ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION 19/20-3331 DECLARING OPPOSITION OF THE SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT TO YALE TRANSITION CENTER PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District is comprised of 56 schools located over a 24-square mile area in the northern part of Orange County;

WHEREAS, the 2019-2020 projected enrollment of students attending schools in the District is approximately 47,000;

WHEREAS, the District offers educational programs for grades k-12 and students enrolled in such schools are generally between the ages of 4-19;

WHEREAS, some school campuses are open campuses, meaning that the schools are generally accessible to the public;

WHEREAS, it has been reported by many reliable sources that Orange County has seen a significant rise in the number of homeless individuals residing within its boundaries since January 2017;

WHEREAS, studies have shown that the homeless population is frequently beset by any number of challenging and unfortunate conditions, including drug addiction, mental illness, physical disabilities, poor health generally, absence of sound personal hygiene practices, can be carriers of communicable diseases, and possess little or no financial resources;

WHEREAS, efforts have been made since the initiation of litigation in January of 2018 by the *Orange County Catholic Worker v Orange County et al.*, Case No,. 8:18-cv-00155-DOK-KES to address the homeless crisis in the County, the results have been less than adequate and have disproportionally affected a limited number of municipalities, especially the City of Santa Ana, while other cities have not committed the resources and, in fact, appear to be implementing policy decisions that have or will continue to exacerbate the situation within the City of Santa Ana unless checked or altered;

WHEREAS, when location of a permanent facility to provide services for the homeless population in the southern portion of the County was reversed because of the objection raised by communities affected, the County set a course to find a location for a permanent facility in an area that did not pose, in the minds of some, the same political challenge as the cities in the south;

WHEREAS, the County has purchased a building located at 2229 S. Yale Street, Santa Ana, less than a mile from Centennial Park, for the purpose of converting an existing office building into a 425-bed Homeless Center;

WHEREAS, in November of 2019, the County Board of Supervisors approved a contract with Home Aide, a business organization known for building homeless centers throughout California;

WHEREAS, members of this Governing Board have stated publicly their concerns about the location of the Homeless Center near school campuses in several different forums, County Officials have ignored these pleas and have elected not to engage in any meaningful dialog with school officials over concerns for the safety of students, staff or parents of students, nor has the County, or its agents, shared their plans to mitigate the potential threats the presence of the homeless population may pose at or near school campuses within the District;

WHEREAS, within a two-square-mile radius of the proposed Yale Transition or Homeless Center are ten (10) school campuses: Mitchell Child Development Center, Godinez High School, Jackson Elementary, Diamond Elementary, Carr Intermediate, Harvey Elementary, Valley High School, Adams Elementary and McFadden Intermediate;

WHEREAS, the District maintains its own police force, which is comprised of 30 sworn peace officers, including command staff officers;

WHEREAS, the District also employs 41 District Safety Officers who provide additional security, supervision, and intervention and who are not sworn personnel, meaning they have not completed POST training but assist and are trained to work in tandem with sworn police officers;

WHEREAS, in the 2018-2019 school year, the Santa Ana USD Police Department responded to more than 116 homeless-related incidents/calls for service at or near the vicinity of schools in the District. In just the first six months of the 2019-2020 school year, the School Police Department has already responded to 158 homeless-related incidents/calls for service;

WHEREAS, the enormity of the service area and the number of calls answered by School Police places significant pressure on the Department to provide a level of service that the Governing Board feels is needed;

WHEREAS, School Police resources are stretched to the maximum now, making nearly impossible officer deployment at the level needed to properly patrol campuses and areas around the schools where the homeless population will likely congregate and frequent;

WHEREAS, it is the Governing Board's understanding that because of the withholding of funding by the County to address the homeless crisis in Orange County, the City of Santa Ana has had to bear a disproportionate share of the cost associated with housing and providing services to the homeless population and is pursuing redress through litigation against the County, as well as other municipalities, including Dana Point, San Clemente, and San Juan Capistrano, to recover a portion of the overall cost for caring for the homeless the City has expended in recent years;

WHEREAS, in court documents filed by the City of Santa Ana, the City has alleged:

- 1. In Fiscal Year 2018-19, Santa Ana spent \$16.6 million to address homeless issues at the expense of core services to Santa Ana residents. This amount was spent on a wide variety of services, including police response, clean-up and code enforcement, homeless services, park safety, fire response, and management and legal services.
- 2. For Fiscal Year 2019-20, Santa Ana's estimated costs to address and mitigate homelessness are projected at \$25.4 million for these same services and at the expense of core services to residents.
- 3. As a result, Santa Ana's physical resources have been overwhelmed. Until April 2018, over 200 homeless individuals lived in the Civic Center in tents and other makeshift shelters, specifically in an area known as the Plaza of the Flags, immediately adjacent to Santa Ana City Hall. This encampment necessitated the leasing of temporary bathroom facilities and created issues regarding the storage of personal property left unattended in and around the Civic Center. The circumstances gave rise to the near-constant law enforcement presence in the Civic Center.
- 4. Santa Ana police have provided homeless outreach services and faced quality of life issues, including suicide attempts, physical assaults, petty crimes, homicide investigations, among a variety of other issues. City personnel also undertook extraordinary health and safety measures, including the collection of abandoned, used, uncapped hypodermic needles, disposal of human waste left in public areas, increased maintenance services to confront excessive trash, and the implementation of weekly power washing to minimize Hepatitis A and other health concerns.
- 5. Despite admonitions from the Federal Court Judge, homeless individuals continue to be intentionally or unintentionally abandoned within Santa Ana by various means. Some are transported for services to Santa Ana and left without a plan for return transportation to the city of origin. Other homeless individuals are brought to Santa Ana for shelter and essentially remain in Santa Ana if that housing solution ends. For others, it is believed they are simply transported to Santa Ana by neighboring agencies and ultimately abandoned.

6. The County, through the Orange County Sheriff's Department, routinely releases inmates who are homeless from its Central Jail Complex into Santa Ana instead of transporting these individuals to their original place of residency. This practice has dramatically increased the homeless population in Santa Ana.

WHEREAS, a federal court recently denied a request made by the City of Santa Ana to enjoin the County, as well as other cities located in Orange County, from transporting members of the homeless population residing in those jurisdictions to facilities located within the City, thus resulting in a continual influx of members of the homeless population into the City boundaries;

WHEREAS, located within the City of Santa Ana presently are two homeless shelters, one of which is situated at the National Guard Armory. This facility operates a 200-bed center, with all individuals having to leave the facility by 6:30 am the following day;

WHEREAS, the Armory is located next to Santa Ana's Delhi Park and Community Center. The Park is one of the largest within the City boundaries and is frequented by large numbers of residents because of the recreational fields, playgrounds, handball courts, and restrooms on the property. Additionally, the Community Center is a fullservice community center used by local residents and organizations routinely;

WHEREAS, users of the Armory Center often do not leave the area and frequently spend daytime hours in and around Delhi Park, discouraging residents and their families from using both the park and Community Center;

WHEREAS, the Governing Board anticipates that similar activity as occurs at Delhi Park will occur in or around schools in the District, especially at Godinez High School, which is located adjacent to Centennial Park;

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED THAT,

The Governing Board of the Santa Ana Unified School District hereby declares its strong opposition to the decision of the County of Orange Board of Supervisors to locate what has been called the Yale Property Homeless Transition Center in close proximity of nine (9) schools in the District for all the reasons identified above.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT,

The Governing Board directs the District Administration (1) to explore any and all available options to address the concerns of the District and the greater school community over the location of the Homeless Center in proximity to several schools in the District including, but not limited to, the safety of students and staff, the strong possibility of loitering at or near campuses, accumulation of trash, harassment of students, parents, or legal guardians, the potential for criminal activity, and the possible spread of contagious diseases; (2) to provide notification to County Officials of the District's objection to the location of the Homeless Center so close to schools in the District; (3) to open a dialog with County Officials so that concerns about the safety of students, staff and the greater school community can be presented to them; (4) to retain counsel for the purpose of advising the Governing Board of its options to delay or seek suspension of the project until the County has agreed to terms for mitigation of the concerns parents and students have about their safety and wellbeing should the County, through their representatives, decline to meet or fail to present and/or consider reasonable mitigation of the concerns that have been identified commonly attendant with the homeless population.
