This allows for comparison between and with the same students to see if the programs offered in SAUSD are meeting students' needs. The State system for monitoring graduation and dropout rate is not functioning; therefore, the District will provide credit completion information only.

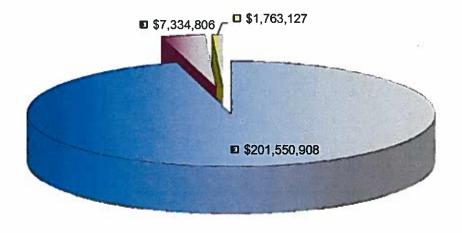

FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 06/30/10



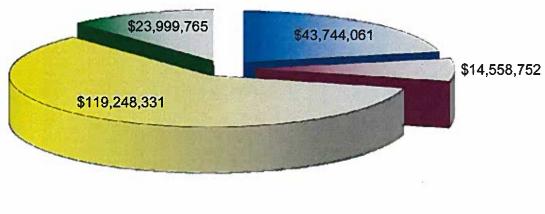
■Orange County Educational Investment Pool
