### MINUTES

## REGULAR MEETING SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

### January 24, 2012

### CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 4:58 p.m. by President Richardson. Other members in attendance were Dr. Yamagata-Noji, Mr. Palacio, and Mr. Reyna.

Cabinet members present were Dr. Meléndez de Santa Ana, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Ms. Lohnes, Mr. Dixon, Ms. Miller, and Mr. Hammitt.

### CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Richardson asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board on matters of Closed Session.

### RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting was immediately recessed to consider student discipline issues, legal issues, negotiations, and personnel matters. Mr. Hernández arrived during Closed Session.

### RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:24 p.m.

### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Vice President Hernández.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Meléndez welcomed all present at the meeting.
- Dr. Meléndez was pleased to report that, after conducting four months of interviews, community meetings, and reviews, she is energized by the commitment of the students, parents, teachers, staff, community and leadership in Santa Ana Unified School District.
  - Dr. Meléndez recognized the success of the fall high school sport teams.
     She called Dawn Miller, Assistant Superintendent, Secondary Education, to the podium. Ms. Miller introduced the six comprehensive high school student-athletes representing their sport and their high school.

- Dr. Meléndez recognized Jackson Elementary's outstanding physical fitness program. Partnering with Santa Ana Police Department, Jackson's students work with police officers in a noontime program that has dramatically improved the health and fitness of the students. Marisela Longacre, principal of Jackson Elementary, Officer Tom Serafin, and Commander James Schnabl from Santa Ana PD, joined the Superintendent at the podium for recognition.
- In keeping with the District's core values of respect, responsibility, and results, Dr. Meléndez showed a brief video that captured some of the activities of CENA, Caring Educators Nurturing All. That day, once again, the employees and their families enjoyed themselves on Christmas Eve, serving over 2,300 individuals at the annual CENA dinner. The children received a toy, book, and a dictionary.
- Dr. Meléndez shared that Esqueda Elementary was invited by Superintendent of Public Instruction Tom Torlakson to apply for the National Blue Ribbon School Program. Esqueda has made very significant gains on their API, with two consecutive years' gains of 46 points for a total of 92 points.
- Dr. Meléndez mentioned that Jim Thorpe Fundamental Elementary is a finalist for the National Center for Urban School Transformation (NCUST) 2012 National Excellence in Urban Education Awards. Thorpe will be visited on Friday, January 27th, to validate its application.
- Dr. Meléndez stated that Greenville Fundamental, Muir Fundamental, and Monroe elementaries were identified as eligible for California Distinguished School status. The schools were determined to be eligible to apply because they met all Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) criteria and Growth Academic Performance Index (API) targets for the school overall and for all numerically significant subgroups.
- Dr. Meléndez announced that lottery registration for the fundamental schools for incoming kindergarten and sixth grade students will be conducted January 30<sup>th</sup> through February 17<sup>th</sup>. Incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders will be registering January 31<sup>st</sup> through February 7<sup>th</sup>. Lottery numbers will be randomly selected and posted at each fundamental school.

### RECOGNITION

### <u>Santa Ana Unified School District Medalists in Orange County Register's</u> 2012 <u>Public High Schools Ranking</u>

Dr. Cathie Olsky, Deputy Superintendent, Chief Academic Officer (CAO), introduced the Orange County Register's 2012 Public High Schools Ranking. Out of the entire 67 public high schools in Orange County, Middle College was ranked number two and is a Gold medal finalist. Claudia Flint, Principal at Middle College High School, was called to the podium to receive the recognition.

### Classified Employee of the Month for January 2012 - Alma R. Sanchez

Mr. Jimenez, Director, Classified Personnel, welcomed to the podium Ms. Lillian Soto, Principal, and Alma Sanchez, Attendance Technician at Spurgeon Intermediate School. Ms. Sanchez is recognized as a caring employee who is kind, patient, and gracious to staff, parents, and students.

AR 5111.1(a)

### Students

### District Residency

Prior to admission, students living within the district must provide proof of residency. (cf. 5111 - Admission) Proof of district residency shall be established by one of the following:

- (1) The parent/guardian provides a valid California driver's license or government-issued photo identification showing a current address in the relevant attendance area; or
- (2) The parent/guardian provides one of the following documents, dated within the past two months (unless otherwise indicated), showing a current address in the relevant attendance area:
  - (a) Utility Service Contract, Statement, or Payment Receipt (e.g., water, gas, electric, or waste management);
  - (b) Telephone Bill (land kine or cellular bill);
  - (c) Mortgage/Rental Contract, Lease, or Payment Receipt;
  - (d) Property Tax Bill or Payment Receipt past year;
  - (e) Pay Stub;
  - (f) Voter Registration;
  - (g) Correspondence from a Government Agency;
  - (h) Car Registration (dated within the past year);
  - (i) Car Insurance Statement (dated within the past year);
  - (j) Bank Statement;
  - (k) Federal or State Income Tax Forms (dated within the past year); or
  - (1) Declaration from Primary Resident/Owner indicating that student is living with Primary Resident/Owner.

If none of the above documents are submitted, the parent/guardian is required to execute an Affidavit of Residency. However, pursuant to the McKinney-Vento Act, homeless students must be enrolled even if they are unable to produce records normally required for enrollment, such as residency documentation.

A student may establish residency by documenting that he/she has a parent/guardian that lives within the district, is an emancipated minor living in the district, is in the court-appointed care of a licensed foster home, family home, or children's institution within the district, or lives in the home of a care-giving adult within the district. Upon enrollment of a student residing in the home of a care-giving adult within district boundaries, the care-giving adult shall execute, under penalty of perjury, the affidavit specified in Family Code 6552. (E.C. 48204) (cf. 5111.11 - Residency of Students with care-giver) (cf. 5111.12 - Residency Based on Parent/Guardian Employment) (cf. 5111.13 - Residency for Homeless Children)

AR 5111.1(b)

The Superintendent or designee shall annually notify parents/guardians of all existing attendance options available in the district, including but not limited to all options for meeting residency requirements for school attendance. When a student or parent/guardian participating in the Safe at Home program requests that the district use the substitute address designated by the Secretary of State, the Superintendent or designee may request the actual residence address for the purpose of establishing residency within district boundaries. The Superintendent or designee shall not include the actual address in the student's file or any other public record and shall instead use the substitute address for all future communications and correspondence. (Govt. Code 6206, 6207)

The district shall retain a copy of the document or written verification offered as proof of residency. In addition, the district may annually verify the student's residency and retain a copy of the document or written statement offered as verification. (Code of Regulations, Title 5, Section 432) (cf. 5125 - Student Records)

If a district employee reasonably believes that a parent/guardian has provided false or unreliable evidence of residency, the Superintendent or designee shall make reasonable efforts to determine whether the student resides in the district.

A student not residing within the district shall be deemed a district resident if admitted through the district's interdistrict attendance program or if the student resides in a state hospital in the district or is confined to a district area hospital or residential care facility in the district for treatment of a temporary disability. (E.C. 48206.3-48208) (cf. 5117 - Interdistrict Attendance) (cf. 6183 - Home and Hospital Instruction)

District residency is not required for enrollment in a regional occupational center or program if there are openings in the program or class. (E.C. 52317)

### Revocation of Enrollment

If the Superintendent or designee, upon investigation, has determined that a student's enrollment is based on false evidence of residency, he/she shall revoke the student's enrollment. Before any such revocation, the parent/guardian shall be sent written notice of the facts leading to the decision. This notice shall state the parent/guardian's right, within 10 school days, to schedule a meeting with a hearing officer to inspect supporting documents, rebut district evidence, question any district witnesses, and present oral and/or documentary evidence, including witnesses, on the student's behalf. For good cause, the hearing officer may extend the meeting date for an additional 10 days to permit the parent/guardian to obtain required documentation.

If the parent/guardian fails to schedule  $\frac{1}{10}$  the above meeting, the student's enrollment shall be revoked 11 school days after the date of the notice.

If the above meeting is held, the hearing officer shall prepare a written decision describing his/her findings. If this decision upholds the revocation, the parent/guardian shall be informed of his/her right to appeal to the Governing Board within 10 days. The hearing officer's decision shall be final unless appealed.

AR 5111.1(c)

A parent/guardian who appeals to the Board shall have the right to have a representative present and to rebut district evidence, question any district witnesses, and present oral and/or documentary evidence, including witnesses, on the student's behalf. Except in cases where good cause is shown, the Board will not reopen the record to consider evidence or argument which was not presented to the hearing officer. The student may continue to attend school during the period of the appeal. The Board's decision shall be final.

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF 2011-12 TAX AND REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES FOR THE DISTRICT AND REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF ORANGE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF THE NOTES

WHEREAS, the Board of Education ("the District Board") desires to authorize the issuance of its 2011-12 Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes (the "Notes") by requesting the Board of Supervisors (the "County Board") of the County of Orange (the "County") to issue the Notes on behalf of the Santa Ana Unified School District ( the "District"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 53850 et seq. of the Government Code of the State of California (the "Act") contained in Article 7.6 thereof, entitled "Temporary Borrowing" that provides for temporary borrowing by certain local agencies on or after the first day of any fiscal year (being July 1), the District may borrow money by issuing notes for any purpose for which the District is authorized to use and expend moneys, including but not limited to current expenses, capital expenditures, investment and reinvestment and the discharge of any obligation or indebtedness of the District; and

WHEREAS, Section 53853 of the Act provides that, since the District has not been accorded independent fiscal accountability status under Section 42647 or Section 42650 of the California Education Code, the Notes must be issued in the name of the District by the board of supervisors of the county, the county superintendent of schools of which has jurisdiction over the District, as soon as possible following the receipt of a resolution of the governing board of the District requesting the borrowing; and

WHEREAS, the County Superintendent of the County of Orange has jurisdiction over the District, and the District Board, hereby requests a borrowing of not to exceed Sixty-Five Million Dollars (\$65,000,000) at an interest rate not to exceed six percent (6.0%) per annum, through the issuance by the County Board of the Notes in the name of the District to be sold by negotiated sale; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Act, such Notes shall be payable noglater than fifteen months after their date of delivery, and shall be payable only from revenue received or accrued during the fiscal year 2011-12; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 53856 of the Act, the District may pledge any taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts or other moneys, including moneys deposited in inactive or term deposits (but excepting certain moneys encumbered for a special purpose); and this Resolution specifies that certain unrestricted revenues which will be received or accrued by the District for the General Fund of the District during fiscal year 2011-12 are pledged for the payment of the Notes; and

WHEREAS, the Notes shall be a general obligation of the District, and to the extent not paid from the taxes, income, revenue, cash receipts and other moneys of the District pledged for the payment thereof shall be paid with interest thereon from any other moneys of the District lawfully available therefor, as required by Section 53857 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Notes shall be in denominations of \$5,000, or integral multiples thereof, as permitted by Section 53854 of the Act; shall be issued on a date to be designated and shall be substantially in the form and executed in the manner prescribed in this Resolution, all as permitted and required by Section 53853 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the District Board finds and determines that, as required by Section 53858 of the Act, the \$65,000,000 maximum principal amount of Notes authorized to be issued in the name of the District by the County Board in fiscal year 2011-12, when added to the interest payable thereon, does not exceed eighty-five percent (85%) of the estimated amount of the uncollected taxes, income, revenue (including but not limited to revenue from state and federal governments), cash receipts and other moneys of the District which will be available for the payment of the Notes and interest thereon; and

WHEREAS, the Notes will not be issued in an amount greater than the sum of the maximum anticipated cumulative cash flow deficit to be financed by the anticipated tax or other revenue sources for the period for which such taxes or other revenues are anticipated and during which such Notes are outstanding plus a permitted working capital reserve, all as provided in Section 1.103-14(c) of the Income Tax Regulations of the United States Treasury, or in such other amount as is permitted by the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, as determined by Stradling Yocca Carlson &

Treasurer-Tax Collector shall not be responsible or liable for sufficiency of the Repayment Fund.
- (E) Disbursement and Investment of Moneys in Repayment Fund. From the date this Resolution takes effect, all Pledged Revenues and Other Moneys required to be transferred to the Repayment Fund in accordance with Section 4(B) and 4(C) above shall, when received, be accounted for in the Repayment Fund and shall remain in the Repayment Fund until the principal of and interest on the Notes is paid in full. On the maturity date of the Notes, the moneys in the Repayment Fund shall be used, to the extent necessary, to pay the principal of and interest on the Notes and any moneys in excess of such amount remaining in or accruing to the Repayment Fund shall be transferred to the General Fund of the District.

### RECITALS

Whereas, OCSD collects, treats, and disposes of wastewater generated within its boundaries. The School District owns and operates properties within OCSD's boundaries, and discharges wastewater from these properties to the OCSD collection, treatment, and disposal system.

Whereas, OCSD levies a fee on property owners known as the "Capital Facilities Capacity Charge" ("CFCC"). OCSD uses CFCC revenues to pay for the capital construction of new facilities to accommodate projected growth. Property owners must pay the CFCC when they (1) newly connect to OCSD's system, or (2) expand the use of property that is already connected to OCSD's system. The requirements for payment of CFCCs are currently set forth in Ordinance No. OCSD-40.

Whereas, OCSD calculates the amount of CFCCs for non-residential properties based on, inter alia, the estimated relative demand for water associated with different property uses. 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### AGREEMENT REGARDING THE IMPOSITION AND PAYMENT OF CAPITAL FACILITIES CAPACITY CHARGES

This Agreement Regarding the Imposition and Payment of Capital Facilities Capacity
Charges ("Agreement") is entered into between the Orange County Sanitation District ("OCSD")
