REGULAR MEETING
SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

June 22, 2010

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 4:58 p.m. by Board President Yamagata-Noji. Other members in attendance were Mr. Richardson, Mr. Hernández, and Mr. Palacio. Dr. Yamagata-Noji left the meeting at 7:35 p.m. and Mr. Reyna arrived at 8:30 p.m.

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Mr. Ayala, Ms. Lohnes, and Mr. Dixon.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board President Yamagata-Noji asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

There were no individuals wishing to address the Board.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

The Regular meeting recessed to Closed Session to consider student discipline issues, negotiations, public employee discipline/dismissal, confidential issues, and personnel matters.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:05 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Emma Sophia Serrano, Kindergartener from Muir Fundamental Elementary.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

The Superintendent and Board members recognized 16 juniors from Saddleback High School and Segerstrom High School Class of 2012 Simon Scholars. She thanked special guests Dr. Kathy Simon Abels, Executive Director, and Megan Barnes, Program Director, who also were at the meeting. Every year, the Simon Family Foundation selects students to receive six years of stipends and scholarships in excess of \$30,000 to each scholar to help fund their college education. The scholarships are for the full four years of college. Each Simon Scholar was introduced. Higher Education Coordinators Olga Henderson from Saddleback High School and Adriana Huevo from Segerstrom High School introduced each student. Dr. Abels shared a few words about the program and encouraged students to do their best.

Ms. Russo congratulated and saluted all SAUSD graduates. At the meeting, she recognized three special seniors who have received the prestigious Gates Millennium Scholarship, made possible by Bill and Melinda Gates. Students, Jannet Sanchez from Century High, Vy Truong from Saddleback High, and Aura Carrillo from Santa Ana High, were among 1,000 nationwide selected for a full four-year renewable scholarship to the accredited college or university of their choice. The scholarship is based on student need, less financial aid, and could be as high as \$40,000 a year. In addition, students who pursue graduate studies in the fields of Computer Science, Education, Engineering, Library Science, Mathematics, Public Health or Science, may be eligible for Gates Millennium Scholarship fellowship funding for a master's and doctorate degree.

A slideshow was shown of 27 Middle College High School seniors who graduated with an Associates of Arts Degree, in addition to their high school diploma. Their hard work and efforts have put them at an advantage because this degree makes the students eligible to be at junior standing when they enter college.

Lincoln Elementary School Principal Damaris Molina recognized instructional assistant Fabiola Inda-Llamas. Fabiola was named the 2010 Classified Employee of the Year, Para-Educator, for Orange County. The Superintendent and Board of Education thanked Ms. Inda-Llamas for being an exemplary employee.

Facilities Staff awarded prizes for the winners of the Green School Contest for most improved in energy efficiency. Every dollar saved has a direct impact to our General Fund, so thank you Santa Ana students, teachers, and staff for your commitment and efforts to reduce energy use this school year. Ms. Tova Corman, Senior Facilities Planner, shared the results of the contest: 3rd place for \$500 went to Monroe Elementary, \$1,000 went to Greenville Fundamental Elementary, and \$1,500 went to Carr Intermediate Schools to be used for instructional supplies or anything the schools may need.

This summer, SAUSD will again collaborate with the City of Santa Ana to offer a free summer meal program for youths under age 18. The federally-funded program will operate Monday through Friday beginning Thursday, June 24, through July 30. at various school sites. The program will run from June 28 through August 20 at city locations. Participants must eat all meals at the participating site. President Yamagata-Noji declared the meeting open to conduct a Public Hearing to receive comments regarding the adoption of the 2010-11 Budget.

President Yamagata-Noji asked those members of the community who wished to address the Board to step forward as she called their names.

Hearing no additional comments, the Public Hearing was closed.

President Yamagata-Noji declared the meeting open to conduct a Public Hearing to receive comments regarding the Adoption of Resolution No. 09/10-2842 - Use Flexibility Provision for Tier III Categorical Programs and Funds for 2010-11

President Yamagata-Noji asked those members of the community who wished to address the Board to step forward as she called their names.

Hearing no comment, the Public Hearing was closed.

CHANGE IN AGENDA ORDER

It was by Board consensus that action be taken on Agenda Items 6.0 and 7.0 at this time.

ITEM 6.0 - ADOPTION OF 2010-11 BUDGET AND APPROVAL OF "ATTACHMENT C" ADDENDUM

Mr. Bishop, CBO, Associate Superintendent, Business Services, and Mr. Kelvin Tsunozumi, Executive Director, Fiscal Services, summarized the budget. He stated that the assumptions used in the budget are mainly based upon the Governor's "May Revision" which is merely a proposal related to the current and next State fiscal budget year.

Mr. Bishop reviewed the SAUSD's 2010 adopted budget that includes Board priorities, 2010-11 adopted budget, and next steps. He examined key revenue assumptions, which included a Revenue Limit reduction of 3.85%, reduced Revenue of 0.39% (due to negative COLA) and total revenue cuts in 2010-11 of \$14.3 million.

Mr. Bishop stated that the annual State funding has declined since 2007-08 and for 2010-11 is \$62 million less than 2007-08 levels. He then examined enrollment and costs by year, key American Reinvestment and Recovery Act funding which will end in the 2010-11 school year and K-3 Class Size Reduction through 2010-11. He next reviewed the combined restricted and unrestricted General Fund Revenue distribution for 2009-10 and 2010-11. He stated that the revenue decrease is due to revenue limit and State categorical budget reductions, declining enrollment, one-time Federal stimulus revenues received in 2009-10, categorical carryovers, which will be re-budgeted in fiscal year 2010-11, and local revenues/donations that are not budgeted until actually received.

Mr. Tsunozumi reviewed key expenditure assumptions in the following areas:

- COLA
- step/column and longevity
- staff development
- substitute costs
- continued management furlough days
- increases in Special Education costs
- AB3632 Mental Health initiative
- Health & Welfare costs
- PERS and STRS costs
- vacancy credit
- expenses noted in Second Interim
- K-6 Pilot at identified elementary schools
- SAEA Memorandum of Understanding related to Intermediate Class Size, Curriculum specialist CLAD stipends, and intermediate coaches

Mr. Tsunozumi stated that inadequate State funding of our schools has resulted in educational program reductions. The latest projected budget reduction estimate for 2011-12 and 2012-13 are \$32.5 million and \$30.5 million respectively. He stated that the State previously initiated \$70 million in deferrals (for SAUSD). The May Revise proposed deferrals of an additional \$19 million means that the State will pay the District several months late for money owed now. He said that the SAUSD has obligations such as payroll and vendor invoices that must be paid therefore, TRANS borrowing may occur.

Mr. Bishop stated that by December 15, 2010, the SAUSD must identify \$32.5 million in 2011-12 budget cuts and reach a decision on Class Size Reduction for 2011-12 and future years.

Mr. Bishop stated that the approval of attachment "C" with the 2010-11 is a requirement of the Orange County Department of Education for districts submitting a 2010-11 budget which includes significant budget reductions in 2011-12 and 2012-13 that have yet to be Board approved and implemented.

It was moved by Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Palacio, and carried 4-0, to adopt the 2010-11 budget and approve Attachment "C" addendum. The resolution is attached to the Minutes.

ITEM 7.0 - ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 09/10-2842 - USE FLEXIBILITY PROVISION FOR TIER III CATEGORICAL PROGRAMS AND FUNDS FOR 2010-11

Mr. Bishop stated that the District is required to conduct an annual public hearing concerning the approval for plans to use the flexibility provision for Tier III categorical programs and funds. Similar to last year, the flexibility provision allows the District to utilize Tier III program funding for any educational purpose, including general fund expenditures.

It was moved by Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Hernández, and carried 4-0, to adopt resolution No. 09/10-2842 certifying the use of flexibility provision for Tier III categorical programs and funds for 2010-11 for any educational purpose as approved by the Board of Education. The resolution is attached to the Minutes.

Update on Cal-SAFE Program

Mr. Ayala, Assistant Superintendent, Secondary Education, introduced the item and called upon Ms. Janneth Linnell, Early childhood Education Coordinator to provide an update of the Cal-SAFE Program.

Ms. Linnell reviewed the program's goals, enrollment, staffing, and next steps. She stated that 98% students enrolled in California School Age Families Educations or Cal-SAFE have remained in District schools. The program provides essential support services to pregnant and parenting students in the SAUSD to prevent school dropout and help students reintegrate to school.

Ms. Linnell stated school nurses provide health and development screening for all children in childcares, case management for high-risk pregnancies, and for children that have special medical needs. Two childcare classrooms reopened at Valley High in October 2009, offering weekly parenting enrichment activities provided by Early Childhood Education parent trainers on Fridays, after school. The program has established community's partnerships THINK Together, Kiwanis, Orange County Department of Education, WestED, Alta Med Health Services, and the City of Santa Ana to support the CalSAFE program.

Ms. Linnell stated that all students enrolled in the program have home-to-school transportation bus passes, and all students participate in parenting and life-skills education workshops on Saturdays.

In closing, Ms. Linnell stated that the State now requires licensing for childcare and there are Federal grant opportunities for agencies with licenses; therefore, the District will look into licensing. Additionally, should the SAUSD receive the Promise Neighborhoods grant, it would enhance outreach, support, and capacity building for prenatal children through age 23.

Mitchell Child Development Center Campus Improvement Plan

Mr. Dixon, Assistant Superintendent, Facilities and Governmental Relations, provided an update to the Board of the Mitchell Child Development Center (CDC) Campus Improvement Plan. He stated that in March 2010, the Board authorized the use of Critically Overcrowded Schools project savings for a high-priority capital outlay project. He stated that Mitchell CDC has not received state funding nor has it had modernization since 1968. He introduced Helena Jubany, AIA, LEED AP Principal of Jubany NAC Architects, who provided a conceptual design of the proposed Mitchell CDE improvement campus plan.

Ms. Jubany stated that they have met with Principal Mark Bello, staff, and district staff regarding planning and programming. She next viewed PowerPoint slides showing an aerial view of the existing site.

Mr. Dixon provided a calendar which included the following timeline:

- June 2010 - initial conceptual design and Board input
- October 2010 - design development/District collaboration
- October-March 2011 - Division of State Architect review and approval of design
- June 2011 - begin construction
- August 2012 - Occupancy

DISTRICT NO. 2004-1 OF SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT
(CENTRAL PARK PROJECT) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2010-2011

WHEREAS, the Santa Ana Unified School District (the "District") previously established Community Facilities District No. 2004-1 of the Santa Ana Unified School District (Central Park Project) ("CFD No. 2004-1") all pursuant to the terms and provisions of the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, commencing with Government Code Section 53111 (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, CFD No. 2004-1 issued its 2005 Special Tax Bonds in the original principal amount of \$11,785,000 pursuant to Resolution No. 05/06-2615, adopted by the Board of Education of the District acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 2004-1 on July 26, 2006 (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the District acting as the legislative body of CFD No. 2004-1 is authorized pursuant to Resolution Nos. 04/05-2576 and 04/05-2575 approved on August 24, 2004 (collectively, the "Resolutions of Intention"), Resolution No. 04/05-2580 approved on September 28, 2004 (the "Resolution of Formation") and the Ordinance Authorizing the Levy of Special Taxes, approved on October 8, 2004 (the "Ordinance") to levy a special tax on property in CFD No. 2004-1 to pay principal, interest and administrative expenses with respect to all bonds of CFD No. 2004-1, which include the Bonds, to pay for the construction, acquisition and rehabilitation of certain public facilities authorized to be financed by the levy of special taxes of CFD No. 2004-1 pursuant to the Resolutions of Formation and to pay all expenses incidental thereto; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary and appropriate that this Board levy and collect the special taxes for Fiscal Year 2009-10 for the purpose specified in the Ordinance, by the adoption of a resolution as specified by the Act and the Ordinance; and

1 WHEREAS, the special taxes being levied hereunder are at the same
2 rate or at a lower rate than provided by the Ordinance; and

3 NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE SANTA ANA UNIFIED
4 SCHOOL DISTRICT, ACTING IN ITS CAPACITY AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF
5 COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2004-1, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE
6 AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

7 Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct.

8 Section 2. The special tax ("Special Tax") is imposed without regard
9 to property valuation and is levied in compliance with the Act and the
10 Ordinance.

11 Section 3. In accordance with the Act and the Ordinance, there is
12 hereby levied upon the parcels within the District which are not otherwise
13 exempt from taxation under the Act or the Ordinance the special taxes for
14 Fiscal Year 2010-11 at the tax rates set forth in the report prepared by
15 Dolinka Group, Inc. for CFD No. 2004-1 entitled "Administration Report
16 Fiscal Year 2010-11" (the "Report") submitted herewith, which rates do not
17 exceed the maximum rates set forth in the Ordinance. After adoption of
18 this Resolution, the Assistant Superintendent, Facilities and Governmental
19 Relations, of the District, or his designee, may make any necessary
20 modifications to these special taxes to correct any errors, omissions or
21 inconsistencies in the listing or categorization of parcels to be taxed or
22 in the amount to be charged to any category of parcels; provided, however,
23 that any such modifications shall not result in an increase in the tax
24 applicable to any category of parcels and can only be made prior to the
25 submission of the tax rolls to the Orange County Auditor.

26 Section 4. All of the collections of the special tax shall be used
27 only as provided for in the Act and Resolutions of Formation. The special
28 tax shall be levied only so long as needed to accomplish the purposes
29 described in Resolutions of Formation.

30 Section 5. The special tax shall be collected in the same manner as
31 ordinary *ad valorem* taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same

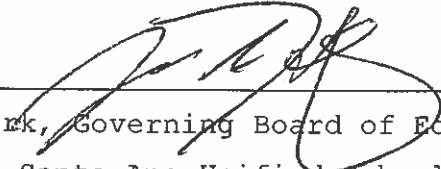
1 penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as
2 provided for *ad valorem* taxes as such procedure may be modified by law or
3 this Board from time to time.

4 Section 6. As a cumulative remedy, if any amount levied as a special
5 tax for payment of bond interest or principal, together with any penalties
6 and other charges accruing under this Resolution, are not paid when due,
7 the Board of Education may, not later than four years after the due date
8 of the last installment of principal on the Bonds, order that the same be
9 collected by an action brought in the superior court to foreclose the lien
10 of such special tax.

11 Section 7. The actions of District staff heretofore taken in order
12 to obtain consent from the Orange County Auditor to a later filing date
13 are hereby ratified and the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to
14 transmit a certified copy of this Resolution and the Report to the Orange
15 County Auditor, together with other supporting documentation as may be
16 required to place said special taxes on the secured property tax roll for
17 Fiscal Year 2010-11 on or before August 10, 2010, or such later date as
18 may be consented to by the Orange County Assessor, and to perform all
19 other acts which are required by the Act, the Ordinance, or by law in
20 order to accomplish the purpose of this Resolution.
