

Simon Scholars Program

Saddleback High School is one of two qualified schools in Santa Ana Unified District. Each year eight sophomore students are chosen to receive a scholarship to assist them in getting their college diploma. This is a unique six-year program that starts in a student's junior year in high school and continues until they graduate from college. During high school, students receive a cash stipend, a laptop computer, social skills training, academic support, leadership training and community service activities. Scholars are also provided with college-preparatory assistance through ACT and SAT courses, college tours and assistance in the application process from college coaches. Following the completion of high school, Simon Scholars receive a \$16,000 college scholarship.
