recent gains on their Academic Performance Index (API), Superintendent Jane Russo acknowledged Dr. Manuel Fuentes, principal of Esqueda Elementary School, and Edna Velado, principal of Romero Cruz Elementary School, along with their educators and students for recent academic success. Esqueda gained 46 points to increase to a 783 API score, and Romero-Cruz is now at 798, having experienced a 39-point gain.
