#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board authorization to reject all bids and rebid for Bid Packages 1101.2, 1301.2, and 2801.2, for Storm Pump Tank at Fremont, Hoover, and Wilson Elementary Schools. On November 1 and 8, 2010, legal advertisements were placed with the *Orange County Register* notifying contractors that we were accepting bids. Staff contacted 79 contractors of which 10 picked up the plans. On November 16, 2010, bid day, the District received five bids.

The architect, construction manager, and staff are all in agreement that all bids be rejected. The Board is requested to reject all bids and authorize staff to rebid Bid Packages No. 1101.2, 1301.2, and 2801.2, for Storm Pump Tank at Fremont, Hoover and Wilson Elementary Schools in the spring for a summer work schedule.
