Attendance Things to Remember...

Many of you know that you are an adult when you turn 18. This is true, that you are considered an adult by legal age; however, because you are still in school, you are not free to leave campus, work during the school day or excuse your own absences. Congratulations- Class of 2020!

To insure that all school events are positive experiences for our students, it is important to review the conditions of this contract. Remember that by reviewing this contract,

you agree to the following: I understand that all <u>Segerstom</u> activities, SENIOR activities and the Jaguar Graduation Ceremony are a privilege, NOT a right.

- FINANCIAL DEBTS: I agree to pay all debts or return all Segerstrom property prior to the purchase of any
 dance including Sadie Hawkins. Please remember that Senior Packages are not refunded for any reason. I
 understand all debts must be cleared in full in order to participate in any senior event.
- 2. DISCIPLINE OBLIGATIONS: I agree to clear all discipline obligations prior to purchasing tickets for any dance or activity until the end of the school year.
- 3. GUESTS FOR DANCES: I understand that my guest at any event (if permissible) must follow school rules and the guest permit contract. I must fill out and agree to the contract outlined on the guest permit available at the ASB window. The age limit for my guest is 20 years old and they must provide a valid school or California ID.
- 4. ELIGIBILITY FOR SENIOR EVENTS: I understand that the purchase of a dance or activity ticket DOES NOT guarantee entrance to the dance. I understand that my discipline, attendance and financial obligations will be reviewed prior to ticket sales and throughout the time tickets are sold up to the event.

Your signature indicates that you have read, understand and will adhere to the following guidelines for Segerstrom High School Dances:

- ALL DANCE TICKET SALES ARE FINAL (NO REFUNDS/TRADING)
- Each student who wishes to attend any dance at Segerstrom must completely fill out the Segerstrom Dance Contract prior to purchasing any tickets.
 - · Contract must be signed by parent or guardian even if you are 18 years of age.
- Forgery of signatures will result in your privilege to not attend and may invoke other school disciplinary consequences.
- All prices will be announced prior to ticket sales. Prices and timelines for purchasing tickets will be posted on the ASB window.
- All students will be under a review process for any school disciplinary or school attendance issues and must maintain satisfactory, attendance and behavior in order to attend a Segerstrom High School Dance.

Guests of Segerstrom Students

- · Guests will pay the NON-ASB cost depending on ticket timeline costs.
- · Segerstrom Guest Permit must be completed prior to purchasing guest ticket.
- · All required signatures must be submitted as outlined on the guest permit.
- A copy of your guest's school or California ID must be submitted with the guest permit. No exceptions!
- · Guests cannot be over 20 years of age.
- Middle School students, regardless of age are not permitted to attend a Segerstrom High School dance.
- Guest must check in to the dance with Segerstrom student whom purchased the ticket.
- Segerstrom students are responsible for informing guest of all school behavior rules and dress code policies.

Ticket Policy

- · Tickets may not be given, sold or exchanged by students.
- Each student is allowed to purchase a maximum of two tickets; one for the student and one companion ticket or one for an off campus guest.
