MINUTES

REGULAR MEETING SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

October 27, 2009

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 4:40 p.m. by Mr. Hernández. Other members in attendance were Dr. Yamagata-Noji, Mr. Palacio, and Mr. Reyna.

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Mr. Ayala, Ms. Lohnes, and Mr. Dixon.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board President Hernández asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no speakers to address the Board regarding Closed Session items.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting was immediately recessed to Closed Session to consider student discipline issues, negotiations, and personnel matters.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:10 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Jonathan Fernandez, Century High School student.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

The Superintendent called upon Middle College High School President Anthony Le who discussed the role as ASB president. He shared the year's vision for the school year at Middle College High School. He presented a PowerPoint and video for illustrations.

Ms. Russo then recognized the 2009 Apple of Gold Award winner, Mr. Kasey Klappenback, second-grade teacher at Heroes Elementary School and the school's very first teacher of the year. Mr. Klappenback received this honor for excellence in teaching and educational leadership by the Hispanic Education Endowment Fund.

The Superintendent announced that the Ronald Simon Family Foundation selected several outstanding juniors as SAUSD Simon Scholars. Simon scholars recently were honored in an awards ceremony. These scholars will each receive six years of stipends and scholarships in excess of \$32,000, including tutors and mentors, leadership retreats, theater nights, and life-skills training. Ms. Russo announced Red Ribbon Week from October 26 through October 30. Santa Ana Unified Schools are participating in a host of special observances, activities, and assemblies to promote safe, drug-free schools. In addition, the best overall winner of the School Police Drug Awareness poster contest is Courtney Bennett, a 3rd grade student from Santiago Elementary School. Courtney will become an "Honorary Junior Police Officer" for a day on Thursday, October 29, and will be sworn into office during the police officer morning briefing at which time she will receive her assignments of assisting School Police. First place winners at the secondary level include:

Our school police department was selected as a beta test site of a Statewide "Safe Schools Website" that will serve as a tool in offering online safety information and news updates for K-12 schools. School Police was invited to present its experience with the software at this week's California School Resource Officer's Conference held in San Diego. Guests of conference organizers include School Police Chief David Valentin, Sergeant Walter McIntyre, and school resource officers Brian Chesmore of Santa Ana High School and Jim Thomas of Godinez Fundamental High. The completed software will be distributed to school districts throughout California in 2010.

Ms. Doreen Lohnes, Assistant Superintendent of Support Services and District Nurse Gayle McLean were called to the podium. They provided an update about the H1N1. There will be a SAUSD XTEND message delivered to SAUSD families about the location(s) to receive the H1N1 vaccination in Santa Ana. Ms. Lohnes stated that they would continue to update the Board and community as information is received by the Orange County Health Care Agency. Ms. McLean reminded all to wash hands regularly and cover their coughs.

Greenville Fundamental Elementary School will celebrate "30 Years of Excellence" on Friday, October 30 at 1:00 p.m. The school's former principal Melanie Champion, who served 16 years at Greenville Fundamental Elementary, will be present and also Joan Ranney Sullivan, the school's first principal.

The Greenville choir will also perform, and Segerstrom High's cheerleaders will lead a rally to build school spirit. Later that afternoon, the school's annual fall carnival will be held from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. on the main playground as part of the celebration. The public is welcome to join the students and staff of Greenville Elementary in celebrating this momentous occasion.

Ms. Russo announced Valley High School's 50th Anniversary celebration on Friday, October 30, at Valley High School. The celebration begins with a special poolside reception at 7:00 p.m. There will be music, light refreshments, special guests and memorabilia for sale by Valley clubs and teams.

The Superintendent then announced that Chavez High School won a Golden Bell. The P.R.I.D.E. program, which won in the student services category, improves student attendance, reduces dropout rates and encourages student punctuality, accountability and determination for positive actions. PUBLIC HEARING

Mr. Hernández declared the meeting open to conduct a public hearing to receive comments regarding the use of flexibility provision for Tier III Categorical Program Funds for 2009-10. Hearing no comments, the hearing was declared closed.

By consensus of the Board, action was taken on Item 8.0, which is in reference to the public hearing.

Action Item: 8.0

ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 09/10-2813 - USE FLEXIBILITY PROVISION FOR TIER III CATEGORICAL PROGRAM FUNDS FOR 2009-10

In compliance with Education Code Section 42605(c) (2), the District must conduct a Public hearing. The flexibility provision allows the District to utilize Tier III program funding for any educational purpose including general fund expenditures per an attached listing. Mr. Murrey stated that the Orange County Department of Education, recently issued guidance advising districts to hold a public hearing and obtain Board approval to use the flexibility provision on an annual basis.

It was moved by Mr. Hernandez, seconded by Mr. Richardson, and carried 3-2, Mr. Palacio and Mr. Reyna dissenting, to adopt Resolution No. 09/10 2813 - to use flexibility provision for Tier III Categorical Program Funds for 2009-10 for any educational purpose as approved by the Board of Education.

PRESENTATIONS

#1 Presentation - Budget Update

Mr. Murrey provided an update on the current State budget and its effects to the SAUSD. He stated that the State budget is still unstable and 2009-10 is expected to bring the same. He showed a chart of capital gains and corporate income taxes that California relies on which show instability. He discussed the report by Employment Development Department, showing 39,300 jobs lost in September and the Department of Finance report that shows revenues short of projections by \$810 million. Mr. Murrey stated that School Services of California reported that the State economy is not expected to recover to 2007 levels until 2015.

Mr. Murrey stated that budget reductions are needed to be identified by December 15, 2009 for the first Financial Interim Report, with the prospect of new mid-year State budget cuts to education expected. He reviewed \$82 million in State cash deferrals which means that the State will pay the district late even though there are obligations such as payroll, vendor invoices that must be paid on a timely basis. He discussed American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (AARA) monies and how special education AARA funds have not been received. \$1.1 million in July, August, September and \$5.7 n October were delayed at the State with no revised timeline for distribution. Furthermore, \$6.2 million in October for Title 1 has been delayed at the State with a revised timeline for distributions and must be used over two years.

Mr. Murrey called upon Mr. Darren Dang, Director, Business Services, with the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE). Mr. Dang reviewed the 2008-09 unaudited actuals and addressed questions from the Board. He then stated that at the October 13, 2009, Board meeting, the OCDE was asked to review the District's \$93 million Ending Fund Balance based on variations in figures between the SAUSD and SAEA. Dr. Benkert, Associate Superintendent, Business Services, agreed to the study. Mr. Dang stated that based upon OCDE's review of the ending fund figures, the SAUSD was accurate and he found no discrepancies. He stated that the way SAEA and SAUSD calculate figures and the time in which calculations were completed would allow for differences. He explained that it is similar to a general checking account. When an individual is paid there is money in the account and while expenditures are made it reduces monies on a daily basis and depending on the time of month those calculations are made, it will throw off figures and that is what occurred.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

President Hernández asked those members of the community who wished to address the Board to step forward as he called their names.

#2 Presentation - Summarized Data of Williams Settlement First Quarterly Report

Dr. Olsky stated in order to meet the Williams Settlement Uniform Complaint reporting requirements staff is required to report summarized data on the nature and resolution of all complaints on a quarterly basis to the County Superintendent and Governing Board of the District. There were no complaints for the first quarter. The next reporting date is January 2010. Board of Education Minutes October 27, 2009

#3 Presentation - Career Technical Education

Ms. Patricia Carter, Director, Career Development/ROP, presented information about the Career Technical Education (CTE) program. She described CTE as a program that prepares students for their future workforce. She stated last year there were 8,742 students in the CTE program and today there are 8,240 or 20% less. Due to recent legislation, the program has changed its focus to high school students. And because of the State's budget, CTE had a reduction of \$1 million this year. The CTE umbrella covers several programs, the largest being ROP. Classes are offered at all six comprehensive high schools, Chavez High, and the Ritchie site. Other areas of CTE programs are Career Partnership Academies, the Education Academy at Century High, e-Business Academy at Century High, and the Global Business Academy at Valley High School.

Another program is the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Act, which is a federal grant focused on improvement and integration of CTE. It serves special populations, which are students with disabilities, English Language Learners, economically disadvantaged, and single parents. Another component under CTE is High School, Inc. at Valley High School, a formal presentation will come in December. She stated that an award was received for over \$4 million for facilities at Valley High School. Additionally, a new Career Academy Scholars program began at Valley, Santa Ana, and Century High Schools this year which is in collaboration with Santa Ana College. She then reviewed the CTE curriculum and stated that new classes include Art of Animation, Sports Medicine classes, and they are currently awaiting approval for a new course of Engineering & Design. She stated that some classes offer college course credits. She then reviewed relationships with over 300 businesses that provide community internships, mentor programs, and scholarship programs.

DISCUSSIONS

#1 Discussion - Enrollment Committee

Mr. Dixon introduced the item and stated that this item was brought before the Board to seek recommendations as to the formation of an enrollment committee chaired by the Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction to review the District's current enrollment due to changes in enrollment trends, Class Size Reduction and Measure G.

The Board made several suggestions and recommendations and asked the staff to return to the Board with a plan to form a committee with the information provided.

#2 Discussion - Legislative Platform for 2009-10 and 2010-11

Ms. Russo, Superintendent, stated that item is to seek recommendations from the Board as to the development of a Santa Ana Unified School District legislative platform. She stated that SAUSD has worked on QEIA and staff is currently involved in conference calls in regards to "Race to the Top" which focuses on underperforming schools in hopes of exiting Program Improvement. Some items for the platform include No Child Left Behind, which is up for reauthorization, and there is some change regarding Charter Schools in legislation with other issues coming up. Board members made suggestions regarding topics to be discussed. Dr. Yamagata-Noji and Mr. Richardson were selected by their peers to sit on the committee. Additional information regarding Race to the Top has been requested. When the legislative platform is developed, it will be brought to the Board for review.
