Fines

All students must have their student account balances paid off in order to participate in all events. Events include all Senior Activities. Fines include material fees, athletic fees, textbook and library fines. All Fines are to be paid in full by February 1, 2019. Fines are listed outside of the ASB windows.

Students must also have cleared all Central Detentions and Saturday Schools. Please note that Saturday and detention lists will be monitored daily. Students who receive Saturdays or detentions after they have purchased tickets to senior activities must serve the detentions and Saturdays prior to the event date or their name will be removed from the list.

Academics

In order to participate in graduation exercises, you must meet the Santa Ana Unified School District graduation requirements.

Attendance/Tardies

It is important that all seniors continue to attend all classes. All unexcused absences can lead to Saturday School and the loss of some or all senior activities. Students with excessive absences may not be allowed to purchase senior activities. All Saturdays must be cleared if you are going to attend any Senior Activities. Remember that all activity sales are final (no refunds).

California Scholarship Federation (CSF)

Students who earn four or more semesters of membership in CSF (with at least one semester during their senior year) qualify for Life Membership in CSF and are eligible to wear the CSF stole and pin during the graduation ceremony. Students will also have the CSF Seal embossed on their diploma. Students will receive their stole at the Senior Awards Night on May 23rd, 2019.

California Seal of Biliiteracy

This program recognizes high school graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing one or more languages in addition to English. Students who meet the following criteria will be able to receive a special Seal on their diploma:

- ★ Proficient or Advanced on the ELA CST
- ★ 2.0 or better in overall ELA GPA
- ★ Proficiency in any foreign Language, proven by either passing score on an AP Exam, 4-year study in same language, or passage of District Approved Foreign Language Exam
