MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

May 10, 2011

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:10 p.m. by President Hernández. Other members in attendance were Mr. Richardson, Dr. Yamagata-Noji, and Mr. Palacio. Mr. Reyna arrived at 5:20 p.m. to the meeting.

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Mendez, Ms. Miller, Mr. Dixon, and Ms. Lohnes.

CLOSED SESSION PRESENTATIONS

Board President Hernández asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

At 5:11 p.m., President Hernández recessed to Closed Session.

The Regular meeting recessed to Closed Session to consider student matters, negotiations, confidential issues, administrative appointments, and personnel matters.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:30 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by student Erika Fuentes from Saddleback High School.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

Ms. Russo introduced and congratulated SAUSD's nine Difference Makers scholars, who were each recipients of \$1,000 scholarships from the Santa Ana Chamber of Commerce for making a difference as leaders at their school and in the Santa Ana community. She then called each student by name to the podium; students briefly informed the Board which college or university they planned to attend and one way in which they make a difference. Recipients of the awards were:

Andrew Ayala, Lorin Griset Academy Samira Meza, Middle College High Erika Fuentes, Saddleback High Angelica Martinez, Santa Ana High Jessica Gandara, Valley High Ms. Russo congratulated students from the SAUSD trash-art Earth Day contest, sponsored by the District's Facilities Department. Students used their creativity to turn recyclable materials and re-used trash such as trash bags, newspaper, and wire hangers into art. A video displayed all students with their art. Ms. Russo thanked Barnhart-Heery for sponsoring the prizes and the students for their creativeness.

- Mrs. Dunn's 4th grade class at Lincoln Elementary won the 1st place prize of \$500 for "Butterflies."
- Godinez Fundamental High School's Art Club won the 2nd place prize of \$300 for "Trash-wear." The club is also a finalist in the countywide Muzeo TrashARTist Challenge.
- Ms. Dyer's 6th grade class at Lathrop Intermediate took 3rd place and \$200 for its entry "Biome Dolls," on a world map. The art will be displayed at the County of Orange Green Fair Art Walk on May 19, and displayed on the Facilities website.

The Superintendent and SAUSD legal counsel Mr. Hom announced a legal victory to the SAUSD. Mr. Hom provided the information. On May 2^{nd} , it was ruled that Kirk Montgomery Employee Benefits Services (KMEBS) wrongfully concealed commission payments and ordered the firm to pay back \$2.4 million it had received over three years. SAUSD is in the process of recovering funds and interest, which could add another million dollars to their fine.

There were three stages to this case: the bidding phase, the investigative phase, and the litigation phase. KMEBS maneuvered through this process to manipulate the payment of millions of dollars in hidden commissions by advocating that SAUSD move from self-insurance to Blue Cross coverage, and by doing so, KMEBS opened the door for its commissions.

The Board of Education expressed its pleasure in the ruling and stated that during these tough financial times, they will assure that every education dollar is spent wisely and appropriately. Board members stated that they expect and will demand that all consultants meet the District's high standards for integrity and transparency in the way they conduct business on SAUSD's behalf.

Above and Beyond the Call of Duty "ABCD" Award - Mr. David N. Ream

Superintendent Russo called upon Mr. Rob Richardson, who on behalf of the Santa Ana Unified School District and Board of Education, publicly recognized Mr. David Ream, Manager for the City of Santa Ana, for his dedication and ongoing support to the Santa Ana Unified School District and Santa Ana community.

Mr. Richardson highlighted the many ways in which Mr. Ream has spearheaded projects in the SAUSD since 1986. Mr. Ream's support to SAUSD students, families and community members has been exemplary. Other Board members commended Mr. Ream for his outstanding service and dedication to the SAUSD.

Mr. Richardson stated that Mr. Ream plans to retire this year to follow suit with his wife Diane, who is a retired teacher from Los Alamitos Unified School District. The Santa Ana Unified School District wanted to let him know how much we truly appreciate all the doors he has opened and all that he has done to ensure that the children of Santa Ana have a quality education in grade A facilities.

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SAUSD is fortunate to have a liaison and advocate like Mr. Dave Ream. Mr. Ream has headed major joint initiatives with SAUSD and played a pivotal role in supporting the SAUSD with virtually every new school project since the late 1980's. In 1987, the construction and maintenance of Carver, Esqueda, Garfield, Heninger, Kennedy, King, Pio Pico, Sepulveda, and Walker elementary schools involved complex site assembly, right of way, and other developmental issues. Coordination of these projects was critical for their completion, and Mr. Ream was at the forefront helping to clear any obstacles to those paths to get the jobs done correctly and on time.

Additionally, Mr. Ream helped to facilitate the allocation of funds from one of the South Main Redevelopment Project Areas to district to assist with debt service for purchase of our current property at Chestnut and Grand Avenues. This former commercial site today houses Villa Fundamental Intermediate School and the District Administration Offices. This action led to the eventual opening of Wally Davis Elementary School.

These aforementioned projects were critical to the expansion and success of our school district. Mr. Richardson noted that there is one in particular that deserves noting which is the highly visible joint-use facility with Godinez Fundamental High School adjacent to Centennial Park.

Mr. Ream's support and guidance of the joint-use of Centennial Park for the eventual development of Godinez Fundamental High School began a new commitment to our school district. The facility serves people of all ages in our community. It is safe to say that absent Mr. Ream's contribution, this project would not have been completed. This type of partnership has led to the next big joint-use undertaking. It's the Willard Intermediate Park Project for which the State Department of Parks and Recreation awarded \$4.4 million in Proposition 84 Grant funding. This project will create a recreation and athletic field for the Willard community and will coincide with the complete remodeling of Willard Intermediate and the elimination of all of the portables on site.

Mr. Ream also supported efforts to enable the Orange County High School of the Arts to become a charter school in SAUSD. Additionally, he has supported our collaboration with the City, Santa Ana College, and the Santa Ana Chamber of Commerce, having been a part of the Santa Ana 2000 Partnership with these four organizations. That partnership gave birth to a scholarship program with initial seed funding of \$500,000. Over the years, City employees have also voluntarily contributed to this fund through payroll deduction. Today, that program will help fund the Santa Ana Adelante! initiative just launched what promises to be an opportunity for a college degree in every home by 2020 for those students who pledge to matriculate to Santa Ana College and continue on to California State University of Fullerton.

Recently Mr. Ream was supportive in executing a memorandum of understanding leading to the appointment of Chief of School Police, David Valentin, who is on loan to School Police Department from the City. This move solidified our shared priority and commitment to community safety.

For all the reasons listed above, the Above and Beyond the Call of Duty Award was presented to Mr. David Ream on behalf of the Board of Education, SAUSD, staff, parents, and students. All Board members expressed gratitude to Mr. Ream for the many years of service to Santa Ana students and the community.

Mr. Ream thanked the SAUSD and Board of Education for the honor and said that he has enjoyed working with the SAUSD and the joint projects that they have completed together over the past several years.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

President Hernández asked those members of the community who wished to address the Board to step forward as he called their names.

Ron Shepherd, SAUSD teacher and SAEA Benefits Committee Member, stated that when it was time to select an insurance broker, the committee's recommendation was not KMBC. He then thanked Dr. Yamagata-Noji and Mr. Richardson for supporting the recall of Mr. Nativo Lopez. He thanked Mr. Richardson for initiating and obtaining passage of AB 2589 that requires full disclosure of Healthcare Insurance Commissions to public entity clients. Mr. Shepherd expressed congratulatory comments to Ms. Russo on her retirement. He thanked her and Mr. Lopez for working with teachers in the spirit of collaboration and looks forward to continuing that relationship in the future.

Victoria Zaragoza, SAUSD parent and Parent/Student Advocate, referred back to when KMBC was hired then thanked Dr. Yamagata-Noji and Mr. Richardson for their outstanding choices they have made for the SAUSD and their advocacy for students and parents of Santa Ana. She thanked Ms. Russo for bridging the relationship with parents and making them feel welcome and a part of the District. She then referred to Mr. Richardson and thanked him for his involvement with AB 2589. She also applauded National Police Week, honoring our Police force who also goes above-and-beyond the call of duty.

Jerry and Areceli Cazales, with Toyoma Karate-Do, were present at the meeting to extend an invitation to the Board of Education, Superintendent, and Santa Ana Community to attend their 20th Anniversary Banquet Dinner on Friday, June 3, 2011, to be held at the Anaheim Plaza Hotel. They said that Toyoma Karate-Do has been impacting the community by changing the lives of children for many years. Mr. Cazales stated that they would also be holding a ceremony on June 5, from 2-6 p.m., at the Santa Ana Boys and Girls Club and encouraged everyone to come out and support the event. In addition, they offer an after school program to SAUSD students. They expressed their appreciation to Ms. Russo for her dedication to the SAUSD and congratulated her on her retirement.

- She said besides her being present at the Santa Ana Adelante! Mr. Richardson and Mr. Reyna were present. The Santa Ana Adelante! press conference was phenomenal. She said that this day and age, to know that a student graduates from SAUSD, goes directly to SAC, and has guaranteed admission to a university is remarkable. She thanked Superintendent Russo, Dr. Martinez from SAC, and Mr. Gordon from CSUF for making this possible.

Mr. Richardson:

- He echoed Dr. Yamagata-Noji's comments. He stated that Santa Ana Adelante! was one of the most exciting events and called it a career capper for Ms. Russo!
