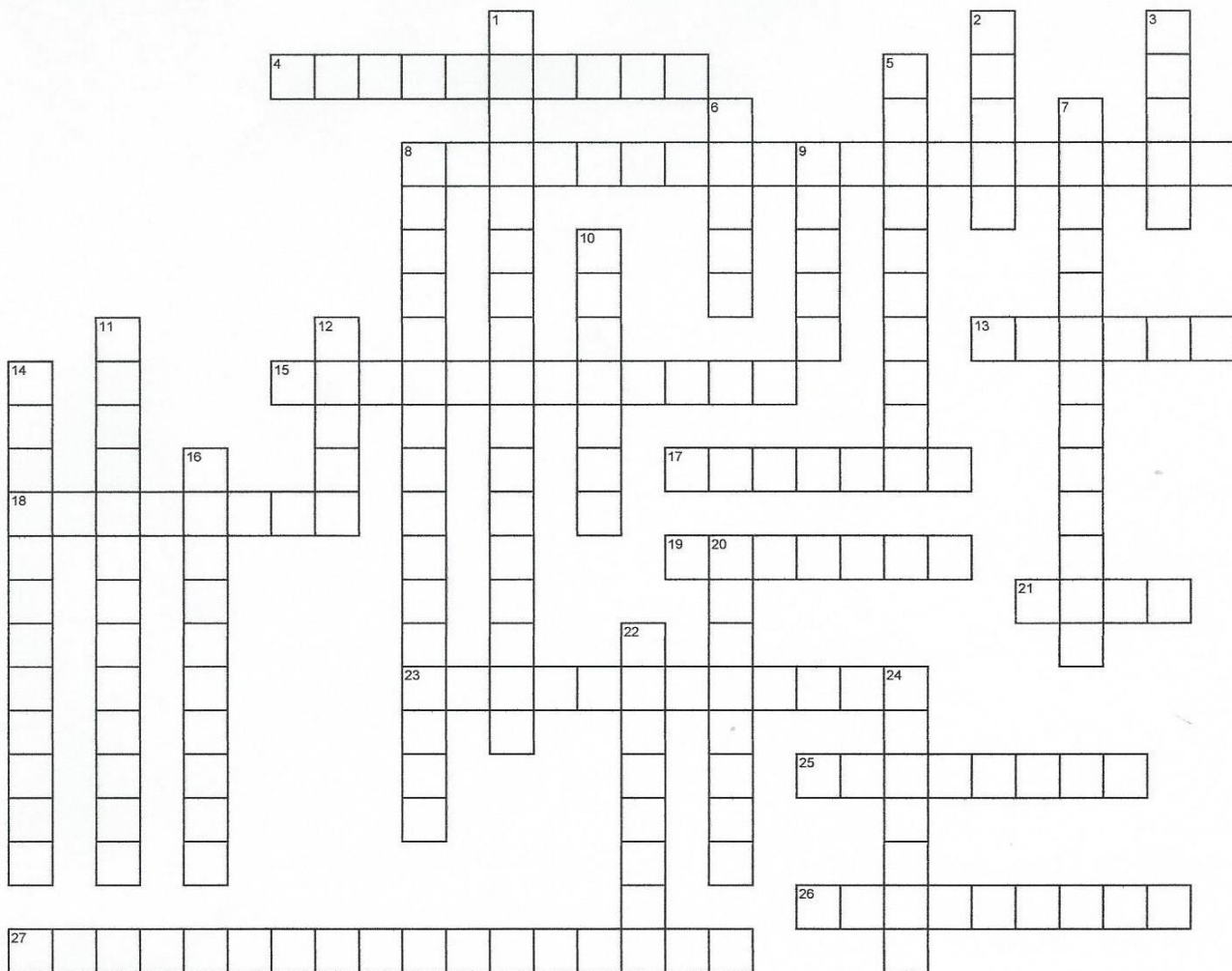


Crossword:

- 4 members of the medical support team trained in managing victims of trauma

 17 the father of Neurosurgery
 18 a guide for successfully performing a task the same way each time
 19 the force that keeps our bodies from floating off into space
 21 the colored part of your eye
 23 the active exchange of oxygen and carbon dioxide between the atmosphere and our bodies
 25 weakness and ballooning within artery or vein; examples are brain and aorta
 26 the capacity to endure pain or hardship; the increased need for a higher dose of a medicine over time

 3 the control center of the human body; sits inside the skull
 5 a temporary traumatic brain injury caused by jarring force; common injury in violent sports, such as football
 6 the red liquid that circulates in arteries and veins, carrying oxygen to and carbon dioxide from the tissues
 7 the force of blood pushing against our arteries at contraction and relaxation of our heart
 8 weakness and ballooning of a blood vessel in the brain; can rupture spontaneously to produce an intracranial bleed
 9 the rate at which your heart beats
 10 according to Newton's First Law, the property that matter remains at rest or in motion unless acted upon by an external force
 11 energy possessed by virtue of being in motion
 12 blood vessels returning de-oxygenated blood to the lungs
 14 a surgical procedure where a hole is drilled through the skull to release blood following a brain injury
 16 an injury occurring from a blow, cut, or penetrating wound
 20 a sequence of actions regularly followed: the way you choose to accomplish a frequently performed task
 22 a crack or break in a bone
 24 the absence of bacteria and other germs
