Plagiarism will result in negative points for the assignment and after school detention.

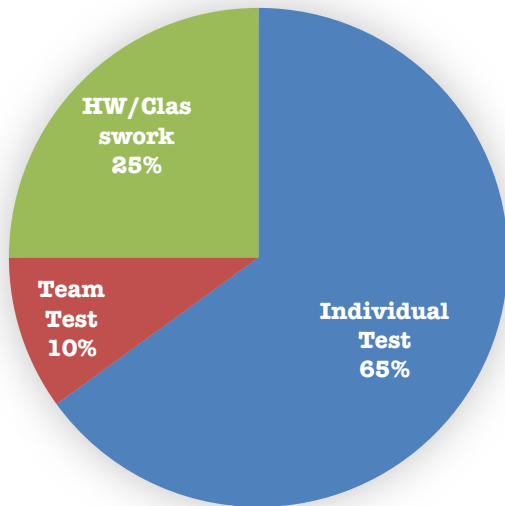
Am I Really Done?
