REGULAR MEETING  
SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

October 12, 2010

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 5:45 p.m. by Board Vice President Richardson. Other members in attendance were Mr. Hernández, Mr. Palacio. Mr. Reyna and Dr. Yamagata-Noji arrived at 6:00 p.m.

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Dixon, Mr. Mendez, Mrs. Miller, and Ms. Lohnes.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board Vice President Richardson asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no speakers to address the Board regarding Closed Session items.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting recessed to Closed Session to consider student expulsions and discipline issues, negotiations, confidential issues, and personnel matters.

STUDENT EXPULSION HEARINGS

Expulsion hearing with the Board of Education occurred on behalf of student with parent and student advocate, for Student ID # 185149. The Board received additional information from the parent and advocate. The Board concluded to approve the conditions as recommended by staff.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Cynthia Guerra, 12<sup>th</sup> grade student at Godinez High School.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

Superintendent Russo indicated she had several items to share. Preschoolers at Wilson Elementary School were treated to a big furry, red surprise. Sesame Street's Elmo visited the students to tell the students about the "Math is Everywhere" program. A brief video was played.

Segerstrom High School Principal Dr. Amy Avina kept her promise of shaving off her hair in celebration of the School's achievement of an 812 score on the

State's Academic Performance Index. Other staff members showed their support by shaving their hair off too.

On October 9<sup>th</sup>, Santa Ana Unified held its 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Parent Conference at Valley High School. Over 500 parents, educators, and administrators participated in the day-long series of workshops, informative sessions, and community fair to learn or renew skills and acquire tips to help their children thrive in the educational process to prepare students for college and lead successful lives. Ms. Russo asked Parent, Family, and Community Coordinator Patricia Gomez to step up to the podium and recognize staff members who supported this conference. Ms. Gomez thanked her staff for all their hard work.

Two Sierra Intermediate 8<sup>th</sup> grade students, Guadalupe Merida and Kierra Mitchell, participated in the American Association of University Women - California Tech Trek Science Camp for Girls at UCI this past summer. Guadalupe and Kierra shared their summer experience.

Ms. Russo asked Cynthia Guerra, a senior at Godinez Fundamental High School who serves as the Associated Student Body President, to the podium. Cynthia and Jennifer Garcia, senior class vice president, provided a brief recap of events that took place during the first month of school as well as provided a brief DVD presentation of the various events that have taken place on campus.

Two teachers who traveled to Washington, D. C. were recognized. They went to lobby for the passage of the federal Jobs Bill bringing \$10.3 million in funding to SAUSD. Ms. Russo asked Susan Mercer, President of the Santa Ana Educators' Association, to the podium. She explained the work of Language Arts teachers Peter Boyd, from MacArthur Fundamental Intermediate, and Clarissa Barragan, from Mendez Fundamental Intermediate School. They shared their experiences in speaking with Congress.

Superintendent Russo recognized the principal and teachers at Esqueda Elementary School and Romero-Cruz Elementary School. They have made remarkable achievement in exiting the federal No Child Left Behind Program Improvement status. Esqueda's State Academic Performance Index score this year is 783, a 46-point increase over last year. Romero-Cruz Elementary School's score is 798, a 39-point gain. Last year, the school's math scores skyrocketed thanks to their use of the MIND Research Institute's program. Both schools met federal testing targets for two consecutive years.

Ms. Russo invited the community to attend the annual State of the District address, which will be held on Thursday, October 21, at McFadden Intermediate School. A report on the accomplishments and future challenges for the District will be shared. The event is scheduled to begin at 5:00 p.m. with a reception, and program commencing at 5:30 p.m.

On Saturday, October 30, Santa Ana Unified School District will host a program to mark the official switch over to the new solar program at Saddleback High School. The event will begin with a reception at 10:30 a.m., followed by a formal program at 11:00 a.m.

The Superintendent asked those present to draw their attention to the student artwork displayed in the Board room from Santa Ana High School. Students in Ms. Westing's class had pencil drawings and artwork featuring hand designs with short poems describing their thoughts and feelings about how hands can be used and their pride in being "Saints." Community Day School teacher Ms. Isensee's English Language arts class featured poetry as well as focusing on various themes. Madison Elementary School's 5<sup>th</sup> grade students from Mrs. Anderson's class used a Halloween Haiku theme and drew images with white color

pencil on black paper. Martin Elementary School Special Education program's art displayed included Pablo Picasso self-portraits and Georgia O'Keefe replicas. Students in the Think Together After-School program made Japanese cherry blossoms, and learned about various cultures as they made their fine crafts.

International Walk to School Day was observed Districtwide on October 6. Martin Students made posters with safety tips and drew detailed pictures of safe routes from their homes to their schools.

#### PRESENTATION

##### Charter School Update

Mr. Herman Mendez, Assistant Superintendent for Educational Services Elementary Division provided a charter school update, which included information on the status of the District's five charter schools: Edward B. Cole, El Sol Science and Arts Academy, NOVA Academy Early College High School, Orange County Educational Arts Academy (OCEAA) and Orange County High School of the Arts (OCHSA). Director for Elementary Student Achievement/Charter Schools Michelle Rodriguez, and Mr. Edward Winchester, Director for Secondary Student Achievement/Charter Schools gave an overview of each of the five charter schools in the areas of non-profit entity, initial start date, current charter term, status and terms of facilities, evaluation of 2008-10 student achievement data, and program features were given. The schools serve both Santa Ana resident students as well as students from surrounding communities

##### Santa Ana-Garden Grove Fixed-Guideway Project

Mr. Joe Dixon, Assistant Superintendent for Facilities and Governmental Relations, provided an overview of the Santa Ana-Garden Grove Fixed-Guideway Project. The cities of Santa Ana and Garden Grove, in cooperation with the Orange County Transportation Authority, are proposing to build a fixed guideway transportation system to provide high frequency transit service between the Santa Ana Regional Transportation Center and a new transportation center in the City of Garden Grove. Mr. David Biondolillo, project manager of public works for the city of Santa Ana, approached the podium and provided information on the project development process and the specifics. Mr. Biondolillo informed the board that an in-depth study had been completed, analyzing which technology would be most suitable for the community, as well as a detailed evaluation of accessibility, feasibility, affordability, and community acceptance was performed.

##### Budget Update

Mr. Michael Bishop, Associate Superintendent for Business, and Mr. Kelvin Tsunozumi Executive Director of Fiscal Services, provided a budget update, which included an overview of budget priorities and considerations for the 2010-11 school year based on the most current State budget adoption action, the ramifications of restoring programs/positions, and the availability of funds. Mr. Bishop also presented the salary and benefit settlements of the eight largest Orange County school districts. Mr. Bishop described the District's next budget steps, which include negotiations with SAEA and CSEA. He stated that in November, a presentation of the proposed 2011-12 budget reductions would begin. On December 14, the 2010 First Interim Report would come to the Board, 2011-12 Budget reductions, and a decision on Class Size Reduction for 2011-12 and determination for future years.

Mr. Tsunozumi presented information pertaining to State cash deferrals, which are still monitored very closely. He also reviewed the projected cash

shortfalls for 2010-11 and 2011-12 and the probable need to borrow funds to meet payroll as well as pay vendors.

Mr. Bishop formally announced to the Board that this is the second to the last Board meeting for Mr. Tsunozumi, as last night he was appointed as Assistant Superintendent of Business for Buena Park School District.

#### PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board President Yamagata-Noji asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to items on the Agenda to step to the podium.

Sharon Courson, teacher at Sierra Intermediate School, addressed the Board regarding changes in public education. She provided the Board with copies of an article from the Time Magazine regarding changes in education. She informed the Board that she resigned from a corporation in Texas to work in education.

#### DISCUSSIONS

##### Capital Financing Options

Mr. Michael Bishop, Associate Superintendent for Business, addressed the Board regarding Measure G and the options available in terms of issuing the remaining Measure G authorization. QSCBs are a federal program in which the U.S. Treasury will reimburse the District for a significant portion of its interest costs. This year the bonds will be taxable, as the Federal Government changed the program.

Mr. Joe Dixon, Assistant Superintendent for Facilities, and Governmental Relations addressed the Board regarding projects that have been completed, projects underway, and projects to come.

Mr. Bishop informed the Board of the District's intent to continue momentum on Measure G construction and complete projects as soon as possible. The District's goal is to deliver Measure G projects to the Community in a timely manner, while meeting public expectations in terms of minimizing tax rates. It was mentioned that a resolution to issue the remaining Measure G Authorization, The 2010 Allocation of QSCBs and possibly refinancing a portion of Measure C outstanding bonds would be brought to the November 9<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.

##### Key Performance Indicators

Superintendent Russo presented District focus areas for the 2010-11 school year as a follow-up from discussion at the Board Retreat of August 26, 2010. The 2009-10 school year points of excellence, areas of most improved, and biggest challenges were identified. A chart was developed and provided to the Board for review, input and suggestions. Cabinet will quantify the key action steps to meet these challenges. Superintendent asked if the Board had input to the key performance indicators as proposed key action in response to these challenges. Discussion ensued.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Mr. Richardson seconded by Mr. Reyna and carried 4-0-1, to approve the Minutes of the Regular Board meeting of September 14, and approve Minutes of the Regular Board meeting of September 28, with a vote of 4-0-1, with Mr. Palacio abstaining.
