SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Almendarez thanked all certificated staff, classified staff, administrators and parents for their work and dedication to students over this past academic year.

He announced that the summer programs launched today across the district. SAUSD's robust summer school endorsed by the Board of Education, aims to support credit recovery, academic intervention, enrichment opportunities, services for our students with special needs, and other activities. These activities are taking place almost entirely in person across schools. Students are returning to schools for face-to-face interaction with teachers and other staff. This is a huge step in the efforts to return to full time in-person instruction when the new school year starts on August 16. Mr. Almendarez shared that he had a chance to visit classrooms today and stated that an important piece of reopening schools safely is ensuring that as many eligible students, families and staff members as possible have the opportunity to receive their vaccinations. To date, the district has offered close to 50,000 at SAUSD school sites with the support of partners, staff, and volunteers. Superintendent Almendarez thanked everyone who has contributed to this monumental effort. These clinics would not be possible without the tireless work of those who show up each Monday for up to 10 hours to make sure every last person in line gets a shot. The next clinic is Monday, June 14, from 10 am to 6 pm at Villa Fundamental Intermediate School. Visit www.sausd.us/vaccines for all the latest information.

Mr. Almendarez stated that for the last two Mondays, he and the district's leadership team had the opportunity to meet virtually with hundreds of parents from across the community. The goal is to help answer a lot of the questions they have regarding the return to in-person instruction. The goal through these meetings is to provide the best information at the time but for many of these parents, they just want an opportunity to be heard. He shared that more of these information sessions will be held in the weeks to come. Superintendent Almendarez announced that this Thursday, Friday and Saturday, the District will celebrate the graduating seniors in the Class of 2021 with in-person ceremonies at Angel Stadium. He thanked the Board of Education for making this opportunity possible and shared that SAUSD is the only school district in Orange County that will have high school graduation ceremonies at this scale. For those unable to attend, all ceremonies will be streamed live on SAUSD's website, and SAUSD's Facebook and YouTube pages starting at 6 p.m. each night. Finally, he congratulated Sommer Pedroza, the District's Coordinator of Health Services. Sommer Pedroza was recently selected as the 2020-2021 School Nurse Administrator of the Year by the Board of the Orange County School Nurses Organization. She was chosen for her excellence in school nursing and her leadership in school health. Sommer is highly regarded in the community and is known for her compassion and integrity. She constantly strives to develop and implement programs that promote student health and well-being. She is collaborative among the various departments in the district and works hard to ensure student success.

BOARD REPORTS

Dr. Alvarez welcomed everyone back to the in-person Board meeting and to the first day of summer school. He thanked the public speakers for reaching out and encouraged everyone to continue with the effort to reach out to the community so that they can be part of the decision-making. Dr. Alvarez shared that effective June 1st, the National Association of Social Work has changed its policy on ethics. Their new policy states that self-care is imperative in order to ensure ethical and competent social work services to the community. Social workers are suffering secondary trauma, compassion fatigue, anxiety and depression. He asked that the District continue to monitor the mental health of children and staff. He added that vaccination numbers are going up and thanked staff that has been helping with the distribution of the vaccines. He encouraged the community to get vaccinated. Dr. Alvarez announced that on June 13 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., he and Mayor Sarmiento will be sponsoring a food distribution at Delhi Center, a vaccination distribution, and a diaper distribution.

Ms. Amezcua congratulated Santa Ana High School football team. They will be receiving their CIF championship rings thanks to the donations of an anonymous donor that gave thousands of dollars, the Costa family and their friends, other friends in the community, Labor 652, Congressman Correa, and Assemblyman Daly. She also thanked Labor 652 because they will also be purchasing letterman jackets. She stated she is looking forward to graduations this weekend and thanked staff for the preparations. Ms. Amezcua welcomed students and parents back and returning to summer school. Parents and students are excited to be back. She shared that Reach has 200 students in their night program and will have 43 graduates this year. She stated that everyone will be returning in the Fall and thanked Superintendent Almendarez for sharing the survey results. The survey showed that 87% of

our families wanted to return to school. Ms. Amezcua encouraged staff to get the high flex equipment taken care of including the adult education schools. She announced that 2,038 vaccines were administered on Monday thanks to Rite Aid and Dr. Patel. Ms. Amezcua asked Mr. Almendarez for the Grant presentation. On June 15 Willard will be having a vaccine clinic and asked if it could be pushed out on social media. Ms. Amezcua also thanked Madison for their vaccine clinic. Lastly, she asked Superintendent Almendarez if any of our children were suspended during COVID and would like to know who, why, and how do you tell a child to stay off a Zoom for a couple of days. She stated that if children have been suspended, there needs to be a conversation. She asked if it was documented and asked that information be provided to the Board in B2B.

Mr. Palacio looks forward to graduations. He shared that the OC Register recognized two student volunteers of the year for Big Brothers and Big Sisters. He announced that Santa Ana High School won the CIF Championship and serve to be recognized for having one of the best games and won with 8 seconds on the clock. Mr. Palacio added that Summer school gives everyone an opportunity to learn from it as we expand to the fall. He asked staff to look into the sliding scale for day care and to consider expanding to one hour before school starts and after 5:00 p.m. and to promote. Mr. Palacio thanked staff for their hard work and is looking forward to the close of this academic year and the new year.

Ms. Torres thanked the pre-school teachers that called in. She also thanked all classified staff for getting schools ready for teachers, curriculum planning, and teachers for volunteering to teach during summer school. Ms. Torres also thanked district staff for their reports and presentations. She also asked staff to pay attention to rent protection and eviction protection expires June 30 which may affect our families and students. Ms. Torres requested an updated organizational chart. She thanked staff for help with the vaccine clinics. She stated that she is looking forward to graduation. It is her first graduation celebration as a Board member. Ms. Torres thanked parents, staff, and students for navigating this very difficult year. She stated she is looking forward to dropping by classrooms during the summer. Lastly, she wished all LBGTQI parents, students, and staff a happy pride month.

Dr. Rodriguez congratulated the class of 2021 and stated that he is looking forward to the graduations at Angels Stadium. He thanked classified staff and teachers whether on campus and via Zoom. He also thanked the Engage 360 staff, learning labs, and summer school teachers. Dr. Rodriguez shared that when everyone returns in person, it will be in a different but better way. Things like no combo classes, smaller class size, make sure that staff is collaborating, deeper stronger parent engagement, early learning component, and intermediate components. With the additional funding over the next three years, the district can mitigate and create a better system with first best instruction, and 5C's. He shared that he is excited to work with Superintendent Almendarez and the Deputies and all other staff.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, Board President Rodriguez adjourned the meeting at 10:20 p.m.

SCOPE:

The Governing Board recognizes its critical responsibility for adopting a sound budget for each fiscal year which is aligned with and reflects the District's vision, goals, priorities, local control and accountability plan (LCAP), and other comprehensive plans. The District budget shall guide decisions and actions throughout the year and shall serve as a tool for monitoring the fiscal health of the District. (cf. 0000 - Vision) (cf. 0200 - Goals for the School District) (cf. 0400 - Comprehensive Plans) (cf. 0460 - Local Control and Accountability Plan) (cf. 3300 - Expenditures and Purchases) (cf. 3460 - Financial Reports and Accountability) (cf. 9000 - Role of the Board)

POLICY:

The District budget shall show a complete plan and itemized statement of all proposed expenditures and all estimated revenues for the following fiscal year, together with a comparison of revenues and expenditures for the current fiscal year. The budget shall also include the appropriations limit and the total annual appropriations subject to limitation as determined pursuant to Government Code 7900-7914. (Education Code 42122)

Budget Development and Adoption Process

In order to provide guidance in the development of the budget, the Board shall annually establish budget priorities based on identified District needs and goals and on realistic projections of available funds.

The Superintendent or designee shall oversee the preparation of a proposed District budget for approval by the Board and shall involve appropriate staff in the development of budget projections.

The Board shall hold a public hearing on the proposed budget in accordance with Education Code 42103 and 42127. The hearing shall occur at the same meeting as the public hearing on the District's LCAP and the local control funding formula (LCFF) budget overview for parents/guardians. (Education Code 42103, 42127, 52062, 52064.1) (cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices) (cf. 9322 - Agenda/Meeting Materials) (cf. 9323 - Meeting Conduct)

The Board shall adopt the District budget at a public meeting held after the date of the public hearing but on or before July 1 of each year. The Board shall adopt the budget following its adoption of the LCAP, or annual update to the LCAP, and the LCFF budget overview for parents/guardians. The budget shall include the expenditures necessary to implement the LCAP or the annual update to the LCAP. (Education Code 42127, 52062)

The budget that is presented at the public hearing as well as the budget formally adopted by the Board shall adhere to the state's Standardized Account Code Structure as prescribed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction (SPI). (Education Code 42126, 42127)

The Superintendent or designee may supplement this format with additional information as necessary to effectively communicate the budget to the Board, staff, and public.

No later than five days after the Board adopts the District budget or by July 1, whichever occurs first, the Board shall file the adopted District budget with the County Superintendent of Schools. The budget and supporting data shall be maintained and made available for public review. (Education Code 42127) (cf. 1340 - Access to District Records)

If the County Superintendent disapproves or conditionally approves the District's budget, the Board shall review and respond to the County Superintendent's recommendations at a regular public meeting on or before October 8. The response shall include any revisions to the adopted budget and any other proposed actions to be taken as a result of those recommendations. (Education Code 42127)

Budget Criteria and Standards

The District budget shall be developed in accordance with state criteria and standards specified in 5 CCR 15440-15450 as they relate to projections of average daily attendance (ADA), enrollment, ratio of ADA to enrollment, LCFF revenue, salaries and benefits, other revenues and expenditures, facilities maintenance, deficit spending, fund balance, and reserves. In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall provide the supplemental information specified in 5 CCR 15451 which addresses the methodology and budget assumptions used, contingent liabilities, use of one-time revenues for ongoing expenditures, use of ongoing revenues for one-time expenditures, contingent revenues, contributions, long-term commitments, unfunded liabilities, status of collective bargaining agreements, the LCAP, and LCAP expenditures. (Education Code 33128, 33129, 42127.01; 5 CCR 15440-15451)

The District budget shall provide for increased or improved services for unduplicated students at least in proportion to the increase in funds apportioned on the basis of the number and concentration of unduplicated students in accordance with 5 CCR 15496. Unduplicated students are students who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals, English learners, and/or foster youth. (Education Code 42238.07; 5 CCR 15496) (cf. 3553 - Free and Reduced Price Meals) (cf. 6173.1 - Education for Foster Youth) (cf. 6174 - Education for English Learners)

The Board may establish other budget assumptions or parameters which may take into consideration the stability of funding sources, legal requirements and constraints on the use of funds, anticipated increases and/or decreases in the cost of services and supplies, program requirements, and any other factors necessary to ensure that the budget is a realistic plan for District revenues and expenditures. (cf. 2210 - Administrative Discretion Regarding Board Policy) (cf. 3110 - Transfer of Funds)

Fund Balance

The District shall classify fund balances in compliance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement 54, as follows:

1. Nonspendable fund balance includes amounts that are not expected to be converted to cash, such as resources that are not in a spendable form (e.g., inventories and prepaids) or that are legally or contractually required to be maintained intact.
2. Restricted fund balance includes amounts constrained to specific purposes by their providers or by law.
3. Committed fund balance includes amounts constrained to specific purposes by the Board.

For this purpose, all commitments of funds shall be approved by a majority vote of the Board. The constraints shall be imposed no later than the end of the reporting period (June 30), although the actual amounts may be determined subsequent to that date but prior to the issuance of the financial statements.

4. Assigned fund balance includes amounts which are intended for a specific purpose but do not meet the criteria to be classified as restricted or committed.

The Board delegates authority to assign funds to the assigned fund balance to the Superintendent and authorizes the assignment of such funds to be made any time prior to the issuance of the financial statements. The Superintendent shall have discretion to further delegate the authority to assign funds.

5. Unassigned fund balance includes amounts that are available for any purpose.

When multiple types of funds are available for an expenditure, the District shall first utilize funds from the restricted fund balance as appropriate, then from the committed fund balance, then from the assigned fund balance, and lastly from the unassigned fund balance.

The Board intends to maintain a minimum assigned and unassigned fund balance in an amount the Board deems sufficient to maintain fiscal solvency and stability and to protect the District against unforeseen circumstances.

If the assigned and unassigned fund balance falls below the level set by the Board due to an emergency situation, unexpected expenditures, or revenue shortfalls, the Board shall develop a plan to recover the fund balance which may include dedicating new unrestricted revenues, reducing expenditures, and/or increasing revenues or pursuing other funding sources.

Reserve Balance

The District budget shall include a minimum reserve balance for economic uncertainties that is consistent with the percentage or amount specified in 5 CCR 15450.

In any year following the fiscal year in which the District is notified by the SPI that the amount of monies in the state Public School System Stabilization Account equals or exceeds three percent of the combined total of general fund revenues appropriated for school districts and allocated local proceeds of taxes, the District budget shall not contain a combined assigned or unassigned ending general fund balance that is in excess of 10 percent of these funds, unless the requirement is waived in accordance with Education Code 42127.01. (Education Code 42127.01)

Long-Term Financial Obligations

The District's current-year budget and multiyear projections shall include adequate provisions for addressing the District's long-term financial obligations, including, but not limited to, long-term obligations resulting from collective bargaining agreements, financing of facilities projects, unfunded or future liability for retiree benefits, and accrued workers' compensation claims. (cf. 4141/4241 - Collective Bargaining Agreement) (cf. 4154/4254/4354 - Health and Welfare Benefits) (cf. 7210 - Facilities Financing) (cf. 9250 - Remuneration, Reimbursement and Other Benefits)

The Board may approve a plan for meeting the District's long-term obligations to fund contributions to the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) which, to the extent possible, minimizes significant increases in annual general fund expenditures towards pension obligations. The plan may include prefunding required pension contributions through the California Employers' Pension Prefunding Trust Program pursuant to Government Code 21710-21716.

The Board shall approve a plan for meeting the District's long-term obligations to fund nonpension, other postemployment benefits (OPEBs). This plan shall include a specific funding strategy and the method that will be used to finance the District's annual fiscal obligations for such benefits in a manner that continually reduces the deficit to the District to the extent possible. The Board reserves the authority to review and amend the funding strategy as necessary to ensure that it continues to serve the best interests of the District and maintains flexibility to adjust for changing budgetary considerations.

The Superintendent or designee shall annually present a report to the Board on the estimated accrued but unfunded cost of OPEBs. As a separate agenda item at the same meeting, the Board shall disclose whether or not it will reserve a sufficient amount of money in its budget to fund the present value of the benefits of existing retirees and/or the future cost of employees who are eligible for benefits in the current fiscal year. (Education Code 42140)

The Superintendent or designee shall annually present a report to the Board on the estimated accrued but unfunded cost of workers' compensation claims and the actuarial reports upon which the estimated costs are based. As a separate agenda item at the same meeting, the Board shall disclose whether or not it will reserve in the budget sufficient amounts to fund the present value of accrued but unfunded workers' compensation claims or if it is otherwise decreasing the amount in its workers' compensation reserve fund. The Board shall annually certify to the County Superintendent the amount, if any, that it has decided to reserve in the budget for these costs. The Board shall submit to the County Superintendent any budget revisions that may be necessary to account for this budget reserve. (Education Code 42141)

Budget Amendments

No later than 45 days after the Governor signs the annual Budget Act, the Superintendent or designee shall make available for public review any revisions in budgeted revenues and expenditures which occur as a result of the funding made available by that Budget Act. (Education Code 42127)

Whenever revenues and expenditures change significantly throughout the year, the Superintendent or designee shall recommend budget amendments to ensure accurate projections of the District's net ending balance. When final figures for the prior-year budget are available, this information shall be used as soon as possible to update the current-year budget's beginning balance and projected revenues and expenditures.

In addition, budget amendments shall be submitted for Board approval as necessary when collective bargaining agreements are accepted, District income declines, increased revenues or unanticipated savings are made available to the District, program proposals are significantly different from those approved during budget adoption, interfund transfers are needed to meet actual program expenditures, and/or other significant changes occur that impact budget projections.

DESIRED OUTCOME:

Through this policy the District shall establish procedures related to the Budget for the purpose of adopting a sound budget for each year, which is aligned with the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) and other comprehensive plans.

SCOPE:

The Governing Board recognizes its responsibility to monitor the District's fiscal practices to ensure accountability regarding the expenditure of public funds and compliance with legal requirements. (cf. 0460 - Local Control and Accountability Plan) (cf. 3100 - Budget) (cf. 3400 - Management of District Assets/Accounts) (cf. 3460 - Financial Reports and Accountability)

POLICY:

The total amount budgeted by the District for each major classification of expenditures, as listed in the California Department of Education's budget forms, shall be the maximum amount which the District may expend for that classification for the school year. (Education Code 42600)

However, when it is in the best interest of the District, the Board may:

1. At any time, adopt a written resolution providing for transfers from the designated fund balance or the unappropriated fund balance to any expenditure classification or between classifications. The resolution shall be filed with the County Superintendent of Schools and the county auditor. (Education Code 42600)
2. Direct the temporary transfer of monies held in any District fund or account to another fund or account as necessary for the payment of obligations. Such borrowing shall occur only when the fund or account receiving the money will earn sufficient income during the current fiscal year to repay the amount transferred. No more than 75 percent of the maximum amount held in any fund or account during the current fiscal year may be transferred. Amounts transferred shall be repaid in the same fiscal year, or in the following fiscal year if the transfer takes place within the final 120 calendar days of a fiscal year. (Education Code 42603)
3. At the close of a school year, request that the County Superintendent make transfers between the designated fund balance or the unappropriated fund balance and any expenditure classification(s), or balance any expenditure classifications of the District budget as necessary for the payment of obligations incurred during that school year. (Education Code 42601)
4. Specify amounts to be transferred by the county auditor and treasurer from the District's general fund to the special reserve fund during the fiscal year. If any special reserve funds are maintained for purposes other than capital outlay or if monies in the special reserve fund are not actually encumbered for ongoing expenses, the Board may transfer those monies into the general fund for the general operating purposes of the District. If any monies remain in the special reserve fund at the conclusion of a project, the Board may, by written request to the County Superintendent, auditor, and treasurer, transfer those monies to the District's general fund. (Education Code 42841-42843)
5. Transfer monies between other funds or accounts when authorized by law.

The Governing Board intends to use California State Lottery funds for supplemental and nonrecurring expenditures in support of educational programs and activities. In recognition of the yearly fluctuations of lottery funds received by the District, the Board shall not commit lottery funds for any purpose until they have been received. (cf. 3000 - Concepts and Roles) (cf. 3100 - Budget)

POLICY:

The Board shall establish funding priorities and approve all allocations in accordance with law. (cf. 6161.1 - Selection and Evaluation of Instructional Materials)

Lottery funds allocated by the state for the purchase of instructional materials shall be expended on instructional materials as defined in Education Code 60010. Lottery funds shall not be used for the acquisition of real property, construction of school facilities, financing of research, or any other noninstructional purpose. (Government Code 8880.4, 8880.5) (cf. 3460 - Financial Reports and Accountability)

For the receipt and expenditure of lottery funds, the Superintendent or designee shall establish a separate account that shall be clearly identified as a lottery education account. (Government Code 8880.5)

The Board encourages staff and community members to participate in determining how lottery funds will be used. The Superintendent or designee may solicit input through District advisory groups, school site councils, and/or individual students, staff, parents/guardians and community members. (cf. 0420 - School Plans/Site Councils) (cf. 1220 - Citizen Advisory Committees)

DESIRED OUTCOME:

Through this policy, the District shall ensure California State Lottery funds expenditures are in compliance with the law.

RESPONSIBLE OFFICE(S): Administrative Services, Facilities

SCOPE:

The Governing Board believes that District facilities and resources should be utilized in an economical and practical manner. The Superintendent or designee shall periodically study the current and projected use of all District facilities to ensure the efficient utilization of space for the effective delivery of instruction. (cf. 1330 - Use of School Facilities) (cf. 7110 - Facilities Master Plan) (cf. 7111 - Evaluating Existing Buildings) (cf. 7160 - Charter School Facilities)

POLICY:

Prior to the sale or lease of any surplus real property, the Board shall appoint a District advisory committee to advise the Board regarding the use or disposition of schools or school building space which is not needed for school purposes. The Board may elect not to appoint a District advisory committee for any of the following: (Education Code 17388, 17391, 17515 - 17529) (cf. 1220 - Citizen Advisory Committees)

1. A rental of property for a period of time not exceeding 30 days
2. A lease or rental of surplus property to a private educational institution for the purpose of offering summer school or who serve SAUSD students.
3. A sale, lease, or rental of surplus property to be used for teacher, student or other employee housing and complimentary uses.
4. Until July 1, 2024, a sale or lease of surplus property that has not previously operated, or was not constructed to be operated, as an early childhood education facility or a school for elementary or secondary instruction
5. In the case of a joint-occupancy lease or joint-use lease

In addition, to ensure that the proposed disposition of the property conforms with any general plan adopted by the local planning agency that affects or includes the area where the surplus property is located, the Board shall submit a report to the local planning agency describing the location of the surplus property and the purpose and extent of the proposed sale or lease. (Government Code 65402)

The Board shall determine whether the sale or lease of the surplus property is subject to review under the California Environmental Quality Act. (Public Resources Code 21000-21177; 14 CCR 15061-15062)

The Board may meet in closed session with its real property negotiator prior to the sale or lease of real property by the District in order to grant its negotiator authority regarding the minimum price or rent and terms of the sale or lease. (Government Code 54956.8) (cf. 9321 - Closed Session)

When selling or leasing District real property, the Board shall comply with applicable procedures and give priority to specified public agencies as required by law. (Education Code 17230, 17464, 17485-17499; Government Code 54222) (cf. 5148 - Child Care and Development) (cf. 5148.2 - Before/After School Programs) (cf. 5148.3 - Preschool/Early Childhood Education)

Resolution of Intention to Sell or Lease

Before ordering the sale or lease of any real property, the Board shall adopt a resolution by a two-thirds vote of all of its members at a regularly scheduled open meeting. The resolution shall describe the property proposed to be sold or leased in such a manner as to identify it, specify the minimum price or rent, describe the terms upon which it will be sold or leased, and specify the commission or rate, if any, which the Board will pay to a licensed real estate broker out of the minimum price or rent. The resolution shall fix a time, not less than three weeks thereafter, for a public meeting, held at the Board's regular meeting place, at which sealed proposals to purchase or lease will be received and considered. (Education Code 17466) (cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices) (cf. 9323.2 - Actions by the Board)

The Superintendent or designee shall provide notice of the adoption of the resolution and of the time and place of the meeting that will be held to consider bids by posting copies of the resolution, signed by the Board, in three public places not less than 15 days before the date of the meeting. In addition, the notice shall be published at least once a week for three successive weeks before the meeting, in a newspaper of general circulation published in the county in which the District is located, if such a newspaper exists. (Education Code 17469)

At least 60 days prior to the public meeting, the Superintendent or designee shall take reasonable steps to provide written notification of the public meeting, by certified mail, to the former owner from whom the District acquired the property. (Education Code 17470)

Acceptance/Rejection of Bids

At the public meeting specified in the resolution of intention to sell or lease property, the Board shall open, examine, and declare all sealed bids. Before accepting a written proposal, the Board shall call for oral bids in accordance with law. (Education Code 17472, 17473)

The Board may reject any and all bids, either written or oral, and withdraw the properties from sale when the Board determines that rejection is in the best public interest. If no proposals are submitted or the submitted proposals do not conform to all the terms and conditions specified in the resolution of intention to lease, the Board may lease the property in accordance with Education Code 17477. (Education Code 17476, 17477)

Of the proposals submitted by responsible bidders which conform to all terms and conditions specified in the resolution of intention to sell or lease, the Board shall finally accept the highest bid after deducting the commission, if any, to be paid to a licensed real estate broker, unless the Board accepts a higher oral bid or rejects all bids. (Education Code 17472)

The final acceptance of the bid may be made either at the same meeting specified in the resolution or at any adjourned/continued meeting held within 10 days. Upon acceptance of the bid, the Board may adopt a resolution of acceptance that directs the Board President, or any other Board Member, to execute the deed or lease and to deliver the document upon performance and compliance by the successful bidder of all of the terms and conditions of the contract. (Education Code 17475-17478) (cf. 1431 - Waivers)

Use of Proceeds

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the proceeds from the sale or lease with an option to purchase of surplus District property are used for one-time capital outlay expenditures and not for ongoing expenditures such as salaries and general operating expenses. (Education Code 17462; 2 CCR 1700)

Proceeds from a sale of surplus District property shall generally be used for capital outlay or maintenance costs that the Board determines will not recur within a five-year period. Proceeds from a lease of district property with an option to purchase may be deposited into a restricted fund for the routine repair of district facilities, as defined by the SAB, for up to a five-year period. (Education Code 17462)

However, if the Board and SAB determine that the District has no anticipated need for additional sites or building construction for the next 10 years and no major deferred maintenance requirements, the proceeds from the sale or lease with an option to purchase may be deposited in a special reserve fund for the future maintenance and renovation of school sites or in the District's general fund. (Education Code 17462) (cf. 3100 - Budget) (cf. 3460 - Financial Reports and Accountability)

In addition, until July 1, 2024, if District surplus property was purchased entirely with local funds, the proceeds from the sale or lease of the property, together with any personal property located on the property, may be deposited into the general fund of the district and may be used for any one-time general fund purpose. Before exercising this authority, the Board shall: (Education Code 17463.7)

1. Submit to SAB documents certifying that the sale of real property does not violate the provisions of a local bond act and the real property is not suitable to meet projected school construction needs for the next 10 years
2. At a public meeting, adopt a plan for expending one-time resources from the sale or lease of the property which identifies the source and intended use of the surplus property proceeds and describes the reasons that the expenditure will not result in ongoing fiscal obligations for the District

Whenever the District sells real property that was purchased, improved, or modernized with funds that were received from a state school facilities funding program within the previous 10 years, the District shall notify OPSC within 90 calendar days of the sale of the property if the proceeds from the sale are not used for capital outlay and the property is not sold to a charter school, another school district, a county office of education, or an agency that will use the property exclusively for the delivery of child care and development services. If SAB subsequently makes a finding that the sale is subject to Education Code 17462.3, the District shall return the funds to the SAB within 90 calendar days of the finding. (2 CCR 1702)

DESIRED OUTCOME:

This policy establishes guidance on the sale or lease of District-owned property while complying with State and federal guidelines to maximize District real property.
