MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING
SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

February 28, 2012

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:04 p.m. by President Richardson. Other members in attendance were Dr. Yamagata-Noji, Mr. Palacio, and Mr. Reyna.

Cabinet members present were Dr. Meléndez de Santa Ana, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Ms. Lohnes, Mr. Dixon, Ms. Miller, and Mr. Hammitt.

CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Richardson asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board on matters of Closed Session.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting was immediately recessed to consider student discipline issues, legal issues, negotiations, and personnel matters. Mr. Hernández arrived during Closed Session.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:40 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Board Vice President Hernández.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Meléndez welcomed all present at the meeting.

Dr. Meléndez themed tonight's meeting "*On the Move*," because there is no denying that the Santa Ana Unified School District is a district on the move, constantly searching for new and better ways to serve teachers, students and schools. As a result, throughout the county and state the District is looked as an innovative education leader.

- Dr. Meléndez announced that Target and the Ellen DeGeneres Show selected Taft Elementary School to receive a \$100,000 grant that will be used to fund a unique lab that integrates physical fitness with literacy. Taft is the only school in Orange County and one of only 50 nationwide to receive this honor. Taft Principal, Mr. Steve Longacre has come up with a very appropriate motto for the lab: "Fit to Read!" To recognize this wonderful grant, an assembly will be held at the school on Thursday, March 1st, at 8:30 a.m.
- Dr. Meléndez mentioned Friday, March 2nd, is "Read Across America Day." The National Education Association established the annual day in 1998 on March 2, which happens to be the birthday of Mr. Theodor Geisel, better known as Dr. Seuss. She was happy to report that more than 15 schools are holding activities to celebrate the wonders and importance of reading. Dr. Seuss put it best when he wrote: "The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you'll go." The District wants students to go far in life, and that is why the District places such a strong emphasis on early literacy. She encouraged everyone to celebrate "Read Across America Day" by picking up a book and experiencing the joy of reading to a child.
- Dr. Meléndez was pleased to welcome Principal, Mr. Adrian Ayala, Language Arts Teacher, Mr. Jason Crabbe three students from Lathrop Intermediate School. Mr. Crabbe's students recently had a very fascinating, and eye-opening visit from Ms. Ruth Treeson. Ms. Treeson is a native of Warsaw, Poland, and a Jewish Holocaust survivor of the Nazi war camps. She offered the students an overview of her life and answered their many questions, and her visit was covered by the Orange County Register. Students in attendance and who shared their experience were: Fatima Avalos, Alexis Zaragoza, and Celeste Tlaseca.
- Dr. Meléndez introduced Ms. Renee Rowan, Principal, Mr. Jesse Church, Assistant Principal, and several students from Villa Fundamental Intermediate School. It may be only his first year at the school, but Assistant Principal Church is already making a big impact, through the creation of "The Red Tie Club". The club helps male students develop leadership skills and good moral character.
- Dr. Meléndez mentioned that the District is vibrant and forward-thinking, and those two adjectives do go hand-in-hand. Heading into the coming months the District faces a variety of challenges, and the forward-thinking planning that has already taken place will keep the District vibrant. Working collaboratively with the associations, striving to ensure that the District is, and will remain, fiscally solvent, and that the focus remains to support students, teachers and schools, even as we work within stringent budget restrictions.
- Dr. Meléndez stated that the best example that SAUSD is "On The Move" occurred last week at Mr. Bill Habermehl's annual Orange County State of Education address. Mr. Habermehl specifically cited SAUSD for closing the achievement gap in mathematics at the elementary school level.
- Dr. Meléndez congratulated Dr. Audrey Yamagata-Noji for accepting to serve as a Board Member on the California School Boards Association (CSBA), a collaborative group of virtually all of the state's more than 1,000 school districts and county offices of education. Dr. Noji has been named Director-At-Large, Asian Pacific Islander, and CSBA will be well-served by her experience and knowledge.
- In closing, Dr. Meléndez and staff were appalled by the news today about the alleged behavior of a former District teacher. The safety of the students is the District's number one priority. Two years ago, District

staff began visiting schools to remind them of the early warning signs of potential student abuse. In this instance, the District acted swiftly upon learning about these allegations, placed the teacher on administrative leave, and reported the allegations to the appropriate authorities. The District continues to cooperate fully with the Santa Ana Police Department and strongly encourages anyone with information that might assist in their investigation to come forward. Staff has been instructed to review District procedures to ensure that students are provided with a safe learning environment.

PRESENTATIONS

Senate Bill 1381 (Kindergarten Readiness Act of 2010) Update

Mr. Herman Mendez, Assistant Superintendent, Elementary Education, provided updated information regarding the guiding principles, implementation timeline, and key components of the District's SB 1381 Transitional Kindergarten Program implementation.

Budget Update - Governor's Proposed Budget

Mr. Michael Bishop, Deputy Superintendent, Operations, provided awareness of the possibility of additional State budget cuts, the ramifications that reduced funding has on programs/positions, the lack of availability of one-time and on-going funds, and to provide follow-up information on items requested by the Board.

Board President Richardson asked Mr. Bishop to introduce the item.

Board President Richardson asked for the three individual speakers wishing to address this item to step to the podium and stated that when Ms. Carmona gets started, he would declare the Public Hearing open. Parents Maria Elena Carmona, Laura Benavides and Cecilia Damian each spoke of their support and interest in the 21st Century Global Academy. They asked the Board for their support and approve the charter petition. Virginia Carrillo introduced herself as one of the petitioners for the charter school. She explained the unique educational opportunities the school will have to offer. Ms. Carrillo introduced Kelli Wagstaff and Goldeen Burton as co-petitioners. Both Ms. Wagstaff and Ms. Burton gave their in-depth curriculum vitae's.

Request from the County Treasury a Bridge Transfer as a Means to Ease Cash Flow Shortages Pertaining to Negative Educational Revenue Augmentation Fund

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 12-010, the Orange County Board of Supervisors has authorized the County Treasurer to make Bridge Transfers (as defined in Resolution No. 12-010); and

WHEREAS, Santa Ana Unified School District (the "District") desires to request the County Treasurer to make a Bridge Transfer of monies to meet current maintenance expenses for fiscal year 2011-12; and

WHEREAS, California Constitution Article XVI, Section 6, provides that the County Treasurer shall have the power and the duty to make temporary transfers of monies, as further specified therein, upon resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors authorizing such temporary transfer; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Constitution Article XVI, Section 6 and Education Code section 42620, the total amount that may be temporarily transferred to the District may not exceed 85% of the anticipated revenues which will accrue to the District during the fiscal year ("FY"); and

WHEREAS, any Bridge Transfer to the District will be made from and limited to the Orange County Investment Pool.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 12-011, the County, subject to the terms, conditions, restrictions and limitations expressed therein, will reimburse the District for interest paid on the Bridge Transfer.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby:

1. Find and determine that the Bridge Transfers are in the public interest and serve a valid public purpose.

1 2. The District Board of Trustees hereby requests a Bridge Transfer of monies
2 from the Orange County Investment Pool to the District to cover the District's
3 current maintenance expenses for FY 2011-12. The aggregate amount of any Bridge
4 Transfer and Transfer (as authorized by Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 11-195)
5 cannot exceed 85% of the anticipated revenues which will accrue to the District
6 during the fiscal year. This amount shall be certified by the District and the
7 actual amount of any Bridge Transfer(s) will be approved, if at all, in the
8 discretion of the County Treasurer, exercising her trust and fiduciary duties with
9 respect to protecting all of the Orange County Investment Pool participants from
10 any principal loss and ensuring adequate liquidity to meet operating cash needs,
11 that such monies are available for such Transfers. The District's Deputy
12 Superintendent, Operations is hereby authorized and directed for and on behalf of
13 the District to formally request a Bridge Transfer in an amount and upon a date
14 designated by the District's Deputy Superintendent, Operations, not to exceed the
15 limitations to such Bridge Transfer, as provided herein.

16 3. The District hereby requests that the Bridge Transfer be made by
17 the Treasurer in one or more installments not prior to the earlier of January 31,
18 2012 or the date the County Auditor Controller allocates County VLFAA (as defined
19 in County Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 12-010), or later than April 30,
20 2012.

21 4. It is hereby requested that the Treasurer deposit Bridge Transfer
22 installments to the District in the General Fund. All Bridge Transfers
23 installments to the District will be made from and limited to the Orange County
24 Investment Pool.

25 5. Compound interest on any Bridge Transfer installment will accrue and be
26 payable by the District at a rate equal to the gross rate the Orange County
27 Investment Pool is earning for the same period from the date of the Bridge Transfer
28 plus five (5) basis points until the entire Transfer and applicable interest is
29 repaid.

30 6. Repayment of the Bridge Transfer(s), plus interest, shall be repaid to
31 the Orange County Investment Pool. Bridge Transfers made in January 2012, if any,
32 shall be repaid based on the amount of funds Districts receive from the State,
33 irrespective of whether such funds are attributable to SB89 VLFAA Increment. It is
34 estimated that Districts will receive State funding in the following percentages:
35 February 2012 1.2%, April 2012 10.2%, May 2012 3.2%, July 2012 50.2% and August
36 2012 35.2%. All other Bridge Transfers will be repaid in the following estimated
37 percentages: May 2012 14.6%, July 2012 50.2% and August 2012 35.2%. The actual

1 date of each repayment will be one (1) week following the date of actual State
2 reimbursement. Repayment dates will be certified by the Department of Education.
3 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary herein, Bridge Transfers shall be
4 repaid no later than October 31, 2012, irrespective of the amount and timing of
5 State reimbursements.

6 7. The District understands and agrees that repayment of any and all Bridge
7 Transfers are obligations imposed by law and the obligation of the District to make
8 payments with respect to such Bridge Transfer(s) is absolute and unconditional,
9 payable from lawfully available funds of the District. The repayment of such
10 Bridge Transfer is secured by the first revenues accruing to the District before
11 any other obligation of the District is met from such revenue. In furtherance of
12 the District's repayment obligations, District hereby grants the County a lien on
13 and pledge of all revenues accruing to the District that may be lawfully applied to
14 the repayment of the Bridge Transfers for the purpose of repayment of the Bridge
15 Transfer(s). Notwithstanding, the security, pledges and liens securing the
16 repayment of Bridge Transfers shall be subordinate to any security, pledges, liens
17 and set-asides made to the holders of TRANS (or other cash-flow securities
18 borrowing) issued by the District in FY 2011-12 or FY 2012-13.

19 8. The District Board of Trustees hereby determines that it can meet its
20 financial obligations as set forth in the Bridge Transfer Agreement presented to
21 this Board. The Bridge Transfer Agreement is hereby approved and the District's
22 Deputy Superintendent, Operations is hereby authorized and directed to execute the
23 Bridge Transfer Agreement on behalf of the District.

24 9. The District understands and agrees that: a) no Bridge Transfer shall
25 be made if the County Auditor-Controller fails to allocate, is prohibited from
26 allocating, or is required to escrow, SB89 VLFAA Increment, whether on or before
27 January 31 or on or before May 31, 2012, and b) all Bridge Transfers made prior to
28 such failure to allocate or prohibition from allocating SB89 VLFAA Increment, shall
29 be repaid by the District in accordance with the requirements of Section 6 of this
30 Resolution, as such may be amended by the Bridge Transfer Agreement.

31 10. The Clerk/Secretary of the Board of Trustees is hereby directed to
32 submit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Orange County Treasurer-Tax
33 Collector.
