

The General Fund Budget Expenditures of \$555,967,398 reflect the non-COVID-19 related operating and programs expenditures, while the budgeted expenditures in the Learning Continuity Plan specifically reflect the COVID-19 related expenditures.

Additional Support/Services to High Need Students: Academic screening assessments in English language arts, English language development, and mathematics at the beginning of the school year will be used to determine the level of learning loss experienced by students and identify which students require supplemental support to address learning gaps. Students in need of tiered support and/or special education and related services, require more focused attention to ensure that they stay in school and succeed academically. One-on-one and targeted intervention such as tutoring, office hours, and small group instruction are available for students in need including English learners, students experiencing poverty and/or homelessness, foster youth, and students receiving special education and related services who have experienced significant learning loss.

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).




s chart shows the total general purpose revenue Santa Ana Unified School District expects t in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Santa Ana Unified School District is \$729,614,152.78, of which \$501,831,268.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$88,191,058.59 is other state funds, \$10,595,478.00 is local funds, and \$128,996,348.19 is federal funds. Of the \$128,996,348.19 in federal funds, \$68,885,666.71 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$501,831,268.00 in LCFF Funds, \$124,180,146.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to desribe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Santa Ana Unified School District plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

Santa Ana Unified School District plans to spend \$749,803,151.43 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$193,835,753.02 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$555,967,398.41 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:


In 2020-2021, Santa Ana Unified School District is projecting it will receive \$124,180,146.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students.
