MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

October 9, 2012

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:09 p.m. by President Richardson. Other members in attendance were Mr. Hernández and Mr. Palacio.

Cabinet members present were Dr. Meléndez de Santa Ana, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Bishop, Ms. Lohnes, Mr. Dixon, Ms. Miller, and Mr. Hammitt.

CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Richardson asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the lectern.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board on matters of Closed Session.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular Board meeting was immediately recessed to consider legal issues, negotiations, and personnel matters. Dr. Yamagata-Noji and Mr. Reyna arrived during Closed Session.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular Board meeting reconvened at 6:35 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Mr. Reyna.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Meléndez greeted all present.

Dr. Meléndez began her remarks with the rededication celebration at Edison Elementary School. Mr. Richardson, Mr. Hernández, Dr. Noji, and Dr. Meléndez took part in a ribbon-cutting ceremony. She was moved by the memories Mr. Hernández shared about his arrival at Edison Elementary as an English Language Learner. Dr. Meléndez had the honor of meeting one of Edison's oldest students, Mr. Bill Gear. Mr. Gear attended Edison 75 years ago. Dr. Meléndez was touched by the photo he showed her of himself as a child, standing proudly in the front row of his 1940's class picture. Mr. Gear's daughter, Felisa Gear accompanied him to the celebration, who is the principal of Greenville Fundamental School.

Dr. Meléndez mentioned that the District hosted a delegation from El Salvador. The delegation consisted of local and national police representatives and District staff. She met the delegation who visited the District's Police Department to learn about SAUSD's best practices in providing for a safe learning and working environment. They visited Century High School to discuss successful crime prevention techniques and how the District maximizes safety through a community policing framework. The delegation also visited Jackson Elementary to observe a successful fitness program that students participate in with the Santa Ana Police Department. Lastly, they visited Lincoln Elementary school's after-school program.

Dr. Meléndez stated that Dr. Yamagata-Noji, Mr. Hernández, and she had the opportunity to visit Thorpe Fundamental Elementary School, last Wednesday where a delegation of 22 educators, from Phoenix, Arizona, and San Diego visited the school to tour, observe, and discuss how Thorpe has been successful in closing the academic achievement gap. The visit was sponsored by the National Center for Urban School Transformation. A special thanks to Principal Linda Bell, for her leadership and her team for such a great representation of the District.

Dr. Meléndez participated in International Walk to School Day. This year, along with Mr. Richardson and Dr. Yamagata-Noji, walked in the neighborhood of Heninger Elementary School. The walk ended at Heninger where the program took place that highlighted the benefits of walking. Dr. Meléndez enjoyed the presentations in which students took pictures, described their walks, and addressed specific safety concerns. After sharing their results with the audience, students presented them to the Santa Ana School Police Department, City of Santa Ana Police Department, and the City Public Works division.

Dr. Meléndez concluded her remarks by sharing about the Early Childhood Education Department, teaming up with Heninger Elementary School to host the National Read for the Record Day. The pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students were dressed in their pajamas and antennas. Sergeant Manuel Chavez of the Santa Ana Unified School Police Department read the story Ladybug Girl and the Bug Squad. Each student received a copy of the book to take home, thanks to a generous donation by the Pearson Foundation.

- (i) Mathematics,
- (ii) Science,
- (iii) History-Social Science,
- (iv) English/Language Arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program
- (v) Visual and performing arts

Under the general direction of the Director of Food Services and/or designee, develops, plans and prepares menus and menu specifications, establishing and monitoring quality control procedures to ensure sanitary and safe food preparation to meet student acceptability and USDA and State guidelines. Developing nutritional analysis and cost studies of proposed menu offerings and menus for special dietary needs. Implement and monitor comprehensive nutrition education programs and wellness program and promotions within the District to provide nutritional guidance to students, parents, and food service staff.

- Plans and prepares menus and specifications to provide quality, nutritionally balanced meals according to USDA and State guidelines. E
- Evaluates nutritional content and performs cost analysis of menu items to develop specifications for food items to be purchased. E
- Monitors feeding program to assure compliance with USDA and State guidelines. E
- Assists in developing, evaluating, and testing new and existing recipes with the intent of recommending innovative menu items to students that meet nutrition guidelines and promotions. E
