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**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval to amend the Joint Powers Agreement for Mail Delivery, Amendment No. 1.

**RATIONALE:**

All School Districts within the County require courier service to and from the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE). In consideration of the common need and to assimilate the mutual advantage attributable to economies of scale associated with a jointly provided courier service, OCDE has formed a Joint Powers entity. The entity is established for the purpose of operating and maintaining a County-wide system for the delivery of letters and other materials necessary in the normal course of school district business. The Schools First Federal Credit Union is in partnership with the entity. Schools First contributes significantly in monetary resources, thus defraying the cost to participant districts.

General Fund: \$3,700

## **JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT FOR MAIL DELIVERY**

### **AMENDMENT NO. 1**

THE AGREEMENT, made and entered into by, between, and among the public educational agencies which elected to unite in a joint powers entity created thereby, and those public educational agencies which may hereafter elect to join, is amended as follows

1. Section 7 TREASURER/AUDITOR subsection (d) is deleted in its entirety and is replaced with the following:

An employee of the Superintendent shall be designated as the Treasurer/Auditor of the Entity. The Treasurer/Auditor shall be the depository and have custody of all the money of the Entity, from whatever source. The Treasurer/Auditor shall:

- d. Verify and report in writing to the parties to this Agreement the amount of money held for the Entity, the amount of receipts since the last report, and the amount paid out since the last report. Such verification and written report shall be sent to the parties to this Agreement four (4) times a year as determined by the Executive Committee.

2. Section 9 PAYMENTS is deleted in its entirety and is replaced with the following provisions:

- a. Each fiscal year the Executive Committee shall reevaluate the cost of the delivery service. On or before June 30, the Executive Committee shall determine the amount payable by the participants for delivery services for the ensuing fiscal year.
- b. The Superintendent shall prepare an invoice for the delivery services and submit the invoice to each participant prior to July 31 of each fiscal year. Payment shall be made annually to the Superintendent within sixty (60) days of receipt of an invoice, unless the participant has given notice of its intention to withdraw from the County-wide delivery service pursuant to Section 10 of this Agreement. Payment shall be mailed to: Orange County Superintendent of Schools, 200 Kalmus Drive, P.O. Box 9050, Costa Mesa, California 92628-9050, Attention: Fiscal Services.

3. Except as herein amended, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

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**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval of the revisions to the reclassification criteria to include English Learner Students in grades 1 and 2. California's Education Code and regulations (*EC 313[d]*; 5 *CCR 11303*) require districts to establish policy and procedures to reclassify a pupil, grades 1-12 from English Learner (EL) to Fluent English Proficient (FEP) by using a process and criteria that include, but are not limited to:

- (a) Assessment of English-language proficiency (*CELDT*)
- (b) Assessment of performance in basic skills; *California Standards Test for English-Language Arts*
- (c) Teacher evaluation that includes, but is not limited to, the pupil's academic performance.
- (d) Parent opinion and consultation during the reclassification process

To meet California Department of Education EL student Reclassification requirements, SAUSD's reclassification criteria must include procedures and processes to include EL students in grades 1 and 2, who meet state-identified CELDT proficiency criteria.

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**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval to adopt Resolution No. 10/11-2856 – providing the issuance and sale of one or more series of election of 2008 general obligation bonds of Santa Ana Unified School District in the aggregate Principal Amount of not to Exceed \$45,901,029.75.

**RATIONALE:**

In June 2008, 69% of voters within the District approved Measure G authorizing the issuance of \$200 million of general obligation bonds to finance authorized school projects. We have issued \$154.1 million of general obligation bonds under Measure G to date. The resolution authorizes the issuance of the remaining \$45.9 million of general obligation bonds in a negotiated sale to George K. Baum, the underwriter for the Measure G bonds.

The resolution enables the bonds to be issued as a combination of Qualified School Construction Bonds (QSCBs), Build America Bonds (BABs), tax-exempt current interest bonds, and tax-exempt capital appreciation bonds. Both QSCBs and BABs were authorized under ARRA to provide government agencies with lower cost borrowing methods. Staff will work with George K. Baum and our financial advisor, Government Financial Strategies, to determine the appropriate structure to optimize financing terms.

The sale of the bonds is expected to close with \$45.9 million of proceeds available for projects in December 2010.

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**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board approval to adopt Resolution No. 10/11-2857 – providing for issuance and sale of 2010 general obligation refunding bonds of District in aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$34,500,000 to refund District's election of 1999 general obligation bonds, series 2002 and approving related documents and actions.

**RATIONALE:**

The District currently has approximately \$265 million in outstanding general obligation bonds issued in six different series. Governmental Financial Strategies, and the District's Financial Advisor, continue to monitor District outstanding debt to identify potential refunding opportunities. Given current market conditions, the interest rates on our outstanding debt, and the prepayment requirements, staff believes the District could refinance the callable portion of the Series 2002 Measure C Bonds for estimated savings of \$2.5 million for taxpayers at this time. Savings are subject to change based on actual interest rates received on the refunding bonds.

The schedule for the refinancing includes potentially selling the bonds in conjunction with the Measure G issuance scheduled for December in order to maximize overall taxpayer benefits. As we approach the sale date, interest rates will be reviewed to determine whether a refinancing remains justified.

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**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board authorization to obtain bids for the purchase of custodial supplies for warehouse stock.

**RATIONALE:**

The District purchases large quantities of custodial supplies each year for warehouse stock. These items include, restroom paper supplies and hand soap as well as daily use custodial supplies such as trash bags, mops and brooms. This bid will maintain the same level of quality and conditions set forth by the District, as well as, provide safer, greener supplies to the schools.

On October 13, 2009, the Board authorized the administration to award Bid #8-10 for custodial supplies for warehouse stock with the option to renew for two additional years. In surveying the current awarded vendors, however, the requested price increases are excessive. Re-bidding this commodity rather than renewing the existing bid will potentially allow cost savings to the District. Re-bidding also provides an opportunity to evaluate current items, remove slow moving items and replace them with more environmentally friendly products. Staff estimates product usage for the upcoming fiscal year to be approximately \$650,000.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to seek Board authorization to award a contract for Bid Package No. 502.1, for Paving Repairs at Saddleback High School under the Emergency Repair Program. Scope of work includes replacement of asphalt on basketball courts, cantilevered pool deck and drains, three tennis courts, and other related site work.

### RATIONALE:

Legal advertisements of notice calling for bids for Bid Package No. 502.1, for Paving Repairs were placed with the *Orange County Register* on October 12 and 19, 2010. Staff contacted 81 contractors of which 18 picked up the plans. On October 26, 2010, bid day, the District received 10 bids. The Architect and staff are in agreement that Hardy & Harper, Inc. represents the lowest bidder. This bid amount is within budget. The following is a list of all bids received:

- Interests in real estate (real property)
- Sources of personal income, including gifts, loans and travel payments
- Positions of management or employment with business entities
