do so, the district shall conduct a telephone, video conference, or in-person student-parent-educator conference or other meeting during

which the student, parent/guardian, or their advocate may ask questions about the educational options, including which curriculum offerings and nonacademic supports will be available to the student in independent study. (EC 51747)

Course-Based Independent Study

The district's course-based independent study program for students in grades K-12 shall be subject to the following requirements: (EC 51749.5)

- 1. A signed learning agreement shall be completed and on file for each participating student pursuant to Education Code 51749.6.
- 2. Courses shall be taught under the general supervision of certificated employees who hold the appropriate subject matter credential and are employed by the district or by another district, charter school, or county office of education with which the district has a memorandum of understanding, to provide the instruction.
- 3. Courses shall be annually certified by Board resolution to be of the same rigor and educational quality and to provide intellectual challenge that is substantially equivalent to in-person, classroom-based instruction, and shall be aligned to all relevant local and state content standards. For high schools, this shall include access to all courses offered by the district for graduation and approved by the University of California or the California State University as creditable under the A-G admissions criteria. The certification shall, at a minimum, include the duration, number of equivalent daily instructional minutes for each school day that student is enrolled, number of equivalent total instructional minutes, and number of course credits for each course, consistent with that of equivalent classroom-based courses. The certification shall also include plans to provide opportunities for students in grades transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and grades 1-3 to receive daily synchronous instruction, for students in grades 4-8, to receive both daily live interaction and at least weekly synchronous instruction, and for students in grades 9-12 to receive at least weekly synchronous instruction.
- 4. Students enrolled in independent study courses shall meet the applicable age requirements established pursuant to Education Code 46300.1, 46300.4, 47612, and 47612.1, and the applicable residency and enrollment requirements established pursuant to Education Code 46300.2, 47612, 48204, and 51747.3.
- 5. For each student participating in an independent study course, satisfactory educational progress shall be determined based on the student's achievement and engagement in the independent study program, as indicated by their performance on applicable student-level measures of student achievement and student engagement set forth in Education Code 52060, completion of assignments, assessments, or other indicators that evidence that the student is working on assignments, learning of required concepts, as determined by the supervising teacher, and progress toward successful completion of the course of study or individual course, as determined by the supervising teacher.

If satisfactory educational progress in an independent study class is not being made, the teacher shall notify the student and, if the student is under age 18 years, the student's parent/guardian. The teacher shall



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conduct an evaluation to determine whether it is in the student's best interest to remain in the course or whether the student should be referred to an alternative program, which may include, but is not limited to, a regular school program. A written record of the evaluation findings shall be a mandatory interim student record maintained for three years from the date of the evaluation. If the student transfers to another California public school, the record shall be forwarded to that school.

Procedures for tiered reengagement strategies shall be used for all students who are not making satisfactory educational progress in one or more courses or who are in violation of the written learning agreement, as described in the section "Learning Agreement for Course-Based Independent Study" below. These procedures shall include, but are not necessarily limited to, the verification of current contact information for each enrolled student, notification to parents/guardians of lack of participation within one school day of the absence or lack of participation, a plan for outreach from the school to determine student needs, including connection with health and social services as necessary, and a clear standard for requiring a student- parent-educator conference to review a student's written agreement and reconsider the independent study program's impact on the student's achievement and well-being.

- 6. Examinations shall be administered by a proctor.
- 7. Statewide testing results shall be reported and assigned to the school at which the student is enrolled and shall be included in the aggregate results of the district. Test results also shall be disaggregated for purposes of comparisons with the test results of students enrolled in classroombased courses.
- 8. A student shall not be required to enroll in courses included in the course-based independent study program.
- 9. The student-teacher ratio in the courses in this program shall meet the requirements of Education Code 51745.6.
- 10. For each student, the combined equivalent daily instructional minutes for courses in this program and all other courses shall meet applicable minimum instructional day requirements, and the student shall be offered the minimum annual total equivalent instructional minutes pursuant to Education Code 46200-46208.
- 11. Courses required for high school graduation or for admission to the University of California or California State University shall not be offered exclusively through independent study.
- 12. A student participating in this program shall not be assessed a fee that is prohibited by Education Code 49011.
- 13. A student shall not be prohibited from participating in independent study solely on the basis that the student does not have the materials, equipment, or access to Internet connectivity necessary to participate in the course.
- 14. A student with disabilities, as defined in Education Code 56026, shall not participate in course-based independent study, unless the student's individualized education program specifically provides for that participation.
- 15. A temporarily disabled student shall not receive individual instruction pursuant to Education Code 48206.3 through course-based independent study.

16. The district shall maintain a plan to transition any student whose family wishes to return to inperson instruction from course-based independent study expeditiously, and, in no case, later than five (5) instructional days.

Learning Agreement for Course-Based Independent Study

Before enrolling a student in a course within this program, the Superintendent or designee shall provide the student and, if the student is under the age of 18 years, the student's parent/guardian with a written learning agreement that includes all of the following: (EC 51749.6)

- 1. A summary of the district's policies and procedures related to course-based independent study pursuant to Education Code 51749.5.
- 2. The duration of the enrolled course(s) and the number of course credits for each enrolled course, consistent with the Board certifications made pursuant to item #2 above.
- 3. The duration of the learning agreement, which shall not exceed a school year or span multiple school years.
- 4. The learning objectives and expectations for each course, including, but not limited to, a description of how satisfactory educational progress is measured and when a student evaluation is required to determine whether the student should remain in the course or be referred to an alternative program, which may include, but is not limited to, a regular school program.
- 5. The specific resources that will be made available to the student, including materials and personnel, and access to Internet connectivity and devices adequate to participate in the educational program and complete assigned work.
- 6. A statement detailing the academic and other supports that will be provided to address the needs of students who are not performing at grade level, or need support in other areas, such as English learners, students with disabilities with an individualized education program or a Section 504 plan in order to be consistent with their program or plan, students in foster care or experiencing homelessness, and students requiring mental health supports.
- 7. A statement that enrollment is an optional educational alternative in which no student may be required to participate. In the case of a student who is suspended or expelled, or who is referred or assigned to any school, class, or program pursuant to Education Code 48915 or 48917, the agreement also shall include the statement that instruction may be provided to the student through course-based independent study only if the student is offered the alternative of classroom instruction.
- 8. The manner, time, frequency, and place for submitting a student's assignments, for reporting the student's academic progress, and for communicating with a student's parent/guardian regarding a student's academic progress.
- 9. The objectives and methods of study for the student's work, and the methods used to evaluate that work.
- 10. A statement of the adopted policies regarding the maximum length of time allowed between the assignment and the completion of a student's assigned work, the level of satisfactory educational

progress, and the number of missed assignments allowed before an evaluation of whether the student should be allowed to continue in course- based independent study.

- 11. A statement of the number of course credits or, for the elementary grades, other measures of academic accomplishment appropriate to the learning agreement, to be earned by the student upon completion.
- 12. Before the commencement of an independent study course, the learning agreement shall be signed and dated by the student, the student's parent/guardian or caregiver, if the student is less than 18 years of age, the certificated employee who has been designated as having responsibility for the general supervision of the independent study course, and all persons who have direct responsibility for providing assistance to the student. For purposes of this paragraph "caregiver" means a person who has met the requirements of Family Code 6550-6552.

Written agreements may be signed using an electronic signature that complies with state and federal standards, as determined by the CDE. (EC 51749.6)

The student's or parent/guardian's signature shall constitute permission for the student to receive instruction through independent study. (EC 51749.6)

The Superintendent or designee shall retain a physical or electronic copy of the signed learning agreement for at least three (3) years and as appropriate for auditing purposes. (EC 51749.6)

Student-Parent-Educator Conferences

A student-parent-educator conference shall be held as appropriate including, but not limited to, as a reengagement strategy and/or if requested by a parent/guardian prior to enrollment or disenrollment from independent study. (EC 51745.5, 51747, 51749.5)

Independent Study Plan Certification

Pursuant to Education Code Section 46393, for Form J-13A submissions due to a school closure and/or material decrease in attendance occurring after September 1, 2021, a school district, county office of education, or charter school that provides a Form J-13A affidavit to the Superintendent, pursuant to EC Section 41422 (school closure) or EC Section 46392 (material decrease), shall certify that it has a plan for which independent study will be offered to students, pursuant to Article 5.5 (commencing with EC Section 51745) of Chapter 5 of Part 28 of Division 4.

The independent study plan shall comply with all of the following:

1. Independent study is offered to any student impacted by any of the conditions listed in EC Section 46392 within 10 days of the first day of a school closure or material decrease in attendance. Students who are individuals with exceptional needs shall receive the services identified in their individualized education programs pursuant to paragraph (9) of subdivision (a) of EC Section 56345 and may participate in an independent study program.

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2. Require reopening for in-person instruction as soon as possible unless prohibited under the direction of the local or state health officer.

3. Notwithstanding subdivision (c) of EC Section 51745 or subparagraph (F) of paragraph (9) of subdivision (g) of Section 51747, include information regarding establishing independent study master agreements in a reasonable amount of time.

Records for Audit Purposes

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that records are maintained for audit purposes. These records shall include, but not be limited to: (EC 51748; 5 CCR 11703)

- 1. A copy of the Board policy, administrative regulation, and other procedures related to independent study.
- 2. A listing of the students, by grade level, program, and school, who have participated in independent study, along with the units of the curriculum attempted and completed by students in grades K-8 and the course credits attempted by and awarded to students in grades 9-12 and adult education.
- 3. A file of all agreements, with representative samples of each student's work products bearing the supervising teacher's notations indicating that the teacher has personally evaluated the work or personally reviewed the evaluations made by another certificated teacher.
- 4. As appropriate to the program in which the students are participating, a daily or hourly attendance register that is separate from classroom attendance records, maintained on a current basis as time values of student work products judged by a certificated teacher, and reviewed by the supervising teacher if they are two different persons.
- 5. Appropriate documentation of compliance with the teacher-student ratios required by Education Code 51745.6 and 51749.5
- 6. Appropriate documentation of compliance with the requirements pursuant to Education Code 51747.5 to ensure the coordination, evaluation, and supervision of the independent study of each student by a district employee who possesses a valid certification document pursuant to Education Code 44865 or an emergency credential pursuant to Education Code 44300. (EC 51747.5)

The district shall document each student's participation in live interaction and synchronous instruction pursuant to Education Code 51747 on each school day, as applicable, in whole or in part, for which independent study is provided. A student who does not participate in independent study on a school day shall be documented as non-participatory for that school day. (EC 51747.5)

The Superintendent or designee also shall maintain a written or computer-based record such as a grade book or summary document of student engagement, for each class, of all grades, assignments, and assessments for each student for independent study assignments. (EC 51747.5)

The signed, dated agreement, any supplemental agreement, assignment records, work samples, and attendance records may be maintained on file electronically. (EC 51747)

Program Evaluation

The Superintendent or designee shall annually report to the Board the number of district students participating in independent study, the average daily attendance generated for apportionment purposes, student performance as measured by standard indicators and in comparison to students in classroom-based instruction, and the number and proportion of independent study students who graduate or successfully complete independent study. Based on the program evaluation, the Board and Superintendent shall determine areas for program improvement as needed.

Elementary

Students in 1st-3rd grades will meet with the teacher:

remotely daily for a synchronous lesson;

twice a week in person – the teacher will provide individual support and monitor the student's progress with the online curriculum.

Students in 4th-5th grades will meet with the teacher:

remotely daily for a "live interaction" online;

twice a week in person – the teacher will provide individual support and monitor the student's progress with the online curriculum.

Secondary

Independent Study offers an individualized course of study for pupils whose needs may be met outside of the traditional classroom setting. Students graduating shall complete all district core requirements, earn 220 credits and pass all competency tests. These are the same requirements met by continuation high school students.

The minimum period of time for any independent study option shall be five (5) consecutive school days.

Educational opportunities offered through independent study may include, but are not limited to: (EC 51745)

- 1. Special assignments extending the content of regular courses of instruction. (cf. 6143-Courses of Study)
- 2. Individualized study in a particular area of interest or in a subject not currently available in the regular school curriculum.
- 3. Individualized alternative education designed to teach the knowledge and skills of the core curriculum, but not provided as an alternative curriculum.
- 4. Continuing and special study during travel.
- 5. Volunteer community service activities and leadership opportunities that support and strengthen student achievement.

RESPONSIBLE OFFICE(S): Educational Services, K-12 Teaching and Learning

In addition, when requested by a parent/guardian due to an emergency, vacation, or illness, independent study may be used on a short-term basis to ensure that the student is able to maintain academic progress in their regular classes.

No course required for high school graduation shall be offered exclusively through independent study. (EC 51745)

A student's participation in independent study shall be voluntary. Students participating in independent study shall have the right, at any time, to enter or return to the regular classroom mode of instruction. (EC 51747)

Students in independent study shall have access to the same services and resources that are available to other students in the school and shall have equal rights and privileges.

The district shall not provide independent study students and their parents/guardians with funds or items of value that are not provided for other students and their parents/guardians. (EC 46300.6, 51747.3)

The Superintendent or designee shall determine that the prospective Independent Study student understands and is prepared to meet the district's requirements for Independent Study. No student with exceptional needs receiving special education services may participate in any Independent Study services or program unless authorized by the Individualized Educational Plan (IEP). (EC 51745c)

A written agreement shall be developed and implemented for each student participating in independent study for five or more consecutive school days. (EC 46300, 51747)

The agreement shall include general student data, including the student's name, address, grade level, birth date, school of enrollment, and program placement. The independent study agreement for each participating student also shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following: (EC 51747)

- 1. The manner, time, frequency, and place for submitting the student's assignments and for reporting their progress.
- 2. The objectives and methods of study for the student's work and the methods used to evaluate that work.
- 3. The specific resources, including materials and personnel, that will be made available to the student.

Long-Term Independent Study

The master agreement shall specify the length of time in which each independent study assignment must be completed. Because excessive leniency in the duration of independent study assignments may result in a student falling behind their peers and increase the risk of dropping out of school, independent study



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assignments shall be no more than one week for all grade levels and types of programs. However, when necessary, based on the specific circumstances of the student's approved program, the Superintendent or designee may allow for a longer period of time between the date an assignment is made and when it is due, up to the termination date of the agreement.

An evaluation shall be conducted to determine whether it is in a student's best interest to remain in independent study whenever the student misses three assignments and/or two class meetings, unless the student's written agreement specifies a lower or higher number of missed assignments based on the nature of the assignments, the total number of assignments, and/or other unique circumstances.

Student-Teacher Conferences

Supervising teachers should establish an appropriate schedule for student-teacher conferences in order to help identify students falling behind in their work or in danger of failing or dropping out of school. Teachers are expected to monitor student progress and work closely with each student to determine the amount and type of contact needed for the student to be successful in the program. Missing appointments with the supervising teacher without valid reasons may trigger an evaluation to determine whether the student should remain in independent study.

Independent Study

When any student fails to complete consecutive independent study assignments, the Superintendent or designee shall conduct an evaluation to determine whether it is in the student's best interest to remain in independent study. Evaluation findings shall be kept in the student's permanent record. (cf. 5125 - Student Records)

The Superintendent or designee shall annually report to the Board the number of students engaged in independent study, the ADA generated, the quality of these students' work as measured by standard indicators, and the number and proportion of independent study students who graduate or successfully complete independent study.

Homeschooling Through Independent Study

The Superintendent or designee shall encourage parents/guardians desiring to teach their children at home to enroll their children in independent study. Such enrollment allows continued contact and cooperation between the school system and home-based students.

DESIRED OUTCOME:

This revised independent study Board policy provides an optional alternative instructional strategy for eligible students whose needs may be best met through study outside of the traditional classroom setting and expands independent study options to include a course-based independent study program.
