REGULAR MEETING SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

November 8, 2011

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. by President Hernández. Other members in attendance were Mr. Richardson, Dr. Yamagata-Noji, and Mr. Palacio. Mr. Reyna was not present at the meeting.

Cabinet members present were Dr. Meléndez de Santa Ana, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Ms. Lohnes, Mr. Dixon, and Ms. Miller. Mr. Bishop was not present.

CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Board President Hernández asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board on matters of Closed Session.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting recessed to Closed Session to consider confidential issues, negotiations, and personnel matters.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:35 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Viridiana Mojica, Senior at Saddleback High School.

ANNOUNCEMENT

Mr. Hernández announced the Annual Organizational meeting on December 13, 2011. At that meeting, the Board will elect officers for the 2012 school year and adopt a calendar of Board meetings for the year.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

Dr. Meléndez welcomed all present at the meeting. Superintendent Meléndez's opening report focused on keeping kids on track for success.

Dr. Meléndez asked Viridiana Mojica and Giovani Rios, Saddleback High School students, to step to the podium. Viridiana and Giovani gave a brief presentation on College and Career Day held at Saddleback High School. All students were given the opportunity to varied college preparation tests which enabled them to explore different career options.

Dr. Meléndez announced that eight principals were in attendance to receive recognition for their respective schools outstanding result in the area of attendance improvement. Dr. Tony Wold, Executive Director of Business Operations, and Mrs. Nancy Diaz-Miller, Senior Director of Pupil Support Services, provided a brief description of the increase in attendance. In the 2010-11 school year, the District's average daily attendance (ADA) increased by 0.25%; the District's ADA was 96.46%, which is equivalent to an increase of over \$600,000. Over 36,000 parent attendance notifications were sent out. The District was able to have over 10,900 face-to-face meeting with parents. Mr. Jack O'Connell, former Superintendent of Schools, State of California, was in attendance to lead the recognition. Mr. O'Connell is now Educational Director of Schools Innovation and Advocacy. Mr. O'Connell presented awards in recognition of the schools dedication and commitment to parental involvement and student learning through improved attendance to the following schools:

Dr. Meléndez provided an update of her 100-Day Entry Plan. Over 250 parents and community members have participated in group meetings. The two remaining meetings to be held are from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. on:

- Wednesday, November 9, at Mendez Fundamental Intermediate School, and
- Tuesday, November 15, at Thorpe Fundamental Elementary School

Dr. Meléndez announced that Jackson Elementary School has been named a finalist for a 2011 Golden Bell Award by the California School Boards Association. The School was nominated as a recipient for the coveted Golden Bell Award for its lunchtime fitness program administered through the Santa Ana Police and Athletic League. Principal Sela Longacre and Officer Tom Serafin, Santa Ana Police Athletic & Activity League, stepped up to the podium and shared information on their partnership.

Dr. Meléndez shared information of arts events that will be taking place this fall.

- Willard Intermediate School is partnering with New Hope Presbyterian Church in sponsoring the Hope Alive! Keeping Music Alive in the Schools concert on Sunday, November 13, 2011.
- Caring Educators Nourishing All (CENA) will be held on Saturday, December 24, 2011, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at Valley High School. This has been a Christmas Eve tradition for the past 22 years. All employees and their families were invited to volunteer their time or to contribute in some way.

• And, in support of CENA, Barnes and Noble at Metro Pointe in South Coast Plaza will host an SAUSD book fair from Friday-Sunday, November 25-27, 2011. The store will donate a percentage of purchases made when SAUSD or CENA are mentioned.

PRESENTATIONS

2010-11 Annual Report for Williams Settlement Legislation

Dr. Cathie Olsky, Deputy Superintendent, provided a summary of the 2010-11 Annual Report for Williams Settlement Legislation from the Orange County Department of Education. The Williams Legislation Annual Report for the 2010-11 school year is as follows:

<u>Instructional Materials</u> (Reviews conducted September14-21, 2010)

Thirty schools were evaluated. All schools were found to have sufficient textbooks and instructional materials, as well as the Uniform Complaint Procedure posting in classrooms.

 $\frac{\text{Facilities}}{\text{Thirty-one}}$ (Reviews conducted September14-November 9, 2010) Thirty-one schools were evaluated. No deficiencies were noted.

School Accountability Report Cards (Reviews conducted May 20, 2011) Thirty schools were evaluated. All SARCs were evaluated and found to be accurate with respect to reporting sufficiency of materials and facilities.

<u>Teacher Assignments</u> (Reviews conducted on July 1, 2011)
Thirty schools were reviewed. Teacher assignments were reviewed and any misassignment was corrected.

Valenzuela/CAHSEE

Century, Saddleback, Santa Ana and Valley High schools were evaluated and found all schools in compliance.

SAUSD Budget Update

Mr. Michael Bishop, Associate Superintendent of Business Services, Secondary, provided a budget update to keep the Board abreast of the possible additional State budget cuts, the ramifications of restoring programs and/or positions, and the availability of one-time and on-going funds.

On Friday, October 28, a SAUSD delegation, in partnership with Los Angeles Unified and San Diego Unified school districts met with key Legislative and Administration advisors in Sacramento regarding the State budget. Meetings were held with Ms. Chris Woods, Budget Director for Assembly Speaker John Perez; Mr. Michael Cohen Chief Deputy Director of Budget for the Department of Finance; WestEd; School Services of California; School Innovations & Advocacy President Kevin Gordon, and Strategic Education Services Principal Stephen Rhodes. Those meetings focused on what has happened with this year's budget, what is expected next year, elements of the Superintendent's 100 day plan, and the role of lobbyists as advocates. Mr. Bishop spoke about the 2012-13 Budget and reductions.

Presentation of First Interim Report will be brought forward at the December 13, 2011 Board meeting. In addition, a representative from the audit firm will be present.

Facilities Update

Mr. Joe Dixon, Assistant Superintendent of Facilities Planning & Governmental Relations, provided information on the Williams Settlement inspections. He also provided an update of the projects completed, as well as projects in progress and those planned as part of Measure G. Mr. Dixon mentioned that facilities funds can only be used in capital facilities projects and cannot be used in the general fund.

SAUSD had zero deficiencies in the Williams Settlement inspection. The Orange County Department of Education said that rarely is there a school district with zero deficiencies. Mr. Dixon acknowledged Paul Arroyos, Hilario Beltran, and Dennis Ziegler for leading the team. Discussion ensued regarding projects at various sites.
