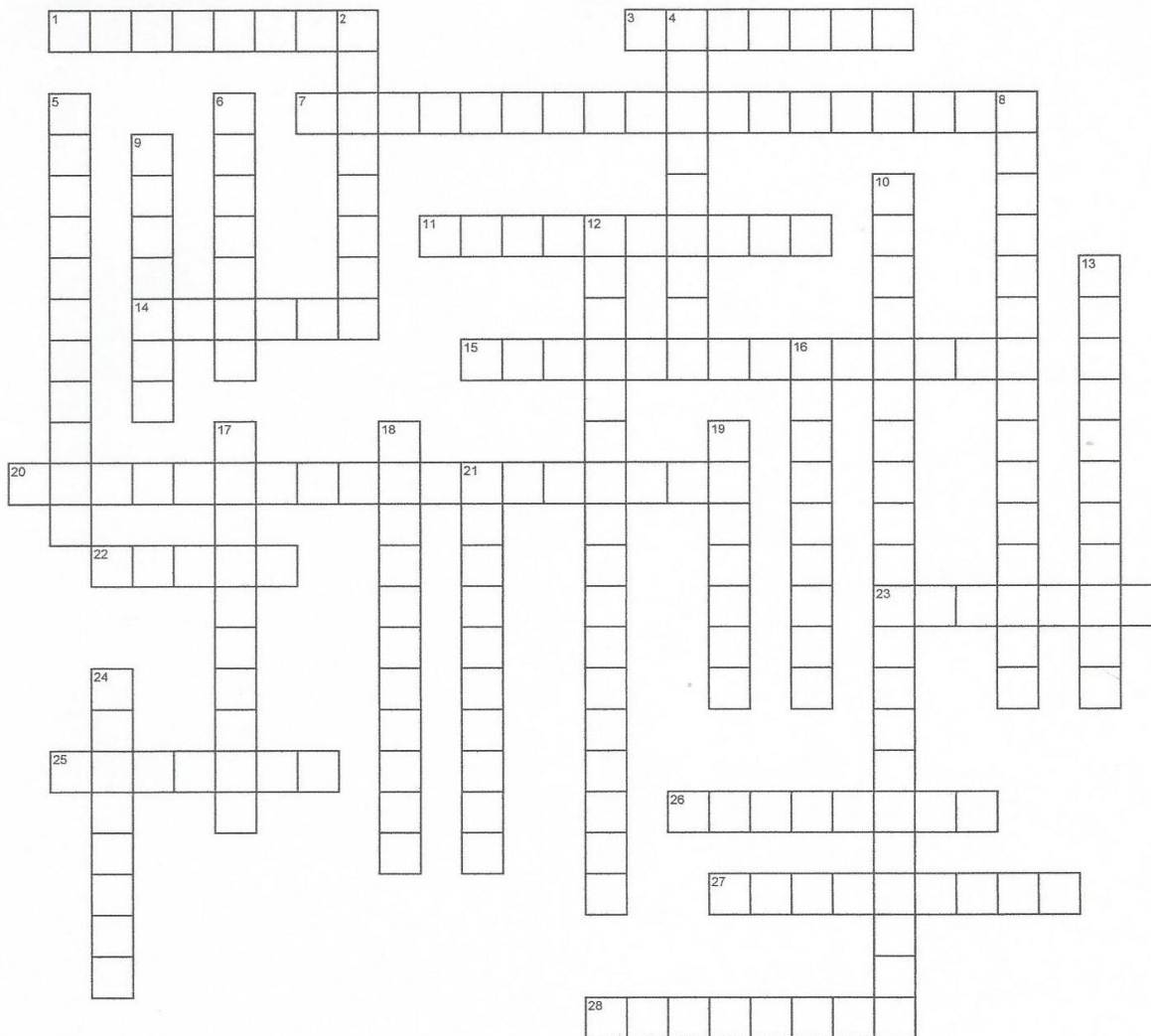


Weak & Dizzy

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ACROSS

- 1 removed from the body; sweat, pee, or poo
 3 means best or greatest value
 7 a specialist treating only disorders of the intestinal tract
 11 small bodies located along the lymphatic system of the neck, armpits, and groin that filter bacteria and foreign particles from lymph fluid
 14 deficiency of hemoglobin or red blood cells resulting in fatigue and pallor
 15 yellowing of the whites of the eyes; occurs with jaundice of the liver
 20 means white lines across the nail; Mees' lines sign of arsenic poisoning
 22 large glandular organ in right upper quadrant having many metabolic functions
 23 a poisonous element used in rat poison; causes Mees' lines in humans
 25 organs responsible for filtering liquid waste from blood
 26 female hormone; promotes female characteristics
 27 related to the lungs or breathing
 28 preventive inoculations used to confer immunity to specific diseases

DOWN

- 2 condition of liquid poop that can cause dehydration
 4 bacterial or viral infection of the lungs

- 5 changing food or medicine into a form useable or excreted by the body; performed by kidneys and liver
 6 organ storing urine until you feel the urge to pee
 8 periodic vaccination to prevent tetanus; after three doses immunity is usually achieved
 9 the organ of the intestinal tract where food is stored and prepared for digestion
 10 a list of all possible causes of an illness
 12 condition where the skin darkens, from small areas to entire body
 13 excess water loss caused by excess sweating, vomiting, or diarrhea
 16 a method of bonding metallic ions, such as arsenic, for removal from the body
 17 the area between the stomach and anus where food is digested and nutrients absorbed
 18 not paying attention
 19 to examine the patient by touch; example is palpating the liver
 21 a physician treating only certain conditions or body systems
 24 re-emergence of the virus years after chicken pox
