REGULAR MEETING SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

March 13, 2012

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 4:45 p.m. by Vice President Hernández. Other members in attendance were Dr. Yamagata-Noji, and Mr. Palacio.

Cabinet members present were Dr. Meléndez de Santa Ana, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Ms. Miller, Ms. Lohnes, Mr. Dixon, and Mr. Hammitt.

CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Hernández asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board on matters of Closed Session.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting was immediately recessed to consider student discipline issues, legal issues, negotiations, and personnel matters. Mr. Richardson arrived during Closed Session.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:30 p.m. Mr. Reyna arrived during the Regular meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Liz Silva, Captain of the Santa Ana Valley Girls Water Polo Team.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Meléndez greeted all present.

Dr. Meléndez themed tonight's meeting "Spring Forward" because with each new day fresh opportunities are handed to help and encourage children to Spring Forward in their lives... to Spring Forward with hope, confidence, optimism, and with a desire to learn something new about the world, and themselves.

She encouraged all to make the season a great one for students. Together, we can help them accelerate their academic achievements on their way to fulfilling their life's goals and dreams.

Dr. Meléndez congratulated the Lady Falcons Water Polo Team members and their Coach, Mr. Fred Lammers from Santa Ana Valley High School. They are the 2012 Orange League Champions and for the second year in a row, they are the CIF Division 7 Champions, having defeated the Los Amigos Lobos to claim the title. Water Polo team members present were Bianka Baeza, Gabriela Chavez, Jazmin Hinojoza, Minh Le, Merab Romero, Vanessa Santos, and Liz Silva.

Dr. Meléndez gave a facilities project update. Over winter break, an unoccupied District-owned, four-story building, on the corner of Broadway and Halesworth was demolished. El Sol Sciences and Arts Academy will use the space for improvements as part of their future building plans. The removal of the building was supervised by Mr. Joe Dixon, Assistant Superintendent, Facilities and Government Relations. Under Mr. Dixon's leadership, the project was completed on-time and within budget. The demolition was documented in a very interesting time-lapse video.

Dr. Meléndez stated that last fall, the District held six Community Engagement meetings to gather detailed input from parents. The meetings were part of her 100-Day Entry Plan. The goal was to hear directly from parents what they thought was working well in their schools and the District and areas they believe need improvement. Nearly 400 parents participated by giving valuable input. She thanked them, and assured them that the District is committed to using communications to promote trust and confidence among parents, teachers, students, and the community.

Dr. Meléndez surprised four very deserving "Teacher of the Year" recipients last week. Ms. Patricia Banuelos-Perez from Heroes Elementary, Ms. Anne Menaldo from Carr Intermediate, Mr. Todd Harvey at Community Day Intermediate and High School and Ms. Martie Lubetkin at John Muir Fundamental were all thrilled and overjoyed at their selection.

Dr. Meléndez had a wonderful opportunity to read "Green Eggs and Ham" to about 80 kindergarten, first, and second grade students at Lincoln Elementary and Jackson Elementary on "Read Across America Day." The students were attentive and enthusiastic.

Dr. Meléndez mentioned the Annual Honor Orchestra Concert held at Santa Ana High School. Many talented elementary, intermediate and high school music students participated. Another highlight of the evening was provided by Mr. Maxim Eshkenazy, one of the rising stars among today's young conductors, who serves as the assistant conductor for the Pacific Symphony Orchestra. He donated his time, talent, and inspiration to conduct our high school honor orchestra students. The District is very proud of the vibrant and thriving music programs, and thanked the board for their continued support of the arts.

This special fundraising event will be held in the teachers' lounge from 5:30 p.m. to 6:45 p.m. Besides raising awareness of the Foundation and their important work, the event will shine a well-deserved spotlight on Santa Ana High's arts program and its talented students. Tickets are \$40 and include the reception, dinner, and the show. A wonderful deal for a terrific cause.

Dr. Meléndez invited Ms. Kathy Cobb-Woll to the podium, she introduced a talented student performer, Michael Morales, who plays "Tony" and gave a live performance of "Something's Coming" from "West Side Story."

ORANGE COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

Approval of Temporary Cash Borrowing from the Orange County Treasury

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District (the "District") desires to request the County Treasury to make temporary transfers (the "Transfer") of monies to meet its current maintenance expenses for fiscal years 2011-12 and 2012-13; and

WHEREAS, California Constitution Article XVI, Section 6, provides that the County Treasurer shall have the power and the duty to make temporary transfers of monies, as further specified therein, upon resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors authorizing such temporary transfer; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Constitution Article XVI, Section 6 and Education Code section 42620, the total amount that may be temporarily transferred to the District may not exceed 85 percent of the anticipated revenues which will accrue to the District during the fiscal year ("FY"); and

WHEREAS, the District has not issued, nor will issue, a TRAN or other borrowing or any kind or nature for the purpose of funding the District's short term cash flow, which is outstanding in whole or in part, while a Transfer is outstanding; and

WHEREAS, any Transfer to the District will be made from and limited to the Educational Money Market Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby:

- 1. Find and determine that the Transfers are in the public interest and serve a valid public purpose.
- 2. The District Board of Trustees hereby requests transfers of monies from the Educational Money Market Fund to the District to cover the District's current maintenance expenses for FY 2011-12 and FY 2012-13. The amount of any Transfer cannot exceed 85 percent of the anticipated revenues which will accrue to the District during the fiscal year. This amount shall be certified by the District

and the actual amount of any Transfer(s) will be approved, if at all in the March 13, 2012 discretion of the County Treasurer, exercising her trust and fiduciary duties with respect to protecting all of the Educational Investment Pool participants from any principal loss and ensuring adequate liquidity to meet operating cash needs, that such monies are available for such Transfers. The District Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, Operations or the Director of Accounting are hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf of the District to formally request a Transfer in an amount and upon a date designated by the District Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, Operations or the Director of Accounting, not to exceed the limitations to such Transfer as provided herein.

3. For FY 2011-12, the District hereby requests that the Transfer be made by the Treasurer in one or more installments and not prior to July 1, 2011, nor later than April 30, 2012. The Transfer shall be repaid no later than October 31, 2012.

4. For FY 2012-2013, the District hereby requests that the Transfer be made by the Treasurer in one or more installments and not prior to July 1, 2012, nor later than April 29, 2013. The Transfer shall be repaid no later than October 31, 2013.

5. It is hereby requested that the Treasurer deposit Transfer installments to the District in the General Fund. All Transfers installments to the District will be made from and limited to the Educational Money Market Fund.

 6. The monies transferred to the District shall be repaid to the Educational Investment Pool from the first revenues accruing to the District before any other obligation of the District is met from such revenue. Compound interest on any Transfer installment will accrue and be payable by the District at a rate equal to the gross rate the Educational Investment Pool is earning for the same period from the date of the Transfer plus five (5) basis points until the entire Transfer and applicable interest is repaid.

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7. The monies transferred to the District will be repaid to the Educational Money Market Fund from the first revenues accruing to the District before any other obligation of the District is met from such revenue. Full repayment of any Transfer shall be made no later than October 31 following each fiscal year. The District understands and agrees that repayment of any and all Transfers is an obligation imposed by law and the obligation of the District to make payments with respect to such Transfer(s) is absolute and unconditional, payable from lawfully available funds of the District. In furtherance of the District's repayment obligations, District hereby grants the County a first lien
