REGULAR MEETING SANTA ANA BOARD OF EDUCATION

June 8, 2010

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at $4:55~\rm p.m.$ by Board President Yamagata-Noji. Other members in attendance were Mr. Richardson, Mr. Hernández, and Mr. Palacio. Mr. Reyna arrived at $6:00~\rm p.m.$ Mr. Hernández left the meeting at $5:45~\rm p.m.$ and returned at $7:30~\rm p.m.$ Mr. Richardson left the meeting at $9:40~\rm p.m.$

Cabinet members present were Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, Mr. Bishop, Mr. Lopez, Mr. Mendez, Mr. Ayala, Ms. Lohnes, and Mr. Dixon.

RECESS TO CLOSED SESSION

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board President Yamagata-Noji asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to Closed Session to step to the podium.

The parent of Student ID#160809 addressed the Board to request a change of recommendation for the student. The Board received additional information from the parent. The parent was advised that a decision would be announced later in the meeting.

The guardian of Student ID#145344 addressed the Board to request a change of recommendation for the student. The Board received additional information from the parent. The parent was advised that a decision would be announced later in the meeting.

A classified employee and respective advocate addressed the Board regarding confidential matters. The individuals were advised that information received would be considered and a decision would be announced later in the meeting.

RECONVENE OPEN MEETING

The Regular meeting reconvened at 6:45 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Sergio Roman, fourth-grade student from King Elementary School.

REMOVAL/AMENDMENT OF AGENDA ITEM(S)

Dr. Noji asked if staff wished to remove any items from the Board Agenda. Superintendent Russo requested that item 1.10, page 2, item #10 be removed, as it is a duplicate entry. The Board unanimously approved the removal of the entry and adjusted the Agenda item accordingly.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

Dr. Yamagata-Noji acknowledged Ms. Russo for receiving an award from Healthy Eating Active Communities "HEAC" for her commitment to the health and well-being of SAUSD Children. Ms. Russo developed the office of special projects to focus on health, wellness, and physical education; facilitated development of the exercise science curriculum that allows students to help design their fitness routine, and the development of a wellness policy and related programs including the Governor's Fitness Challenge with participants surpassing 55,000 students and staff.

The Superintendent attended the California Distinguished Schools Ceremony at the Disneyland Hotel honoring the six SAUSD schools named California Distinguished Schools, which are Harvey, Heninger, King, and Madison Elementaries, Thorpe Fundamental Elementary and El Sol Science & Arts Academy. She also had the honor of participating in the Distinguished School Celebration that took place at King Elementary School on Friday, May 21. Students were asked to participate in a writing contest entitled "What Makes King School a Distinguished School?" One of the contest winners was 5th grade student Jazmin Soto, who shared her essay with the Board this evening.

Following Jazmin's essay reading, Mrs. Prado's third/fourth-grade class performed "I Believe I Can Fly" for the Board and audience.

GEAR Up images were displaying on the screen while Ms. Russo congratulated two intermediate students who received an Educational Trust Scholarship courtesy of GEAR Up and the Santa Ana College Academic Talent Search Program for academic excellence. Award recipient Manuel Velasquez is a sixth grader at Willard Intermediate School and Ricardo Franco is an eighth grader at McFadden Intermediate. Manuel and Ricardo were chosen out of thousands throughout the State for this award which helps low-income students gain the skills, encouragement, and preparation to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. Each will receive a \$2,000 award that will be secured for them in a trust until they graduate from high school and apply to a college or university of their choice.

Mr. Lopez, Associate Superintendent of Human Resources, formally acknowledged SAUSD's Nationally Board Certified teachers Anne Bravo, 2nd grade at Martin and Ann Hernández, 2nd grade teacher at Carver Elementary Schools. He also congratulated outstanding New Board Certified teachers Stacy Kline, Technology teacher at Spurgeon Intermediate and Morgan McElfresh teacher at Saddleback High Schools.

The Superintendent asked those in the Board Room to draw their attention to the creative student artwork displayed in our Board Room from Mendez Fundamental Intermediate and Kennedy and King Elementary Schools.

Classified Employee of the Month - May

A District Classified Selection Committee nominated Ms. Elva Euyoque, School Office Assistant, Walker Elementary School, as Classified Employee of the Month, for May. Ms. Owings, Walker Principal, presented Ms. Euyoque with the honor. Elva is consistent in her work ethic, dependable, reliable and honest. She is organized, multi-tasked and very efficient. She uses her time wisely and is very competent in her work. Her communication with parents is cheerful, respectful, and professional. She is an outstanding employee.

Accompanying Elva to receive this special honor were her husband Carlos, son Carlos, Jr., daughters Erika and Nancy, son-in-law, John, and friends. On behalf of the Santa Ana Unified School District and the Board, she was presented a beautiful bouquet of flowers, a plaque engraved with her name and month for which she is honored, and a gift certificate for dinner.

PROMISE NEIGHBORHOODS INITIATIVE UPDATE

Dr. Olsky presented an update on the Promise Neighborhoods Initiative. She said that the last update was on February 23, 2010. Dr. Olsky stated that THINK Together, a community-based organization serves as the fiscal agent/initiator of the grant. The purpose of the initiative is to develop a coordinated effort of supportive services from early childhood education to after-school activities, college and career counseling, and support from health and social services in an entire neighborhood. Dr. Olsky reminded the Board that the application is for a planning grant not an implementation grant.

The primary applicants must be community-based organizations with a current 501(c)(3) that demonstrates a strong partnership with schools. She stated that THINK Together and KidWorks are working together as well as other partners such as the Children and Families Commission of O.C., California Endowment, Santa Ana College, Latino Health Access, and the City of Santa Ana, to develop a Promise Neighborhoods grant proposal. Schools identified within the Promise Neighborhoods grant are Valley High, Spurgeon Intermediate, and Lincoln and Monte Vista Elementary Schools.

She briefly reviewed the timeline and stated that the Request for Proposals came out in May, the planning grant applications are due on June 25 and the yearlong planning process would commence in September 2010.

A video was shown of a conception vision and plan that the group is putting together. At the meeting were Randy Barth, Founder/CEO and Dr. CynDee Zandes, Chief Program Officer of THINK Together.

Dr. Noji asked if project design, services, personnel, management plan, and significance have been written in yet. Dr. Zandes stated that there have been many meetings involving Ms. Russo, Dr. Olsky, principals, parents, community agencies, partners, and teachers and it is still in draft form at this time. She added that they are still receiving input to provide a solid platform in which to plan. Completed portions of the grant will be shared with the Board for discussion. She stated that they are on the right track as they have captured various issues that people believe are important.

The challenges are similar to the Santa Ana Building Healthy Communities. They are excited about the wonderful opportunity for community to seek Board input. They will keep Board apprised.

Mr. Reyna has asked that staff include the following agencies to the application if possible, which are OCCCO, Taller San Jose, Boys and Girls Club of Santa Ana, and Girls, Inc.

Dr. Olsky stated that staff would keep the Board apprised up until the submission date.

BUDGET UPDATE

Mr. Bishop, Sr., CBO, Associate Superintendant, Business Services, provided a brief Budget update. He stated that the May Revise is only a proposal and that Legislative approval is required. The State and national economy continues to be weak and cuts to education are roughly similar to the January Governor's proposal. He stated the 2010-11 SAUSD budget would be presented at the subsequent Board meeting. In addition, the 2010-11 numbers presented as part of the Third Interim will undoubtedly change as additional May Revise details are released. He reviewed Multi-Year projections using Third-Interim numbers that included unspecified cuts.

Mr. Bishop stated that for the 2010-11 school year there were \$34 million in approved budget reductions (\$23 million were one-time reductions). In 2011-12, there will be \$26 million reduced, and for 2012-12, \$30 million in reductions will be identified and are included in the current projection.

Mr. Bishop stated that next year, 2010-11 school year, ARRA funds would expire, impacting Special Education staff funded with ARRA funds due to an increase in Autism and expansion of high incident programs remaining. In addition, Persistently Low Achieving Schools (PLAS) sustainability support is required, and as for Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) Federal reauthorization of NCLB funding allocation changes if any, all not yet known.

In closing Mr. Bishop reviewed current 2009-10 Board priorities with the possible exception of Class Size Reduction. In addition, he reminded the Board of the \$26 million in budget reductions to be made by December 15, 2010.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

Board President Yamagata-Noji asked those wishing to address the Board in matters pertaining to items on the Agenda to step to the podium.

Arturo Barrados, SAUSD parent, addressed the Board to request an exchange of his student from Mendez Fundamental Intermediate to Villa Fundamental Intermediate Schools and knows of a parent who is willing to trade enrollment.

Rocio Mojica, SAUSD parent, addressed the Board to request a reimbursement related to her special needs child. (During this presentation Mrs. Saldana, parent of the District, on behalf of Ms. Mojica, read a California Public Records Act Request and recited California Government Code 6253(a) et seq.) The Public Records Act has been noted and a response will be generated.

Andre Hernández, SAUSD student, addressed the Board to request an Occupational Therapist and the enrollment to a Prentice or Pathways Schools.

Brianna Hernández, SAUSD student, addressed the Board stating that she wished to be enrolled in a different school, alleged being followed by private investigators, and suggested that the District pay for a private school.

Yolanda Ochoa, SAUSD parent, addressed the Board to request that a follow up phone call be made to her regarding an intra-district transfer. She also spoke regarding her child attending a different school outside of the SAUSD.

Jason Ochoa, SAUSD student, addressed the Board to voice his objection to Villa Fundamental Intermediate's wait list where his name is listed and to state that he is waiting for a call to enroll.

RENEWAL OF CHARTER SCHOOL PETITION FOR ORANGE COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL OF THE ARTS CHARTER SCHOOL BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SANTA ANA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Section 47605, et seq., the Governing Board of the Santa Ana Unified School District ("SAUSD" and/or "District") is required to review and authorize creation of a charter school; and

WHEREAS, on or about January 28, 2000, the Governing Board of the Santa Ana Unified School District approved the original operating Charter for the Orange County High School of the Arts Charter School ("OCHSA") for a five year term which expired July 25, 2005; and

WHEREAS, on or about July 26, 2005, the original operating charter was renewed for a five year term that will expire July 25, 2010; and

WHEREAS, on or about November 8, 2009, Orange County High School of the Arts Charter School submitted to the Santa Ana Unified School District a Charter School Petition for renewal of its Charter for a five year term beginning July 1, 2010 and expiring June 30, 2015, and has subsequently submitted a revised Petition and budgetary documents; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was conducted on December 8, 2009, pursuant to Education Code Section 47605, to consider the level of public support for this Charter by teachers employed by the District, other employees of the District, and parents; and
