In elementary grades, average class size is straightforward to calculate due to self-contained classrooms. However, at the secondary level, students take multiple subjects, making it challenging to calculate a single average across diverse courses. We chose to use English classes for estimating average class size because:

- 1. **Consistency**: English is a required subject for all students, ensuring broad representation.
- 2. **Uniformity**: English classes tend to have similar enrollment numbers across grades.
- 3. **Representativeness**: As a core subject, English provides a reasonable reflection of overall class sizes.

This approach allows for a standardized and comparable estimate across secondary levels.

Figure 2 displays average secondary English class sizes from the 2022-23 school year to the 2024-25 school year for intermediate-level courses, high school-level courses, and courses

taught in opportunity/continuation schools (REACH Academy, Lorin Griset Academy, and Cesar Chavez High School). For intermediate-level courses, the average class size ranged from 24.39 to 25.91 students per class across school years. For high school courses, the average class size ranged from 25.65 to 27.83 students per class. For opportunity/continuation courses, the average class size ranged from 12.15 to 18.94 students per class.



Tables 3-5 show average English class sizes by course type. Table 6 shows average English class sizes by school.
